AGE UK Islington (AUKI) adopted the ONE AGE UK approach to our work.

We have developed and tested a standard approach that works across the range of service types and across service systems.

- It works at an individual client level
- At an individual case level
- Across One Age UK Services including ICH

It is based on two common and easy to understand questions

- How well is someone functioning?
- How able are they to deal with things themselves?

It is the core of the One Age UK approach.

Our Contact Centre has a duty team consisting of a member of staff from each services area including Islington Carers Hub (ICH), Locality Navigation Service, Enablement Service and a Floating duty worker.

The four duty desks are responsible to covering all enquires from their own specific duty line and the generic AUKI contact number.

There are a variety of ways that an enquiry or referral comes in to AUKI including phone calls, self presentation at the Contact Centre or email. This enables ICH to identify hidden carers that would not have previously been identified.

Flexible Breaks Fund from ICH

The Fund is for carers who are in need of some support with their caring role but neither they nor the person they are caring for is getting support or a Personal Budget from Social Services. Carers are required to have a Carers Assessment in order to apply.

Awards range from £200 for individual up to £ 600 for a family Application restriction of 1 application every 2 years but priority is mainly given to carers that have never benefited from the fund

Islington Carers Hub have a partnership arrangement with the University College London Medical School to deliver Carer Awareness training to medical students.

The selected carers who volunteer their time have the opportunity to discuss and answer any questions the students have relating to long term health condition of a patient on unpaid carers such as family and friends.

CARERS ASSESSMENTS by ISLINGTON CARERS HUB

- ICH carries out Carers Assessment for carers whose cared for is not currently in receipt of service from Social Services
- A Carers Assessment will consider the impact the care and support you provide is having on your own wellbeing
- A carer's assessment looks at the different ways caring affects your life.
- All Carers Assessments are followed up with the completion of a Support Plan.
- ICH worker will use the assessment to identify your support needs, and to discuss how these could be met.
- The ICH worker will discuss with the carer the various community and wider support networks that exist within the borough.



Carers Emergency Card

This card is for peace of mind for carers, knowing that someone will take care of their loved ones in an emergency.

- The Carers Emergency Card Scheme is for all unpaid adult carers caring for someone living in Islington.
- Nominate two people to be contacted in an emergency.
- Get a small card to keep in your wallet or purse with a unique ID number and an emergency phone number.
- All details are registered securely with Islington Council.





Work with GP surgeries

- Supporting GP surgeries to identify carers on their lists
- Talks to staff teams
- Posters and leaflets in waiting rooms
- Information packs and registration forms mailed out to carers
- Covering letter from GPs to introduce and promote our services
- Reaching hidden carers

Total clients who are registered as carers with ICH = 2128 70% are female, 30% male

The highest age group are those in their 50's30%

We are registering an averaging of approx. 37 new carers per month

We are working with an averaging of approx. 50 all carers per month

We are working an averaging of approx. 82 new cases per month

Case work analysis = Carers Assessments, Emergency Carers Card, FBF, Education/Training, Emotional support, Benefit checks including CA etc.

Housing related case work = 13.0%

Clients YoY growth = **68.3**%

Cases YoY growth = 153.6%



HOUSING SERVICES: Islington Carers - Mini Survey


- 1. 110 carer clients identified ICH Case Work involving housing related issues in last 12 months.


