1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to:
 - i) Allow the provision of late night refreshment, Mondays to Sundays from 23:00 until 00:00.



Dear Mr. D. Whitton,

This representation is in reference to you letter dated 2nd July, WK/1213 53264, informing of the premises license application for Kentucky Fried Chicken (KFC).

Together with my wife [redacted], we have been residents of the first floor flat at [redacted] for the last 5 years. [redacted]

We both object to this application for further expansion of the opening times of the Kentucky Fried Chicken premises, due the following issues:

* We believe the expansion of opening times will have an effect on crime and disorder on the street. We have noticed that the pavement in front of the KFC is a regular meeting and loitering spot for youths. If this were to extend into the late hours of the evening, with less social control around to deter misbehaviour, the KFC front pavement would become an unpleasant and possibly threatening environment. [redacted]

* We feel that the expansion of opening times will also cause a public nuisance. The KFC has air-filter and ventilation equipments installed on the roof [redacted]. However, there is always a noticeable smell of cooking oil during the day and in the evening. This is accompanied by a humming noise from the ventilation system. If the KFC opening hours were to be extended, it will create a nuisance in terms of smell and noise. This will directly effect or sleep and rest times; I am particularly worried about this as we are expecting a baby this October.

* As a last aspect, the KFC's garbage disposal could become an issue of public safety. The refuse from the restaurant is put on the street for the daily pick-up

trucks. This is usually a large quantum of bags. If the opening hours were to be extended the garbage would be put out after midnight by KFC. Without a pick-up, the garbage could potentially stay out all night. This could attract animals and vermin to the street, therefore causing a health & safety issue.

Please take these aspects into consideration before granting a licence to this premise.

To whom it may concern,

Further to the below, I would like to add to the objections to the proposed application.

I feel strongly that extending the licensing hours Kentucky Fried Chicken would exacerbate existing antisocial behaviour and late night disorder in the surrounding area, causing nuisance to the many residents who live in the vicinity.

It is commonplace to see groups congregating outside this (and other similar) establishments late at night. In addition to the excessively loud and rowdy behaviour, which causes a high level of disturbance to residents, this also leads to numerous confrontations and it is not at all uncommon to see the police called to the area following disputes. This clearly impacts on public safety, as well as the hugely disruptive impact it has on residents trying to sleep at night.

Myself and other residents already have to contend with large amounts of rubbish, mostly fast-food packaging, discarded on the road/pavement from the previous night, and this problem will only increase if the licensing hours are relaxed further.

Finally, further extending licensing hours would only serve to permit and encourage alcohol-fuelled persons to stay in the area (which it should not be forgotten is largely residential) for longer. I, and other residents, already have to contend with shouting, vomiting and urinating in the street, and I strongly object to an application which, if successful, would facilitate and encourage more of this same antisocial behaviour.

Licencing Application: Kentucky Fried Chicken, 241 Upper Street, London, N1 1RU

I am writing in response to your letter dated 2 July concerning the application by Kentucky Fried Chicken to extend the hours of their licence, pursuant to the Licensing Act 2003.



I'd like to express my objections to the application on the basis that the area is already very noisy in the evenings. Customers of Kentucky Fried Chicken, together with those of the Famous Cock Tavern and McDonalds Restaurant, can be very loud and have a tendency to congregate at those establishments after closing and in the surrounding locality, particularly on the lane where I reside. I wish to express my concern that extending the licencing hours of Kentucky Fried Chicken would mean that the noise caused by customers would continue much later into the night, disturbing local residents such as myself. I believe that this is a 'relevant' complaint which falls within the "prevention of nuisance" heading as set out in your letter. Though not directly caused by Kentucky Fried Chicken, broken glass is often found on Upper Street and in the surrounding areas at weekends and in the mornings and this is a safety concern.

I hope you agree that the granting of extended hours should be a balanced decision taking this sort of complaint into account. While I understand that Kentucky Fried Chicken has a right to make this sort of application, I strongly object to it on the aforementioned basis.

I would also like to take this opportunity to request copies of the licences held by the Famous Cock Tavern and McDonalds Restaurant, as I am concerned that those establishments are not complying with the conditions contained therein. Staff are often very loud when disposing of rubbish and often do so very early in the morning. Disposing of glass, for example, is particularly loud and disruptive.

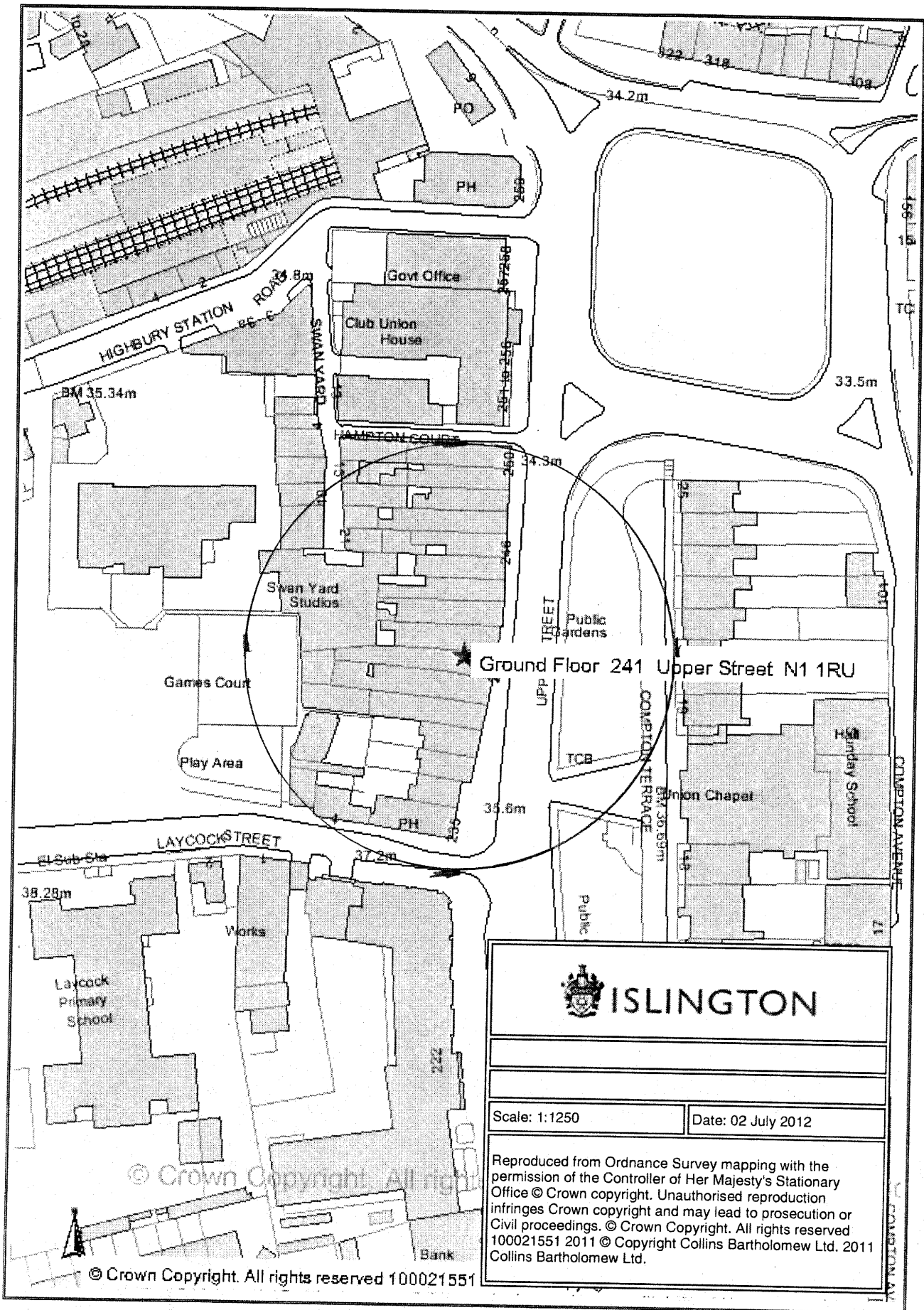

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
2. Litter patrol shall be performed every four hours whilst the premises is open.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by Health and Safety Officer

3. The premises shall not be used under the licence until the requirements specified in the schedule dated 19 July 2012 have been completed and approved in writing by the responsible authority for health and public safety.

Suggested conditions of approval recommended by Noise Team

4. The extract ductwork shall be cleaned every six months and the most recent record of cleaning, or a copy of it, kept on site available for inspection by an authorised council officer.
5. Carbon filters shall be changed every six months. The most recent record of filtration change, or a copy of it, shall be kept on site and available for inspection by an authorised council officer.
6. In the event of a noise complaint received and substantiated by the council's noise service caused by the mechanical extract system, an acoustic survey shall be carried out by an acoustic consultant registered with either the Institute of Acoustics or the Association of Noise Consultants on the fixed plant and machinery. The measurement of the noise shall be carried out in line with BS 4142:1997. The report shall be submitted to the Council's Noise Team for approval and any works identified to prevent the likelihood of noise nuisance shall be carried out within 40 days of the company being notified of noise nuisance from the extract system.
