1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The premises currently holds a licence allowing:
 - The sale by retail of alcohol, deliveries only, Mondays to Saturdays from 11:00 until 23:00 and Sundays from 11:00 until 22:30;
 - The provision of late night refreshment (Phone orders and delivery only), Mondays to Thursdays from 23:00 until 01:00 the following day, Fridays & Saturdays from 23:00 until 02:00 the following day and Sundays from 23:00 until 00:00; and
 - The premises to be open to the public, Mondays to Saturdays from 11:00 until 23:00 and Sundays from 11:00 until 22:30.
- 1.3 The variation application is to allow:
 - The sale by retail of alcohol, on & off supplies, Mondays to Saturdays from 11:00 until 23:00 and Sundays from 11:00 until 22:30;
 - The provision of late night refreshment, Mondays to Thursdays from 23:00 until 01:00 the following day, Fridays & Saturdays from 23:00 until 02:00 the following day and Sundays from 23:00 until 00:00;

- The premises to be open to the public, Mondays to Thursdays from 11:00 until 01:00 the following day, Fridays & Saturdays from 11:00 until 02:00 the following day and Sundays from 11:00 until 00:00; and
- Non-standard timings until 03:00 the following day for Late Night Refreshment and Opening Hours on the below days:

Vaisakhi, Diwali, Valentine's Day, Eid, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

It will be ensured that all four licensing objectives will be promoted as detailed in each section below:

-Only wines and beer shall be sold by the premises.

-Alcohol will be served auxiliary to food

-Alcohol will only be sold accompanied by food of the menu

-Alcohol will only be purchased from an approved supplier and purchase receipt will be made available for inspection upon request by a relevant officer of a responsible authority.

-Part A (the full Premises Licence) either the original or a certified copy should be retained at the premises for production to an authorised person.

-Part B (the summary of the Premises Licence) should be prominently displayed at the venue where it can be easily read by anyone wishing to do so. Please note that both pages of the summary should be visible.

-No alcohol shall be sold after 23:00 Monday-Saturday, 22:30 Sunday.

-Vehicles used for delivery must switch of their engines when waiting outside of the Premises for the collection of food for delivery.

-Drivers shall wait inside the premises between deliveries/for deliveries.

-Home deliveries shall only be carried out by in-house employees of the business.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the Minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.

-The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31-day period.

-A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

-Joining neighbourhood schemes and liaising with the local police.

-Appropriate staff training in responsible alcohol retailing to be completed, training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a relevant officer of a responsible authority.

-Highly visible sign outside the premises that shows opening hours under the terms of the premises license during which licensable activities are permitted.

-Prominent signage indicating the permitted hours for the late night refreshment shall be displayed so as to be visible before entering the premises.

-Adequate lighting provided inside and outside the premises.

-No serving of alcohol to persons who are intoxicated.

-Abide by the law

c) Public safety

-To comply with all current, fire and health and safety legislation as required by the law.

-Health and safety risk assessments to be carried out regularly

-All employees will receive training on health and safety & food safety

-Staff to be trained in fire evacuation procedures

-Installation of appropriate and adequate safety equipment

d) The prevention of public nuisance

-No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure

of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

-All staff shall be trained; training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a relevant officer of a responsible authority.

-Notice to customers regarding consideration shall be displayed at the entrance and exit

-Deliveries of goods will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby businesses and residents. Staff who arrive in the morning or depart late at night will be asked not to cause disturbance to nearby residents.

-Depositing of waste will be at times that minimise any nuisance to nearby neighbours.

-Strict policy not to serve drunken customers.

-All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

-No rubbish will be moved, removed or placed outside between the hours of 23:00 and 08:00.

-Monitor anti-social behaviour through CCTV.

-DPS contact details shall be clearly displayed for the public living with the vicinity

- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer or the Police

e) The protection of children from harm

-Valid ID (UK driver's license or a passport) and all staff will be trained on how to tell whether the ID is authentic.

-Alcohol will not be sold unless a valid ID document is produced in these cases. A sign explaining all this will be prominently displayed at the premises.

-Appropriate staff training in responsible alcohol retailing to be completed, training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a relevant officer of a responsible authority.

-Challenge 25 to be implemented strictly, acceptable forms of proof of age will be a passport, a photo card driving licence or pass accredited identification card.

-Refusal book shall be operated and maintained.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.
- 3. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
 - Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

There are further 'Mandatory conditions' applicable to licences authorising the supply of alcohol. A full list of the current mandatory conditions is available from the licensing pages on Islington's web site, <u>www.islington.gov.uk</u>. Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. There will be no external or internal advertisement at the premises indicating the sale of alcohol other than via the internet.
- 2. Regarding all off sales by way of delivery from telephone/internet orders, the following will be adhered to:
 - a) Alcohol will be served auxiliary to food;
 - b) No more than four beers of 330ml or a 750ml bottle of wine per meal;
 - Couriers will be trained on relevant aspects of the Licensing Act 2003 including underage sales, sales to a person who is drunk, obtaining alcohol for a child or a person who is drunk and delivering alcohol to someone under that age of 18;
 - d) Any person taking an order for the supply of alcohol on behalf of the premises licence holder will inform all customers that proof of age by way of photographic driving licence, passport or a form of identification with the PASS hologram will be required before alcohol is supplied; and
 - e) A delivery register to include the full details of any order for the supply of alcohol to be maintained and available for inspection by a Police Officer or authorised Officer for a period of 31 days.
- 3. When the premises is providing late night refreshment after 23:00 the following conditions will be complied with:
 - a) The premises must be closed to the public;
 - b) Sales are by way of deliveries only;
 - c) There must be no external advertisement to suggest the premises is open for business;
 - The premises must have adequate shutters/blinds so as not to emit any light from the premises or give any persons the impression it is open for walk in trade;
 - e) Any advertisement in any media form for customers must clearly state deliveries only; and
 - f) Any deliveries from online/telephone sales must be to a recognisable royal mail address and not to persons outside of buildings/dwellings.

- 4. Home deliveries shall only be carried out by in-house employees of the business
- 5. Vehicles used for delivery must switch of their engines when waiting outside of the Premises for the collection of food for delivery.
- 6. Drivers shall wait inside the premises between deliveries/for deliveries.
- 7. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained, at all times that the premises is open for licensable activities, so as to comply with the following criteria:
 - a) The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, shall be kept and made available to Police or authorised Council officers on request;
 - b) The Police must be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason;
 - c) One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering;
 - d) The system will provide full coverage of the interior of the premises and any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public;
 - e) The system shall record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped;
 - Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided free of charge to Police or authorised Council officers on request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request; and
 - g) At all times, there will be a person on the premises who can operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request and to supply a copy of footage immediately to Police to assist with the immediate investigation of an offence.
- 8. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to the police or an authorised officer, which will record the following:
 - a) All crimes reported to the venue;
 - b) Any complaints received;
 - c) Any incidents of disorder;
 - d) Any faults in the CCTV system;
 - e) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service;
 - f) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- 9. Appropriate staff training in responsible alcohol retailing to be completed, training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a relevant officer of a responsible authority.
- 10. Alcohol will only be purchased from an approved supplier and purchase receipt will be made available for inspection upon request by a relevant officer of a responsible authority.
- 11. Challenge 25 policy will be implemented at the premises, acceptable forms of proof of age will be a passport, a photo card driving licence or pass accredited identification card.
- 12. Staff will be trained on how to tell whether proof of age ID is authentic. Record of all training will be available for inspection on the request of an authorised officer.
- 13. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

- 14. Notice shall be displayed reminding customers to respect the needs of local residents when leaving the premises.
- 15. Deliveries of goods will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby businesses and residents.
- 16. Staff who arrive in the morning or depart late at night will be asked not to cause disturbance to nearby residents.
- 17. Depositing of waste will be at times that minimise any nuisance to nearby neighbours.
- 18. Strict policy not to serve drunken customers.
- 19. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 20. No rubbish will be moved, removed or placed outside between the hours of 23:00 and 08:00.
- 21. Monitor anti-social behaviour through CCTV.
- 22. DPS contact details shall be clearly displayed for the public living with the vicinity.


