

Subject: PREMISES LICENCE REVIEW APPLICATION

RE: BROTHERS SUPERMARKET, 60 FONTHILL ROAD, LONDON, N4 3HT

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application by David Fordham of Islington Council's Trading Standards team for a Review of the Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the review application is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 The grounds for review are related to the licensing objectives:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application to review the premises licence under Section 52 of the Licensing Act.
- 2.2 The Committee must have regard to the application and any relevant representations. The Committee must take such steps as necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives.
- 2.3 The steps stated in Sections 52(4) of the Act are as follows:
 - a) to modify the conditions of the licence; and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered, omitted or any new condition is added;
 - to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;

- e) to revoke the licence;
- f) the Committee also have the option to leave the licence in its existing state;
- g) the Committee also has the power in relation to steps a) and b) to provide that the modification and exclusion only has effect for a limited period not exceeding three months.

3. Background

- 3.1 The premises currently holds a licence allowing:
 - The sale by retail of alcohol, off supplies only, Monday to Saturday from 08:00 until 23:00; and on Sunday from 10:00 until 22:30.

Appendix 2: current premises licence; Appendix 3: police representations;

Appendix 4: suggested conditions and map of premise location.

3.2 The Licensing Authority has received a representation by way of a witness statement from the police.

4. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

4.1 The Council is required to consider this application for review in the light of all relevant information from the applicant and the licence holder. It may attach such conditions necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

This application to review relates to the objectives to prevent crime & disorder and Licensing Policy 39 and also the protection of children from harm and Licensing Policy 32. It particularly relates to the supply by the business of smuggled goods and the doubt that the described events introduce about the standard of management evident at the premises.

On 23rd March 2011, a letter was sent to the premises, addressed to 'The Licensee and Proprietor', that introduced attached guidance about smuggled alcohol and tobacco and warned that businesses found with smuggled goods in future were likely to have their licences reviewed.

On 17th May 2011, officers from Trading Standards visited the premises after anonymous information had been received that an off licence in Fonthill Road was selling smuggled tobacco. Katherine Forrest of Trading Standards went into the shop, posing as a customer, and asked if they had any cheap tobacco. Mr Koca, owner and licensee of the business was serving and he sold Miss Forrest a 50g pouch of Golden Virginia tobacco for £8 (normal selling price £13.50 - £14.50). This has been confirmed as genuine, but non-duty paid by the manufacturer, Imperial Tobacco.

Miss Forrest and her colleague, Doug Love, returned to the shop to check for further illicit tobacco and alcohol. Eight more 50g pouches of smuggled tobacco was seized. Mr Koca admitted that the tobacco was illicit. A sample of alcohol was checked and five bottles of Russian Standards vodka were seized, pending examination, as the labels differed to those usually seen on that brand, but these later were shown to be genuine and duty paid and have been returned to the business.

On 13th June 2011, Mr Love received information from John Fitzpatrick of the International Federation of Spirits Producers (IFSP). The IFSP represent various spirits producers, including Diageo, the producer of Smirnoff. The information included notice of a test purchase on May 8th (before the TS visit) at Fonthill Mini Market of Smirnoff that was non-duty paid.

On 15th June, Trading Standards and HMRC officers visited all seven shops identified by IFSP as selling illicit Smirnoff. None was found at Fonthill Mini Market.

While the officers were in the shop, Mr Koca asked about the counterfeit Jacob's Creek wine that he had read about in the press. He invited the officers to check his stock, which they did. They identified 62 bottles that were counterfeit, amongst many genuine bottles. Five varietals were seized: Merlot (20 bottles); Chardonnay (14); Shiraz (13); Cabernet Sauvignon (9); and Semillon Sauvignon Blanc (6).

The counterfeit bottles were identified as such by visual examination:

- there were at least three spelling mistakes on the back label "Austrlia", "responsibily" and "drinkoware.com"
- the white wines were in 'red-wine' bottles with darker glass
- the Chardonnay was in the wrong shaped bottle.

Pernod-Ricard, the trade mark holder, have confirmed that they do not believe the counterfeit wine is harmful, but of a much lower quality than the genuine product. They believe it is mostly sold from door-to-door. They are aware of one cash and carry business in Brighton where some has been found.

A single 70cl bottle of Highland Gold whisky was also seized on this occasion – it has a separate duty stamp that does not fluoresce and the code starts with an 'A', instead of a 'W' for whisky.

The total duty that would have been evaded had the illicit goods from both visits been sold totals approximately £187.

Trading Standards are concerned at the possession for supply of illicit alcohol for the following reasons:

- Counterfeit spirits, particularly vodka, may be unsafe to consume.
- Illicit spirits are smuggled into the country and / or produced by organised crime. It is believed that the profits are frequently used to fund other types of serious crime.
- Smuggling causes huge losses to the UK's tax revenues.

Section 13(4) of Licensing Act 2003 and Regulation 7 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005 makes a local weights and measures authority a responsible authority for the purposes of the legislation. Islington Council is a local weights and measures authority and that function is carried out by the trading standards team.

Recommendations:

The supply of illicit alcohol puts public health at risk and undermines the prevention of crime.


Invoices have been promised by the business in respect of the Jacob's Creek, but have not yet been provided. Given the large amount of genuine Jacob's Creek in the store and the fact that counterfeit Jacobs Creek has only been found in one small independent cash and carry in Sussex, any invoices produced will not provide good evidence that the counterfeit stock was purchased innocently from a

The fact that Mr Koca asked the officers to check his stock of Jacob's Creek is worthy of consideration. The motive for doing this can only be known by Mr Koca, but it may be an indication that he was concerned about some that had been purchased, or that he thought the officers would find it anyway. It may have been that he was genuinely confident that they would find nothing.

There is no evidence of the business selling alcohol to underage consumers, but it is a concern that a willingness to break one law indicates that the standard of management at the premises is not satisfactory. This increases the possibility that the approach to all consumer laws may be less rigourous

It is for the Committee to consider the appropriate remedy for these facts. Should the licence continue, Trading Standards wish to recommend the following conditions are added to the licence:

- No alcoholic goods will ever be purchased or taken from persons calling to the shop. 1.
- The licensee will immediately report to Trading Standards any instance of a caller to the shop 2. 3.
- Invoices (or copies) for all alcoholic goods on the premises will be kept at the shop and made available to officers from the council, police or HMRC upon request.
- A stock control system will be introduced, so that the licensee can quickly identify where and when 4.
- An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamp 5. on spirits as soon as practical after they have been purchased.
- If any spirits bought by the company have UK Duty Stamps that do not fluoresce under ultra-violet 6. light, or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee shall identify the supplier to Islington Trading
- The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25, the Retail of Alcohol Standards Group's advice for off-7. licences.
- The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they 8. sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff.
- The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young 9 persons, staff ask to see accredited proof of age cards for example proof of age cards carrying the PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. CCTV system shall be installed and maintained inside the premises
- 2. Staff shall be trained regularly on licensing provisions and company policies.
- The licensee shall liase regularly with the Local Police.
- 4. Staff shall not tolerate anti social or aggressive behaviour, customers behaving in such a manner shall be barred from the premises.
- Noise will not be allowed to emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 6. The premises shall enforce a proof of age scheme for both Alcohol and cigarette sales, which is approved by the Licensing Authority and by the Local Police.
- 7. Not sharp or flammable objects shall be in reach of children.

- 10. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
