## Responsibility for Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG)

Until 2012 schools had a statutory duty under the Education Act 1997 to provide:	Following 2012
A careers education programme for years 7 – 13	The statutory duty is removed
Up to date and impartial access to careers information	The statutory duty is removed
Access to professional careers advice from the delegated careers organisation	The responsibility to provide careers 'guidance' is passed to schools to deliver, without initial DfE guidance or funding
Work experience at Key Stage 4	This as also removed



#### **Since 2012**

- Numerous reports including Ofsted's Going in the Right Direction
- New statutory guidance has been released each year
- Current statutory duties are:
  - all students are provided with independent and impartial careers guidance from year 8 to year 13
  - to include information on the full range of education and training options
  - that it is provided in the best interests of the young person
  - to ensure that young people are aware of RPA

### **CEIAG** Specialist supports schools by:

- Bespoke one to one consultancy support curriculum, careers information and accessing professional careers advice
- Cross borough or in-house training for school staff
- Termly careers network meetings
- Termly newsletter
- On line portal
