

PREMISES LICENCE NEW APPLICATION

RE: MCDONALDS, 280 HOLLOWAY ROAD, LONDON, N7 8AJ

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to allow:
 - i) the provision of late night refreshment from 23:00 until 02:00 on Monday to Sunday.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 To consider that this address is in the Holloway and Finsbury Park Saturation or "Cumulative Impact Policy" of Islington. This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences, club premises certificates, or variation applications that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate why the operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact or otherwise impact adversely on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 2.3 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (See appendix 3);
 - ii. conditions recommended by responsible Authorities (see appendix 3);

iii. any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

Operating Schedule

General

This restaurant understands that in extending our opening hours we have a duty to the local community and that we continue to protect our staff and customers from danger and harm. We believe that the systems we have in place are robust, thorough and will, as far as reasonably practicable, secure the promotion of the four licensing objectives. It should be noted that no McDonald's restaurant within the United Kingdom serves alcohol and further none of our drinks or food are served to customers in glass receptacles.

We are eager to work in partnership with all responsible authorities to ensure the promotion of the four licensing objectives. We also seek to work with the local communities, whom we serve, in achieving a successful cohesion between our business operations and our neighbours.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

This restaurant is keen to work in partnership with the local police force to prevent crime and disorder.

McDonald's operates a robust CCTV Policy to ensure compliance with Data Protection Legislation and to assist the Police with the prevention and detection of crime. At all stores where CCTV is in operation appropriate signage reflecting this information is displayed.

McDonald's operate digital motion activated CCTV systems where images are retained on a hard drive system. The CCTV equipment will be of a standard suitable to record images of a proper quality, it will meet the industry standard and will have Kalagate Certification. As part of the digital system an alarm will sound if the equipment is faulty or not recording, thereby alerting management for the need to intervene. The CCTV system is regularly serviced by qualified maintenance technicians.

Access to the CCTV system will be provided to Police Officers at their request.

At this restaurant all shift running managers have safety and security training.

Public Safety

This restaurant has safety systems in place to protect the safety of customers and staff at all times. These systems are regularly reviewed and updated where appropriate. In line with current legislation all our restaurants are routinely inspected by the local Environmental Health Office and we work with them and the local Fire Service to ensure we are complying, as far as reasonably practicable, with relevant Health and Safety and Fire Safety Legislation. This restaurant is subject to inspections from our own safety and security teams to ensure our systems are being maintained.

All of our restaurant staff are required to attend comprehensive safety training to ensure that safe working methods are adopted and all staff are trained in evacuation procedure in the event of a fire or other dangerous occurrence.

This store operates a "No Open Alcohol Containers" policy to prevent persons carrying open alcohol into the in-store area. Emergency contact mobile telephone numbers are listed in the Business Manager's office.

This restaurant is keen to work in partnership with the local Fire Service and Environmental Health Officer to ensure public safety.

Public Nuisance

McDonald's were the first company in our sector to introduce litter patrols in the early 1980's. These patrols collect McDonald's packaging and other litter within a certain radius of the restaurant. All of McDonald's packaging displays the "Bin It" symbol to encourage our customers to deal with their waste responsibly. We are happy to act on recommendations from the Environmental Health Officer should they feel that we should extend our patrol to a nearby area, as far as this is reasonably practicable. Our pioneering stance on litter patrols has meant working on a project with DEFRA, in

which we piloted 'reducing litter caused by food on the go', a voluntary code of practice for local partnerships. A copy of which can be found at:

We also have measures in place to limit noise. Our doors are self closing and we try to encourage our customers to be considerate to our neighbours and limit noise both when ordering their food and on leaving the local area.

The Protection of Children From Harm

McDonald's do not anticipate that children will use the restaurant in the extended hour's period covered by this licensing application. We do however take their safety extremely seriously and will continue to employ the same practices to ensure that they are protected from harm at all times when visiting the restaurant.

All of our restaurant staff are required to attend comprehensive safety training.



Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing to object to the proposed "Late Night Refreshment" license for the McDonald's at 280 Holloway Road, which would extend opening hours until 2am, seven days a week.

The immediate area already has many, many fast-food restaurants and other dining options. There is even a McDonald's open 24 hours a day just two minute's walk away on Seven Sisters Road.

The restaurant often has a crowd of people gathered outside, which is a real nuisance and can cause a lot of noise.

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Licensing Act 2003- Representation from the Licensing Authority Application: 280 Holloway Road

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority with respect to the new application to permit late night refreshment Mondays to Sundays until 2am.

The recommendation of the Licensing Authority is to restrict the hours of operation until midnight Mondays to Sundays.

The grounds for the representation are:

- Public nuisance
- Crime and disorder

The Licensing Authority is concerned that if this application is granted it will add to the cumulative impact in terms of late noise and antisocial behaviour. Although the premises will not be selling alcohol the late night food offer will encourage more people to remain in the area in the early hours of the morning. There are already a number of premises providing late night refreshment beyond midnight.

The premises is located in the Holloway and Finsbury Park Cumulative Impact area (HFPCIA) which means that the council has determined that the area is already saturated with licenced premises and any licence applications need to be carefully examined to ensure that the proposed activities, opening hours, style of operation and management arrangements contained in the operating schedule will not add to the cumulative impact to such as extent that the licensing objectives are undermined.

Antisocial behaviour hotline calls

There were 147 alcohol related calls made to the ASB hotline in the HFPCIA equating to 122 per km², almost double the Islington average of 74 per km². Twenty per cent of these calls occurred between midnight and 4 am

Operating Schedule

The Licensing Authority expects applicants to describe how they will achieve high standards of management, so as to promote the licensing objectives, in the operating schedule. The operating schedule submitted with this variation application does not provide sufficient detail to enable the Licensing Authority to satisfy itself that the extension of hours will not add to the cumulative impact..

Licensing Policy Considerations

Licensing Policy 2 – '... the type of premises and their cumulative impact upon the area

The Licensing Authority has adopted a special policy relating to cumulative impact in relation to Holloway and Finsbury Park.

This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences, that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate why the operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact or otherwise impact adversely on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Licensing Policy 7- Licensing Hours

The Licensing Authority supports the principle of flexibility in its approach to licensing hours and will consider the merits of each individual application however it is mindful

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that Islington has become saturated with late night premises selling alcohol and it is concerned about the cumulative impact that the proliferation of late night venues and retailers in the borough is having on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Where representations are received from responsible authorities or other persons the Licensing Authority may seek to restrict hours of opening where it is appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

Licensing Policy 9 – Operating schedules

The Licensing Authority seeks to encourage the highest standards of management in licensed premises and expects the operating schedule to describe how these standards will be achieved in relation to promoting the licensing objectives

Summary and recommendations

The Licensing Authority has considered the style and hours of operation proposed by the applicant, the management arrangements described in the operating schedule, the special considerations described in paragraphs 2, 7 & 9 of the Licensing Policy.

The applicant has not presented any evidence to indicate there will be no adverse cumulative impact if this licence is granted.

It is recommended that this application to operate until 2am is refused and consideration be given to permitting late night refreshment until midnight.

- 1. The licensee shall work in partnership with the local police force to prevent crime and disorder.
- CCTV shall be maintained at the premises when the premises is open to the public. CCTV images shall be held for 28 days and access to the CCTV system shall be provided to police officers and council officers at their request.
- 3. The CCTV system shall meet the industry standard and will have Kalegate Certification.
- 4. The CCTV system shall have an alarm that will sound if the equipment is faulty or not recording, thereby alerting management for the need to intervene.
