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Subject: PREMISES LICENCE VARIATION APPLICATION
RE: J SMITH NEWSAGENTS, 191 BLACKSTOCK ROAD, LONDON, N5 2LL

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The variation application is to allow:
 - i) The extension of supply of alcohol to 02:00 from the current 23:00 Monday to Sunday.
 - ii) To instate the following opening hours on the premises licence Monday to Sunday from 06:00 until 03:00 the day following.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a variation of the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 To consider the representation from the Police in the light of the revised Secretary of State Guidance to Local Authorities issued in June 2013 namely:
- 2.3 The Licensing Authority should accept all reasonable and proportionate representations made by the Police unless the Authority has evidence that to do so would not be appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.
- 2.4 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (See appendix 3);
 - ii. conditions recommended by responsible Authorities (see Appendix 3): and

- iii. any conditions deemed appropriate by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

3.1 The premises currently holds a licence allowing:

- i) The sale by retail of alcohol, Monday to Saturday, from 08:00 to 23:00, and Sunday from 10:00 until 22:30.

3.2 Papers are attached as follows:-

- Appendix 1: application form;
Appendix 2: current premises licence;
Appendix 3a name and addresses of representations;
Appendix 3: representations
Appendix 4: suggested conditions map of premise location.

3.3 The Licensing Authority has received representations from local residents as well as representations from the Licensing Authority, the Police, Trading Standards and the Pollution Projects Team. The representations from local residents have been submitted on two different pro forma forms, which have been pre hand written and photo copied. A significant number of these forms were submitted to the Council in one envelope. Only twelve of these forms have the name and address of the resident correctly submitted, one copy of each form is attached to this report for information.

3.4 On the 27th July 2013 licensing officers witnessed the premises selling alcohol outside of its permitted hours. A warning letter was sent to the licensee after this visit.

5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

5.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions necessary to promote the licensing objectives.



Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1) The restrictions on hours during which the sale of alcohol is authorised does not prohibit:
 - a) during the first 20 minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
 - c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval military.
- 2) Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Pollution Projects Team with respect to a variation premises licence application to permit to change the hours for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises to 0600 to 0300 from Monday to Sunday.

The grounds for the representation are:

- Public nuisance

The premises is not located in a cumulative impact area so there is no presumption that the application should be refused and the onus is on responsible authorities and residents to demonstrate that granting the licence will undermine the licensing objectives.

Licensing Policy Considerations

Licensing Policy 9 & 10 Operating schedules

Licensing Policies 9 & 10

The premises operating schedule contains insufficient information to demonstrate that high standards of management will operate. The applicant does not appear to have considered the Licensing Policy in preparing the application, there is no reference to the local context and proposed controls – except in a very general sense to 'keep noise level on low', 'no drinking inside or outside the shop', 'litter – bins', 'community safety' and 'posters/signs'.

Summary and recommendations

The Team has considered this application using the Licensing Policy framework; in particular the management arrangements described in the operating schedule,

The applicant does not appear to have considered the local area, nor sought advice on measures to put in place to promote the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective indicating that the style of management will be reactive rather than proactive.

The Pollution Projects Team recommends that in order to promote the licensing objectives this application is refused.

Licensing Policy 1

The key issues are: the type of premise; the proposed hours of operation and the ability of the licensee to manage the premises in such a way that it will not undermine the licensing objectives.

An extension of the licensing hours will increase the access to alcohol during the early hours of the morning. Islington already suffers from high levels of alcohol related crime and antisocial behaviour. An additional late night licenced premises will add to the cumulative impact of late night premises that we are already experiencing in the borough.

Licensing Policy 7 & 8

The proposed hours are outside the framework hours and in such cases the expectation is that a robust operating schedule should detail the arrangements to ensure that the premises won't add to the cumulative impact.

Licensing Policies 9 & 10

The operating schedule is lacking in detail. There is no reference to the issues raised in the Licensing Policy and no indication of the management arrangements that will be put in place to ensure that the licensing objectives will not be undermined.

Our policy expects late night premises to demonstrate high standards of management. The operating schedule falls significantly below the standard expected.

Summary and recommendations

The Licensing Authority has considered this application using the Licensing Policy

framework, in particular:

- the location of the premises
- the style and hours of operation proposed by the applicant
- feedback from partners
- the management arrangements described in the operating schedule,

The applicant does not appear to have considered the local area, nor sought advice on measures to put in place to put in place to promote the licensing objectives indicating that the style of management will be reactive rather than proactive.

The Licensing Authority recommends that in order to promote the licensing objectives this application is refused.

LICENSING ACT 2003: REPRESENTATIONS BY RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY

J Smith Newsagents, 191 Blackstock Road, N5 2LL

The application for a licence for the above premises has been examined by me and I wish to make the following representations on behalf of Trading Standards. I make them as I have concerns over the steps to prevent crime and disorder and to protect children from harm outlined in the application.

1. Since the start of 2012, Trading Standards have had a seizure of illicit alcohol and two underage sales at the premises. None of these events have been under the current licensee, Bsktas Ltd to which the licence was transferred in Summer 2013.
2. The applicant has not contacted Trading Standards before or since the transfer, but I hope that they are aware of the issues with illicit alcohol and tobacco and underage sales in the borough. I will, of course, be willing to advise them upon request.
3. If the Committee choose to grant the variation, I request that they include the following conditions. It is my contention that a responsible business will be complying with these in any case.
 - No alcoholic goods will ever be purchased or taken from persons calling to the shop.
 - No spirits shall be purchased in a resealed box.
 - The licensee will immediately report to Trading Standards any instance of a caller to the shop attempting to sell alcohol.
 - Invoices (or copies) for all alcoholic goods on the premises will be kept at the shop and made available to officers from the council, police or HMRC upon request.
 - A stock control system will be introduced, so that the licensee can quickly identify where and when alcoholic goods have been purchased.
 - An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamp on spirits as soon as practical after they have been purchased.
 - If any spirits bought by the business have UK Duty Stamps that do not fluoresce under ultra-violet light, or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee shall identify the supplier to Islington Trading Standards and HMRC as soon as possible.
 - The licensee shall adopt 'Challenge 25', the Retail of Alcohol Standards Group's advice for off-licences, and promote it through the display of posters.

- The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The training shall include the assessment of age; making a challenge; acceptable proof of age; and recording refusals. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff, detailing the areas covered, and make them available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
- The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to persons they believe to be less than 25, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is, proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
- The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.

I believe these representations are specific and proportionate to the known trading characteristics of this retail sector and are consistent with the Islington Council Statement of Licensing Policies 25, 26 & 10.

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

Although the applicant was provided with pre application advice including a copy of the Council Licensing Policy 2013 – 2017 which includes a full list of model conditions, the operating schedule included with the application does not contain sufficient detail for conditions to be drafted at the time of preparing the report.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by the Council's Trading Standards team.

1. No alcoholic goods will ever be purchased or taken from persons calling to the shop.
2. No spirits shall be purchased in a resealed box.
3. The licensee will immediately report to Trading Standards any instance of a caller to the shop attempting to sell alcohol.
4. Invoices (or copies) for all alcoholic goods on the premises will be kept at the shop and made available to officers from the council, police or HMRC upon request.
5. A stock control system will be introduced, so that the licensee can quickly identify where and when alcoholic goods have been purchased.
6. An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamp on spirits as soon as practical after they have been purchased.
7. If any spirits bought by the business have UK Duty Stamps that do not fluoresce under ultra-violet light, or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee shall identify the supplier to Islington Trading Standards and HMRC as soon as possible.
8. The licensee shall adopt 'Challenge 25', the Retail of Alcohol Standards Group's advice for off-licences, and promote it through the display of posters.
9. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The training shall include the assessment of age; making a challenge; acceptable proof of age; and recording refusals. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff, detailing the areas covered and make them available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
10. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to persons they believe to be less than 25, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is, proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
11. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
