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Subject: PREMISES LICENCE VARIATION APPLICATION

RE: MCDONALDS RESTAURANT, 251-255 UPPER STREET, LONDON, N1 1RY

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The variation application is to:
 - i) allow the provision of Late Night Refreshment, Mondays to Sundays from 23:00 until 02:00 the following day.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a variation of the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions of the current premises licence;
 - ii. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (See appendix 3);
 - iii. conditions recommended by responsible Authorities (see appendix 3);
 - iv. any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1 The premises currently holds a licence allowing:
- i) the provision of late night refreshment, Sundays to Thursdays from 23:00 until 01:00 the following day and Fridays & Saturdays from 23:00 until 01:30 the following day.

Operating Schedule

General

This restaurant understands that in extending our opening hours we have a duty to the local community and that we continue to protect our staff and customers from danger and harm. We believe that the systems we have in place are robust, thorough and will, as far as reasonably practicable, secure the promotion of the four licensing objectives. It should be noted that no McDonald's restaurant within the United Kingdom serves alcohol and further none of our drinks or food are served to customers in glass receptacles.

We are eager to work in partnership with all responsible authorities to ensure the promotion of the four licensing objectives. We also seek to work with the local communities, whom we serve, in achieving a successful cohesion between our business operations and our neighbours.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

This restaurant is keen to work in partnership with the local police force to prevent crime and disorder.

McDonald's operates a robust CCTV Policy to ensure compliance with Data Protection Legislation and to assist the Police with the prevention and detection of crime. At all stores where CCTV is in operation appropriate signage reflecting this information is displayed.

McDonald's operate digital motion activated CCTV systems where images are retained on a hard drive system. The CCTV equipment will be of a standard suitable to record images of a proper quality, it will meet the industry standard and will have Kalagate Certification. As part of the digital system an alarm will sound if the equipment is faulty or not recording, thereby alerting management for the need to intervene. The CCTV system is regularly serviced by qualified maintenance technicians.

Access to the CCTV system will be provided to Police Officers at their request.

At this restaurant all shift running managers have safety and security training.

Public Safety

This restaurant has safety systems in place to protect the safety of customers and staff at all times. These systems are regularly reviewed and updated where appropriate. In line with current legislation all our restaurants are routinely inspected by the local Environmental Health Office and we work with them and the local Fire Service to ensure we are complying, as far as reasonably practicable, with relevant Health and Safety and Fire Safety Legislation. This restaurant is subject to inspections from our own safety and security teams to ensure our systems are being maintained.

All of our restaurant staff are required to attend comprehensive safety training to ensure that safe working methods are adopted and all staff are trained in evacuation procedure in the event of a fire or other dangerous occurrence.

This store operates a "No Open Alcohol Containers" policy to prevent persons carrying open alcohol into the in-store area. Emergency contact mobile telephone numbers are listed in the Business Manager's office.

This restaurant is keen to work in partnership with the local Fire Service and Environmental Health Officer to ensure public safety.

Public Nuisance

McDonald's were the first company in our sector to introduce litter patrols in the early 1980's. These patrols collect McDonald's packaging and other litter within a certain radius of the restaurant. All of McDonald's packaging displays the "Bin It" symbol to encourage our customers to deal with their waste responsibly. We are happy to act on recommendations from the Environmental Health Officer should they feel that we should extend our patrol to a nearby area, as far as this is reasonably practicable. Our pioneering stance on litter patrols has meant working on a project with DEFRA, in

which we piloted 'reducing litter caused by food on the go', a voluntary code of practice for local partnerships. A copy of which can be found at:

We also have measures in place to limit noise. Our doors are self closing and we try to encourage our customers to be considerate to our neighbours and limit noise both when ordering their food and on leaving the local area.

The Protection of Children From Harm

McDonald's do not anticipate that children will use the restaurant in the extended hour's period covered by this licensing application. We do however take their safety extremely seriously and will continue to employ the same practices to ensure that they are protected from harm at all times when visiting the restaurant.

All of our restaurant staff are required to attend comprehensive safety training.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. The licensee shall operate litter patrols covering the area outside the premises.
2. Doors to the premises shall be fitted with self closing mechanisms to minimise noise escape from the premises.
3. Shift managers shall have documented safety and security training.
4. The maximum number of persons (including staff) permitted on the premises at any one time is:
 - **87 on the Ground and Basement Floors.**
5. The licence shall be subject to the Council's standard conditions for Night Cafes.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained inside and outside the premises. The system will enable a frontal head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for the sale of food and/or drink. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
2. Persons leaving the premises will be advised, by written notice prominently displayed and verbally where necessary, to leave the area quietly and without causing disturbance in the neighbourhood.
3. That access to a toilet is made available at all times whilst the premises is open.

You have requested comment on the above application.

We ask you not to approve the extension of hours for alcohol sales.

We are the owners of [REDACTED] directly behind the restaurant. On many nights we are wakened by noise from drunk people hanging out in our ally, we watch helplessly as people urinate against our walls and leave McDonald's wrappers and other garbage on the ground.

The restaurant recently is requested an extension of hours. We objected, but your office approved the extension. We are confronting a growing nuisance of public disorder on our small lane. As people cluster in Swan Yard eating McDonald's food and drinking alcohol it becoming increasingly menacing in the area. This is an issue of public safety and disorder. Please do not add to it.

In addition, is there a mechanism to require McDonald's to walk the area and clean up garbage left on the streets by its patrons?

Thank you for the clarification re: alcohol and the follow up. I now understand that the term refreshment does not pertain to alcohol.

Nonetheless, I remain concerned about the impact on public safety and the additional public nuisance in the area that the extension of McDonald's closing hours will bring.. As I have previously noted, Hampton Court and Swan Yard are popular hangouts for patrons of McDonald's and other establishments. It is very common for those of us who live in the lane ways to encounter people loitering, gathering, eating, littering or urinating on our doorsteps. I worry that extending the hours of McDonald's will simply push this into even later hours, especially during week nights.

I would also note that it was only a few years ago that McDonald's extended its hours past midnight. What we are seeing is an incremental creep of late-night hours at this franchise. While the extension of closing time by 30 minutes or an hour does not seem significant, added to the previous extension it is much more noteworthy.

As I have said in earlier correspondence, I fully understand that we live in a mixed-use area. It is not my desire or intent to object to any reasonable business request. But I simply do not see the extension of McDonald's hours as anything but setback for our already stressed neighbourhood.

I should also note that I do appreciate the vendor's offer to patrol and clean the lane ways three times a day and if you decide to grant the extension this is an important condition to include in the license.

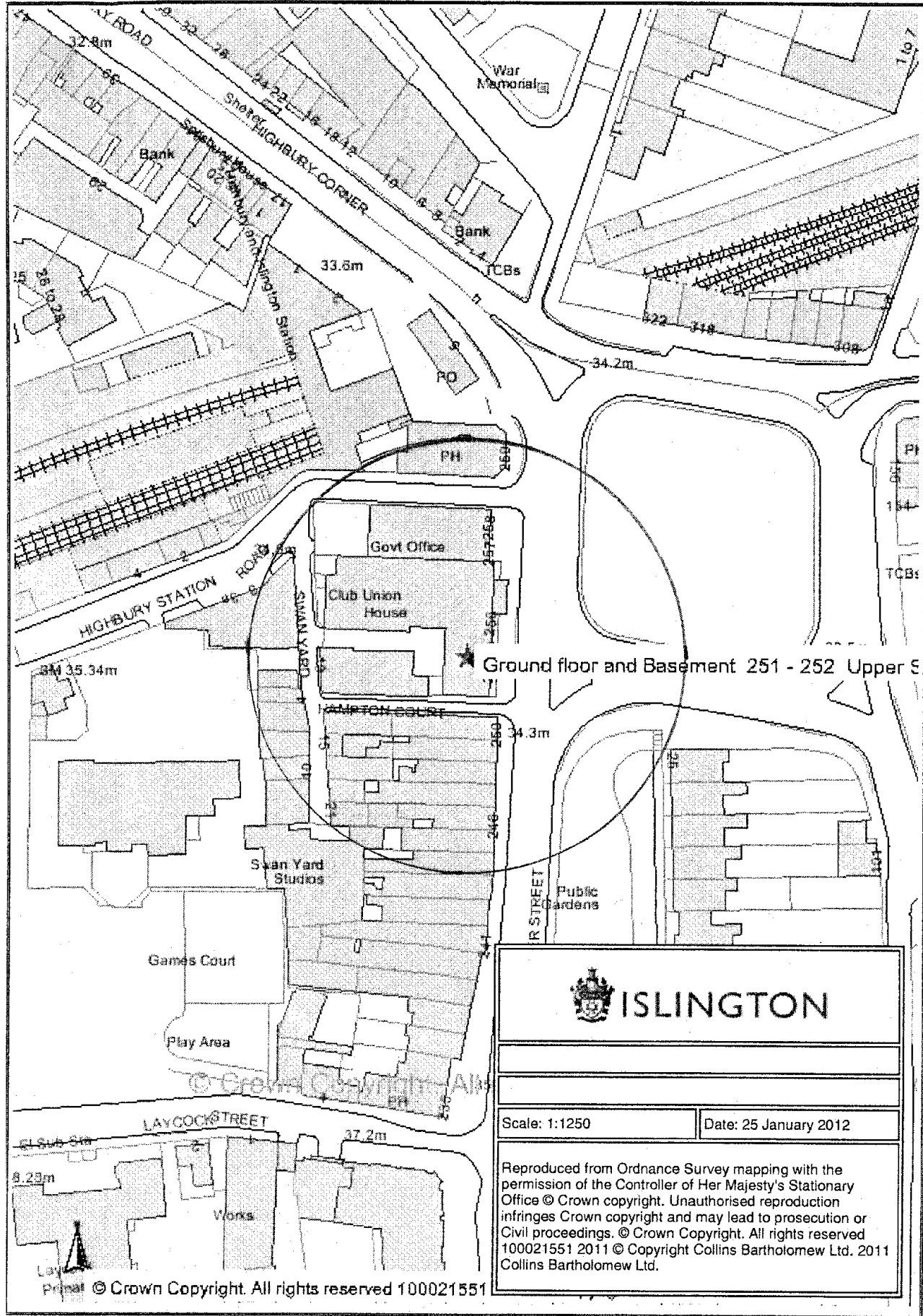

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

1. The licensee shall work in partnership with the local police force to prevent crime and disorder.
2. CCTV shall be maintained at the premises when the premises is open to the public. CCTV images shall be held for 28 days and access to the CCTV system shall be provided to Police Officers and Council Officers at their request.
3. The CCTV system shall meet the industry standard and will have Kalagate Certification.
4. The CCTV system shall have an alarm that will sound if the equipment is faulty or not recording, thereby alerting management for the need to intervene.
5. The licensee shall work in partnership with local Fire Service and Environmental Health Officers to ensure public safety.
6. The licensee shall act on recommendations of the Environmental Health Officer concerning extending litter patrols, as far as is reasonably practical.
7. Doors shall be maintained self closing and customers shall be encouraged to be considerate to neighbours and limit noise when leaving the vicinity of the premises.
8. A "No Open Alcohol Containers" policy shall be in place to prevent persons carrying open alcohol into the in-store area.

Condition put forward by applicant in response to local resident concerns

9. A & L Restaurants Limited t/a McDonald's will carry out litter patrols during the hours the store is open, ensuring that the area behind the store known as Swan Yard is checked at least three times per day and all litter found at that time will be collected. In addition, when the main storage bins located behind the premises are accessed for disposal of other litter, further checks will be made and any litter found at that time will also be cleared.



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
