# **SUBJECT:** APPOINTMENT OF THE LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEES FOR MUNICIPAL YEAR 2012/2013 AND DELEGATION OF LICENSING FUNCTIONS

# 1. Synopsis

1.1 This report proposes the appointment of the Licensing Sub-Committees, the approval of their terms of reference and the delegation of licensing functions to the Licensing Sub-Committees and to officers.

# 2. Recommendation

(a) That four Licensing Sub-Committees be established for the municipal year 2012/2013 with the terms of reference set out in Appendix 1 of the report and that all functions falling within the terms of reference be delegated to them;

(b) That the following members, Chairs and Vice-Chairs, be appointed for the municipal year 2012/2013 or until successors are appointed,

# 3. Background

- 3.1 Licensing Sub-Committees are established under the Licensing Act 2003. They may exercise licensing functions (as defined by the Licensing Act 2003 and licensing functions under the Gambling Act 2005) other than functions specifically reserved to the Council, which are delegated to them by the Licensing Committee
- 3.2 The Licensing Committee may also delegate its functions to officers of the Council, subject to restrictions set out in the Act where relevant representations or police objections are received. Guidance issued in respect of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005 respectively recommends that functions be delegated to sub-committees and officers.
- 3.3 Functions under schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended are the responsibility of the Council. Under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, the Council may arrange for the discharge of these responsibilities by a committee or sub-committee of the Council. Guidance issued by the Home Office states that the Council may delegate these functions to its licensing committee set up to discharge licensing functions under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3.4 The Licensing Committee is asked to appoint a number of Sub-Committees to determine applications in respect of the Licensing Act 2003, schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended and the Gambling Act 2005. The Licensing Committee is asked to approve the detailed terms of reference for the Sub-Committees contained in Appendix 1.
- 3.5 The Committee is asked to approve the delegations to officers in Appendix 1.
- 3.6 A list of dates for each of the Sub-Committees is attached at Appendix 2 for information.

# 4. Implications

4.1 **Financial implications** None.

# 4.2 Legal Implications

4.2.1. The Licensing Act 2003 requires that each licensing authority establish a licensing committee of between ten and fifteen members. A licensing committee may form one or more sub-committees, each comprising three members of the committee.

4.2.2 A licensing committee may sub-delegate its functions to one or more sub-committees, or to an officer of the licensing authority.

4.2.3. Guidance has been issued in respect of the delegation of licensing functions to which the committee is required to have regard. The guidance has been followed in respect of the delegations proposed in this report.

4.2.4. A licensing sub-committee when dealing with an application for a sex establishment licence will not be acting as a sub-committee under the Licensing Act 2003 but would instead be exercising their functions under schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

#### 4.3 Environmental Implications

The environmental impacts have been considered and it was identified that the proposals in this report would have no adverse impacts on the following:

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#### Terms of Reference of Licensing Sub-Committees

#### Licensing Act 2003

1. To determine applications for personal licences where the police have served an objection notice or the applicant has an unspent conviction.

2. To determine applications for premises licences, club premises certificates and provisional statements where a relevant representation is made.

3. To determine applications to vary premises licences and club premises certificates where a relevant representation is made.

4. To determine applications to vary a designated premises supervisor where a police objection is received.

5. To determine applications for transfer of a premises licences where a police objection is received.

6. To determine applications to review premises licences and club premises certificates.

7. To determine applications for interim authorities where a police objection is received.

- 8. To determine a police objection to a temporary event notice.
- 9. Decision to object when the council is a consultee.

#### Gambling Act 2005

10. To determine applications for premises licences and provisional statements where representations have been made and not withdrawn.

11. To determine applications for variation of premises licences where representations have been made and not withdrawn.

12. To determine applications for transfer of premises licences where representations from the Gambling Commission or responsible authority are received.

13. To review a premises licence under section 201.

14. Application for club gaming/club machine permits where objections have been made and not withdrawn.

15. Cancellation of club gaming/club machine permits.

16. Decision to give a counter notice to a temporary use notice.

#### Schedule 3 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended

17. To determine applications for first grant of a sex establishment licence.

18. To determine renewal applications for a sex establishment licence if objections are received and not withdrawn.

19. To determine transfer applications for a sex establishment licence if objections are received and not withdrawn.

#### **General**

20. To determine any application or variation which is capable of being determined by officers but which the Director of Environment and Regeneration considers appropriate for the Sub-Committee to consider.

## **Delegation to Officers**

All functions under the Licensing Act 2003, the Gambling Act 2005 and schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended not within the terms of reference of the Licensing Sub-Committees or reserved to the Council at Part 3 Section 7 of the Constitution, other than the fixing of fees under the Gambling Act 2005.
