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**Subject: LICENSING ACT 2003 - TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE
SPORTS BAR & GRILL, UNIT E, COWCROSS PLACE, COWCROSS STREET,
LONDON EC1M 6DH**

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is a hearing to determine a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) in respect of the above premises. The application was submitted on the 12 January 2018 and is seeking to allow:
- The sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises, the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late night refreshment from 22:30 to 05:30 on Sunday 4 to Monday 5 February 2018.
- 1.2 The premises hold a current premises licence and the TEN is being sought in order to extend the permitted licensed hours for the screening of the NFL Super Bowl.
- 1.3 This application is subject to a representation from Islington's Noise Service in relation to the promotion of the following licencing objectives:
- i. The prevention of Public Nuisance

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the TEN under Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 as the Licensing Sub-Committee consider appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

2.2 The Committee can decide to:

- i. allow the TEN for the specified event;
- ii. allow the TEN, subject to one or more conditions of the existing premises licence; or
- iii. prohibit the TEN by way of a counter notice.

3.1 The premises have sought TENs in respect of the Super Bowl every year since 2012 as follows:



A TEN was granted for the last Superbowl last year and they have been granted in previous years. Last year's Superbowl attracted a call from a local resident as follows:

"Loud roaring coming from the Farringdon sports bar".

The Officer's report of visit is as follows:

Called comp @ 00:26 left a message. Vste @ 01:20 checked premise the sports bar and grill 19-25 cowcross Street we could hear loud cheering and shouting coming from the inside we approached and identified ourselves to the door supervisor and asked for the manger we explained that we have received complaints regarding loud noise he said that they have a temporary vents licence as they are playing the super Bowl(American football) the manager said that it will be difficult to control but they will try. CM08 left @ 01:47

The CM078 coding on the report indicates a possible statutory nuisance. The officers were unable to verify this as access to the resident was not possible. They do report they could hear loud cheering and shouting from Cowcross Street however and the manager at the premises by his own admission was not able to control the noise of the patrons at the premises at the event.

The Sports bar is in Cowcross Place which is a small precinct set off Cowcross Street. The officers state they could hear the noise from there which indicates a significant number of residents were most likely disturbed by this noise. There is a block of flats called City Pavilion directly above the sports bar and other residences in close vicinity.

Looking at our files we had another call from an anonymous resident in connection with unwanted noise from the Superbowl event at the Sports bar in on 8/2/16 at 01:25 as follows:

"Rep believes super bowl is going on and the clients of the sport bar and grill is showing it and the clients are extremely noisy shouting and hollering"

We have another call on our system dated 2/2/15 in relation to an event the previous evening:

"I live above the Sports Bar and Grill in Farringdon, in a development called City Pavilion (33 Britton Street). The Sports Bar and Grill was open last night until 3am, and the noise level was terrible - by far the worst noise problem I have experienced"

Other calls were received on 2/2/15 as follows:

"Noise nuisance from the Sports bar"

02:56: "Sports bar and grill on cowcross causing loud noise with people cheering and shouting"

The Night Safe reports in relation to these calls are pasted below:

03:01. SPORTS BAR AND GRILL: Ref: FI-1352086. We received a call from ASB control with regards to a noise complaint made by a local resident, who was complaining about cheering and chanting coming from SPORTS BAR AND GRILL. On arrival to the premises we could hear patrons inside cheering and it was obvious the premises was showing the Super Bowl. We spoke with the doorman and manager about our attendance to the premises, which was in response to a noise complaint. We requested the manager and doorman control their patrons inside and try to keep the noise to a minimum to prevent any further noise complaints. The manager apologised and explained there was only a few seconds left of the game. He also explained they have laid out barriers to assist in the

dispersal of patrons. Whilst at the premises we informed the doorman and manager about Operation Nightsafe and provided them with a business card. The manager thanked us for our attendance and again apologised about the noise.

Further report timed at 03:46:

We continued our foot patrol around SPORTS BAR AND GRILL to check for any further noise concerns. On arrival we noticed the premises had recently closed and the majority of patrons had left the area. We stood to and monitored the remaining patrons as they entered awaiting taxis. Crime prevention advice was provided to members of the public regarding illegal taxis around the area. We were thanked for our advice and concern. We returned to our patrol vehicle and parked it in a strategic location to act as a visual deterrent and also to observe for illegal taxi touts. Numerous patrons approached us to ask for directions to a nearby tube station. We provided them with information and crime prevention advice about openly displaying their mobile phones. We were thanked for our assistance.

Pollution team is of the opinion the premises cannot control noise from this event and it does not support the promotion of the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance. We therefore request that Licensing Committee refuse this application.



Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

There are further 'Mandatory conditions' applicable to licences authorising the supply of alcohol. A full list of the current mandatory conditions is available from the licensing pages on Islington's web site, www.islington.gov.uk. This list is subject to change by order of the Secretary of State and licensees and other responsible persons are advised to ensure they are aware of the latest conditions.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. Unless otherwise specified on this licence no regulated entertainment shall take place at the premises with the exception of pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dancing for pre-invited guests.
2. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:


Children and Young Persons Act 1933
Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985
3. No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public.
4. Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the police.
5. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.
6. The reasonable requirements of the fire officer shall be complied with.
7. The reasonable requirements of the building control officer shall be complied with.
8. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting that the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
9. Persons under the age of 18 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 22.00.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. The licensee shall appoint a noise consultant registered with the Institute of Acoustics or Association of Noise Consultants to prepare a scheme of sound insulation and noise control measures, which may include the installation of a noise limiting device, to prevent persons in the neighbourhood from being unreasonably disturbed by noise of music from the premises. The scheme shall be submitted for approval by the Council, and the approved scheme fully implemented to the satisfaction of the Council and the licensee notified in writing accordingly, prior to the premises being used for music and dancing.
2. Bottling out from the premises between 22.00 hours and 07.00 hours on any day of the week is prohibited.
3. The outside seating areas shall be cleared, closed and rendered unusable by 21:00 every day and patrons shall not be permitted to take food or drinks outside of the premises after 21.00. The applicant shall provide ropes and posts to cordon off the curtilage of the premises to ensure that the residents of City Pavillion, Zinc House and any other residence have unimpeded access to the entrance of their properties and notices shall be displayed on the premises to that effect.
4. The licensee shall employ a dedicated cab company and devise a system for collection of customers that will minimise disturbance to local residents.
5. Doors and windows to the premises will be kept closed after 21.00 everyday.
6. From 15th May to 15th September annually at least one SIA registered door supervisor will be employed at the premises on a Friday evening from 21:00 until 30 minutes after closing and will be tasked with minimising patron noise outside the premises ensuring that external areas are operated in accordance with the management plan in force at these premises.
7. Signage inside the premises shall be displayed asking patrons to leave in a considerate manner and to remind patrons to use the toilet facilities prior to leaving the premises.
8. The phone number of a responsible manager shall be advertised at the entrance and they shall be contactable during the hours of operation and one hour after the closing time.
9. The premises shall operate at all times in accordance with a management plan, a copy of which shall be produced upon request by the licensing authority, a responsible authority or interested party.
