PREMISES LICENCE NEW APPLICATION

RE: JOURNEYS KINGS CROSS, 54-58 CALEDONIAN ROAD, LONDON N1 9DP

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to:
 - Supply alcohol for consumption on and off the premises 16:00 to 23:00 Sunday to Thursday and 16:00 to midnight Friday and Saturday;
 - ii) Exhibition of films 18:00 to 20:30 Sunday to Monday;
 - iii) Late night refreshment 23:00 to 00:00 Friday to Saturday;
 - iv) Set the opening hours of the premises.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 To consider that this address is in the Kings Cross Saturation or "Cumulative Impact Policy" of Islington. This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences, club premises certificates, or variation applications that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate why the operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact or otherwise impact adversely on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- 2.3 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i) conditions of the current premises licence;
 - ii) conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule
 - iii) conditions recommended by responsible Authorities
 - iv) any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1 The premises is currently unlicensed.
- 3.2 On 3 December 2013 the applicant agreed with the Noise Team to remove recorded music from the application.
- 3.3 Papers are attached as follows:-

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

- a) General all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)
 - We will take appropriate measures in order to control the consumption of alcohol in our premises. Guests tend to bring their own supplies to the hostel and we would like to control the consumption in order to promote all four licensing objectives and offer an enjoyable and safe environment to our quests.
 - We will train our staff thoroughly in health and safety, crime prevention, food and hygiene, and in selling alcohol.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- We have a CCTV recording 24 hours and monitored by the shift manager. Our CCTV signs are in place in the designated areas of the premises where the licensable activities will take place.
- The management team consists of fully trained staff. Two personal license holders, one trained first aid and one first aid instructor trainer.
 We intend to arrange courses to train the rest of our key staff who work at reception and those who are going to work at the bar area.
- Bar staff will perform age checks on under 25 individuals and when deemed necessary. Under 18 individuals are only allowed in the premises if accompanied by an adult and if staying in a private room. The bar will be open to residents only. No visitors are allowed on the premises.
- The bar staff will be fully trained to prevent the excessive consumption of alcohol, and to deny the sale of alcohol to drunken persons. Our aim is to control the consumption of alcohol on our premises.
- Guests will not be allowed to exit the premises with alcohol. There is a shift manager on duty 24 hours, located in front of the main entrance and is checking the guests entering the premises. He/She will prevent anyone from taking alcohol into the street.

c) Public safety

- Fire risk assessment is in place for the premises, fire doors and fire exits clearly marked in public areas.
- The premises are fully equipped with fire fighting equipment, emergency lighting and a fire alarm system.
- The key employees have undertaken health and safety training and are capable to fulfil the public safety responsibilities.
- We will create a safe drinking environment where staff will be fully trained to remove glasses and cups, which will be made of toughened glass or plastic.

d) The prevention of public nuisance


- Our aim is to create a peaceful environment both for our guests and our neighbours. Considering there are people sleeping in the lower ground floor we will keep music levels up to -45dB and switch off the music at 00:00.
- The back yard area is closed every evening at 22:30 to ensure nuisance from human voices affecting our neighbours is eliminated.
 There will be no music in the back yard area.
- Shift managers will be trained to deal with nuisance and be responsible
 to keep the music levels as stated at all times. The music will be
 controlled only by them.
- With regards to storage and collection, we already have arrangements in place with a commercial waste service provider. Collection takes place in the mornings to minimise noise disturbance during collection.
- The licensable activities will be available to residents only and residents will not be leaving the premises after the close time therefore guests will not be departing from the premises and cause nuisance.

e) The protection of children from harm

- We have an age policy in place. Children under 12 years of age are not allowed on site and under 18 individuals from 12 to 17 years old are allowed on site only under adult supervision. Management staff are personal licence holders and staff will be fully trained to perform checks to under 25 individuals in order to prevent the sale of alcohol to children.
- We have strict drug enforcement policy in place. Guests are strictly forbidden to use any kind of drugs in the premises.
- No under 18 individuals will be allowed in the bar area during opening hours.

Health and Safety Representation

Application: Journeys End 54-58 Caledonian Road London N1

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the with respect to the new application for a premises at 54-58 Caledonian Road

The grounds for the representation are:

Public safety

The reasons for the representation are that:

- The plans submitted with the application do not comply with the statutory requirements
- The application is for the Lower Ground Floor but the plans accompanying the application cover the Lower Ground Floor, Ground Floor, First Floor and Second Floor.

Recommendation

If the application is granted the following conditions should be attached to the licence:

- 1. The premises shall not be used under this licence until the licence holder has submitted detailed plans for the lower ground floor and the Licensing Authority has approved them in writing
- 2. A plan of the lower ground floor, in the Standard Scale: 1:100 shall show:
 - a. the extent of the boundary of the building, if relevant, and any external and internal walls of the building and, if different, the perimeter of the premises;
 - b. the location of points of access to and egress from the premises;
 - c. if different from paragraph b, the location of escape routes from the premises;
 - d. in a case where the premises is used for more than one existing licensable activity, the area within the premises used for each activity;
 - e. in a case where an existing licensable activity relates to the supply of alcohol, the location or locations on the premises which is or are to be used for consumption of alcohol;
 - fixed structures (including furniture) or similar objects temporarily in a fixed location (but not furniture) which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment;
 - g. in a case where the premises includes any steps, stairs, elevators or lifts, the location of steps, stairs, elevators or lifts;
 - h. in a case where the premises includes any room or rooms containing public conveniences, the location of the room or rooms;

Please accept this as my official request NOT to have any of my personal or contact details displayed publically as I fear reprisals to my property and family.

Thank you for the opportunity to register my opposing comments to the license application at the above address.

We reside on , whose home is one of a number which ajoins the back of Journeys Kings Cross Hostel, specifically our gardens, kitchen and bedrooms. For years it has been a very real and stressful reality that the noise and anti-social behaviour from the visitors at Journeys causes sleep drepivation and nusiance. In particular, my family and I feel the full brunt of all of this, as it is our property which directly ajoins Journeys Kings Cross hostel.

The visitors at Journeys repeatedly climb out of the bedroom windows onto the low level roof when the staff of those of us who permenantly reside on Northdown Street and who are trying to sleep. They are often seen urinating into our gardens too and even brazenly openly have sex on t! When I call Journeys to ask them to please get thier visitors to stop this offending nusiance I am more often that not, advised that the staff "too busy checking in staff at the reception desk" or that "they dont have the staff to monitor what goes on in their hostel". Admittedly, there are ocasions when the staff do apologise for these incidents and advise that they will "go and have a look", but I will have to wait until they are free to do so!

Just last Thursday, at 16:10, while washing dishes at my kitchen window, my partner and I witnessed a male visitor at Journeys at the 3rd floor open bedroom window, openly masterbating, and joking and shouting to his companions below in the rear open area to "mind their heads" as he ejaculated out if the window. Of course we were disgusted; my partner was incessed so I called the hostel and spoke to Anna about what we were seeing and asked her to go and put an immidiate stop to it; she apologised and said she would do when she was free! But this delay just allowed the incident to play out.

The Journeys staff repeatedly fail to lock the open area at the back of the hostel at the required time of 22:00 each night. After too numerous to count phone calls to Management about this, I was advised that "all staff members have been informed that they must ensure that this door is locked at 22:00, as they are aware of the noise being omitted from this area and that it does cause a nusiance for residents such as myself who would require to sleep". It is a nightly battle to try to sleep as this rule is not adhered to and I have to constantly call Journeys staff to ask why this area has not been locked up on time; they reply that they dont have the staff the manage this and sometimes they leave this to the cleaner to do, but admitted that this also sometimes fails.

I really feel that is truly unacceptble that mine and my family's sleep is dictated by the staff and their visitors to decide when and if they will allow us to do so.

I was once told my Journeys staff that I should sleep during the day to catch up on my sleep! When would I be able to do this considering that I have to go to work every day. I was also told by staff that " yes, it does get quite noisy and we have to wait to get home to get some sleep". Well I am at home, why am I not allowed to sleep.

It is also very offensive to hear all of the foul language that these vistors use as a constant and the constant fights that occur which we have to watch and listen to playing out, as Journeys staff do not police their visitors.

It is hit and miss if we are able to walk on the pavement, as Journeys visitors congrigate outside the premises smoking cigarettes and 'spliff/wacky backy/marijuana' at ALL HOURS of the day, so everyone is forced to walk in the main road which is quite terrifying when buses are hurtling down Caledonian Road towards you.

It is only through the numerous calls to Journeys asking them to get their visitors to close the toilet window when they are using the facilities that they have only recently painted the windows as even when just performing a standard task of washing dishes in our kitchen, we are able to see people actually stitting on toilet and wiping their bottoms! We are also subjected to be forced to view their visitors intimately washing themselves. The painted windows have not made a difference.

This is already a designated Cumulative Impact Area and there is already:

1 pub, an indian takeaway, a thai takeaway, a chinese takeway and a late opening off license selling alcohol only yards-1 door away from Journeys, which staff and visitors DO NOT not even have to cross a road to frequent. Then directly across the road (north) there is a licensed music playing bar, a cafe and a pizzeria. Then yards across the road (east) is a restaurant/cafe another music playing licensed bar, another off license, a chicken takeaway, a

burritos bar, two other restuarants and ANOTHER very late opening music playing pub. Also, directly across the road, there is a courtyard hosting numerous late opening music playing licensed bars and restaurants. All of these amenities are within 1 - 100 yards of Journeys Kings Cross Hostel, not to mention all of the 24 hour opening fast food restaurants readily available and yet ANOTHER licensed pub a few yards to the east of Journeys hotel, so I can see no need or requement which should allow them to sell food or alcohol on their premises which would only fuel the highly offensive anti social behavior that their staff have already admitted that they can not police. We already suffer the noise nusiance from this music playing bars and also from the people as they leave the premsies. There is already a pub, the King Charles, and also from Journeys which also dictates when I and my family are able to sleep.

I would also like to make it clear that we oppose EACH AND ALL of the activities detailed on Journeys license application, including the one in which they require to be able to host these activities seven days a week. When would we get any respite. Also they would not be able to police the anti-social behaviour of those on their premises consuming the alcohol AFTER 23:00. This alcohol consumption would only contribute to the liteny of anti-social incidents we are already forced to indure.

A few years ago, Journeys submitted an application to the Council (I'm sure you might be able to look this up). We submitted our objections then and was contacted by Mr Ben Stackhouse; Journeys Hostel Area Manager who wanted to discuss my points raised regarding noise nusiance. I even invited him to my home, he attended and admitted that he was quite concerned at the very close proximaty if the hostel to my property and was also surpised how he could look directly into all of the rooms at the hostel with such a clear view and witnessed for himself, the volume of noise that we had to endure. Mr Stackhouse assurred us that their staff would be made aware that they would have to do more to address these issues and put a stop to it. It is disappointing that almost 6 or 7 years later - NOTHING HAS CHANGED, BUT HAS GOT WORSE.

We feel aggrieved that we are forced to suffer all of this at the hands of Journeys Hostel and that we encounter rude and offensive lanuague by some of the staff when we call to ask for their help, who demonstrate a clear lack of understanding to these re-curring problems. We have even had the phone put down on us when we call them to tell them that the noise is keeping us awake. We have had to call Journeys at all hours of the night and early morning, and sometimes 3 or 4 times a night to ask them to please get their visitors to reduce their noise levels or even to remind them that they still have not locked the back open area where their vistors are still outside causing a nusiance. It is also highly frustrating that they staff do not always pick up the phone as when we are eventually able to get through to them the advise that they are "too busy" to be able to answer the telephone. If we are made to be kept awake at 2 o'clock and 3 o'clock on any given day of the week, why are they not available to answer our calls for help?

I am unable to submit a licence application response for Journeys Hostel, Caledonian Road and I want to submit my comments today as its the last day for submissions. I think the proposal is ridiculous. The hostel is populated by teenagers, mostly, from the ages of 16 to 21 - I know this because I talk to them and check. This licence has had no thought on the impact yet another establishment selling alcohol will have in the area. The area has become rowdy, unmanageable, crime rates have increased and as a resident, tax payer and council tax payer, I am increasingly feeling unsafe in the area. The journeys hostel has had quite a lot of problems in the past with noise pollution from the residents going well into the small hours of the morning. I work long hours - I get up at Sam and don't get home until 7.30/8pm. And, I don't want to have to deal with drunken teenagers and aggressive people who use my street to congregate and intimidate. They always have drugs on them, I see and smell this. Are there any plans to police the journeys hostel? the residents seem to be able to run without any supervision. The journeys hostel has a responsibility to the surrounding neighbourhood to keep their residents under control. By selling alcohol on the premises there will be no way of monitoring their sales and supervising the drinking quantities of the people buying the alcohol. The area is not in short supply of places to buy alcohol. In fact, the number of alcohol selling premises is at a disturbingly high percentage and this licence request will just exacerbate the situation. Please DO NOT agree to this licence. Please make sure that alcohol establishments have the responsibility to keep their patrons under control and drink in moderation. This area is fast become lawless, unsafe and unsavoury. My street is grade II listed and we get many visitors taking pictures of the architecture and history. How does it look to visitors when they see groups of drunken, drug-taking youths congregate in a menacing way. The application should be thrown out.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application to vary the License as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue is situated in the 'Kings Cross Cumulative impact zone', a locality where this is traditionally high crime and disorder and there are concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area. Islington has almost double the national average of licensed premises per resident, and this is why the Police supported the implementation of the Council's Cumulative Impact Policy. This large number of licensed premises and the issues associated with these impacts greatly on the Police and all other emergency services resources.

It is for these reasons that we are objecting to the application and propose that it is refused.

If the Committee grants the application then I would ask them to consider attaching the following conditions to the application.

- 1. The CCTV system will give a clear head and shoulder image of all persons entering the premises. Copies will be made available to all responsible authorities within 24hrs of request by that authority. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system so that it can be viewed and copied at the time of an incident. The system will be maintained and serviced regularly and checked at least once a week to confirm that it is recording and able to playback. All recordings to be correctly date and time stamped.
- 2. Crime prevention literature will be placed in prominent positions in the premises and in all toilets used by visitors. Signs will be placed on the back of cubicle doors in the ladies and on the wall above the mens urinals. The content of this literature will be agreed and reviewed in conjunction with the local Police.
- 3. Any smoking areas outside the premises will be supervised by staff and there will be no more that 10 persons outside the front of the premises at any one time smoking.

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- The sale of alcohol and late night refreshment shall only be available to bona fide residents of the hostel. Residents shall not be allowed to bring visitors or guests into the bar.
- Staff training shall include health and safety, crime prevention, food and hygiene, first aid and the Licensing Act 2003 including prevention of excessive consumption of alcohol and refusing sales to drunk persons.
- 3. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
- 4. A Challenge 25 policy shall be operated at the premises and all staff shall be trained in its implementation.
- Guests shall not be allowed to take alcohol off of the premises. Guests shall be checked by a sift manager
- 6. Fire risk assessments shall be carried and fire fighting equipment, emergency lighting and fire alarm.
- Only toughened glass shall be used to serve drinks and staff shall be trained about the removal of glasses and cups.
- 8. The back yard area shall be closed at 22:30 and cleared of people.
- 9. There shall be no music played in the back yard.
- 10. Music shall only be played at background levels only.
- 11. Children under 12 years of age shall not be allowed on the premises. Persons aged under 18 to 12 years old shall only be allowed on the premises with adult supervision. Persons under the age of 18 shall not be allowed in the bar area.
- 12. There shall be a strict drug enforcement policy in place and residents shall be forbidden from any kind of illicit drug use.
- 13. Management staff shall be personal licence holders.
- 14. All staff shall be trained in Challenge 25 to prevent under age sales. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25 and the BII National Standards Proof of Age Scheme
- 15. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff.

Suggested conditions of approval from the Police

- The CCTV system will give a clear head and shoulder image of all persons entering the premises. Copies will be made available to all responsible authorities within 24hrs of request by that authority. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system so that it can be viewed and copied at the time of an incident. The system will be maintained and serviced regularly and checked at least once a week to confirm that it is recording and able to playback. All recordings to be correctly date and time stamped.
- 17. Crime prevention literature will be placed in prominent positions in the premises and in all toilets used by visitors. Signs will be placed on the back of cubicle doors in the ladies and on the wall above the men's urinals. The content of this literature will be agreed and reviewed in conjunction with the local Police.
- 18. Any smoking areas outside the premises will be supervised by staff and there will be no more than 10 persons outside the front of the premises at any one time smoking.

Suggested conditions of approval from the Noise Team (accepted)

- 19. No deliveries shall not take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays and should only take place between the hours of 13:00 and 15:00 and 17:00 other days of the week.
- 20. Bottling out and refuse disposal shall not take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays and should only take place between the hours of 09:00 and 14:00 other days of the week.
- 21. No consumption of alcohol shall take place outside the building; including the rear outside area.
- 22. The rear outside area shall close at 21:00.
- 23. Smoking shall be restricted to the rear outside area until 21:00 and after this time to the premises frontage.
- 24. Smokers shall be restricted to a reasonable number at all times.
- 25. A suitable container shall be provided for smoking litter at the premises frontage.
- 26. No noise or vibration shall emanate from the premises to cause a disturbance to neighbouring occupiers.
- 27. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at premises front exit and in the rear outside area requesting residents to respect the needs of local residents and to keep noise levels to a minimum.

Suggested conditions of approval from the Licensing Authority

- 28. The premises shall not be used under this licence until the licence holder has submitted detailed plans for the lower ground floor and the Licensing Authority has approved them in writing
- 29. A plan of the lower ground floor, in the Standard Scale: 1:100 shall show:
 - a) the extent of the boundary of the building, if relevant, and any external and internal walls of the building and, if different, the perimeter of the premises;
 - b) the location of points of access to and egress from the premises;
 - c) if different from paragraph b, the location of escape routes from the premises;
 - d) in a case where the premises is used for more than one existing licensable activity, the area within the premises used for each activity;
