- 9. LOCAL DEMOCRACY WEEK 15th to 19th OCTOBER 2007 (Item 9) Noted that meetings had been held with CEA and useful resources, including some from the Electoral Commission had been passed to schools to help teachers with the democracy and citizenship agenda.

Schools were invited to make use of the Council Chamber for their school debates and attend the weekly Citizenship Ceremonies so that they could put these into context.

The Pupil Parliament would be held in the Council Chamber on 17th October this year and all Members were invited to attend. It was also planned to hold a political speed dating session between a cross section of Councillors and school children.

Other ideas for Democracy Week included spending a day shadowing the Mayor, Leader or backbench Councillor.

Electoral Services would also be writing to all children who will become eligible to vote, giving them details of how to register and vote in elections. They would also be making contact with all community groups in the borough encouraging people to register to vote and seeking volunteers from these communities to help with the annual canvass.

In terms of raising the profile of Councillors Communications were looking into the possibility of putting articles in Islington Now residents magazine that would highlight the role and work of Councillors as well as reminding residents of who their ward councillors were and how they could contact them as well as when and where surgeries were held.
