Subject: PREMISES LICENCE REVIEW APPLICATION
RE: ARDA 2, 156A SEVEN SISTERS ROAD, LONDON, N7 7PL

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application by Metropolitan Police for a Review of the Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the review application is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 The grounds for review are related to the licensing objectives:
 - i) Prevention of crime and disorder.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application to review the premises licence under Section 52 of the Licensing Act.
- 2.2 The Committee must have regard to the application and any relevant representations. The Committee must take such steps as necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives.
- 2.3 To consider the representation from the Police in the light of the revised Secretary of State Guidance to Local Authorities issued on 25th April 2012 namely:
- 2.4 The Licensing Authority should accept all reasonable and proportionate representations made by the Police unless the Authority has evidence that to do so would not be appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

2.5 The steps stated in Sections 52(4) of the Act are as follows:

- a) to modify the conditions of the licence; and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered, omitted or any new condition is added;
- b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- e) to revoke the licence;
- f) the Committee also have the option to leave the licence in its existing state;
- g) the Committee also has the power in relation to steps a) and b) to provide that the modification and exclusion only has effect for a limited period not exceeding three months.

4. Background and Licensing History

4.1 The premises are currently licensed to permit the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises only, and for regulated entertainment, and the provision of late night refreshment from 1000 to 0100 the following day from Monday to Thursday, 1000 to 0330 the following day on Friday & Saturday, and 1200 to 0000 on Sunday.

4.2 Papers are attached as follows:-

- Appendix 1: application form from Metropolitan Police; and additional supplied material.
- Appendix 2: current premises licence;
- Appendix 3: Representations;
- Appendix 4: suggested conditions and map of premise location.

- 4.3 On 12 January 2012 the premises was issued the current licence. The licence was issued to the licence holder Deti (UK) Limited on 12 January 2012 following an appeal to the magistrate's court after the premises licence had been reviewed by a local ward Councillor. The licence was issued by a consent order agreed between the licence holder and Islington Council.
- 4.4 The licence was also subject to a number of licence conditions. Annex 3 of the premises licence conditions numbers sixteen to twenty eight, had been imposed by the Committee at the Council review hearings, and agreed by the licence holder as part of the consent order issued by Highbury Magistrates.
- 4.5 On the 17 September 2012 a complaint was received from a local resident regarding noise from customers. The complaint was querying the opening hours of the premises as the incident was at 04:00 on a Monday morning, and the allegation made said that in the end the Police were called to close the premises.
- 4.6 The licensee was written to on 20 September 2012 detailing the breaches of the Conditions of the premises licence.
- 4.7 The letter requested that the licence holder submit a minor variation application, adding a comprehensive CCTV condition, in order to both promote the licensing objective for the prevention of crime and disorder, and to enable responsible authorities access to images in relation to the premises opening for licensable activities after its permitted hours.
- 4.8 The minor variation also requested a more comprehensive noise condition be added to licence in order to promote the prevention of public nuisance from licensable activities at the premises. In addition the application would permit a relaxation on the condition in relation to the numbers of customers smoking outside the premises.
- 4.9 On the 24 September 2012 a report was received from Islington Council's Noise Team about a visit to the premises on the 23rd September 2013, where the premises was found operating after hours.
- 4.10 On the 26 September 2012 Mr Detar Hukuri was invited into the Council offices for an interview to be conducted under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984 as part of an investigation of offences under Part 7, Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.11 Contact was made by a solicitor representing Mr Hukuri on 2 October 2012. The solicitor confirmed that Mr. Hukuri would be attending the interview with a legal representative. The solicitor offered to submit the minor variation application as requested on the 20th September 2012, but asked for the on-going enforcement to be dealt with by way of a simple caution to be accepted by his client.
- 4.12 On the 3 October 2012 the licence holders solicitor submitted a minor variation application. On the 4 October 2012 Mr Detar Hukuri attended the Council offices accompanied by a legal representative and accepted a simple caution in relation to two offences under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.13 On the 9 November 2012 a new licence was issued to Deti (UK) Limited after the minor variation application was deemed granted.
- 4.14 On the 09 December 2012 13:26 a complaint was received via e-mail from a local resident about the premises. On 14 December 2012, the premise was visited as part of a joint licensing operation with the Metropolitan Police. A request to view the CCTV images from the weekend where the resident alleged the premises was operating after hours was made but the CCTV from the 7 – 10 December 2012 was not available.

- 4.15 On the 19 December 2012 a further letter was sent to Mr. Hekuri. Mr. Hekuri was reminded that the CCTV condition on the licence was in place as a result of a previous investigation into licensing breaches at the premises, for which he had admitted and accepted a simple caution.
- 4.16 On the 3 June licensing received a report from Islington Council's Noise Team about a visit they had made to the premises and where they witnessed customers smoking and the premises open after hours.
- 4.17 On the 4 June 2013 licensing wrote to Mr, Detar Hekuri at the premises in respect of the visit on the 2 June 2013, and requested a copy of the CCTV. As a result of this letter a person called the Council offices from a CCTV company to say that this footage was not available.
- 4.18 On the 12 June 2013 Mr Detar Hukuri was invited him into the Council offices for an interview on the 27 June 2013 to be conducted under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984.
- 4.19 On 27 June 2013 a licensing officer conducted a recorded interview with Mr Detar Hukuri, the premises licence holder in respect of the ground floor of Arda 2, 156a Seven Sisters Road, London, N7 7PL, with an Islington Council Environmental Health Officer. At the interview Mr Detar Hukuri, confirmed that he was the responsible person at the premises. He confirmed that he was aware of the licence conditions and restrictions on hours for trading at the licence.
- 4.20 When questioned as to why the premise was open for licensable activities after the permitted hours on 2 June 2013, Mr Hukuri admitted being open for licensable activities after hours and people smoking on the premises. He said during the interview that it was a complicated night, and stated that if the security employed at the premises had tried to stop the customers smoking then a fight could have started. When asked if he had evidence to show that he had asked people to stop smoking, Mr Hukuri said no that he didn't.
- 4.21 When questioned in relation to the CCTV system at the premises, Mr Hukuri said that was aware that having a comprehensive CCTV system at the premises is a condition of his licence, and also that the images need to be supplied to an authorised officer on request. He confirmed that he had been unable to supply the CCTV images as requested in my letter of 12 June 2013. He said a company had come to replace a camera and had deleted everything.
- 4.22 On the 23 September 2013 a report was received from the Islington Council's Noise Team about another visit to Arda2, where they had witnessed smoking and drinking after hours. On the 24 September 2013 a letter was written to Mr, Detar Hekuri at the premises in respect of the visit on the 22 September 2013, and a copy of the CCTV at the premises requested in line with condition 29 on the premises licence from 3.30 until 05:00 on the 22 September 2013.
- 4.23 Mr Hukuri supplied copies of the CCTV for the premises. The CCTV images were supplied on a USB flash drive on 26 September 2013. The flash drive had images from 9 cameras, number one to eight, and then a camera number ten, but there was no footage covering the public area of the bar where the alleged offences took place.
- 4.24 On 11 October 2013, a Licensing officer visited to investigate whether there was a camera in the premises which showed the bar area, and were able to confirm that there was a camera that covered this area.
- 4.25 On the 27 October 2013 the Licensing officer visited the premises after hours and witnessed customers inside the premises at 04:25 from the street.

- 4.26 On the 29 October 2013 Licensing wrote to Mr Detar Hekuri at the premises in respect of the visit on the 27 October 2013, and requested a copy of -the CCTV footage. Mr Hukuri supplied our copies of the CCTV for the premises for the time period requested. The CCTV images were supplied on a DVD.
- 4.27 The footage supplied for this evening; shows the premises being used until 05:00. The footage clearly shows the till being used, and drinks being served up until 05:00.
- 4.28 The 27 October 2013 was the end of British Summer Time and at 2:00am the time had reverted to Greenwich Mean Time, i.e. 01:00am. It is not clear if the CCTV images were reset by an hour at 02:00, but the footage shows the premises full of customers at 05:00, and also officers witnessed the premises being full of customers at 04:30.
- 4.29 The Council has since filed prosecution papers at Highbury Magistrates Court, relating to nine charges against Mr Huruki as an individual and as a director of the company. The date for the first hearing at the Magistrate Court is 13 March 2014 so Mr Huruki has not had the opportunity to enter a plea yet.

5 **Planning Implications**

- 5.1 Planning enforcement have confirmed that the premise only has permission to trade on Monday to Saturday from 09:00 to 23:00 and no opening on a Sunday or Bank Holiday. Mr Huruki has also been advised to submit a certificate of lawful use in respect of the premises.

6 **Conclusion and reasons for recommendations**


- 6.1 The Council is required to consider this application for review in the light of all relevant information from the applicant and the licence holder. It may attach such conditions necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

I am Police Constable Paul HOPPE 208NI, I am authorised by the Chief Officer of Police to carry out the Police licensing function.

This review is made on the ground of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, to prevent further crimes being committed in and around this venue, to protect members of the public and reduce crime.

The license conditions in force at this venue allow the sale of alcohol, late night refreshment, dancing, making music, performing music and playing recorded music so is therefore a very comprehensive license which has a long list of Mandatory Conditions and also Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule and Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority.

There has however been a number of very serious incidents occurring over the last 2/3 years which give rise to serious concerns over the licensee and his ability to operate a safe, professional venue. Two most serious were a knife attack on 21st October 2012 and the seizure of at least half a kilogram of Cocaine on 8th November 2013.

It is therefore requested that the licensing committee revoke the license.

CRIME in relation to the address:

On 9th June 2011 the premises owner was arrested and charged on 14th July 2011 for physically assaulting and ex-girlfriend at the venue because she had a new boyfriend. Crime Report 2714909/11

On 4th September 2011 two very drunk people who had been at the venue were involved in a fight with each other. They appear to have been partners and had been drinking inside the venue, but when police arrived, even though there were other customers in the venue who must have witnessed the incident, no one would assist police. Crime Report 2722818/11

On 14th July 2012 two males were seriously assaulted after being chased by up to 6 other males (not identified) who were in the venue after the victims mistakenly tried to gain entry to a private party at the venue. Crime Report 2717364/12

On 21st October 2012 two males sitting directly outside the venue were repeatedly stabbed and seriously injured by assailants who drove up in cars just for the attack. This has been linked to drugs, guns and gangs on intelligence systems. Crime Report 2726137/12

On 21st August 2012 The owner/ manager was arrested charged with Greivous Bodily Harm, after a male was beaten with iron bars and poles. The incident was fully investigated and the case went to Court but suddenly the victim refused to give evidence. Crime Report 2411597/12

On 9th April 2013 a male was arrested in the venue for distribution of prostitution cards, after making off from police who were visiting the venue. Crime Intelligence reference NIRT00435429.

On 8th November 2013 a drugs warrant was executed at the flats above the address where the owner/ manager has stated (in interview) he lives. In the residential area, at least half a kilo of Cocaine was found. There were at least six other men in the venue who, according to the owner/ manager all work at the venue. Crime Report 2724791/13

There are eight intelligence reports over 2 years 2011 – 2013 referring to drugs and firearms being present at the venue. There is also one report which states prostitution is being run from the venue (see above for arrests and crime reports).

There have also been a large number of license-related issues culminating in the owner/ manager being brought to a Council/ Police panel and then a hearing which resulted in the large number of conditions being imposed on the license.

There is also a prosecution pending by Islington Borough Council in relation to a large number of license infringements.

Summary and Recommendations:

It is clear that the venue is owned and operated by Mr Detar HEKURI who has been arrested for a number of very serious crimes. It is the opinion of police that he is not running a safe and professional venue as is demonstrated by the large number of license conditions which are

flagrantly being abused. Islington Council is in the process of taking action against these breaches.

It is the recommendation of Police that this venue have its license revoked and cease trading to prevent any further serious crime occurring.

After all the assistance and advice Mr HEKURI has received through panel and from Police and Council Officers, this is the only option to promote the licensing objectives.

This statement relates to the licence review of ARDA 2 Restaurant 156A SEVEN SISTERS ROAD N7 7PL after a large quantity of class A drugs (cocaine and MDMA) was found at the venue in November 2013. I am a member of the Islington Police Licensing team and I have fully investigated this premises over three months; interrogating police intelligence systems, liaising with Islington Licensing Officers and licensing visits to the venue.

Introduction:

ARDA 2 has operated as a licensed establishment since 5th JANUARY 2006. On 5th JANUARY 2010 the premises licence transferred to Mr Bledar URUCI and he was also appointed Designated Premises Supervisor, being a personal licence holder. On 12th JANUARY 2012 the Premises Licence was transferred to DETI (UK) Ltd 283 GREEN LANES PLAMERS GREN N13 4XS. The Director of DETI (UK) Ltd is Detar HEKURI.

The venue is a single story ground floor restaurant and drinking establishment, with a capacity of eighty (80) persons. It has a front door and a back exit. At the rear is a further entrance to a bathroom and upstairs, above the venue, there are four (4) bedrooms. Up another flight of stairs there is a very small kitchen and two further bedrooms. The whole venue including accommodation is owned by Mr Detar HEKURI.

The venue is popular among the Eastern European Community, licensed to provide regulated entertainment by way of live music, recorded music and dance and the provision of late night refreshment and retail sale of alcohol. Opening hours are 0900 to 0130 hours Monday to Thursday and 0900 to 0400 Friday and Saturday and 0900 to 0030 hours Sunday.

Background:

There has been intelligence received and recorded on police intelligence systems regarding drugs stored and used at the venue. This culminated in a Section 23 Misuse of Drugs Act 1973 warrant being executed at the premises by SCD7 who are a Central Metropolitan Police specialist drugs unit. This was a confidential operation and local officers were not informed at the time of execution due to the sensitive nature of the warrant. During the execution, a large quantity of Class A drugs were found and seized by officers in the flats above the restaurant and eight (8) people were arrested, who I believe to be staff working in the restaurant below. They have all given their address to police as FLAT A 156 SEVEN SISTERS ROAD N7 7PL and in Clare STANWORTHS statement (PEH/2) she refers to only staff living in the flats above the restaurant at 156 SEVEN SISTERS ROAD N7 7PL.

The Class A drugs were found in bedrooms, in clothing and under floorboards in the communal kitchen area. All these drugs have been tested and were found to be MDMA (METHYLENEDIOXYMETHYL AMPHETAMINE HYDROCHLORIDE) and Cocaine. The people arrested are currently on police bail and the investigation is still ongoing at the time of writing this statement, however there is evidence linking at least three of the eight (8) arrested to the large drugs find. I have spoken to the Officer in the case and he has provided a statement relating to this warrant (One statement from DC HOBKIRK exhibited as PEH/1). In addition, four (4) of the persons arrested were further arrested for immigration offences. There is no further information regarding the result of these further arrests at the time of reporting.

One of the eight (8) people arrested in the flats above the address, ISMAIL, is referred to in a statement from Clare STANWORTH (exhibited as PEH/2) as a member of staff who works in the restaurant downstairs at the venue. STANWORTH works for ISLINGTON Borough Council as an Environmental Health Officer and on 20th NOVEMBER 2013 she was conducting a housing licensing visit. She also says in her statement that the flats above the restaurant are owned by HEKURI, the Premises License Holder, and that the seven people who live in the flats above the restaurant are all staff in the downstairs restaurant.

The DPS at the venue is Bledar URUCI date of birth 23/11/1981. He was the Premises License Holder between 5th JANUARY 2010 and 12th JANUARY 2012. During my considerable investigations, I have found that this person was arrested in possession of Cocaine on 3rd JANUARY 2010 by HERTFORDSHIRE police for which he received a Police reprimand (exhibited as PEH/3). Although this offence has not gone through the Courts process, the fact that URUCI has admitted the offence of possession of class A drugs and that he is the DPS of a venue where a considerable amount of drugs have been found, strongly indicates that there is a major problem with drugs at this venue. I have contacted RUGBY Council and they have confirmed that URUCI has contacted them regarding his change of address. They have confirmed by email that URUCI has not informed them of his change of address (One email from RUGBY Licensing Unit exhibited as PEH/4).

Conclusion:

The trigger for this review was the execution of a Section 23 Misuse of Drugs Act 1973 warrant which resulted in a large amount of class A drugs being found at the venue. The drugs were found in a communal kitchen which is on the top floor of the venue owned and operated by HEKURI who is the sole director of DETI (UK) Ltd. which is the Premises Licence holder. As soon as this warrant was executed, local police reacted immediately and completed paperwork for an expedited review, however, because of an administrative error, this was not pursued and a normal review was sought.

There were eight (8) arrests of staff who work at the venue during this warrant execution; at least three have admitted possession or have been forensically linked to the drugs found and four were further arrested for immigration offences. The DPS of the venue, who was a previous Premises Licence Holder, was arrested in January 2010 and admitted possession of cocaine which did not go to Court. He has also not informed his personal licence issuing authority of his change of address.

There are clear links to drugs and drug use at this address. It is the view of the police that this premises should be reviewed to achieve the licensing objectives and preventing further crime occurring.

Recommendations:

Considering all the evidence presented, it is the view of police that the Committee consider all options.

It is clear that class A drugs are a serious issue at the venue and this is evidenced by the large drugs find. It is also a fact that the current DPS has history with illegal drugs possession, so as to prevent further crime, police would request that the current DPS be removed immediately.

If the Committee considers the revocation of the Premises License too severe, I would encourage the Committee to consider the following conditions be added to the licence:

- 1) Annex (3) Condition (17) be amended to: There shall be a minimum of two (2) SIA qualified door supervisors from an SIA accredited company working Thursday to Saturday from 2100 hours to thirty (30) minutes after the venue closes. And all persons shall be searched by door supervisors and monitored by the premises CCTV.

This condition is to prevent crime and the introduction of drugs into the venue.

Additional conditions:

- 2) All persons working at the venue shall provide their name, National Insurance number and passport/ proof of identity to the licensee. These names, National Insurance numbers and proof of identity will be recorded by the licensee, photocopies will be made of proof of identity and will be made available immediately to police or other authorised officer.

This condition is to prevent crime (use of flats for drug taking) and immigration offences by people living in the

flats above the venue.

3) Any person suspected of possessing or using drugs on the premises will immediately be removed from the premises by the DPS, barred from entering the premises again and shall be reported to police.

This condition is to prevent crime through drug taking on the premises an encourage engagement with police.

4) All staff shall be trained in relevant Licensing Law. The licensee shall keep records of this training which will be signed by the trainer and trainee.

On Friday 8th November 2013 I was on duty in plain clothes with uniformed officers from the Territorial Support Group. We attended Arda 2 Restaurant and the residential flats above it in order to execute a search warrant issued under The Misuse of Drugs Act, this was as a result of information that had been received that large quantities of controlled drugs were on the premises.

The Misuse of Drugs Act warrant covered both the Arda 2 restaurant and the residential flats. These flats are accessed via a rear courtyard and have a separate entry door to the restaurant. The entry door to the flats is next to the rear door of the café within this courtyard.

Upon the arrival of police the restaurant area was locked up. Access was gained to the flats where the suspects were detained. A search of this area was conducted and a quantity of cocaine was recovered from underneath the floorboards beneath a kitchen cabinet on the top floor of the flats, this is a communal kitchen area.

Other small quantities, consistent with personal use, were found within some of the bedrooms of the flats. This included smaller quantities of cocaine as well as ecstasy.

In total the following drugs were recovered from inside the residential rooms:-

- 1) A small amount of cocaine was found on a plate divided up into two lines in a bedroom on the first floor.
- 2) Three small wraps of cocaine (1.16 grams) in torn pieces of a blue and white carrier bag were recovered in a jacket pocket of a coat hung over the back of a chair.
- 3) A mixed quantity of powder and tablets of MDMA (3.35 grams, 176 milligrams & 11 tablets) contained within a small black bag.
- 4) Five different cling film wraps of cocaine (13.5g, 3.92g, 105g) found inside a grey sock under the kitchen floorboards inside a cupboard.
- 5) A block of cocaine (7.53g & 481g) wrapped in a blue and white carrier bag also under the kitchen floorboards inside a cupboard.

6) A small block of cocaine (2.72g) also under the kitchen floorboards inside a cupboard.

A member of staff attended the venue whilst the search was being conducted, he was arrested, although nothing was found in the restaurant area itself. This member of staff gave his details as Mr Ismail.

The owner of the restaurant, a Mr Detar HEKURI was not present at the time of the execution of the warrant, he has not been arrested to date.

Four males who were arrested at the time of the search were Albanian nationals who are suspected of being illegal entrants to the UK, they failed to return to Islington Police Station in answer to their bail.

Two of these males have been linked to the large quantity of drugs during the course of this investigation.



156A Seven Sisters Road. I asked whether the gate was ever kept locked requiring a key for it to be opened from the inside. Mr Ismail said it was not and that the lock on the gate was broken. At the rear of the property there was a separate entrance door leading into the residential accommodation. There was no house number or letterbox on the entrance door.

I then entered the accommodation, on the ground floor there was only a bathroom with WC, wash hand basin and bath/shower.

Stairs then led up to the first floor where at the back of property there was a kitchen and off the kitchen there was a small room with another WC and wash hand basin.

At the front of the first floor there were two double bedrooms that had been subdivided, each into two rooms, by installing a partition with a door to give access to the newly formed rooms. There was no separate access into the newly formed rooms.

Stairs led up to the second floor where there was a very small kitchen which had had its door removed. I commented on the inadequate kitchen facilities and I was informed that everyone living in the accommodation worked at the restaurant below.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.
5. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any “irresponsible promotions” in relation to the premises.

In this condition, an “irresponsible promotion” means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:

 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:
 - i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

8. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

9. The responsible person shall ensure that:
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:
 - Children and Young Persons Act 1933
 - Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
 - Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985
2. The times that the licence authorises the supply of alcohol does not prohibit:
 - a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
 - b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
 - d) the supply to, or consumption by, any person of alcohol in any premises where they are residing.
3. Suitable beverages other than alcohol, including drinking water, shall be equally available for consumption with or otherwise as an ancillary to meals served in the licensed premises.
4. The premises must be bona fide used for the purpose of habitually providing the customary main meal at midday or in the evening, or both for the accommodation of persons frequenting the premises.
5. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied on the premises otherwise than to persons taking table meals there and for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to his meal.
6. The sale of alcohol is not authorised after midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight.

7. On any day that music and dancing ends between midnight and two o'clock in the morning the sale of alcohol shall cease when the music and dancing end.
8. The sale of alcohol shall cease at midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight;
9. Where music and dancing end between midnight on any Sunday and 00.30hours, sale of alcohol on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.
10. Where music and dancing end between midnight and 02.00 hours on any Sundays immediately before a bank holidays the sale of alcohol on that Sunday shall cease when the music and dancing end.
11. The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
12. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time in the premises shall not exceed the following:
 - Ground Floor - 80
13. The licence is subject to the following Additional Conditions referred to in the Standard Conditions for Places of Public Entertainment:
 - ADDITIONAL CONDITION GO: APPLICABLE TO THE KEEPING OF GOOD ORDER.
 - ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS SX: FOR PARTICULAR CONTROL OVER STRIPTease OR SIMILAR ENTERTAINMENT INVOLVING NUDITY.
14. The licence shall be subject to the Council's standard conditions for Places of Entertainment
15. The licence shall be subject to the Council's technical standards for Places of Entertainment

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

16. Doors and windows to the premises will be kept closed at all times except for entry and exit.
17. The licensee shall provide one door supervisor registered with the SIA from 22:00 until 30 minutes after the terminal hour on Fridays and Saturdays.
18. No more than 10 customers are permitted outside the premises after 23:00.
19. No alcohol shall be taken outside the premises at any time.
20. There shall be no new admissions to the premises after 01:00.
21. A dedicated licensed taxi/mini cab service shall be available from the premises.
22. The name and telephone number of the person in charge of the premises shall be displayed in a prominent position so that it can be seen from outside the premises.

23. There shall be no disposal of bottles or refuse in the rear yard or other outside areas between the hours of 23:00 – 07:00.
24. Signs shall be erected in the premises requiring patrons to book taxis in advance before leaving the premises.
25. An acoustic lobby shall be installed to prevent noise breakout to the premises to the satisfaction of the Council's Noise Team.
26. That the premises operate a closing down procedure as follows:-
 - Music shall be reduced to ambient background levels half an hour prior to closing.
 - For the last half hour, the lighting should be gradually increased so that by closing time, the lighting will be brought up to full beam.
 - As people are being asked to leave, door supervisors, should be outside encouraging people to disperse from the area and not allowing them to loiter on the frontage.
 - Managers shall supervise the dispersal of patrons from the premises, with the door supervisors until all customers have left the area.
 - Managers shall refuse entry to customers who are intoxicated or rowdy.
 - Managers shall refuse service to visibly intoxicated customers.
 - Managers shall maintain a refusals book.
 - A three strike rule shall be implemented for rowdy customers outside (and inside). If they will not quieten down, they are warned about their. If rowdy behaviour continues they should be warned a further one time and then if there is still no improvement, they should be barred from the premises.
27. Notices shall be prominently displayed at exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly and to refrain from parking or walking down Berrimen Road.
28. The premises will advertise a taxi booking system and any guests leaving the premises will be permitted to wait inside the premises until the taxi arrives. The collection point for the taxi's shall be on the Seven Sisters Road.
29. That a comprehensive CCTV system be installed that ensures all areas of the licensed premises are monitored including all entry and exit points and which enable frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition, and a camera cover the customers smoking area. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. (ii) Tape recordings shall be made available to an authorised Council officer or a police officer together with facilities for viewing. (iii) The recordings for the preceding two days shall be made available immediately on request. Recordings outside this period shall be made available on 24 hours notice.
30. The licensee shall install a sound-limiting device on the premises. The device shall be installed and calibrated to the Council's satisfaction within 28 days from the date of this licence. The sound limitation device installed at the premises shall not be altered from any setting fixed by the Council,

and that the Council may inspect the efficiency and setting of the sound limitation device at any reasonable time. All amplified music played within the premises shall be subject to the control of an entertainment noise control system. All pre-recorded music played through the in-house music system shall be controlled by an automatic electronic noise limiting device which restricts the sound system output to below pre-set threshold levels.

I am writing with regard to the Licence Review for Arda 2 restaurant (...which in fact turns into a night club) on behalf of several local residents in Newington Barrow Way. We have grave concerns about this licence. Whilst not wishing to deny anyone the opportunity to enjoy themselves, or run a business, it must be noted that Arda 2 customers create significant disturbance late at night and into the small hours of the morning (4 a.m. is not unusual), being drunk, disorderly, fighting and frequently leaving vomit etc on our pavements.

This has been going on for years now and any complaints have been disregarded, and (one presumes) the owners of the business have removed the public notifications from e.g. lamp posts in the area. Such notices were not anyway posted beyond the immediate area of (i.e. literally just outside) the premises.

We also have issues with the delivery of stock, particularly alcohol being delivered to these premises in what one could call a cavalier fashion, and at all hours of the day and night.

Thank you for your notice that there has been a request for a review of the premises licence for the property above. I write as a resident of Berriman Road with first hand knowledge but also as a local representative with concerns for those living in Corker Walk and Seven Sisters Road.

Over the years I have myself been disturbed and received numerous complaints from others about loud music, raised voices and occasional fracas involving the clientele of Arda 2. I have spoken to the licensee who is always apologetic but seems to have little control over what happens. I am unclear whether the acoustic lobby required by the Licensing Committee in October 2012 was ever installed. Since much of the disturbance still takes place in the early hours of the morning I think it unlikely that the permitted hours are being adhered to.

I am not surprised that the police have concerns about the alleged supplying and use of hard drugs on the premises. I was concerned to know it is suspected that patrons also have access to firearms. I am afraid that as a consequence I support the view of the police that the premises should close pending a full review of the licence.

I write with regard to the use of the premises and the opening hours of the restaurant.

Planning permission granted consent on the 13 November 1975 for the use of the ground floor of 156A Seven Sisters Road, N7, as a licensed restaurant involving a new shop front.

Attached to the planning approval are two conditions, and it is condition 2 that I wish to bring to your attention (copy enclosed for your information). This condition states that *no business shall be carried out on any Sunday or Bank Holiday nor between the hours of 11pm on one day and 9pm on the next day.*

In principle this condition allows the restaurant to trade Monday-Friday and Saturday from 9.00am in the morning until 11.00pm in the evening and no opening on Sunday or Bank Holidays.

I visited the restaurant as part of a joint operation with the Police and Environmental Health on Friday 19 July 2013 as part of operation Red Kite. During the visit, the person in charge of the restaurant at that time, indicated that the premises stayed open until 3.00am. This is clearly

contrary to the condition attached to the planning approval and this breach may be considered for formal action in the form of a breach of condition notice.

To help the planning investigation, I would be grateful if you could confirm the date you took over the business. In addition, if you could confirm the days and times the business trades that would assist in this investigation.

If the restaurant has been trading on Sundays and Bank Holidays and beyond the hours indicated on the planning approval for more than ten years continuously, then you can apply for a certificate of lawfulness under sections 191-2 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended). This will confirm in law that the business can continue to trade outside the days and times as specified by condition mentioned earlier providing the certificate is granted.

I would be grateful if you could supply the information requested in this letter **in writing within 14 days from the date of this letter**. If it is clear that a breach has occurred, then the Council will consider issuing a breach of condition notice on you and anyone with an interest in the property. Non compliance with this type of notice is a criminal offence punishable with a fine of up to £2,500.

- 1) Annex (3) Condition (17) be amended to: There shall be a minimum of two (2) SIA qualified door supervisors from an SIA accredited company working Thursday to Saturday from 2100 hours to thirty (30) minutes after the venue closes. And all persons shall be searched by door supervisors and monitored by the premises CCTV
- 2) All persons working at the venue shall provide their name, National Insurance number and passport/ proof of identity to the licensee. These names, National Insurance numbers and proof of identity will be recorded by the licensee, photocopies will be made of proof of identity and will be made available immediately to police or other authorised officer.
- 3) Any person suspected of possessing or using drugs on the premises will immediately be removed from the premises by the DPS, barred from entering the premises again and shall be reported to police.
- 4) All staff shall be trained in relevant Licensing Law. The licensee shall keep records of this training which will be signed by the trainer and trainee.
- 5) After 2300 hours all customers / staff wishing to leave the venue and to return, for example, to smoke, shall be issued with a wrist band, the maximum number of wrist bands restricted to 10. On re-entry the wrist band shall be returned to staff.
- 6) Door supervisors to monitor the number of customers in the venue every Thursday to Saturday by using a clicker device.
