



1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to:
 - i) Supply alcohol for consumption off the premises 07:00 to 21:00 Monday to Saturday and 07:00 to 18:00 Sunday;

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 2.3 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i) conditions of the current premises licence;
 - ii) conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule
 - iii) conditions recommended by responsible Authorities
 - iv) any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

> I am writing to object in the strongest possible terms to the granting of this licence at the above premises. I have been a local resident for over twenty years and actively involved in the community in many ways, in particular with the regeneration and improvements to Elthorne Park, and am the secretary of the Friends of Elthorne Park group,
which I helped set up.
> Despite constant help and pressure from the local police, council staff, local councillors and outreach workers the park and surrounding area (most notably outside St Mary's church on Ashley Road) have been plagued by large groups of street drinkers for years. Every day a group numbered anywhere between 6 and 12 gathers to drink in Elthorne Park, whilst another, smaller, group of about 4-6 sit on the bench outside the church - these drinkers buy their drink from the number of shops already licensed to sell alcohol on Hornsey Road. Not a week goes by when one or more of the drinkers will urinate in the street, defecate in the park, start some sort of altercation with one or their own number or a passer-by and heavily litter the park and streets with their empty cans, bottles and cigarette butts; it is not a rare sight to see one of them lying in the road asleep and more often than not semi-naked. The problem is so widespread and, sadly now commonplace, that local residents advise their children, as a matter of course, to avoid Ashley Road completely when walking home from school. Only last week, one of the drinkers was lying, comatose, in Highcroft Road, with his trousers and underpants around his knees - at three o'clock <x-appledata-detectors: 1=""> in the afternoon.</x-appledata-detectors:>
> I am aware that over the years the involved authorities have asked the local shops not to sell alcohol to these street drinkers but clearly this request has been ignored. The very last thing this serious and persistent problem
needs is another source of supply.
> I very much trust the council will reject this application.

To whom it may concern

I work within Islington Council's Community Safety Team and lead a multi-agency problem solving panel that looks to address low level crime and anti-social behaviour.

Street population has always been an issue and we have seen an almost 30% increase in street drinking, begging and rough sleeping over the last year.

Elthorne Park is a long standing Islington hotspot for street drinking, a lot of partnership work has taken place to address the behaviour and minimise the impact on the local community. We have received a number of complaints direct to the Council regarding drinkers in Elthorne Park ranging from concerns about shouting, swearing and bad language, violence, drug taking and other dangerous situations where drinkers have almost caused road traffic incidents by wandering into the road. Both the police and ParkGuard also receive regular calls from concerned residents and over the last 6 months I know ParkGuard have carried out over 200 hours of pro-active patrols in the park, they have found street drinkers there on almost every occasion although often they aren't found causing ASB which limits the use of the DPPO powers.

There have been a number of violent incidents and one individual was recently arrested for GBH – within the group itself there are concerns about intimidation and domestic violence. Many of the clients are vulnerable and we have been working to identify individuals and their housing support providers so we can share information and safeguard against harm. We work closely with the nearby hostel to inform them when their clients are engaged in drinking in the park because of concerns for their welfare.

We have made a number of environmental improvements to the area, cutting back bushes, removing benches and increasing litter provision in order to make the area less attractive and reduce the impact and currently both the police and colleagues ParkGuard use the DPPO powers to remove groups from the park or take away their alcohol if they are acting anti socially. There are groups of drinkers who don't cause ASB and therefore the DPPO powers aren't applicable but we have still have concerns for their welfare and the enabling of their alcohol abuse.

Some groups in the park are often drunk early in the day and therefore unable to engage with the outreach teams, once they have consumed their alcohol they continue to sit in the park, causing harassment alarm and distress to the members of the community but officers are unable to use powers to confiscate alcohol because this has already been drunk.

I believe that the drinkers use this area because they are able to buy cheap, strong alcohol nearby. They are obviously under the influence and continue to be allowed to purchase alcohol. I don't believe that the licenced premises in the area are accepting any responsibility for the problem or acting in a responsible manner despite our team having organised joint visits from police and licensing officers and following up with a visit to provide information about the support services available.

In the case of 508 Hornsey Road and existing licenced premises, I don't believe their operating schedule is robust enough or has given enough consideration to the local issues. I think prohibiting the sale of high strength larger and individual cans, which are both attractive to street drinkers, would be appropriate and I think there should be mention of training around the challenging and refusal of selling to those already intoxicated as this could be putting members of staff at risk and needs to be managed effectively.

Licensing Act 2003- Representation from the Licensing Authority Application: ASJ News 508 Hornsey Road London N19 3QW

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority with respect to the new premises licence application to permit off sales of alcohol from ASJ News.

The grounds for the representation are:

- Public nuisance
- Crime and disorder

The premises is not located in a cumulative impact area so there is no presumption that the application should be refused and the onus is on responsible authorities and residents to demonstrate that granting the licence will undermine the licensing objectives.

Licensing Policy 1

The key issues are: the type of premise; their cumulative impact and the mix of premises in the area.

The premise is located in Tollington ward on the boundary with Hillrise ward and is less than 200m from Elthorne Park. The area has a long standing problem with street drinking and Islington Council has worked with partners to tackle the problem through multiagency intervention strategies.

The map attached and table below show the premises licenced for off sales within 250m of 508 Hornsey Road.

The area is well served by off licences to the extent that it could be argued that the area is saturated. Given that the area already has a street drinking problem another off licence would exacerbate the situation and ultimately undermine the licensing objectives.

Licensing Policy 4

This policy outlines the Licensing Authority's approach to shops selling alcohol. It recognises that the statutory guidance issued to Local Authorities suggests that shops should be permitted to sell alcohol during opening hours unless there is 'good reason'. In

view of the number of premises in the area and the existence of a street drinking problem Licensing Policy 4 is applicable to this application.

Licensing Policies 9 & 10

The operating schedule contains insufficient information to demonstrate that high standards of management will operate on the premises. The applicant does not appear to have considered the Licensing Policy in preparing the application, there is no reference to the local context and the proposed controls in the operating schedule are very basic.

Summary and recommendations

The Licensing Authority has considered this application using the Licensing Policy framework, in particular:


- the location of the premises
- the style and hours of operation proposed by the applicant
- feedback from residents and partners
- the management arrangements described in the operating schedule,

The applicant does not appear to have considered the local area, nor sought advice on measures to put in place to put in place to promote the licensing objectives indicating that the style of management will be reactive rather than proactive.

The Licensing Authority recommends that in order to promote the licensing objectives this application is refused.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application in its present form as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives, in particular the crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance.

I am aware that this area is frequented by street drinkers attracted to the high strength, cheap alcohol available from Licensed premises within the locality. There have been reports from Parkguard officers that there area a large number of street drinkers who frequent the Elthorne Park, which is a few minutes walk from where this proposed licensed premises will be. I have also spoken with Pc Mick Murray who works in that area and he has highlighted his concerns to me regarding the street drinkers in and around this location.

I would make the recommendation that the following conditions be added to the license.

- No super-strength beer, lagers or ciders of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises.
- No single cans or bottles of beer or cider shall be sold at the premises.
- No more than (15)% of the sales area shall be used at any one time for the sale, exposure for sale, or display of alcohol.
- CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will
 enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application in its present form as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

I am the Dedicated Ward Officer for Hillrise, in which the above establishment is located; I have been in this position for over 5 years. The ward is served by Elthorne park, a small park which is located to the South at the top of Hornsey road. On joining the team, in 2007, it became apparent that the park was being frequented by street drinkers and that their behaviour was impacting on the recreational use of the park and its facilities by local residents.

The drinkers would invariably gather from around 9am, at the South east corner nearest the shops on Hornsey rd, which is a quieter part of the park and is surrounded by trees and bushes. Their numbers would build throughout the day up to as many as twenty. Most drinkers would have their preferred alcoholic drink but it would be either strong cider or strong larger, with the former usually being 11tr bottles.

As their numbers grew and they became more intoxicated, arguments and fights would break out amongst themselves, often resulting in police being called by members of the public. Some of the more intoxicated drinkers would use the bushes to urinate or defecate in, and at the height of the trouble, there were used by some of the female drinkers who would prostitute themselves. Over the course of 12 hours, hundreds of cans and bottles would be discarded on the ground and the surrounding undergrowth. The local authority eventually installed a recycling bin, however, even though it was (and still is) emptied on a daily basis, it was full to overflowing by midday.

The secondary effect of the presence of the drinkers was the use and selling of class A drugs; resulting in associated acquisitive crime.

Following consultation local residents by way of Ward Panel meetings, the problems in Elthorne park became a Ward Priority, and the following year, in 2008, the local authority deemed the park a Designated Area, giving police officers the power to seize alcohol.

Further improvements in subsequent years included the installation of a basketball court, a 5 a-side football pitch and an upgrade of the children's play area. With these changes and communication with local off-licences, over the course of the following months, the numbers of street drinkers fell and currently lie at around half a dozen.

Eithorne Park is now a very successful park that is very popular and has been further boosted by the presence of a dedicated park keeper.

Complaints do still come into the office about the remaining street drinkers, with callers mostly feeling intimidated by the presence of the drinkers. Myself and colleagues still patrol the park on a daily basis and move on the drinkers and confiscate alcohol as necessary.

Currently, there are 3 off-licences within 100m of Elthorne Park, all of which are located in Hornsey road. My patrol duties will include visiting these establishments to ensure they are complying with the Licensing Act in terms of the sale of alcohol as well as enforcing the designated area in the park. The issue of alcohol-related anti social behaviour in Elthorne park takes up much of my time in terms of time patrolling, and administrative duties with regard to handling complaints and liaising with the local authority and other agencies.

In light of this I would make the recommendation that the following condition be added to the license.

- No super-strength beer, lagers or ciders of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises.
- No single cans or bottles of beer or cider shall be sold at the premises.
- No more than (15)% of the sales area shall be used at any one time for the sale, exposure for sale, or display of alcohol.
- CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will
 enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real
 time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be
 kept available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised
 Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.

LICENSING ACT 2003: REPRESENTATIONS BY RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY

The application for a licence for the above premises has been examined by me and I wish to make the following representations on behalf of Trading Standards. I make them as I have concerns over the steps to prevent crime and disorder and to protect children from harm outlined in the application.

- 1. I have had recent dealings with this business. On 19/02/13 the applicant's wife and business partner, Mrs Selina Khan, sold cigarettes to a 16 year old boy who was assisting Trading Standards during a test purchasing operation. I understand that on the day, an advice pack detailing precautions that can be taken to prevent underage sales and the innocent supply of illicit alcohol was left with Mrs Khan.
- 2. Mrs Khan subsequently attended an Officers' Panel meeting where she was advised in person of the precautions the business should be taking to prevent underage sales. This advice was followed up in writing in a letter sent on 22nd April.
- 3. I was, therefore, disappointed to note the almost total lack of suitable precautions to prevent underage sales or the distribution of illicit alcohol in the application's operating schedule. It appears to me that the applicant has not read the advice pack left or taken heed of the advice in the letter to Mrs Khan.
- 4. In its current format, I believe that the application should be rejected.
- 5. I am, of course, willing to offer further advice to the applicant should he need it, or to comment on an improved operating schedule should he add to it prior to the meeting where the application is heard. I recommend that he looks at Islington's Licensing Policy - and in particular Licensing Policy 10 and the model conditions in Appendix A.

I believe these representations are specific and proportionate to the known trading characteristics of this retail sector and are consistent with the Islington Council Statement of Licensing Policies 25, 26 & 10.

(1) Electrical cables should not be located where they can be walked on or damaged.

Electrical socket outlets should be provided adjacent to each item of electrical apparatus using an approved protected system of wiring in compliance with BS 7671.

- (2) The existing fire alarm and fire detection system should be overhauled and put into full working order in accordance with BS 5839 1. Fire alarm sounders should give clear audible warning of 65 dB(A) in all areas of the premises.
- (3) The existing emergency lighting luminaires and the exit sign over the front door should be overhauled, cleaned and put into full working order.

Any damaged or missing emergency lighting luminaires should be replaced.

All non-maintained emergency lighting within the premises should be wired to the local lighting circuit in such a manner as to operate not only in the event of failure of the mains supply but also on failure of the supply to the local lighting circuit.


