**Subject: VARIATION APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE**  
**RE: CO-OPERATIVE WELCOME, 219-227 CALEDONIAN ROAD,**  
**LONDON N1 0SL**

### 1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application to vary the premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The variation application is to:
  - i) Supply alcohol for consumption off the premises 24 hours Monday to Sunday;

### 2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 To consider that this address is in the Kings Cross Saturation or "Cumulative Impact Policy" of Islington. This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences, club premises certificates, or variation applications that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate why the operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact or otherwise impact adversely on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 2.3 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
  - i) conditions of the current premises licence;
  - ii) conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule

- iii) conditions recommended by responsible Authorities
- iv) any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

### **3. Background**

3.1 The premises currently hold a licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises Monday to Sunday from 08:00 to 00:00 and for late night refreshment 00:00 to 05:00.

3.2 The licensing history of the premises:

- a) On 15 September 2005 the Licensing Sub Committee granted a variation application to Somerfield Stores Ltd to allow the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises to 23:00 on Sundays and to allow for late night refreshment from 00:00 to 05:00 Monday to Sunday.
- b) On 11 December 2006 the Licensing Sub Committee revoked the premises licence following a Review by Trading Standards following sales of alcohol to 3 underage volunteers at the premises.
- c) A new premises licence was granted to Somerfield Stores Ltd by the Licensing Sub Committee on 28 November 2007 for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises from 08:00 to 23:00 on Monday to Sundays and to allow for late night refreshment from 00:00 to 05:00 Monday to Sunday.
- d) On 22 September 2008 the Licensing Sub Committee imposed conditions on the licence following a Review by Trading Standards following the sale of alcohol to an underage volunteer at the premises.
- e) On 14 December 2012 the licence was transferred to the Co-operative Group Food Ltd.

3.3 Papers are attached as follows:-

3.4 The Licensing Authority has received representations from the Licensing Authority, Trading Standards, Noise Team and a ward councillor.

### **4. Planning Implications**

4.1 This site was granted planning permission in 2009 for an A3 restaurant and this permission appears to have been implemented. The current use shown on the licensing application is A1 (retail). Planning permission is not required to change from and A3 to an A1 use.

### **5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations**

5.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

### **a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 9)**

We are aware that the premises falls within the cumulative impact area and we have considered this and feel that having had regard to the four licensing objectives and the locality, the following conditions are appropriate.

### **b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

1. The premises shall maintain a CCTV system which gives coverage of all entry and exit points. The system shall continually record whilst the premises are open and conducting licensable activities. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available upon the receipt of a request by an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.
2. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed at the premises.
3. An incident log (whether kept in a written or electronic form) shall be retained at the premises and made available to an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.
4. The premises shall operate a proof of age scheme, such as a Challenge 25, whereby the only forms of acceptable identification shall be either a photographic driving licence, a valid passport or any other recognised form of photographic identification incorporating the PASS logo.
5. The premises will be fitted with a burglar alarm system
6. The premises will be fitted with a panic button system for staff to utilise in the case of an emergency.

### **c) Public safety**

The premises licence holder shall ensure that the appropriate fire safety, and health and safety regulations are applied at the premises.

### **d) The prevention of public nuisance**

The premises licence holder will, upon request, provide the telephone number of their Customer Relations Contact Centre.

**e) The protection of children from harm**

1. All staff will receive comprehensive training in relation to age restricted products and in particular the sale of alcohol. No member of staff will be permitted to sell age restricted products until such time as they have successfully completed the aforementioned training.
2. An age till prompt system will be utilised at the premises in respect of age restricted products.
3. A refusals register (whether kept and written or electronic form) will be maintained at the premises and will be made available for inspection upon request by an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.

## **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

1. An assessment of the sound emission arising from refrigeration and condenser units to the rear of the premises shall be undertaken and appropriate improvement works carried out to ensure that sound generated by the unit will meet a rating level of 5dB(A) below the lowest background level during their times of operation, 1m from the façade of Caithness House. The assessment and works to be confirmed by the Council's Noise Team prior to the licence being taken into use.
2. Operating procedures and policies which include risk assessments, training of staff in all aspects of regulatory compliance and operating policies and measures for the avoidance of noise or other nuisance to neighbours, shall apply.
3. Whilst the precise location of alcohol within the store may change from time to time, its location will always be subject to "responsible retailing".
4. A suitable risk assessment will be completed and the necessary control measures implemented including the safe evacuation of disabled people. All exit doors shall be maintained easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means. Exit doors shall be regularly checked to ensure they function satisfactorily. Records of these checks shall be kept and produced on request. Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of an emergency shall be prominently displayed and maintained in good condition. All emergency exits and means of escape shall be signed in accordance with BS5499.
5. All food waste shall be bagged and tied. Waste collection receptacles shall be kept locked. Collections of refuse shall be made at appropriate intervals.
6. The applicant shall sign up to the Portman Group Code of Practice on naming, packaging and promotion of alcoholic drink. Staff shall be trained to request evidence of age from any person seeking to buy alcohol and appearing to the member of staff to be under the age of 18 years. Such evidence is to be of a photographic nature such as a passport or



photographic driving licence or any identification carrying the "Pass" logo. The licensee shall actively support the Proof of Age Scheme. Age prompts on the tills shall alert a cashier when age restricted products are scanned. Signage advising staff and customers of ages for restricted products are displayed prominently in the store.

7. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
8. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young persons, staff ask for accredited proof of age cards e.g. Citizencard, a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
9. The designated premises supervisor or other personal licence holders must be present between 18:00 and 00:00 each day to supervise all alcohol sales.
10. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff.
11. A refusal book shall be kept to record all sales of alcohol refused and such record shall be made available to a duly authorised officer of the Local Authority or a Police Officer upon request.

I object to this licence application.

It is not compliant with the Council's licensing policy in two respects: (a) the policy sets guideline closing hours of 11pm and seeks to discourage extended opening hours so a proposal to trade 24 hours per day at this location is plainly at variance with policy; (b) the premises are also located within the area of cumulative impact set out in the policy and therefore there is a presumption to refuse applications which are likely to add to the existing impact.

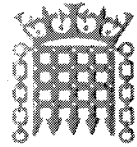
I have reviewed the Operating Schedule of the application and see no evidence that the applicant has addressed the core concerns about excessive sale of alcohol in the area or submitted any case to show why there might be circumstances that are exceptional to this individual application. The applicants says it will meet the prevention of crime and disorder objective merely by installing surveillance and other site specific measures to detect and deter any crime and disorder on the premises. In relation to the prevention of public nuisance objective the applicant asserts this can be met simply by providing a customer call centre number.

These statements simply do not address the reason why a cumulative impact area is in force because crime, disorder and public nuisance are exacerbated by excessive supply of alcohol in the area and the Licensing Authority's policy is adopted in order to reduce purchase of alcohol outside normal hours. The applicant fails to understand that patterns of crime and disorder in the wider neighbourhood are directly caused by easy access to off-sales at irregular hours.

I am especially disappointed that the Co-operative Group is making such an application. The Co-op Group is a business that prides itself by operating to higher ethical standards than most other retailers and I would therefore have expected a far greater understanding of the adverse impact of 24hour alcohol sales in this area.

I am submitting a representation against the application to vary the premises license to permit the sale of alcohol 24 hours a day from Monday to Saturday at the above premises. This representation is on behalf of NHS North Central London's Islington Public Health Department, which as a health body is a responsible authority.

The impact of alcohol is particularly great in Islington with some of the greatest levels of alcohol-related problems in London, including:

- The highest rate of alcohol-specific deaths in men in London
- One of the highest rates of alcohol-related hospital admissions in London
- Significantly higher levels of alcohol-related violent crime and claimants of incapacity benefit where main medical reason for being a claimant is alcoholism

Caledonian ward, in which this store is located, seems to particularly feel the affects of alcohol related harm and has higher rates of alcohol-related ambulance callouts compared with Islington as a whole.

The grounds for the representation are:

- Public safety
- Crime and disorder

The relevant policies in Islington's Licensing Policy

- Policy 2: Cumulative impact and saturation
- Policy 4: Shops selling alcohol
- Policy 7: Licensing hours

The Co-operative Welcome in Caledonian Road is in an area which already has relatively high density of premises. Currently within Caledonian ward there are:

- 88 premises licensed to sell alcohol, equivalent to one premises for every 118 residents aged 18 and over. This is slightly higher than the Islington average of one licenced premises per 128 residents.
- 26 premises are licensed for off-sales of alcohol only (i.e. excluding on-licences that also sell alcohol for consumption off the premises), one for every 400 residents aged 18 and over in the ward, (the Islington average is one per 374 residents aged 18 and over)
- There are two 24-hour off-licences within 500m of the premises, and five 24-hour off-licences within 1.0km. The closest existing 24-hour off-licence is less than 100m away.

The premises is located within the King's Cross cumulative impact area defined in Islington's Licensing Policy 2013-2017.

I am concerned that if this application is granted it will increase the availability of alcohol for consumption off premises. This could lead to an increase in public nuisance and crime and disorder, and impact adversely on health of both those buying and consuming the alcohol and also the health of others who come in contact with them. The area already has sufficient premises to meet demand of local residents and additional outlets supplying alcohol will be detrimental to the local residents in terms of noise and disturbance in the early hours of the morning.

Alcohol and health

Alcohol misuse imposes a major preventable burden to health and the effect of this in Islington is felt across all health services. Recent analysis has estimated that in Islington the cost of hospital admissions where alcohol was an attributable factor was £7429.9k, (£39.4 per Islington resident during the financial year 2008/09<sup>1</sup>).

There is a growing body of evidence that an increased number of alcohol outlets results in significant increases in both alcohol consumption and alcohol-related harm, including injury, violence and medical harm. Evidence from a number of countries indicates reducing alcohol outlet density can have an impact on reducing violence and problem drinking. There is also strong and reasonably consistent evidence that changes in hours or days of trading can have a significant impact on volume of alcohol consumed and rates of alcohol related problems<sup>2,3,4,5,6</sup>.

### Impact of alcohol on health in Islington

The impact of alcohol on health in Islington is particularly severe. Alcohol-specific hospital admissions are those which are wholly related to alcohol (e.g. alcoholic liver disease or alcohol overdose). Islington has the second highest rate in London for hospital admissions where alcohol is the specific cause of admission. For men the rate is also significantly worse than England, with Islington having the 24<sup>th</sup> highest rate out of 326 boroughs nationally.

Currently Islington has one of the highest rates of alcohol-related hospital admissions (all hospital admissions in which alcohol is likely to have played a part, for example injuries/falls or high blood pressure) in London. The rate for both men and women is significantly worse than the England average. Increases in alcohol related admissions have been much higher in Islington than in England as a whole. For instance, in Islington, the increase in alcohol-related admissions in men was 39% and 44% for women between 2003/04 and 2009/10, compared to increases of 25% for both men and women in England.

### **Caledonian**

#### Ambulance callouts

The data on alcohol-related ambulance callouts reflects where the ambulance attended, not where the individual lives, and therefore includes people who live outside the borough but who come into Islington to work, socialise, etc. In 2011/12, there were 205 alcohol-related ambulance callouts in Caledonian ward (8.3% of all alcohol-related callouts in Islington), compared to an average of 146 per ward. Local analysis indicates that there is a general trend of ambulance callouts increasing as the number of licensed premises increases. At the smaller geographical Lower Super Output Area (equal to an area of around 1,500 residents), there were 32 alcohol-related ambulance call-outs in the vicinity of the Co-operative Welcome in Caledonian Road, compared to an average of 20 across all Islington LSOAs. Across Islington, 53% of alcohol-related callouts resulted in conveying a person to hospital, and 6% resulted in assistance being given at the scene or conveyed to an NHS walk-in centre – this results in a substantial use of health service resource. The pattern of alcohol-related ambulance callouts corresponds with the pattern of alcohol-related crime in Islington.

#### Hospital admissions

Caledonian ward had a rate of alcohol-specific hospital admissions comparable with Islington in 2011/12, with a rate of 792 per 100,000 people – equivalent to 76 residents admitted to hospital. The low rate of alcohol-specific hospital admissions but high level of alcohol-related ambulance callouts reflects the status of Caledonian ward, particularly towards and around the King's Cross area, as an area attracting visitors from other parts of Islington and from outside of Islington.

### **Conclusion**

Islington experiences some of the highest levels of alcohol-related harm in London and the cumulative availability of alcohol is one area that is likely to be impacting on this.

Rates of hospital admissions as a result of alcohol are average compared to the borough as a whole, whilst alcohol-related ambulance call-outs are higher. This suggests that the immediate impact of alcohol misuse may be experienced by visitors to the area, which is likely to correspond with the impact of alcohol misuse on crime and anti-social behaviour in the area.

There is already good availability of alcohol for consumption off the premises in Caledonian ward, as measured by the number residents aged 18 and over per off-licence.

There is evidence that increased availability of alcohol, both in terms of the time period in which alcohol is available (hours of sale) and number of premises from which alcohol is available results in an increase in alcohol related harm. The effect of this is increased pressure and costs to the NHS. The impacts are also felt across a range of groups including the council, policing and the community as a whole.

### **Recommendation**

NHS North Central London's Islington Public Health Department recommends that:

1. The variation for a licence to supply alcohol is refused and the current permitted hours remain unchanged.

**To prevent public nuisance**

The application is for the variation of the existing trading hours by extending the hours for the supply and sale of alcohol.

I visited the premises and noted the following:

The premises is a Supermarket selling a range of food produce and other consumer goods. It is located inside the Texaco Petrol Filling Station on Caledonian Road N, north of Kings Cross and within the Cumulative Impact Area. On the opposite side to the premises are residential premises. Caledonian Road is a very busy thoroughfare and the dominant noise is from vehicle traffic movement.

I have considered the application in relation to the Council's Licensing Policy 2; 4; 8 and 9. I have concerns about the extended trading times of the sale of alcohol and the possible potential impact this may have on residents living close to the shop on an already busy part of the borough. This could result in antisocial behaviour from the sale of alcohol in the very early hours of the morning from people gathering outside the premises generating disturbance such as shouting, raised voices, talking, laughing, banging of car doors, music from car audio etc.

It is the experience of the Environmental Health Noise Team that this type of noise disturbance is most difficult to control and causes the most distress to those affected. Furthermore, with regards to section (d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, the applicant has not mention any measure on how to minimise disturbance from the above mentioned activities other than to specify that providing the telephone number of the Customer Relations Contact Centre.






**Suggested conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy your representation or other suggestions you would like the Licensing Sub Committee to take into account. Please use separate sheets where necessary.**

I would therefore recommend that the following condition be attached if the committee decides to grant the variation.

- There will be a log book kept at the premises for the manager and staff to record all noise complaints received during the trading hours. It should be made available to the Environmental Health Noise Team upon request.
- Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- Customers should not be allowed to consume purchased alcohol on the premises/forecourt after purchased.
- The licensee and staff should frequently patrol outside the perimeter of the premises to check and ensure that noise from any customers do not disturb nearby residential premises. All patrol should be recorded in the log book.
- No deliveries or collections to take place between the hours of 22:00 and 07:00hrs.
- No refuse including bottles will be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 22:00 and 07:00hrs.
- No movement of goods in outside areas between 22:00hrs and 07:00hrs.

On behalf of the Noise Team, I have decided to object to the application variation. The reasons for my objection is the concerns of potential noise nuisances arising from the extended trading hours applied for and the lack of control measures not provided to prevent noise emanating from the premises and affecting the residential premises.

I formally oppose the granting of this licence application on behalf of Islington Police. This statement provides the rationale for my decision.

Over recent years Islington has experienced rapid growth in its night time economy. The cumulative effect of this is a heavy footfall of persons who are not resident in Islington Borough but who are present between the hours of 8pm and 6am to take advantage of the extremely vibrant night-time economy.

Unfortunately there has not been commensurate increase in public services. Each new license or extension of an existing license will create additional demand on a range of public services. There is a direct link between the number of persons in public places who have consumed alcohol and the number of violent assaults that take place in that public place. This 'new' business for the police will involve reporting and investigating more instances of theft, anti social behaviour, drunkenness and serious assaults. No additional police resource will be available to cope with this extra demand. More people will be the victims of crime and more people will be injured.

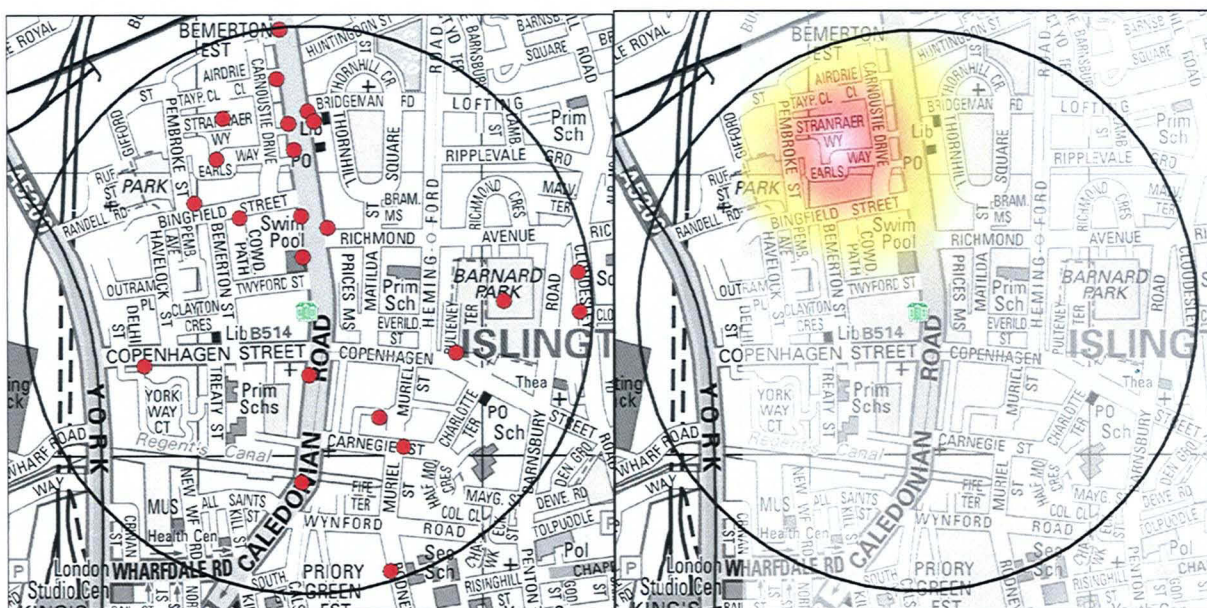
The number of Police personnel available both in terms of uniform deterrence and investigative capacity is at its lowest between the hours of 11pm and 8am. At a time when both Police resources are being severely squeezed long with the resources available to NHS I would strongly resist increasing the number of persons who have consumed alcohol onto the streets of Islington. I have dwindling resources to deal with the consequences. The average investigation into an allegation of Grievous Bodily Harm costs Islington Police £2000 to investigate. Last year Islington investigated over 350 such crimes. This takes no account of the costs to the NHS. It also takes no account of the thousands of alcohol-related Actual Bodily Harm and Common Assault investigations that are taken on by Islington Police every year.

In an area that is already saturated with Licensed Premises it is just not sustainable to keep increasing the number of people on those streets after midnight. No matter how well any establishment is run internally their very business case is based on growing the number of people who end up on the streets of Islington having been drinking. As local public services are already stretched then the inevitable consequence of granting more post-midnight licences is an increase in the number of victims of serious violence. I would ask that the licence application be rejected.

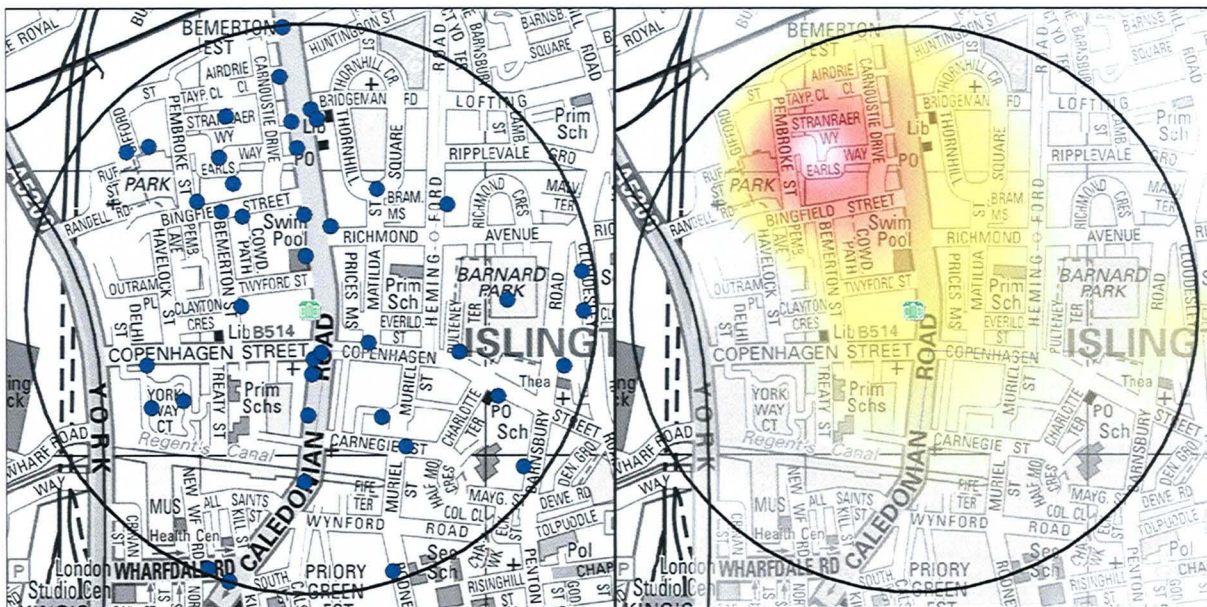

**Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule**

1. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed at the premises.
2. An incident log (whether kept in a written or electronic form) shall be retained at the premises and made available to an authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.
3. The premises shall operate a proof of age scheme, such as a Challenge 25, whereby the only forms of acceptable identification shall either be a photographic driving licence, a valid passport or any other recognised form of photographic identification incorporating the PASS logo.

**(Please note: the LSC might consider removing Annex 2 Conditions 6, 8 and Annex 3 Condition 1 if the above condition is agreed as the three conditions on the current premises licence overlap)**

4. The premises shall be fitted with a burglar alarm system.
5. The premises shall be fitted with a panic button system for staff to utilise in the case of an emergency
6. The premises shall ensure that the appropriate fire safety and health and safety regulations are applied at the premises.
7. The premises licence holder will, upon request, provide the telephone number of their Customer Relations Contact Centre.
8. All staff shall receive comprehensive training in relation to age restricted produces and in particular the sale of alcohol. No member of staff shall be permitted to sell age restricted products until such time as they have successfully completed the aforementioned training.
9. An age till prompt shall be utilised at the premises for age restricted products
10. A refusals register (whether kept in a written or electronic form) shall be maintained at the premises and shall be made available for inspection upon request by and authorised Officer of the Police or the Local Authority.
