

- 3.2 The Licensing Authority has received representations from the Police, the Noise Team, the Licensing Authority and two local residents.
- 3.3 The premises has undergone two recent licensing spots checks, on the first occasion officers found the premises operating during the day breaching a significant number of its licence conditions, and on a separate occasion on 1 November 2014, Licensing Officers managed to buy alcohol after the permitted hours of the licence and also licence conditions being breached.
- 3.4 The premise is due to attend licensing officer panel on the 27th November 2014 to discuss the breaches of the licence.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. All staff to be trained regularly on the licensing provisions and this training is to be documented.
- 2. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the Police.
- 3. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.
- 4. CCTV television shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be made available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a Police officer (Subject to data protection Act 1998) with 24 hours of request.
- 5. The premises licensee shall maintain and check systems in place on a regular basis, including smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, emergency safety lighting and fire alarms.
- 6. The premises shall display notices requesting customers do not cause disturbance to local residents.
- 7. No alcoholic goods will ever be purchased or taken from persons calling to the shop.
- 8. No spirits shall be purchased in a resealed box.
- 9. The licensee will immediately report to Trading Standards any instance of a caller to the shop attempting to sell alcohol.
- 10. Invoices (or copies) for all alcoholic goods on the premises will be kept at the shop or the shops official recognised accountants and made available to officers from the Council, Police or HMRC upon request.
- 11. A stock control system consisting of supporting documentation to determine proof of origin of alcohol in the shop will be introduced, so that the licensee can quickly identify where and when alcoholic goods have been purchased.
- 12. An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamp on spirits as soon as practical after they have been purchased.
- 13. If any spirits bought by the business have UK Duty Stamps that do not fluoresce under ultra-violet light, or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee shall identify the supplier to Islington Trading Standards and HMRC as soon as possible.
- 14. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25, the Retail of Alcohol Standards Group's advice for off-licences.

- 15. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The training shall include the assessment of age; making a challenge; acceptable proof of age; and recording refusals. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff and make them available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
- 16. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young persons, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
- 17. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.

We are a neighbour:

Representation:

The prevention of public nuisance/crime and disorder: we're bombarded by noise pollution almost around the clock: this application will add to it. Once the Gunners or Cannons finally closes, groups of drunks often stand around under our bedroom windows in the early hours talking/shouting: this application will encourage them to hang around, buy alcohol from 229 and continue the party. During AFC home games our front door's a dumping ground for cans, bottles, cigarettes etc – mostly purchased in the off licences around us. After Arsenal's FA Cup success we had a weekend of non-stop drinking, shouting and swearing fuelled by the pubs and off licences; our part of Blackstock Rd shimmered for weeks because of broken glass. Cars already pull up with music blaring at 0100 to buy provisions we don't need that at 0400am too. Previous representations have fallen on deaf ears; is Islington Council on the side of residents? We strongly opposed this application last time and we do so again

Dear Niall,

I write with respect to the renewed application by Arsenal Supermarket to extend their alcohol licensing hours to 24 hours, 7 days per week.

This application was made previously by the supermarket, objected to by local residents and the police, and ultimately rejected. At that time, the licensing hours were instead somewhat extended to their current range - to 1am.

We can see no reason why the extension should be granted. The objections raised in my original communication below still stand, particularly those raised with respect to the security of local residents and the prevention of anti-social behaviour.

This remains a primarily residential area populated by families that will derive no benefit from 24 hour access to alcohol and will instead risk attracting anti-social elements to the area. There is already a crime risk from a recent spate of burglaries, and we witnessed anti-social behaviour in the area during the summer months from attendees at festivals held in Finsbury Park that finished at night - many of these visitors having consumed alcohol.

I reiterate that we wholeheartedly support the continuing success of the Arsenal Supermarket as a thriving local business.

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority with respect to the new premises licence application to permit 24 hours off sales of alcohol.

The grounds for the representation are:

- Public nuisance
- Crime and disorder

The premises is not located in a cumulative impact area so there is no presumption that the application should be refused and the onus is on responsible authorities and other persons to demonstrate that granting the licence will undermine the licensing objectives.

Issues of Concern

- 1. Islington is saturated by late night shops selling alcohol as evidenced in the Licensing Policy 2013-2017. Applicants for late night licences are expected to demonstrate, through their operating schedules, that their proposal will not undermine the licensing objectives.
- 2. No real consideration has been given to the adverse impacts that this application may have on the licensing objectives. The proposals contained in the operating schedule are the conditions attached to the current licence which permits alcohol sales until 1am so in effect there are no new measures proposed to reflect the 24 hour operation.
- 3. There is a history of non-compliance associated with this premises as evidenced by the licence condition prohibiting Yacual Yacuz and Halil Yacuz from being involved in the operation of the premises.
- 4. A routine visit to the premises on 22 October 2014 at 2.30pm confirmed that the following Licence conditions were being breeched:
 - Condition 1. All staff to be trained regularly on the licensing provisions and this training is to be documented.
 - Condition 3. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.
 - Condition 6. The premises shall display notices requesting customers do not cause disturbance to local residents.
 - Condition 14. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25, the Retail of Alcohol Standards Group's advice for off-licences.
 - Condition 15. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The training shall include the assessment of age; making a challenge; acceptable proof of age; and recording refusals. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff and make them available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
 - Condition 16. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young persons, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.

Condition 17. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards

Recommendations

In order to promote the licensing objectives it is recommends that this application is refused

Re: Premises Licence Variation Arsenal Supermarket

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives, being the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

Violence with injury offences across the MPS are currently increasing, and are currently 6% over the reduction target.

This is a considerable problem for police, as a result we have launched a targeted campaign to reduce violence in the night time economy; as a considerable number of violent offences are linked to alcohol consumption.

It has come to our attention that after a recent visit conducted by licensing officers at the Arsenal Supermarket, the venue were found to be breeching seven of their licence conditions.

Most notably, they had no incident book to record instances of public disorder, no display notices requesting customers do not cause disturbance to local residents, and were not adopting the challenge 25 condition.


It is essential that venues comply with ALL of their licensing conditions, especially if they have a 24 hour licence to sell alcohol. For this venue to fail a licensing visit on such a large scale coupled with the current rise in violent crime associated with alcohol, leaves us with no option whatsoever but to object to the application and propose that it is refused.
