

PREMISES LICENCE NEW APPLICATION

Barburrito, 5a Cowcross Street, London EC1M 6DR

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to:
 - a) Permit the premises to sell alcohol, on supplies which include an outside seating area, on Sundays to Thursdays between 11:00 to 23:00 and on Fridays and Saturdays between 11:00 and midnight.
 - b) Permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment on Fridays and Saturdays between 23:00 and 00:00.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (See appendix 4);
 - ii. conditions recommended by responsible Authorities (see appendix 4); and
 - iii. any conditions deemed appropriate by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

- 3.2 The premises is located within the Bunhill and Clerkenwell Cumulative Impact Policy area, adopted by the Council on 24 January 2013.
- 3.3 The Licensing Authority has received 9 letters of representation; the author of one has requested anonymity.
- 3.4 The applicants have submitted a response to the representations by way of an email dated 25 September 2013, which includes a revised draft operating schedule and a menu for the premises. The revised operating schedule clarifies that the operators do not intend to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises; however, it is intended to sell alcohol for consumption in an outside seating area.
- 3.5 A copy of the applicant's response was circulated by the Licensing Authority to all those who had made representation; none of the representations have been withdrawn.

4. Planning Implications

- 4.1 The premises was granted change of use from A1 to a sui generis use (compromising of a mix A1/A3 uses) on the ground floor and basement floors. This consent is subject to a condition that restricts the hours of operation to between 7:00 and 23:00 on any day.
- 4.2 Planning use class A1 applies to "Shops" and includes: Shops, retail warehouses, hairdressers, undertakers, travel and ticket agencies, post offices (but not sorting offices), pet shops, sandwich bars, showrooms, domestic hire shops, dry cleaners, funeral directors and internet cafes.
- 4.3 Planning use class A3 applies to "Restaurants and cafes" for the sale of food and drink for consumption on the premises restaurants, snack bars and cafes.

5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

5.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions as it deems appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

Please describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives:

- a. This application is for a premises licence to sell alcohol for consumption **on the premises only.** There will be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises.
- b. Barburrito Limited intends to adhere to the Islington Licensing Policy 2013 2017 ("the Policy").
- c. Barburrito intends to stop serving alcohol at 11pm Sunday Thursday and at midnight on Friday and Saturday in accordance with the Policy.
- d. Barburrito is a restaurant and takeaway with an average dwell time of 15 minutes. The sale of alcohol at the business is ancillary to the sale of food.
- e. Barburrito will attempt to ensure that it does not add to the cumulative impact of crime, disorder and public nuisance in the area.
- f. Barburrito will use a competent and experienced management team to ensure that the business is well-managed.
- g. Litter patrols will be carried out by Barburrito employees throughout the hours of operation.
- h. Barburrito will not operate as either a bar or a pub. However, the management of the business would, if encouraged, consider undertaking the Licensee's Charter and would participate in any relevant "watch" scheme.
- i. The premises is unlikely to have in excess of 50 people in the premises at any one time. As the premises will operate in accordance with the hours in the Policy, the premises may be considered exceptional. Additionally, the premises will **not** be alcohol led. The sale of alcohol is ancillary to the sale of food.
- j. Advice has been sought from many of the relevant authorities, including the Islington Licensing Authority, in relation to this application.
- k. Barburrito has an excellent track record of acting in accordance with the legal requirements imposed by Licensing Authorities. Barburrito has never been subject to a licensing review or a negative licensing inspection.
- I. There will be no irresponsible drinks promotions at the premises. Any person who is drinking an excessive amount of alcohol will not be served any further alcoholic drinks.
- m. Water will be available at the premises at all times until closing.
- n. Background music will cease 15 minutes prior to closing time.
- o. Barburrito will ensure that non-alcoholic options are available at a cheaper price than alcoholic drinks.
- p. Barburrito understands that the Mandatory Conditions in relation to Licensed

Premises in Islington will also have application.

Match Day Provisions

q. No alcohol will be sold to patrons before 11am on any Match Day.

b) Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- Barburrito will ensure that its staff are aware of the impact of alcohol related crime and anti-social behaviour and the problems that these issues cause in the local community.
- The premises includes seating for customers and vertical drinking will be prohibited.
 Drinking alcohol will be ancillary to the food business.
- c. All staff will be informed that serving alcohol to drunken persons will be considered seriously. Staff members shown to be serving alcoholic drinks to drunken patrons will be disciplined.
- d. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police.
- e. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.
- f. The holder of the premises licence shall subscribe to and participate fully in any relevant "watch" scheme.
- g. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 28 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised Officer or Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
- h. No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be allowed to enter at any time the premises are open to the public.
- Alcoholic drinks may only be consumed within the premises (including the outside seating area).

c) Promotion of Public Safety

- a. Toughened glass and polycarbonates will be used wherever practicable.
- b. Contact details of three local taxi hire companies will be available to all patrons of Barburrito at all times.
- c. Public transport in the area of the premises is good, with night-time buses and the tube being available in the locality.
- d. All exit routes shall be kept unobstructed, with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.
- e. Internal gangways shall be kept clear wherever possible.
- f. All exit doors shall be maintained and easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.
- g. Exit doors shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily and a record of the check shall be maintained.

- h. All edges, steps and stairways must be conspicuous and kept in good condition.
- i. In the absence of daylight, the lighting in any area accessible to the public shall be fully in operation when they are present.
- j. Emergency lighting batteries must be charged before the admission of the public.
- k. Adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment will be available at the premises at all times.

d) Prevention of Public Nuisance

- a. All reasonable efforts will be utilised to ensure that patrons leave the premises quietly. Relevant signage will be displayed.
- b. Patrons will also be informed, if required, that they are not to congregate in the area outside of the premises.
- c. Barburrito will ensure that no noise can be considered a nuisance in nearby residential housing areas.
- d. Extensive supervision of the outside area will be undertaken by Barburrito staff in order to ensure that noise is kept to a minimum.
- e. Barburrito staff will supervise the outside seating area in order to ensure that the outside seating area does not present a pavement obstruction.
- f. External doors shall be kept closed as far as reasonably practicable after 9pm.
- g. The outside tables and chairs shall be cleared of patrons and rendered unusable by 11pm. Adequate notices shall be displayed to inform patrons of this requirement.
- h. All moveable outdoor furniture shall be fitted with rubber (or equivalent) feet.
- i. Any patron who is considered to be causing a nuisance outside of the premises will immediately be asked to leave. Repeated offenders will be banned from entering the premises.
- j. No deliveries of licensable goods shall take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays nor between the hours of 11pm and 5am on any other day of the week.
- k. No rubbish shall be moved, removed or placed in bins outside the premises on Sundays or Bank Holidays, nor between the hours of 11pm and 5am on any other day of the week.
- I. The music played at the premises will be background music only, and will not be played loudly.

e) Protection of Children from Harm

- a. Barburrito will operate a "Challenge 25" and relevant signage will be displayed.
- b. Barburrito is a family and child friendly venue. Barburrito has never been convicted of selling alcohol to underage patrons. Staff will receive adequate training on the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18.
- c. The management of Barburrito shall regularly monitor staff to ensure that they are dealing with sales to young people appropriately.

- d. Barburrito will keep a refusal log in order to note any refusals to sell alcohol to young people. This will be signed monthly by the DPS and management.
- e. Any signs of drug use at the premises will be reported to the police **immediately**.

Public Nuisance

The objection is to the sale of alcohol and fast food in an area with a significant problem of club and bar customers drinking and eating on the street, leaving bottles, glasses, discarded food and containers, making a lot of noise after 11pm and using the streets as a toilet. The proposed premises will create more and similar problems.

Customers will congregate in an already crowded location, immediately adjacent to the Fabric queues, the Rookery hotel and residential premises.

There is no obvious way of addressing these concerns except to reduce the number of premises that create these night time problems and encourage more appropriate day time commercial activity.






We have had repeated occasion in the recent past to draw to the attention of your Authority unacceptable levels of late night noise, exacerbated by excess consumption of alcohol and in many instances other substances. Our guests complain regularly that their sleep is disturbed by anti-social behaviour of this sort, despite the presence of double glazing in all of our windows

Given the location of the premises it is in an area already highlighted as having a cumulative impact. We have been told repeatedly by Islington Licensing representatives that this immediate area is at saturation point. To all interested parties,

We understand that you have made representations in relation to the application for a premises licence for Barburrito at 5a Cowcross Street, Clerkenwell. The directors of Barburrito Limited would like you to be aware that your concerns and representations are considered seriously. Barburrito wants to work in a manner that is consistent with the aspirations of the wider community. Your concerns in relation to Crime and Disorder and Public Nuisance are appreciated by Barburrito Limited. However, Barburrito will not be adding to those issues. Barburrito will be a restaurant with a low dwell time selling Mexican style food.

We should be very grateful if you could take a moment to consider the Operating Schedule, attached. Barburrito is undertaking to act in accordance with this Operating Schedule, and Islington Licensing Service will take action against Barburrito should this Operating Schedule not be complied with. The Operating Schedule is currently in draft only, and Barburrito is willing to consider any further recommended amendments to this document.

It is considered that many of the Representations can be withdrawn on the basis of further information being provided:

- Barburrito is a food-led business. Alcohol is sold to accompany meals. It is a restaurant, not a bar. Please find details of the business here: http://www.barburrito.co.uk/ and the menu attached to this email. In an average week, Barburrito will only sell 200-300 alcoholic drinks. These are all priced around 3.50 per serving.
- Barburrito is **not** applying for a licence to sell alcohol which will be consumed off the premises, nor has this ever been the intention of Barburrito. No other Barburrito restaurants sell alcohol for consumption off the premises. The sales of alcohol will be for consumption **on** the premises **only**.
- Furthermore, vertical drinking will be prohibited. Alcohol can only be consumed by customers taking a table. People will not be taking drinks away with them. Alcohol will be consumed alongside a meal.
- Barburrito cares about its local environment (see here: http://www.barburrito.co.uk/about/barburrito.aspx).
 This includes ensuring that the local environment of the business is clean and attractive to customers.
 Barburrito will do everything reasonably practicable to ensure that litter is minimised. Litter patrols will be in operation throughout the premises' opening times.
- Barburrito is a family friendly venue. Drunk people will not be welcome, and drugs will be absolutely prohibited. Any signs of drugs in the premises will be immediately reported to the police.
- Barburrito is conscious of the noise from deliveries. Late night deliveries will be avoided and the rubbish collection will occur in accordance with council approved collection.
- External premises doors will be kept shut after 9pm and rubber footing will be placed on outside furniture in order to minimise noise.
- Barburrito will stop serving alcohol to customers at 11pm each weekday, and midnight on the weekends. It is
 not intending to be a "late night" bar. Customers will not congregate at Barburrito. There is a short dwell time,
 and customers will then leave.
- Barburrito has undertaken in the Operating Schedule that it will not create a noise nuisance for residents in the locality of the premises.

Barburrito is a food-led business. Barburrito understands residents' and businesses' concerns to not have any more late night bars in the area. This is not the intention of Barburrito. Barburrito is a business that will add to the vibrancy of the area, providing top quality Mexican food at a reasonable price.

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

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
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












Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. Alcohol will be sold for consumption on the premises only. There will be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises.
- 2. The sale of alcohol at the business shall be ancillary to the sale of food.
- 3. The licensee will attempt to ensure that it does not add to the cumulative impact of crime, disorder and public nuisance in the area.
- 4. The licensee will use a competent and experienced management team to ensure that the business is well-managed.
- 5. Litter patrols will be carried out by the licensee's employees throughout the hours of operation.
- 6. The licensee will not operate as either a bar or a pub. However, the management of the business would, if encouraged, consider undertaking the Licensee's Charter and would participate in any relevant "watch" scheme.
- 7. There will be no irresponsible drinks promotions at the premises. Any person who is drinking an excessive amount of alcohol will not be served any further alcoholic drinks.
- 8. Water will be available at the premises at all times until closing.
- 9. Background music will cease 15 minutes prior to closing time.
- 10. The licensee will ensure that non-alcoholic options are available at a cheaper price than alcoholic drinks.
- 11. No alcohol will be sold to patrons before 11am on any Match Day.
- 12. The licensee will ensure that staff are aware of the impact of alcohol related crime and antisocial behaviour and the problems that these issues cause in the local community.
- 13. The premises shall include seating for customers and vertical drinking will be prohibited. Drinking alcohol will be ancillary to the food business.
- 14. All staff will be informed that serving alcohol to drunken persons will be considered seriously. Staff members shown to be serving alcoholic drinks to drunken patrons will be disciplined.
- 15. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police.
- 16. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.
- 17. The holder of the premises licence shall subscribe to and participate fully in any relevant "watch" scheme.
- 18. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 28 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised Officer or Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
- 19. No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be allowed to enter at any time the premises are open to the public.
- 20. Alcoholic drinks may only be consumed within the premises (including the outside seating area).
- 21. Toughened glass and polycarbonates will be used wherever practicable.
- 22. Contact details of three local taxi hire companies will be available to all patrons at all times.

- 23. All exit routes shall be kept unobstructed, with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.
- 24. Internal gangways shall be kept clear wherever possible.
- 25. All exit doors shall be maintained and easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.
- 26. Exit doors shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily and a record of the check shall be maintained.
- 27. All edges, steps and stairways must be conspicuous and kept in good condition.
- 28. In the absence of daylight, the lighting in any area accessible to the public shall be fully in operation when they are present.
- 29. Emergency lighting batteries must be charged before the admission of the public.
- 30. Adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment will be available at the premises at all times.
- 31. All reasonable efforts will be utilised to ensure that patrons leave the premises quietly. Relevant signage will be displayed.
- 32. Patrons will also be informed, if required, that they are not to congregate in the area outside of the premises.
- 33. The licensee will ensure that no noise can be considered a nuisance in nearby residential housing areas.
- 34. Extensive supervision of the outside area will be undertaken by staff in order to ensure that noise is kept to a minimum.
- 35. Staff will supervise the outside seating area in order to ensure that the outside seating area does not present a pavement obstruction.
- 36. External doors shall be kept closed as far as reasonably practicable after 9pm.
- 37. The outside tables and chairs shall be cleared of patrons and rendered unusable by 11pm. Adequate notices shall be displayed to inform patrons of this requirement.
- 38. All moveable outdoor furniture shall be fitted with rubber (or equivalent) feet.
- 39. Any patron who is considered to be causing a nuisance outside of the premises will immediately be asked to leave. Repeated offenders will be banned from entering the premises.
- 40. No deliveries of licensable goods shall take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays nor between the hours of 11pm and 5am on any other day of the week.
- 41. No rubbish shall be moved, removed or placed in bins outside the premises on Sundays or Bank Holidays, nor between the hours of 11pm and 5am on any other day of the week.
- 42. The music played at the premises will be background music only, and will not be played loudly.
- 43. The licensee will operate a "Challenge 25" and relevant signage will be displayed.
- 44. Staff will receive adequate training on the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18.
- 45. Premises management shall regularly monitor staff to ensure that they are dealing with sales to young people appropriately.
- 46. The licensee will keep a refusal log in order to note any refusals to sell alcohol to young people. This will be signed monthly by the DPS and management.

47. Any signs of drug use at the premises will be reported to the police immediately.

Deliveries

48. No rubbish will be moved, removed or placed, in bins outside the premises on Sundays or Bank Holidays, nor between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 hours on any other days of the week.

Rubbish Clearance

49. No rubbish will be moved, removed or placed, in bins outside the premises on Sundays or Bank Holidays, nor between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 hours on any other days of the week.

External Access and Egress Doors

50. The premises external doors shall be kept closed so far as practicable after 21:00.

External Tables and Chairs

- 51. The premises external doors shall be kept closed so far as practicable after 21:00. Adequate notices shall be displayed to inform patrons of this requirement.
- 52. Any moveable furniture will be fitted with rubber (or equivalent) feet.
