

RE: HIGHBURY STUDIO RESTAURANT, UNIT 7, 6 HORNSEY STREET, LONDON, N7

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to:
 - i) Allow the sale by retail of alcohol, on & off supplies, Mondays to Sundays from 11:30 until 22:30; and
 - ii) Allow the premises to be open to public, Mondays to Sundays from 11:30 until 22:30.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions of the current premises licence;
 - ii. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (See appendix 4);
 - iii. conditions recommended by responsible Authorities (see appendix 4);
 - iv. any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

Page 4, Part 3 Operating schedule

General description of the premises

The premise at Unit 7, 6 Hornsey Street, London N7 8GR is currently under construction. The unit has not yet be fitted out and has not previously been occupied, as such there is no previous history of operation.

The venue will be newly established Japanese restaurant with cooking class, trading under Upstream Studio Co Limited. The restaurant serves Japanese dishes while people get opportunity to learn how to cook Japanese food at the workshop area.

As we are going to operate a restaurant, alcohol will be served with proper meal on the premise. We would like to provide off-supplies of alcohol as well because we would like to introduce Japanese alcohol drinks. However, we are not intending to sell large number of alcohol like local bottle shops do because we are a restaurant and those products from Japan are priced higher than usual drinks. So the impact to local community is expected very low.

The venue is located on the ground floor of a newly build development called "The Studios Islington" which offers mixed use commercial accommodation at ground floor with circa 500 residential units above.





Appendix 3

First of all, we appreciate that the existing problem was brought up this time, otherwise we would have known the issue, which should be fixed anyway.

We would like to find out the time range of those noise problems occurred previously.

It will be great if I can get specified the problems' time range.

We are going to operate a Japanese restaurant between 11:30 and 22:30. So if those mentioned noise problems are occurring past our business hours, say around midnight, the relevance to our business seems very little.

If those problems are happening within our business hours, our business operation works as deterrent against those drinkers gathering in this area. As they normally gather at obscure corner, while there is a shop operating and people are coming and going, the fact reduces the chance of those gathering, we believe.

We are going to operate a Japanese restaurant and serving alcohol with meals, so the way of serving alcohol is different from pubs and night clubs.

We will take extra care to guiding our customers to leave the premises quietly at night to avoid disturbing the local residents.

As regards off licence, we ONLY sell bottled Japanese Sake, no other alcoholic drinks such as wines or beers. This was a clearly stated condition given by the Public Protection Division of Islington Council.

Potential purchasers are only Japanese foodies and those are not type of alcohol drinks to be consumed outside like beers.

We also would like to eliminate the drinkers gathering noise problem in the area. Therefore I have already spoken to the manager of the Studios Islington (where our venue belong to) in order to find out the details and prepare to take steps against those existing noise problems.

The manager is going to have a meeting with Police department next week and he promised me to bring up the current issue.

As above points show, the existing noise problems don't seem to be reduced if we don't serve alcohol, and also don't seem to be increased even if we serve alcohol. Therefore the relevance to our operation is very little.

However as I mentioned, we are willing to tackle this existing noise problem together with the management company and the Landlord.

I am more than happy to meet and talk through the matter.

- 2. An appropriately worded notice will be prominently displayed stating that a "Challenge 25" Policy operates in store.
- 3. A refusal log will be operated for the recording of all refused sales of alcohol. The log will be checked regularly by the DPS who will regularly sign off the log to check the completeness of entries on at least a monthly basis.
- 4. A CCTV system will be installed to the reasonable satisfaction of the Police. Images must be retained for 31 days. Recordings will be made available within 24hrs upon request by a responsible authority and there will always be a member of staff on duty who can work the CCTV system so that it may be viewed immediately by Police if an incident has occurred.
- 5. An appropriately worded notice will be displayed prominently in store advising customers that CCTV is in operation.
- 6. Japanese Sake bottles and other alcohol will be displayed behind the counter and will not be self-served.
- 7. A current written authorisation issued by the DPS detailing all staff authorised to sell alcohol will be available for inspection by an authorised officer.
- 8. An appropriately worded notice will be prominently displayed requesting customers leave the premises quietly at night and to respect the local residents.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by Health and Safety Officer

9. The premises shall not be used under the licence until the requirements specified in the schedule dated 25 September 2013 have been completed and approved in writing by the responsible authority for health and public safety.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by Noise Team

- 10. No deliveries of licensable goods will take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays nor between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 hours on any other days of the week.
- 11. No rubbish will be moved, removed or placed, in bins outside the premises on Sundays or Bank Holidays, nor between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 hours on any other days of the week.
- 12. The premises external doors shall be kept closed so far as practicable after 21:00.
- 13. The outside tables and chairs shall be cleared of patrons and rendered unusable by 23:00; adequate notices shall be displayed to inform patrons of the requirement.
- 14. Moveable furniture outside the premises will be fitted with rubber (or equivalent) feet.
- 15. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises kitchen extract system, nor any other fixed plant or equipment associated with the premises, so as to cause a nuisance to neighbours.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by the Police

- 16. The on sales supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for the consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- 17. The sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be by way of sealed bottles only and will be limited to Japanese alcoholic drinks only.
- 18. Customers shall not be permitted to purchase alcoholic drinks for consumption immediately outside the premises.
