

An Apple A Day, 621 Holloway Road, London N19 5SS

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The application is for a licence to allow:
 - the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises: 08:00 to 23:00 on Monday to Saturday and 08:00 to 22:00 on Sundays

- 3.2 The Police, four local residents and two local residents groups have submitted representations. The Noise Service submitted a representation with conditions attached. These conditions have been accepted by the applicant and the Noise Service has withdrawn their representation.
- 3.3 The premises previously held a premises licence for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises for 24hrs a day from Monday to Sunday. This licence was revoked at a committee hearing on 29th April 2014 after being reviewed by Trading Standards. The Trading Standards review related to the licensing objectives to protect children from harm and to prevent crime and disorder. The review particularly related to a sale of alcohol by the business to an underage volunteer, the presence on the premises of illicit goods including a seizure of non-UK duty wine and ongoing breaches of licence conditions and the provision of false documentation by the business management in an attempt to justify the wine.
- 3.4 The Licensee and designated premises supervisor (DPS) of the business at this time was Jamshid Orodpour who operated in these roles from 2009 till January 2014. In January 2014 a licence transfer took place and the new Licensee was Samaneh Serposhan. The premises DPS was also transferred from Mr Orodpour to Kamran Dadjooyi in January 2014.

4. Planning Implications

5

4.1 The application concerns the use of the sale of alcohol at a supermarket and off licence. Such a use would fall under use class A1, which records suggest is the lawful use of the premises. There are no ongoing enforcement investigations relating to the land. As such, the planning department has no objections to the application.

Recommendations

- 5.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- To consider the representation from the Police in the light of the revised Secretary of State Guidance to Local Authorities issued on 25th April 2012 namely:

- 5.3 The Licensing Authority should accept all reasonable and proportionate representations made by the Police unless the Authority has evidence that to do so would not be appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.
- 5.4 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 3)
 - ii. any conditions deemed appropriate by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives. (see appendix 3)
 - iii. any conditions deemed necessary by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

6.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions as appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

With reference to the above application, we are writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue is situated in the 'Junction Cumulative impact zone', an area which traditionally suffers from high levels of crime and disorder and there are concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

The premises has previously held a License and this license was revoked by the Licensing Sub-Committee D on 29/04/2014.

Islington has almost double the national average of licensed premises per resident, and this is why the Police supported the implementation of the Council's Cumulative Impact Policy. This large number of licensed premises and the issues associated with these impacts greatly on the Police and all other emergency services resourse.

There are a total of 19 Licensed Premises within a 250m radius of these premises.

It is for these reasons that we are objecting to the application, and propose that it is refused.

Dear Licensing Dept at islington Council,

as a resident of Upper Holloway/Archway I would like to object to the licence applied for the sale of alcohol which may be consumed off the premised by An Apple A Day, 621 Holloway Road, London N19 5SS.

I'm objecting to the granting of an off licence to this applicant because of its impact on the Upper Holloway and Archway community and neighbourhood and because the grant of the licence would be against the Sale of Liquor Act's object of reducing liquor abuse. Under section 35 of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 I ask the Authority to consider the impact on the neighbourhood generally and the object of the Act specifically when considering this application.

The particular impact on me from the grant of this licence would be on quality of life and social wellbeing.

The grant of an off licence to this applicant would increase, rather than reduce, the misuse and abuse of alcohol because of the:

- Evidence of a high number of off licence businesses already existing in the area in close proximity.
- Existing vulnerable community (deprivation and socioeconomic disadvantage)
- Sensitive local amenities (proximity of schools, churches and medical centres; proximity of a park and other locations prone to loitering; residential nature of the neighbourhood)
- Liquor misuse and abuse (Policy reports of previous misuse of licence related to the same premises; vandalism and foul litter, loitering an general antisocial behaviour related to alcohol consumption; public nuisance).

For these reasons I object to the grant of yet another off licence. It would contravene the object of the Act and would lead to a significant negative impact on the Upper Holloway/Archway community.

I'm hoping you will keep my views into account when discussing this matter.

I am writing in response to this licensing application on behalf of the Better Archway Forum.

There is grave concern among residents of the Archway area regarding the impact of off licences held by general purpose shops. The main reason for this is the fact that many of them are found to facilitate under age drinking, and sell non duty paid and fake branded drink. There is accordingly very significant support among residents for the withdrawal of licences from premises found in contravention of the licensing objectives. In addition, given the clear evidence of drug dealing activity in the area, notably in Hargrave Road and Elthorne Road, we believe it is particularly important to ensure that a firm stance is taken with businesses which are failing to comply with regulations, as these are the ones which may accommodate such illegal activity.

In the case of 621 Holloway Road, when trading under the name of Super Persia LB Islington trading standards found numerous and sustained violations of licensing regulations and the license was correctly withdrawn.

Since then the shop name and signage has been changed, but although the application for a licence is just now being made, alcohol is being sold. This indicates that the new owners are either unaware of the rules governing such licences, or are willing to ignore them. Neither indicate applicants who are fit holders of such a licence in an area which is a designated alcohol saturation zone.

For these reasons we hope that LB Islington and the licensing committee refuse this application, continuing their previous good work.

To whom it may concern:

I recently received notification about a new licensing request for 'An Apple a Day', 621 Holloway Road, London N19 5SS. I am an XXXX on Pemberton Gardens. I am also XXX of the Church Garth Residents' Association.

I would like to oppose this request for the following reasons:

- 1. This shop is still owned by the same people who owned it when it was called 'Persia', and when they were caught in breach of their license. They have simply changed the name of the shop, and there is no reason why this will not occur again.
- 2. The owners have been caught dumping rubbish in the service road between Holloway Road and Church Garth. We have ongoing dialogue with Islington Council Health and Safety department about the continued dumping of rubbish here, and the owners of 621 Holloway Road have consistently contributed to this. We are trying to get them not to dump more rubbish week by week, and extended licensing permissions are not the incentive to do this.
- 3. There is an ongoing problem with public drinking, urinating and defecating in the service road between Holloway Road and Church Garth. Many of the residents look onto this road, and are forced to see people drinking in the street (which is in any case illegal), then urinating in this service road throughout the evening (also illegal). This has led to some residents seeing people defecate in the same area. This is disgusting behaviour that is a huge health and safety risk. Extended licensing permissions will simply fuel this behaviour, creating a horrible environment to live in, as well as a health and safety hazard for anyone in the area, including the local food market on Saturdays.

If you need any further information or evidence on the above, please let me know and I will be happy to gather details from fellow residents.

However, I trust that the ongoing issues caused by the owners in their shop's previous guise, as well as the public issues that extended licensing would increase, are reason enough to deny this application.

It is on this basis that I am commenting on An Apple A Day's licence application.







- 1. All supplies of alcohol will be made by a personal licence holder or a person authorised by a personal licence holder.
- 2. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirement of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period as required by the Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of the Police or authorised officer.
- 3. A notice will be displayed informing customers that CCTV is in operation.
- 4. Fire Exits will be clear at all times.
- 5. No beers, larger, cider will be displayed at the entrance to the premises.
- 6. No self service will be made available for spirits, wines or strong alcoholic drinks at any time.
- 7. Signage will be displayed asking customers to leave quietly and to respect the local residents.
- 8. Challenge 25 will be in operation along with challenge 25 signage.
- 9. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young persons, staff ask to see accredited proof of age cards e.g. proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
- 10. The licensee and staff should note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection by the licensing team, police or trading standards.

Conditions suggested by the Noise Service (Agreed)

- 1. There shall be no deliveries or collections between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 and no deliveries or collections on Sundays and Ban Holidays..
- 2. No rubbish will be moved or placed outside the premises between the hours of 23:00 07:00 or on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- 3. Noise and vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
