The Licensee, that is the person in whose name the premises licence is issued, shall ensure that all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police. The Licensee will install comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises.

The CCTV system shall conform to the following points:

- 1. Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside.
- 2. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i. e. capable of identification.
- 3. Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen.
- 4. Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
- 5. Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed.
- 6. Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image.
- 7. Provide good quality images –colour during opening times.

- 8. Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
- 9. Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet.
- 10. Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality.
- 11. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture retention.
- 12. Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation.
- 13. Digital images must be kept for 31 days.
- 14. Police will have access to images at any reasonable time.
- 15. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e. G. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy, if this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

c) Public safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H20 and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting (see enclosed plan for details of locations). All appliances are inspected annually.

All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly.

Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, the Connexions Card and Citizen Card, photographic driving licence or passport, an official identity card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer.

All staff will be trained for UNDERAGE SALES PREVENTION regularly.

A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises.



the Quadrant Estate is a quiet estate with a mixture of residents, I believe this shop will

have a large impact on the area with increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic

as a resident living adjacent to the property I find the hours 07.00 to 23.00 seven days a week excessive as opening the shop and closing with noisy metal shutters will extend this time.

If it has to hours should be limited to a reasonable time 08.00 to 20.00 or 21.00

The proposed opening times will cause local residents to lose sleep and possibly jobs as the noise and disturbance will be intolerable.

Crime and Disorder

I expect the granting of this licence lead to an increase in crime, loitering and bad behaviour.

Public Nuisance

The cumulative impact policy

This area already has a high number of licenced premises Public houses, Restaurants and shops.

the Quadrant Estate is a quiet estate with a mixture of residents, I believe this shop will have a large impact on the area with increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic

as a resident living adjacent to the property I find the hours 07.00 to 23.00 seven days a week excessive as opening the shop and closing with noisy metal shutters will extend this time.

If it has to hours should be limited to a reasonable time 08.00 to 20.00 or 21.00

The proposed opening times will cause local residents to lose sleep and possibly jobs as the noise and disturbance will be intolerable.

Customers creating disturbance, drinking outside, below resident windows, as the small walls in the area encourages sitting

Crime and Disorder

I expect the granting of this licence lead to an increase in crime, loitering and bad behaviour.

Local housing communal areas, stainvells to become no go zones for local residents with associated litter and urination and other bad behaviour.

Protection of Children from Harm

There are a number of nursery schools and other schools in Highbury New Park area who I believe could be affected by a licenced premise being so close, and the increase in vehicular traffic, there is also a community centre across from said shop I believe this would lead to local youths misbehaving leading to disorder

There is a local park, Clissold park who hold frequent events during the year this shop would contribute to bad behaviour in this area

I write as a resident of Highbury New Park estate with regard to the application for a license to sell alcohol between 7am-11pm at the above commercial unit. My husband and I have concerns with regard to three licensing objectives, which are set out below in the format of your Licensing Act 2003 representation pro-forma.

Licensing objective concern 1: Public Nuisance

The premises for which a license is sought are situated in the centre of a residential area. Our block in particular is predominantly home to young families and elderly residents. Highbury New Park is a road already prone to public nuisance and we have concerns the sale of alcohol for long hours will increase these incidents.

In the two years since we have lived on the estate, we have observed regular noise from people shouting in the streets, occasional drunk and disorderly behaviour and frequent young people driving motorbikes on the pavements. In the past few weeks we have seen adults drinking cans of lager sitting on the wall outside the commercial unit during the day. On more than one occasion, we have had to call the police; on the most recent occasion at 2am due to Incessant shouting from drunk people in the road.

Young people used to congregate in the terminoid area outside the commercial unit, where tray would make a lot of mise and infinidate local residents. During the buildings works they relocated to other areas but we have concerns the opening of a shop salling alcohol until late will encourage them to return with the resultant risk of continued noise and miseance from customers leaving and/or drinking in the outside areas.

Licensing objective concern 2: Crime and Disorder

Antisocial behaviour is also prevalent on our estate. This ranges from smoking of cannabis in the stainwell of our building, burglary, and as extreme as our neighbours witnessing a stabbing approximately two years ago. Research shows that such crime and disorder are all linked to alcohol consumption.

Recently the police have worked hard to reduce crime and antisocial behaviour in the area which has led to a greater sense of security amongst our neighbours. We have concerns that easy access to alcohol until late in the evening will undo this good work and return the problem of crime and disorder to its previous level.

Licensing objective concern 3: Protection of children from harm

We have concerns that the granting of this license to these premises will inevitably increase problems associated with under-age drinking. Furthermore, given the nature of the estate, it is likely that children will be exposed to incidents of antisocial behaviour caused by the consumption of alcohol.

Measures to address our concerns

Our preference would be that no license to sell alcohol is granted to the commercial unit.

However, if this is not accepted we submit that it would be more appropriate for the licensing hours to be restricted to the daytime. This measure would reduce the likelihood of both nuisance and criminal behaviour. We believe this is reasonable because the nearest shop to buy alcohol for extended hours is The Shopping Garden, 156 Green Lanes, N16 9DL, which is under 3 minutes' walk in a less residential area, where alcohol is available 6am to midnight.

In addition, we believe the licensing applicant will require a very strict policy to prevent selling alcohol to individuals under the age of 18 years or the purchase of alcohol on behalf of people under 18 years. Restricting the drinking of alcohol on the street outside the shop may also reduce the incidence of noise from customers leaving the shop and limit the likelihood of customers congregating to drink in the area.

Thank you for considering our concerns and taking these into account when making a licensing decision.

Appendix 3

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business then Police must be informed. (Agreed with Police)
- 2. The licence shall ensure that staff under take training on all the licensing objectives.
- 3. Training will include identifying persons under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof of age, making and recording a refusal, avoiding conflict and responsible alcohol retailing.
- 4. Written training records will be kept.
- 5. Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (Foam H20 and Co2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire signs, numerous smoke detectors, and emergency lighting. All fire equipment shall be serviced annually.
- 6. The challenge 25 proof of age policy will be operated and only a photographic driving licence, valid
- 7. Passport or proof of age cards with the bearer's photograph & the pass logo/ hologram on it will be accepted as proof of age.
- 8. A written refusals record will be kept and made available to police or council officers on request.
- 9. Notices will be prominently displayed at the entry and at the point of sale stating that challenge 25 is in use and the provisions of the licensing act regarding underage and proxy purchases and sales.
- 10. All staff will be trained for their role on induction and at regular intervals of six months thereafter.

 Training will include identifying persons under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof of age, making and recording a refusal, avoiding conflict and responsible alcohol retailing. Written training records will be kept and made available to police or council officers on request.

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
