



Re: Premises License Application: 52 Seven Sisters Road, N7 6AA

With reference to the above application, We are writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

There are 33 other licenced premises within a 250 meter radius of these premises, 14 of these have Off Sales. This is a vast amount in such a small area. It is our concern that another off licence within this area would have an impact on crime and disorder and public nuisance, both of which are objectives in the Licensing Policy 2013-2017.

The proposed venue is situated just West, of an area which has historically been a street drinking hot spot for many years. This is outside the Clarkes shoe shop located about 100 metres East of the proposed venue. Islington has in place a Designated Public Places Order (DPPO) which is in operation across the Borough. This is in place to prevent Anti- Social- Behaviour linked to street drinking. The Police do not see how having another Off Licence in this area would not impact on street drinking in this area.

It is for these reasons that we are objecting to this application being approved.

However, should the Committee decide to approve the application we would ask that the following conditions are attached to the license?

1) 1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge.

- 2) No High Strength Beer, Larger or Cider of 6.% abv or above shall be sold other than premium beer, larger or cider priced at £1.95 or above per 500ml.
- Signage to be in place at all entrances and exits and points of sale of alcohol advising customers of the DPPO
- 4) The hours of sale of alcohol to be between 0900-2300hrs Mon-Sat and 1000-2300hrs on Sunday.
- 5) No more than 15% of the premises to be used for alcohol.

RE Groland Food & Wine, 52 Seven Sisters Road Licence application:

As a local resident, I personally object to the licence permission of Groland Food & Wine, 52 Seven Sisters Road.

My concerns are based on prevention of public nuisance and prevention and crime and disorder.

# Reasoning:

In my view, the street is generally "deprived" with a significant number of betting shops, cheap pubs and off licences within a short distance of the selected address. As a resident, I have seen numerous times, drunk individuals urinating outside the blocks entrance door, and when these doors are unlocked, urinating, having sexual intercourse inside the entrance. I do not see any proposal to prevent this deprivation worsening.

I have personally had to help drunk older men after falling in to the main road after openly drinking in the street and unable to get up (unreported).

Further to this, in my view, a very high number of "alcoholic street walkers" already in this short section of street, I only see this will encourage a further influx to the area.

My added concern, is that with this added extra incentive for further street drinking in a deprived area, is their will not be an increased presence of policing. I have had to personally call the police for fears of personal safety, no response arrived within an hour. I note the recent tragedy in which a mugger died just a couple of hundred meters away from this shop, although I uncertain of circumstances, I do believe helps highlights the types of individuals already attracted to the area for which I believe this will entice further.

I believe my perceptions will coincide with the councils figures for reported crimes, alcohol and substance abuse along with anti social disorder reported along this short section of road.

- 12. Challenge 25 posters displayed where alcohol is sold.
- 13. "No proof of age No Sale" sign age displayed.
- 14. Alcohol kept away from confectionery shelf.
- 15. Refusal book kept at premises and updated on every occasion when alcohol/tobacco is refused to underage or challenged.

# Conditions proposed by the Metropolitan Police

- 16. No High Strength Beer, Larger or Cider of 6.% abv or above shall be sold other than premium beer, larger or cider priced at £1.95 or above per 500ml.
- 17. Signage to be in place at all entrances and exits and points of sale of alcohol advising customers of the DPPO.

- 18. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained meansthat the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge.
- 19. The hours of sale of alcohol to be between 0900-2300hrs Mon-Sat and 1000-2300hrs on Sunday.
- 20. No more than 15% of the premises to be used for alcohol.
