Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. The restrictions on hours during which the sale of alcohol is authorised does not prohibit:
- a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military
- 2. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.
- 3. A CCTV system shall be installed or the existing system maintained which is fit for the purpose. The system will incorporate a camera covering each of the entrance doors and be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
- 4. The CCTV system shall incorporate a recording facility and any recording shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of one calendar month. A system shall be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained. The system will comply with other essential legislation and all signs as required will be clearly displayed. The system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity. If the premises are using a video recording system, the cassette tape shall be used on no more than 12 occasions.
- 5. Adequate staff levels shall be maintained at all times. Such staff levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and Police.
- 6. Signage shall be displayed at the exit of the premises requesting customers leaving the premises late at night to do so quietly and with consideration so as not to disturb nearby residents.
- All cashiers will be trained to require evidence of age from any person seeking to buy alcohol and appearing to the cashier to be under the age of 18. The evidence shall be photographic, such as a passport or photographic driving licence until other effective identification technology (for example thumb print or pupil recognition) is introduced.
- 8. Prominent notices will be displayed at points of sale advising customers that they may be asked to provide evidence of age.

I have seen the application for Licence Variation from the above party and wish to object strongly to the proposed changes on the following grounds.

Prevention of public nuisance

- 1. The lifting of the restriction of alcohol being sold in an open container or to be consumed in the licensed premises would indicate that it will be some sort of bar. As a resident who lives directly opposite the premises I fear we will be plagued by noise, anti-social behaviour, litter and the other detritus that accompany public alcohol consumption. I have lived next door to public houses and speak from experience.
- 2. Removal of signage requesting customers to leave the premises quietly so as not to disturb residents suggests that the management anticipates that there will be noise late at night but offer no encouragement for patrons to consider the neighbours.
- 3. I am not convinced that the provision of "adequate waste receptacles in and around the premises" will do anything to alleviate problems of litter. The term "adequate" is used without any means of qualification. The same vagueness is used in reference to the staffing levels. How many is adequate? Adequate for what situation? How many customers do they expect to deal with?

The Prevention of crime & disorder

- 4. The idea of people consuming alcohol at a petrol station is not a good one as it makes drinking & driving more likely. Surely the Council should not be encouraging this? There have been instances of robbery at the petrol station during the years that I have lived opposite and I think anything that encourages higher traffic of people for longer periods will attract more crime.
- 5. There is an existing problem of young people from the adjacent estate congregating on the low walls at the entrance to the petrol station. The proposed changes will give them more reason to be there and will almost certainly encourage under-age drinking.

Public Safety

6. The exit of the petrol station is adjacent to a zebra crossing on an extremely busy main road. It is a rather awkward siting as it is also close to a busy junction. The combination of inebriated customers leaving the premises either on foot or driving and traffic negotiating a busy junction and two zebra crossings in close proximity at the brow of a hill, is an accident waiting to happen.

Protection of children from harm

7. The Licence holder's assurances that age verification policies will be in place is again very vague and unconvincing. A statement that staff will be "trained to ask any customer attempting to purchase alcohol who appears to be under 25" to ask for identification is meaningless. Staff can be trained to do anything, whether policies are actively enforced is another matter entirely. It is notoriously difficult to ascertain the ages of some young people as teenage girls in particular can be made up to look considerably older.

I believe that the proposed variations in the premises licence will do great harm to the quality of life for residents in the area through increased nuisance as well as creating potentially dangerous situations through the combination of alcohol and road traffic.

- 1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises,. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer subject to Data Protection legislation) within 24 hours of any request free of charge. There shall be a member of staff on duty at all times who can operate the CCTV in order for the police or appointed officer to view the CCTV footage.
- 2. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.
- Signage shall be displayed at the exit of the premises requesting customers leaving the premises late at night to do so quietly and with consideration so as not to disturb nearby residents.
- 4. The premises licence holder will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff. Such staff levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and police.
- 5. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers shall be provided in and immediately outside the premises.
- 6. The premises licence holder will ensure that an age verification policy will apply to the premises whereby all cashiers will be trained to ask any customer attempting to purchase alcohol, who appears to be under the age of 25 years (or older if the licence holder so elects) to produce, before being sold alcohol, identification being a passport or photocard driving licence bearing a holographic mark or other form of identification bearing a customer's photograph, date of birth and Proof of Age Standards Scheme (or similarly accredited scheme) hologram.
- 7. Prominent notices shall be displayed at points of sale advising customers that they may be asked to provide evidence of age.
- 8. All staff engaged or to be engaged in the sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive the following training in age restricted sales:
 - i. Induction training which must be completed and documented prior to the sale of alcohol by the staff member.
 - ii. Refresher/reinforcement training at intervals of no more than 6 months.
 - iii. Training records will be available for inspection by a police officer or other authorised officer on request
- 9. All cashiers shall be trained to record refusals of sales of alcohol in a refusals book/register. The book/register will contain:
 - i. details of the time and date the refusal was made;
 - ii. the identity of the staff member refusing the sale;
 - iii. details of the alcohol the person attempted to purchase.

This book/register will be available for inspection by a police officer or other authorised officer on request.
