Subject: LICENSING ACT 2003 - TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE
RE: FESTAC, 148 HOLLOWAY ROAD, LONDON, 8DD

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The TEN is to allow:
 - The sale of alcohol and the provision of entertainment from 21:00 on Sunday 28 May until 0430 on Monday 29th May. Please note this is a Bank Holiday Monday.
- 1.3 The nature of the event is described on the application form as being for a promoted private Birthday party. The applicant has stated that the last entry into the event will be at 02:00 and that the event will end at 04:30. The applicant has confirmed that he will comply with all the conditions of the premises licence currently in place at the premises.
- 1.4 The premises hold a premises licence for the following activities and to the following times;
 - The provision of regulated entertainment, the exhibition of films, the performance of live music, the playing of recorded music and the performance of dance from 08:00 until 00:00 Sunday to Wednesday, from 08:00 until 02:00 Thursdays and from 08:00 until 04:00 Friday and Saturday.
- 1.5 The temporary event notice is applied for under Part 5, Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.6 This application is subject to a representation from the Police Licensing Team relating to the following licensing objective :

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance

- 1.7 This objection related to an incident on the last occasion a temporary event was granted on a bank holiday Sunday evening. The event resulted in a large fight involving a weapon, where two people sustained injuries which resulted in them having to receive hospital treatment.
- 1.8 The licence holder would not provide any details of the incident. Similarly, officers requested the CCTV with 24 hours in line with premises licence condition Annex 2, Condition 2, however, the bar owner stated he would give the CCTV, but not for three days. The CCTV was provided to officers on Friday 19 May.



With reference to the above application, we are writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue already operates a license which allows for the sale of alcohol on the dates requested Until 0200hrs.

The venue operated under a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) on 30th April 2017 allowing for the venue to remain open until 0430hrs on 01/05/2017.

On this occasion at approximately 0400hrs Police on routine patrol came across a large disturbance/fight involving a group of 20 males and females, all of whom stated they had come from Festac. During this disturbance two males were injured and a claw hammer was found at the scene. All persons entering Festac should be searched on entry. It is possible that the claw hammer was retrieved from outside the club, but very unlikely.

The following report was made by the Officers who attended the scene.

At approximately 0400 hours on MONDAY 01/05/2017 officers came across a large fight in the street on HOLLOWAY ROAD, N7 opposite FESTAC BAR 148 HOLLOWAY ROAD N7. There were approximately 20 people fighting and a short handled claw hammer was found with blood on it.

Two victims had sustained injuries that required hospital treatment. One had a very nasty head injury.

All people involved had been at a party in FESTAC BAR. This was a private event and it is unknown what happened to start the fight as no one wanted to assist police by telling us what happened. This included the bar owner who would not provide any details either however stated he would give CCTV but not for three days.

The bar owner, who is the applicant for this TEN, is described as being unhelpful?

The Bar owner also stated that CCTV could not be provided for 3 days. This is a breach of the current CCTV condition on the license which states that CCTV footage will be provided within 24hrs or immediately if required for the immediate investigation of an offence.

Based on these reported facts we are objecting to this application.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

There are further 'Mandatory conditions' applicable to licences authorising the supply of alcohol. A full list of the current mandatory conditions is available from the licensing pages on Islington's web site, www.islington.gov.uk. This list is subject to change by order of the Secretary of State and licensees and other responsible persons are advised to ensure they are aware of the latest conditions.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, consumed in or taken from the premises except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means the authorised hours specified on this licence for the sale by retail of alcohol. This restriction does not prohibit:
 - a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
 - b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
 - d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
 - h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

2. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours for the sale by retail of alcohol unless one of the following applies:
 - a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
 - d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

3. Unless otherwise specified on this licence no regulated entertainment shall take place at the premises with the exception of pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dancing for pre-invited guests.
4. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:
 - Children and Young Persons Act 1933
 - Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
 - Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985
5. Alcohol may be sold or supplied to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the permitted hours for the sale or supply of alcohol shall be one hour less than the terminal hour specified above; in such circumstances there shall be no sale or supply of alcohol between 15.00 and 19.00 on Christmas Day.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. Polycarbonate drinking vessels only to be used. All glass bottles to be decanted, with the exception of wine, champagne and spirit bottles. Staff will clear all empty glass bottles promptly.
2. CCTV shall be installed, operated, and maintained in agreement with the police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date, and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an authorised or a police officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow officers to view recordings and if required by a police officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business, then police must be informed.
3. Regarding promoted events, Metropolitan Police Risk Assessment form 696 must be completed and submitted to the Metropolitan Clubs and Vice Unit and Islington Police Licensing Units with at least 14 days notice. Form 696A to be submitted within 3 days of the completion of the event.

4. When alcohol and regulated entertainment are both provided after midnight then not less than two SIA registered door supervisors will be employed from 10pm until 30 after closing time on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. When regulated entertainment is not provided at premises then 1 security personnel per 80 customers shall be provided from 10pm until 30 minutes after closing time on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Door Supervisors Register – A register shall be maintained recording all SIA door supervisors employed at the premises. This shall include their name, badge number, the agency they work for (if any) and the time they start and finish work.
5. On any occasion when entertainment is being provided by means of a DJ and/or live music, all patrons visiting the premises will be searched by means of an electronic hand held wand. All visiting DJs will be searched upon arrival. There will be at least 2 fully functional wands in use at the premises.
6. Electronic searching equipment shall be maintained in working order. A register shall be kept recording the details of the maintenance, which must be carried out by a qualified person. All Door Supervisors must be trained in the use of this equipment and a record kept of this training.
7. When alcohol and/or public entertainment is provided by way of music and dancing the premises will operate an admission and photo-id database system at all times.
8. To have a dedicated minicab company and customers to wait inside the premises until their taxi arrives.
9. There shall be notices placed at exit points and within the male and female toilets reminding guests to leave quietly. In addition the management, staff and door staff will remind customers to leave quietly and discourage them from loitering outside.
10. The phone number of a responsible manager shall be advertised at the entrance so as to be visible from outside the premises and they shall be contactable during the hours of operation and for half an hour after closing time.
11. The premises shall be in accordance with the Technical Standards for Places of Entertainment.
12. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time in the premises shall not exceed 260. Within this number the number of persons accommodated at any one time in each specific area shall not exceed the following:
Basement Bar – 200
Ground Floor Bar – 60: and
Mezzanine Level – 40.
13. The licensee shall ensure that at all times that this licence is in operation, all amplified sound and music played on the premises is subject to the control of an entertainment noise control system. The system must be set to maximum music noise levels in all areas of use approved by and in conjunction with the Councils Noise Team
14. The entertainment noise control system shall be monitored, checked and calibrated as necessary, so that the approved levels by the Council, are not exceeded. In the event of notification that noise nuisance has been witnessed by an authorised officer, the Licensee shall immediately reduce sound levels being played out and recalibrate the sound system. They shall provide a copy of a calibration certificate from an accredited acoustic consultant to the Noise Team within 14 days of any notification.
15. Last entry to the premises is 2am when opening is beyond midnight. No re-entry apart from smokers.
16. Smoking area to be limited to maximum of 8 persons at any time.
17. No persons under 21 shall be permitted on the premises without prior approval in writing or e-mail notification by the Police Licensing Team.

18. The DPS shall work at the premises from 9pm until 30 minutes after closing whenever the premises are open after midnight.
19. The DPS shall be in the sole managerial control of all aspects of compliance of the premises with the licence, including the licence conditions and the licensing objectives.
