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Subject: PREMISES LICENCE NEW APPLICATION
RE: METRO FOOD & WINE, 8 – 10 JUNCTION ROAD, LONDON, N19 5RQ

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is a new premise licence application submitted under the Licensing Act 2003 to permit the provision of late night refreshment on
 - Monday to Thursday until 1am
 - Friday and Saturday until 4am.
- 1.2 The applicant also holds a premises licence to permit the sale of alcohol on the premises. The application does not alter the hours during which alcohol will be sold.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (See appendix 3);
 - ii. conditions recommended by responsible Authorities (see appendix 3);
 - iii. any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1 The premises currently holds a licence to permit the sale of alcohol by off sales on:
- Sunday to Thursday from 7.00am until 2.00am
 - Friday and Saturday from 7.00am until 3.00am
- 3.2 It is proposed that the layout of the premises be changed to provide a Subway outlet and to offer hot food beyond 11pm. Alcohol will continue to be sold on the premises within the terms of its existing licence.
- 3.3 Papers are attached as follows:-
- Appendix 1: application form;
- Appendix 2a: name & address details of those persons making representations;
- Appendix 2: representations;
- Appendix 3: suggested conditions and map of premise location.
- 3.4 The Licensing Authority has received 10 letters of representation; 2 representations were withdrawn on confirmation that the application did not alter the alcohol sales and a representation from a responsible authority was withdrawn once the applicant agreed to include their conditions in the operating schedule.

Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

- 4.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

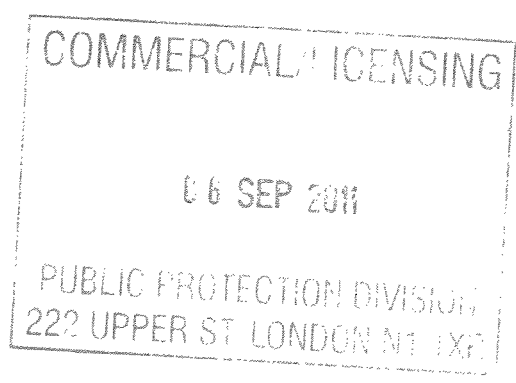

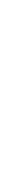

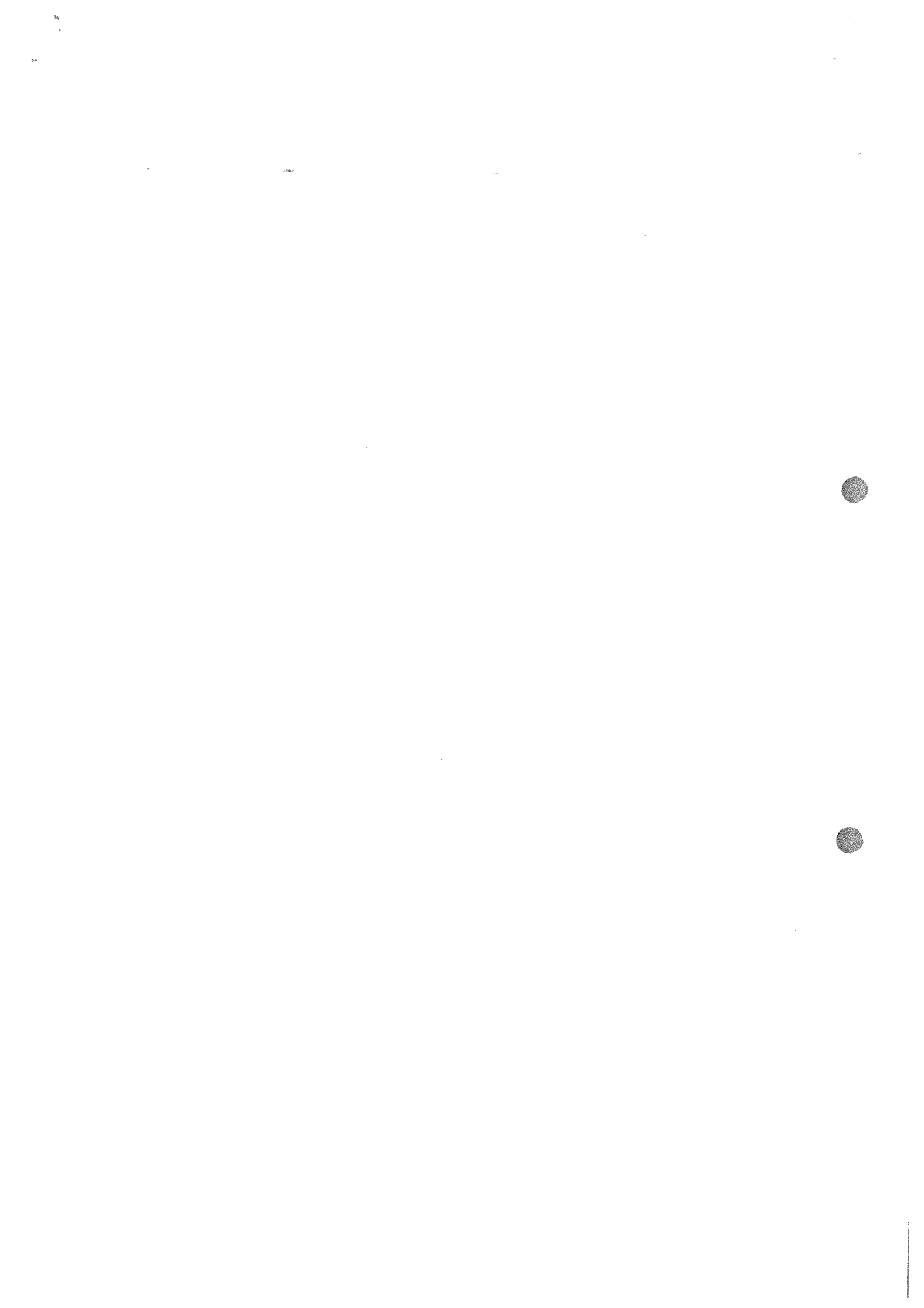

I have lived in Archway over twenty years and I am very concerned about the current application to extend the alcohol license to 8-10 Junction Rd, N19 5RO, Sunday to Thursday, 07:00 - 02:00, and Friday to Saturday 07:00 - 03:00. And to sell late night refreshments Sunday to Wednesday 23.00 - 02:00, and Thursday to Saturday 23:00 - 05:00.

I live very close by on [redacted] and due to a health condition I prefer to go out at night when the streets are quieter. Allowing this license, to me means it will be that much less safe for me and others like me. Alcohol causes people to lose normal inhibitions, and opens the way for chaotic behaviour and even violence. Surely there are more than enough licensed premises in Archway! Please have some respect for those of us who love Archway and want to see it improve.

I am also concerned for young people for whom life is difficult enough. They deserve not to be exposed unnecessarily to such high access to mood altering substances. I worked for many years as a counselor to young homeless people and base my concerns on real knowledge of the harm issuing too many licenses can allow.

We believe that the application will increase crime and disorder in Archway.

As such we believe it will reduce public safety.

It is certain that such a licence would increase public nuisance.

Archway already suffers from high levels of drunkenness and late at night that results in both vandalism against property and domestic disputes and aggressive fights in the central public area.

The application relating to 8-10 Junction Road, London N19 5RQ is to extend the licence Sunday to Thursday, 07:00 - 02:00, and Friday to Saturday 07:00 - 03:00 and to sell late night refreshments Sunday to Wednesday 23.00 - 02:00, and Thursday to Saturday 23:00 - 05:00.

The grounds for objection under current law are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- the protection of children from harm
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance.

Given the existing level of late night alcohol consumption, fuelled by those arriving on the late night buses, it is clear that a refusal would prevent crime and disorder, increase public safety, and prevent public nuisance.

Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

1. CCTV system shall be installed and maintained inside and outside the premises, including a CCTV unit, which monitors the immediate vicinity of the premises. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Tape recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a police officer within 24 hours of any request.
2. There shall be a minimum of 3 members of staff at the premises at all times that the premises are open for licensable activities.
3. A security guard shall be on the premises from 15:00 onwards when licensing activities are taking place.
4. There shall be signage at the premises reminding customers that it is illegal to sell alcohol to persons under the age of 18.
5. The licensee should regularly monitor staff to check how they are dealing with young people who ask for alcohol and other age restricted products.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by Noise Team (agreed)

6. No deliveries will take place on Sundays or Bank Holiday and between the hours of 10pm and 7am other days of the week.
7. No rubbish including bottles will be moved, removed or placed in an outside area on Sunday or Bank Holiday and between the hours of 10pm and 7am other days of the week.
8. Doors to the premises to be kept closed between 11pm and 8am.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by Health & Safety Team (agreed)

9. The missing handrail to the steps should be replaced.
10. Mechanical extract ventilation should be installed in the toilet extracting direct to external air at a rate of not less than 6 litres/second. The extract fan should have a 15 minute over-run controlled by the light switch or occupant detecting sensor. Air inlet to the toilet should be provided, e.g. 10mm gap under the door.
11. Copies of the inspection and test certificates specified below, certified by an approved competent person, should be submitted to the responsible authority for health and safety:
 - Electrical installation periodic inspection report for Shop and Subway.
 - Emergency lighting for Shop and Subway.

An approved competent person for the testing and certification of electrical installations and emergency lighting should be one of the following:

- (i) A qualified member of the Institution of Engineering and Technology, or
- (ii) A contractor enrolled with the National Inspection Council for Electrical Installation Contracting, or a member of the Electrical Contractors Association, or a competent person from an appropriate approved organisation.
