



P Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

The Licensee, that is the person in whose name the premises licence is issued, shall ensure that all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police. The Licensee will install comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises.

The CCTV system shall conform to the following points:

- 1. Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside.
- 2. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
- Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen.
- 4. Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
- 5. Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed.
- 6. Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image.
- 7. Provide good quality images –colour during opening times.
- 8. Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
- 9. Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet.
- 10. Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality.
- 11. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture retention.
- 12. Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation.
- 13. Digital images must be kept for 31 days.
- 14. Police will have access to images at any reasonable time.
- 15. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e. G. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy, if this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H20 and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting (see enclosed plan for details of locations). All appliances are inspected annually.

All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly.

Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, the Connexions Card and Citizen Card, photographic driving licence or passport, an official identity card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer.

All staff will be trained for UNDERAGE SALES PREVENTION regularly.

A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises.



With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives, being the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The venue is situated in the designated 'Kings Cross Cumulative Impact Area'; a locality where there is traditionally high crime and disorder, and a large number of licensed bars and off-licenses in the immediate area. Islington has almost double the national average of licensed premises per resident, and this is why the Police supported the implementation of the Council's Cumulative Impact Policy. This large number of licensed premises and the issues associated with these impacts greatly on the Police and all other emergency service's resources.

It is only for the above reason that we are objecting to the application and propose that it is refused.

Licensing Act 2003 - Representation from the Pollution Team Application: Le Cantine 21 White Conduit Street Islington N1

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Pollution Team with respect to a new premises licence application to permit the sale of alcohol, for consumption on the premises, from 09:00 until 23:00 Monday to Sunday.

The grounds for the representation are:

Public nuisance

The premises is located in the Angel and Upper Street Cumulative Impact Area so there is a presumption that the application should be refused and the onus is on the applicant to demonstrate that the granting of the licence will not add to the cumulative impact or otherwise impact adversely on the promotion of the licensing objectives; including the prevention of public nuisance.

The area the premises is situated in is primarily commercial however there are some residential properties immediately above and to its rear.

The premises had a previous café use and a review of our Complaints system revealed no recent nuisance complaints.

Licensing Policy 9 and 10

The premises operating schedule provided contains insufficient information to demonstrate that high standards of management will operate on the premises; the applicant does not appear to have considered the Licensing Policy in preparing it; there is no reference to the local context and the proposed controls in the operating schedule relating to the prevention of public nuisance

We have visited the premises and met with Mr Loudovic Femenia to discuss the proposed operation.

Summary and recommendations

The Pollution Team has considered the application using the Licensing Framework. The applicant does not appear to have considered that the premises is situated in the Angel and Upper Street Cumulative Impact Area or nor sought advice on measures to put in place to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance indicating that the style of management will be reactive rather than proactive.

We object to the granting of this Licence however if the Licensing Committee is satisfied that the operation of the premises will not add to the existing cumulative impact we recommend that the following conditions are placed on the Licence.

A. Dispersal

Page 1 of 2 110

- 1. The Premises Licence Holder will prepare and implement a dispersal policy to the written approval and satisfaction of the Council's Noise Service.
- B. Deliveries
- 1. Deliveries shall not take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- 2. Deliveries should only be made between the hours of 10:00 and 17:00 on other days.
- C. Bottling Out and Refuse
- 1. Bottling out and refuse disposal shall not take place Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- 2. Bottling out and refuse disposal shall only take place between the hours of 10:00 and 17:00 other days.
- D. External Tables and Chairs
- 1. The outside tables and chairs shall be cleared of patrons and rendered unusable by 23:00;

I am against the approval of this license. I have lived at this address for over ten years, & chapel st on a thursday, friday, saturday night is in my opinion like most of islington on these evenings Noisy, Rife with anti social behaviour (ie public urination, swearing, fights, arguments, marajuana smoking, street drinking etc) and above all Dangerous.

This has worsened over the years I feel.

I avoid going out after dark on these evenings for fear of ending up a victim of assault by someone drunk.

When I have been out I have noticed far greater numbers of people who dont appear local, walking about in groups, arguing, singing, shouting etc and one never knows when one might fall foul of this given the clearly intoxicated state of these people. Myself or friends have been bumped into seemingly intentionally several times on these nights but not risen to the affront.

I live without a view of the street on the back of the shops but the noise is still bad enough you can hear it until late into the night.

Its clear there are arguments and assaults every week as you can hear screaming, aggressive shouts, bangs and the arrival of the police.

We frequently have people being sick, urinating and leaving litter in the entrance to our flats.

Public Nuisance, all of her habitable rooms [bedroom and living room notably] front onto White Conduit street and are from No 21. The additional noise from customers going into and leaving No 21 up to as late as 00.00 would have a huge impact on her ability to rest/sleep and therefore her well being. This would be greatly furthered if the customers were allowed to stand outside and smoke or continue to drink at tables provided.

Appendix 3

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. The licensee shall ensure that all times when the premises are used for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence for preventing crime and disorder.
- 2. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training on the responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.
- 3. A CCTV system shall be installed, operated and maintained at the premises. (1) camera must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors, the alcohol displays, and floor areas (2) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all the people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification. (3) Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen. (4) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises. (5) Camera must capture a minimum of 16 frames per second. (6) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed. (7) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image. (8) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image. (9) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises. (10) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet. (11) Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality. (12) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention. (13) Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation. (14) Digital images must be kept for 31 days. (15) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time. (16) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If the format is non – standard 9i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.
- 4. Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H20, and Co2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting. All appliances shall be inspected annually.
- 5. All emergency exits shall be kept clear from obstruction at all times
- 6. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to neighbours.
- 7. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to anyone who appears to be under 25, staff ask to see accredited proof of age cards for example proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
- 8. All staff shall be trained on underage sales prevention.
- 9. A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by the Noise Team

- 1. The Premises Licence Holder will prepare and implement a dispersal policy to the written approval and satisfaction of the Council's Noise Service.
- 2. Deliveries shall not take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- 3. Deliveries should only be made between the hours of 10:00 and 17:00 on other days.

- 4. Bottling out and refuse disposal shall not take place Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- 5. Bottling out and refuse disposal shall only take place between the hours of 10:00 and 17:00 other days.
- 6. The outside tables and chairs shall be cleared of patrons and rendered unusable by 23:00; adequate notices shall be displayed to inform patrons of the requirement in and, any moveable furniture will be fitted with rubber (or equivalent) feet.
- 7. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises kitchen extract system, nor any other fixed plant or equipment associated with the premises, so as to cause a nuisance to neighbouring occupiers.
