

SUBJECT: Street Trading Account – Review of Fees and Charges

1. Synopsis

The report outlines proposals for changes to the Street Trading fees and charges with effect from 01 January 2014.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To agree the proposed increases to the fees and charges as outlined in Appendix 1.
- 2.2 To agree that the new fees come into effect from 01January 2014

3. Background

- 3.1 The Street Trading Account is a ring-fenced account, and fees and charges collected can only be spent on costs related to the running of the market Inspectors salaries, cleansing, waste collection repair and maintenance etc.
- 3.2 The Street Trading Account is monitored monthly and reviewed annually to ensure that the account does not go into arrears.
- 3.3 Street Trading fees have not been raised since 2008, and yet since then, we have seen large rises in electricity costs in Whitecross Street and Chapel Market . We will soon have to make some significant investment in things like electricity pillar maintenance in Chapel Market and Whitecross Street and repair/replacement of market canopies and equipment in Whitecross St. We are also

introducing new hardware and software for Inspectors to use in the markets and this system will need to be reviewed and updated as appropriate.

- It is recommended, that there is at least a 2.5% increase to all fees. This will mean for example that a 8ftx3ft pitch selling non-food in Chapel Market will go from £58.50 to £60.00 per week, an increase of £1.50 per week. The 2.5% increase will apply to nearly 88% of the Chapel Market Traders and these traders will see no other increase. The 2.5% increase is in line with the Councils position relating to other fees and charges.
- We also want to tackle the growing increase in the cost of electricity, and to start to secure funds for future maintenance/repair of electricity supply boxes and underground cables. Here the fee increase will be 15%, but will only effect the traders that use high levels of electricity, i.e. Hot Food sellers. In Whitecross Street, for example, a weekly pitch fee for hot food will increase from £65.00 to £75.00. We still think that this is excellent value for 5 days trading in what is recognised as a highly successful lunchtime market. This will affect 54% of the traders. Chapel Market hot food sellers will also see an increase of 15% equating to a £10 increase in their
- We are also proposing to remove the discount for 2nd or subsequent hot food pitches in Whitecross St Market. Currently a hot food trader gets a £10.00 week reduction for a second or subsequent pitch. This reduction was introduced, when we were developing the market, but due to the fairly recent explosion in street food, we have seen demand to sell hot food completely outstrip the availability of pitches. Whilst we recognise that we need to be loyal and support existing traders, we do believe the removal of the discount is entirely justified. This will effect 11% of traders, but these are the same traders that have also seen a 15% increase in their first pitch fee. We will still give a discount to non-hot food sellers for second/subsequent pitches.
- 3.7 In Camden Passage we have 8 pitches designated for street trading on at least 2 days a week. As part of partnership working, Angel Aim purchased pop up style gazebos for the traders and the street trading account pays for the weekly storage of the gazebos. We intend to offer the gazebos (in their current state of repair) to the existing regular traders with the proviso that they provide their own storage or alternatively recover the full storage costs as part of their daily/weekly rental. The storage charge equates to approx. £5 a day.
- In accordance with Section 32(7) of the London Local Authorities Act 1990 (as amended) a notice giving details of the proposed charges was published in the Islington Gazette on Thursday 22 August 2013 See Appendix 2. In addition to the Public notice each licensee was notified in writing of the proposed charges. See Appendix 3
- The deadline for receiving written responses to the proposals has now passed and we have not received any comments or objections to the proposals.

4. Implications

4.1 Financial implications:

weekly rent (12% of Traders)

- 4.1.1. The Street Trading Account is a ring fenced account and all expenditure incurred must be recovered by charges made to the traders.
- 4.1.2. The report recommends an increase for Fees and Charges of approximately 15% on Take away Hot food and 2.5% across other commodities, exceptions to these increases are outlined within the report.
- 4.1.3. The intention is to offset both the increasing Electrical costs and maintenance costs incurred providing electricity to the Hot Food venders.
- 4.1.4. The Current Income Target for 2013-14 is £639,738.00 this Fee increase is expected to generate

a further £40k in a full year.

4.1.5. Any balance above the breakeven level will be ear marked for the improvement of infrastructure to the Street Trading Sites. If the income target is not reached a review identifying savings within Expenditure will have to be carried out.

4.2 Legal implications:

- 4.2.1. Section 32 London Local Authorities Act 1990 (Part III) makes provision for fees and charges. A borough council may charge such fees for the grant or renewal of a street trading licence under this Part of this Act, the grant of a temporary licence or for the variation at the request of the licence holder of the conditions of a street trading licence as they may determine and as may be sufficient in the aggregate to cover in whole or in part the reasonable administrative or other costs in connection with their functions under this Part of this Act, not otherwise recovered.
- 4.2.2. A borough council may recover from licence holders such charges as may be sufficient in the aggregate taking one year with another to cover the reasonable costs, not otherwise recovered, of:
 - (a) The condition, removal and disposal of refuse or other services rendered by them to such holders; and
 - (b) The cleansing of streets in which street trading takes place in so far as that cleansing is attributable to such trading; and
 - (c) Any reasonable administrative or other costs incurred in connection with the administration of this Part of this Act; and
 - (d) The cost of enforcing the provisions of this Part of this Act

4.2.3. A borough council may determine:

- (a) that charges under subsection 4.2.2 above shall be included in a fee payable under subsection 4.2.1 above; or
- (b) That they are separately recoverable.

4.2.4. A borough council may:

- (a) Require that every application for a licence under this Part of this Act be accompanied by the whole or part of the fee determined under subsection 4.2.1 above; and
- (b) Determine that the fee may be paid by instalments.
- 4.2.5. Where a borough council refuse to renew a licence they shall repay to the person who made the application therefore the amount of such fee paid by him.
- 4.2.6. A borough council may determine the fees to be charged on the grant of a temporary licence under section 31 (Temporary licences) of this Act, and in doing so they shall have regard to the matters specified in subsection 4.2.2 above and such fees shall be included in the computation for the purposes of determining the fees and charges under subsections 4.2.2 above.
- 4.2.7. Before determining charges to be made under subsection 4.2.2 above (whether originally or by way of variation of charges previously determined) a borough council:
 - (a) Shall give notice of the proposed charges to licence holders or to a body or bodies representative of them; and
 - (b) Shall publish notice of the proposed charges in a newspaper circulating in the area in which the licence street or streets in respect of which the charges will be applied is situated.

- (c) A notice under subsection 4.2.7(a) above shall be accompanied by a statement showing how the proposed charges have been computed; and any body representative of licence holders may request the borough council to supply such further information or explanation with regard to the proposed charges as the body may reasonably required in order to ascertain whether the proposed charges are reasonable and have been computed in accordance with the provisions of this section.
- 4.2.8. A notice under subsection 4.2.7(a) above shall specify a reasonable period being not less than 28 days from the date of publication of the newspaper referred to in subsection 4.2.7 (b) above within which written representations concerning the proposed charges may be made to the borough council.
- 4.2.9. It shall be the duty of a borough council to:
 - (a) Consider any such representations which are made to them within the period specified in the notice and (b) comply with any request made under subsection 4.2.7(c) above;
 - (b) and where any such request is made the period so specified. If still current, shall be treated as extended by the number of days in the period beginning with the day on which the request is made and ending with that on which it is complied with.
- 4.2.10 When a borough council have determined fees under subsection 4.2.1 above or charges under subsection 4.2.2 above (whether originally or by way of variation of fees or charges previously determined) they shall give notice of the fees or charges so determined and of the date on which those fees or charges are to be brought into effect in the manner prescribed in subsection 4.2.7 above.

4.3 Equality impact assessment:

4.3.1. An equalities impact assessment (EIA) on this proposal has been carried out. The EIA identified that there would be no differential impacts on different groups in Islington and no negative consequences for community cohesion. This conclusion was drawn because the fees increase will be applicable to all businesses operating in a commercial environment.

5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendation

The fee increase is necessary to ensure that we can continue to invest in the Street Trading infrastructure for the benefit of everyone. The above inflation increases, particularly for Whitecross Street and Chapel Market in the main only effect hot food traders. The general view from officers and other professionals involved in the market is that even with the increase, the rentals for these types of stalls demonstrate excellent value for money, particularly in comparison with other markets.



PROPOSED FEE INCREASES

I am writing to inform you that fees and charges are currently under review and a proposal for increases has been published through a public notice in the Islington gazette as per the London Local Authorities Act 1990 (as amended).

As you are no doubt aware the Street Trading account is ringfenced and must be self-funding. The last increase was applied in October 2008. Price increases have been kept to the minimum for a number of years but due to an increase in running costs we have been forced again to review our charges. Having consulted with other boroughs the revised increases are still competitive and in line with fees in neighbouring areas.

I have enclosed the proposed fees for your attention. If approved, the increases will come to effect as from 1st January 2014.
