

PREMISES LICENCE VARIATION APPLICATION

RE: FOOD AND WINE, 285 CITY ROAD, LONDON, EC1V 1LA

1. Synopsis

- 1.1. This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2. The variation application is to:
 - i. Extend opening hours for sale by retail of alcohol from 06:00 till midnight to 06:00 till 03:00 the following day.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. To determine the application for a variation of the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2. To consider the representation from the Police in the light of the revised Secretary of State Guidance to Local Authorities issued on 25th April 2012 namely:

The Licensing Authority should accept all reasonable and proportionate representations made by the Police unless the Authority has evidence that to do so would not be appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

2.3. To consider that this address is in the Bunhill Saturation or "Cumulative Impact Policy" of Islington. This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences, club premises certificates, or variation applications that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate

why the operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact or otherwise impact adversely on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- 2.4. If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions on the current licence.
 - ii. conditions recommended by responsible Authorities;
 - iii. any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1. Islington Council has received 8 representations from local residents as well as representations from the Police, Licensing Authority and Noise Team.

3.3. Licensing history of the premises

On 11th May 2011 HMRC seized alcohol that had not had duty paid. Trading Standards called a review of the license and a two week suspension was given by the Sub Committee dated 20th September 2011.

4. Planning implications

4.1. Planning records indicate that no specific planning permission of this property as a retail shop within use class A1. However, planning permission (Ref: 94/1207) was granted ON 13.02.1995 for change of use of the basement and ground floor to a wine bar (A4) and restaurant (A3). Within this context, if the planning permission was implemented and the use of the premises can be converted to A1 (retail) without the need to obtain planning permission.

If however, the planning permission was not implemented, planning records indicate that the premises were use as an office (B1). The change of use from B1 (office) to A1 (retail shop) requires planning permission for which it appears has not been sought or granted. No comments can be made to the suitability to extend the hours of business to 3.00 until the matter has been regularised. Accordingly, I would suggest that the applicant should be notified/advised to submit an application for a certificate of lawfulness under Sections 191-2 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

There are outstanding planning enforcement investigations in relation to this site. The enforcement matter relates to the unauthorised use of the roof of the premises as an outdoor amenity area.

5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

5.1. The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. The licensing shall liaise with the local the Police.
- 2. The licence holder shall CCTV cameras to record for a minimum of 30 days.
- 3. The licence holder shall display signs informing customers that anti social behaviour will not be tolerated.
- 4. Staff shall be regularly trained on health and safety requirements.
- 5. Customers shall be requested by way of notice to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 6. Deliveries shall not be allowed at anti social times, so as to not disturb residents.
- 7. There shall be sign displayed inside the premises requesting that adult's keep children with them at all times.
- 8. Sharp or flammable objects shall be kept out of the reach of children.
- 9. The licence holder shall prevent under age sales by requesting valid photographic identification from any customer who appears underage.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. No alcoholic goods will ever be purchased from sellers calling to the shop.
- 2. The licensee will immediately report to Trading Standards any instance of a caller to the shop attempting to sell alcohol.
- 3. Invoices (or copies) for all alcoholic goods on the premises will be kept at the shop and made available to officers from the Council, Police, or HMRC, upon request.
- 4. A stock control system will be introduced, to that the licensee can quickly identify where and when alcoholic goods have been purchased.
- 5. An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamp on spirits as soon as practical after they have been purchased.
- 6. If any spirits bought by the company have UK Duty Stamps that do not fluoresce under ultra-violet light, or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee shall identify the supplier to Islington Trading Standards and HMRC as soon as possible.
- 7. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25, the Retail of Alcohol Standards Group's advice for off-licences.
- 8. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff.
- 9. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young persons, staff ask to see accredited proof of age cards for example proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
- 10. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection by the licensing team, police or trading standards

I write to OBJECT to the proposed Premises Licence Variation (worksheet number WK/201318010) for Food & Wine Shop, 285 City Road. requesting an extension of permitted hours to sell alcohol from 12 midnight to 3am.

This is a densely populated residential area with no wish nor demand for an outlet selling alcohol at this late hour of the night, and it will only increase anti-social behaviour. There are already too many such outlets and we are recognized as being in a saturated area — so this application goes against Council policy and should be refused. A late night off licence in this part of City Road will:

- increase the supply of alcohol in the area
- make it easier for people to purchase alcohol, particularly at night
- encourage more people to visit and remain longer in the area during the early hours of the morning

There are 172 premises licenced to supply off sales of alcohol in St Peter's and Bunhill wards. Of these 7 are licenced to sell alcohol 24hours a day:

132-136 Whitecross St 152 Central St 120 Old St 122-128 Old St 87-91 Old St 126-128 Essex Road

The chain supermarkets that operate in the borough tend to cease selling alcohol at 11pm.
