

- CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system
 will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall
 record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The
 recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made
 available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act
 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
- Except for the hatched area shown on the plans, the supply of alcohol on the premises shall only be to a person taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person seated as ancillary to their meal.
- Food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 4. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.
- Except for any designated external seating areas, alcoholic and other drinks purchased from the premises may not be taken away from the immediate curtilage of the premises in open containers such as glasses or opened bottles.
- 6. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 7. Refuse such as bottles must be placed into receptacles outside the premises at times that will minimise the disturbance to nearby properties.
- 8. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25 and the BII National Standards Proof of Age Scheme.



I object to this application for a licence.

Whilst a good quality restaurant would benefit this area of Upper Street the licence applied for is far too wide. This property is in the cumulative impact area and the Upper Street/ Angel is one of the three areas in the borough that has the greatest alcohol fuelled crime and anti social behaviour.

Once a property has a licence that remains with the property for he benefit of any subsequent business and it is therefore important to look at the possible effect of the licence applied for in isolation to the applicant and the current proposed business.

The application is for a full Licence that is both on and off sales. I assume this is because of the two outside tables shown on the plan but as applied for there is nothing to stop general off sales. This means that the premises could become a general off licence in the future. The location of this property is such that it is totally unsuitable for that use which would add to the preloading which already takes place in this area; Milly's mart opposite was refused an off licence on those grounds. Any licence granted should only be for an on licence. The pavement outside the shop is too narrow for dining tables where the diners face east/ west as shown on the plan. This is a crowded area, there is a pedestrian crossing and two waste bins just outside the property. Thai Square which has outside tables has its diners facing each other north/south with the tables abutting the windows so the encroachment on the pavement is narrower. There should be no outside seating permitted at these premises and no off licence granted.

Although the use of the premises is described as a restaurant in fact the application provides that food only has to be served on the first floor. The applicant wishes to be able to use the whole of the ground floor as an open bar serving all forms of alcohol. The seating shown is indicative only. In a cumulative impact zone another drinking establishment is neither justified nor needed and will only add to the alcohol problems of the area. Even if the applicant does intend to serve food on the ground floor any subsequent owner would have the right to operate an open bar with vertical drinking on the ground floor if the licence is granted on the terms applied for. Any licence granted it should be on the condition that alcohol will only be served to people seated at a table and ancillary to a substantial meal.

This particular application on the terms applied for should be refused.

Dear Mr Senler,

The incessant rain of alcohol licence applications just goes on and on.

These applications come one after another despite the fact that we are in a "Saturation Zone" and each applicant has to demonstrate that this additional licence

will not add to the "Cumulative Impact" in the Zone which is already inundated with drinking establishments. At this rate it will be just a question of time before Upper Street, Camden Passage and Islington High Street lose their unique identity and become a place to drink and eat, with no consideration for the many residents living above the shops and the remaining individual traders which suffer all the usual unpleasant side effects that go with the sale of alcohol, details of which I have outlined so many times before.

Notices in the window of Oldroyd describe it confidently as a 40-cover neighbourhood restaurant and also state that it has applied for a license to sell alcohol and have late-night opening augmented by permission for late-night refreshments.

I wish to record my objection to this licensing application which I believe should be refused. The proposed restaurant is located in a Cumulative Impact Zone where requests to increase the number of licensed premises should be refused unless properly justified. This location is in Upper Street which is already saturated with licensed restaurants which have led in recent years to a great increase in anti-social behaviour particularly at weekends and late at night.

Also the proposed restaurant adjoins a kebab shop which has latenight opening and has often been blamed for littering and antisocial behaviour late at night on the part of its customers. The opening of a late-night restaurant next door is likely to make this situation worse.

I would be grateful if the Licensing Committee would take these considerations into account in making its decision.

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business then Police must be informed.
- 2. Save for up to a maximum of 10 persons in the hatched area, the supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person taking a table meal and for the consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- 3. Food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 4. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.
- 5. Except for any designated external seating areas, alcoholic and other drinks purchased from the premises may not be taken away from the immediate curtilage of the premises in open containers such as glasses or opened bottles.
- 6. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 7. Refuse such as bottles must be placed into receptacles outside the premises at times that will minimise the disturbance to nearby properties.
- 8. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25 and the BII National Standards Proof of Age Scheme.
- 9. Except for the designated external seating area all sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises will be in sealed containers only and ancillary to a take away meal.
