SOURCED MARKET, GROUND FLOOR, 7-12 GOSWELL ROAD, LONDON EC1M 7AH

## 1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to:
  - i. Supply alcohol for consumption on the premises from 11:00 until 22:00 Monday to Sunday;
  - ii. Opening hours of the premises from 07:00 to until 20:00 Monday to Sunday.
- 1.3 The application was amended to the above hours with additional conditions on 10 May.
- 1.4 The application was further amended at LSC on 22 May and an additional condition added to the operating schedule.

3.2 The premises is currently unlicensed.

## 4. Planning Implications

- 4.1 The Certificate was for the "proposed use of ancillary food and beverage service at ground floor to serve Hotel customers". The cover letter also states that it "is proposed to create an ancillary food and beverage offer at the ground floor level of 7-21 Goswell Road to serve customers of the hotel". Furthermore, the covering letter went on to state that "it is anticipated that the revenue from hotel guests will represent approximately 90% of Sourced Market's total revenue". It is evident that the proposed use is to be ancillary to the hotel use, primarily serving the hotel customers but with an element of service to the general public.
- 4.2 The planning officer has stated that, "Should this position change, and Sourced Market is no longer considered ancillary to the hotel use whereby the café/shop is primarily serving the general public with diminished service to the hotel customers, then a material change of use will have occurred and enforcement case may be opened, whereby we would request an application for the change of use from C1 hotel to mixed C1/A3 (hotel/café) use, which may or may not be granted planning permission but would go to public consultation.."

#### 5 Recommendations

- 5.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5.2 To consider that this address is in the Bunhill Saturation or "Cumulative Impact Policy" of Islington. This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences, club premises certificates, or variation applications that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, unless the applicant can demonstrate why the operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact or otherwise impact adversely on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

5.3 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:

- i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 4)
- ii. any conditions deemed appropriate by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.(see appendix 4)

## 6 Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

6.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions as appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.



## AMENDED HOURS for the sale and supply of alcohol 10am until 10pm Monday to Sunday inclusive

### **Proposed Conditions**

- Food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 2. Alcohol consumed on the premises shall be served by waiter/waitress service only.

There is a lot of housing in the area, so the amount of noise should be minimised to avoid causing a public nuisance and disrupting residents' lives. I would therefore like the Council to consider imposing conditions on the licence as follows:

Licensing hours to be limited to 8am to 11pm all week (i.e. no extension on Fridays or Saturdays - or if there is, limited to hotel residents only)

No drinking to be permitted on the pavement or outside the premises (in particular, no chairs or tables outside and no open doors or windows after 9pm)

The management should take action to ensure that people do not drink outside or congregate outside to smoke after 9pm

My concern as a resident with regard to this licensing application is to ask why the sale of alcohol llicence applied for both on and off the premises is requested for 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. over 5 days and 8 a.m. to midinight 2 days a week i.e an 8 a.m. start 7 days a week.

The opening hours (which may be different from their licences) of local licensed premises are as follows:

The Wine Shop Mon 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. Tuesday Wed Thur Fri 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Sat noon to 10 p.m.

The Shakespeare public house Mon to Fri midday to 11p.m Sat 5 p.m. to 11 p.m.

Venezia Restaurant Mon to Fri midday to 10 p.m Sat 5:30 p.m to 10 p.m.

My concern relates to the possible and what might become actual sale of alcohol to customers from 8 a.m. in the morning.

The only customers in the early hours of the day would likely be very serious alcoholics and I don't think any good will come from the encouragement of such people into even more alcohol consumption.

So my question is why should Sourced Market have a licence to sell alcohol both on and off the premises 3 to 4 hours before other local licenneed premises?

## Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. Food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 2. Alcohol consumed on the premises shall be served by waiter/waitress service only.
- 3. The capacity of the premises shall be limited to 45 customers.
- 4. There shall be no vertical drinking at the premises.
- 5. Alcohol shall not be allowed in the external seating area after 22:00.
- 6. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business then Police must be informed.
- 7. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.
- 8. Except for any designated external seating areas, sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be in sealed containers.
- 9. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 10. No bottling out, no waste collections and no deliveries between 22:00 hours and 08:00 hours the following morning.
- 11. No noise and vibration shall emanate from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 12. The premises licence holder will maintain a documented policy setting out measures to protect children from harm. The policy should consider all activities associated with the premises including the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises.
- 13. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25 and the BII National Standards Proof of Age scheme.
- 14. All staff should be trained on Challenge 25 and the policy setting out measures to protect children from harm.
- 15. There shall be no primary cooking on the premises.
- 16. There shall be no off sales made through delivery drivers.
- 17. The tables and chairs on the frontage of the premises be cleared away or rendered unusable and cleared of patrons by 22:00 hours.
- 18. The premises will operate as an ancillary hotel food and beverage facility, predominately serving hotel customers, with some incidental trade with members of the public.
