**Subject: TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE APPLICATIONS**  
**RE: CLUB AQUARIUM, 256-260 OLD STREET, LONDON EC1V 9DD**

## 1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is a hearing to determine a temporary event notice (TEN) in respect of the above premises to extend the terminal hour for licensable activities from 3.30am to 6.00am on 25 April 2013. The temporary event notice is applied for under section 100, Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 This application is subject to a representation from the Police and the Council's Noise Team in respect of public nuisance.
- 1.3 The Licensing Sub-Committee are asked to consider whether or not to authorise the notice, and if allowed whether to impose any of the current premises licence conditions.

## 2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the temporary event notice under Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 as the Licensing Sub-Committee consider appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.
- 2.2 The Committee can decide to:
  - i. allow the temporary event notice for the specified event,
  - ii. allow the temporary event, subject to one or more conditions of the existing premises licence;
  - iii. prohibit the temporary event notice by way of a counter notice.

### 3. Background

3.1 The premise holds a premises licence which allows regulated entertainment and sale of alcohol between -09:00 and 02:30 on Monday and Tuesday, 09:00 and 03:30 on Wednesday 09:00 to 06:00 on Thursday and from 09:00 to 09:00 on Friday to Sunday, live music and performance of dance between -09:00 and 03:00 on Monday and Tuesday, 09:00 and 04:00 on Wednesday 09:00 to 06:00 on Thursday and from 09:00 to 09:00 on Friday to Sunday, recorded music for 24 hour a day each day of the week, and late night refreshment from 23:00 until 03:00 Monday and Tuesday, 23:00 and 04:00 on Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday, 23:00 to 05:00 on Friday and Saturday. Please note that facilities for making music and dancing are no longer regulated.

**Re: Temporary Event Notice Application by Club Aquarium 256 – 260 Old Street EC1V**

As the Police Borough Commander I write to you to formally oppose the granting of a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) in favour of the Club Aquarium, 256 – 260 Old Street, London, EC1V 9DD.

**Application:**

I have been apprised by Islington Local Authority Licencing Department that Mr Antony RUBER of the Club Aquarium has made an application for a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) for 25 April 2013. This TEN, if granted affects the hours, which the club is able to provide Music and Dance on 25 & 26 April 2013.

**Background Information to support police opposition:**

Since 1 April 2012 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2013 there were 95 allegations of crime recorded by the Metropolitan Police Service relating to offences committed either directly inside, outside or otherwise in the immediate vicinity of the Club Aquarium. These offences include assaults (of varying degrees of severity), public order offences (including affray and racially aggravated offence), personal robbery, theft person, theft and possession of an offensive weapon.

Thirty of these offences have included offences of violence, threat of violence, threatening behaviour or the possession of offensive weapons (3 offences involving knives). On balance it is also appropriate to identify that a small number offences have been identified by Club Aquarium staff members e.g. suspect detained or identified by staff.

However that said it is of note that there are 5 crimes recorded, whereby a victim has alleged that the Clubs door staff have committed the offences. These include:

- 15.2.13 Victim ejected from the Club alleged he was punched in the head and had his left hand bent backwards causing a break in one of his fingers. Remain undetected.
- 30.3.13 Two door staff at the venue, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have been charged with an offence of affray having been identified assaulting a member of the public outside the club premises. This crime was captured on CCTV.

All of the offences involving Security Industry Authority (SIA) door staff are serious allegations and are of concern.

SIA door staff are trained and accredited to undertake their role in a professional, safe and effective way, therefore I have every reason to suppose that they will discharge their duties in such a lawful and tolerant manner using only proportionate and necessary force as is permitted by law e.g. section 3 Criminal Law Act 1967.

Given the above, most notably (although not exclusively) the assault, which took place on March 31<sup>st</sup> whereby 2 SIA door staff stand charged with an Affray (section 3 Public Order Act 1986) I am not satisfied that the Designated Premises Supervisor has effective control or management of the SIA door staff to prevent crime and disorder inside or outside of the Club Aquarium.

With consideration of the above I formally oppose the granting of a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) in favour of the Aquarium Club, 256 – 260 Old Street, London, EC1V 9DD.

Noise team was recently in receipt of complaints from local residents alleging unwanted noise from customers from Club Aquarium after they left the premises.  
The allegation consisted of reports of customers gathering in Singer Street and using their car stereos to play music very early in the morning at weekends after the club closed. The customers would also allegedly drink outside in the street.  
We have been assured by the premises that customer sare not permitted to take drinks outside with them but these people allegedly have been drinking outside, possibly with pre-purchased alcohol and continuing their club nights in the street.

I contacted the premises and got the following reply:  
"All our security staff are now informed to warn guests verbally when they leave the venue as well as handing out leaflets telling them to respect our neighbours. We will monitor singer street when we close , 2 of our security staff will make sure that no one hangs around and play music from their cars etc. Just to let you know that we do not allow anyone ( including the staff ) leave the premises with any alcoholic drink. We are now changing the contents of the leaflets we handout to our guest when leaving , adding " after we close anyone found around the venue ( specially in singer street ) making noise , drinking , playing loud music on their car stereo and ignoring our warnings will be banned from the Club. We take this issue very seriously and will do our best to stop any nuisance to our neighbours."

I e mailed the applicant yesterday seeking assurances that the licence conditions quoted above would be applied during the event and that the further measures discussed above would also be applied. I have not had any response, hence this representation with regard to potential public nuisance connected to this proposed event.

## **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
  - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

1. The sale of alcohol is not authorised after midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight.

On any day that music and dancing ends between midnight and two o'clock in the morning the sale of alcohol shall cease when the music and dancing end.

The sale of alcohol shall cease at midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight;

Where music and dancing end between midnight on any Sunday and 00.30hours, sale of alcohol on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.

Where music and dancing end between midnight and 02.00 hours on any Sundays immediately before a bank holidays the sale of alcohol on that Sunday shall cease when the music and dancing end.

The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
2. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours for the sale by retail of alcohol unless one of the following applies:
  - a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
  - b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
  - c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
  - d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.
3. Unless otherwise specified on this licence no regulated entertainment shall take place at the premises with the exception of pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dancing for pre-invited guests.
4. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:

Children and Young Persons Act 1933  
Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955  
Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985
5. The licence shall be subject to the Council's standard conditions for Places of Entertainment

6. The licence shall be subject to the Council's technical standards for Places of Entertainment
7. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time in the premises shall not exceed the following: Back Room 100, Main Dance Area and Private Bar 350, Foyer Bar 50 and Swimming Pool Area 40.
8. The licence is subject to the following Additional Conditions referred to in the Standard Conditions for Places of Public Entertainment:
  - ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS D: APPLICABLE TO PREMISES USING DOOR SUPERVISORS.
  - ADDITIONAL CONDITION GO: APPLICABLE TO THE KEEPING OF GOOD ORDER.
9. The name and contact number of the person in charge of the premises shall be displayed on the premises in a prominent position so that it can be seen by passers-by.
10. Notices shall be displayed on the premises:
  - a. with the telephone number of at least one local Taxi Cab company;
  - b. showing the Club's Rules of Management;
  - c. requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly and not to slam car doors.
11. **CONDITIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL AREA:**
  - a. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time in the Swimming Pool area shall not exceed 40.
  - b. A lifeguard shall be on duty in the Swimming Pool area during the whole time that it is in use.
  - c. The consumption of drinks in the Swimming Pool area shall be non-alcoholic and shall be served in paper or plastic materials.
  - d. Patrons who appear to be intoxicated shall be prevented from entering the Swimming Pool area.
  - e. A Steward shall guard the entrance to the Swimming Pool area the whole time it is in use.
  - f. When the Swimming Pool area is not in use, the entrance shall be locked shut for the duration of the Club's opening hours.
  - g. Swimming costumes must be worn by all persons using the swimming pool.
12. CCTV system shall be maintained inside and outside the premises, including a CCTV unit, which monitors the immediate vicinity of the premises. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Tape recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a police officer within 24 hours of any request.
13. No person shall be allowed in the premises under the age of 18 years when the licence is being used.
14. All security staff shall be equipped with radios, linking them to the other security guards.
15. All staff shall be trained in the premises emergency evacuation measures and first aid procedures.
16. All exits at the premises shall be checked throughout the night.

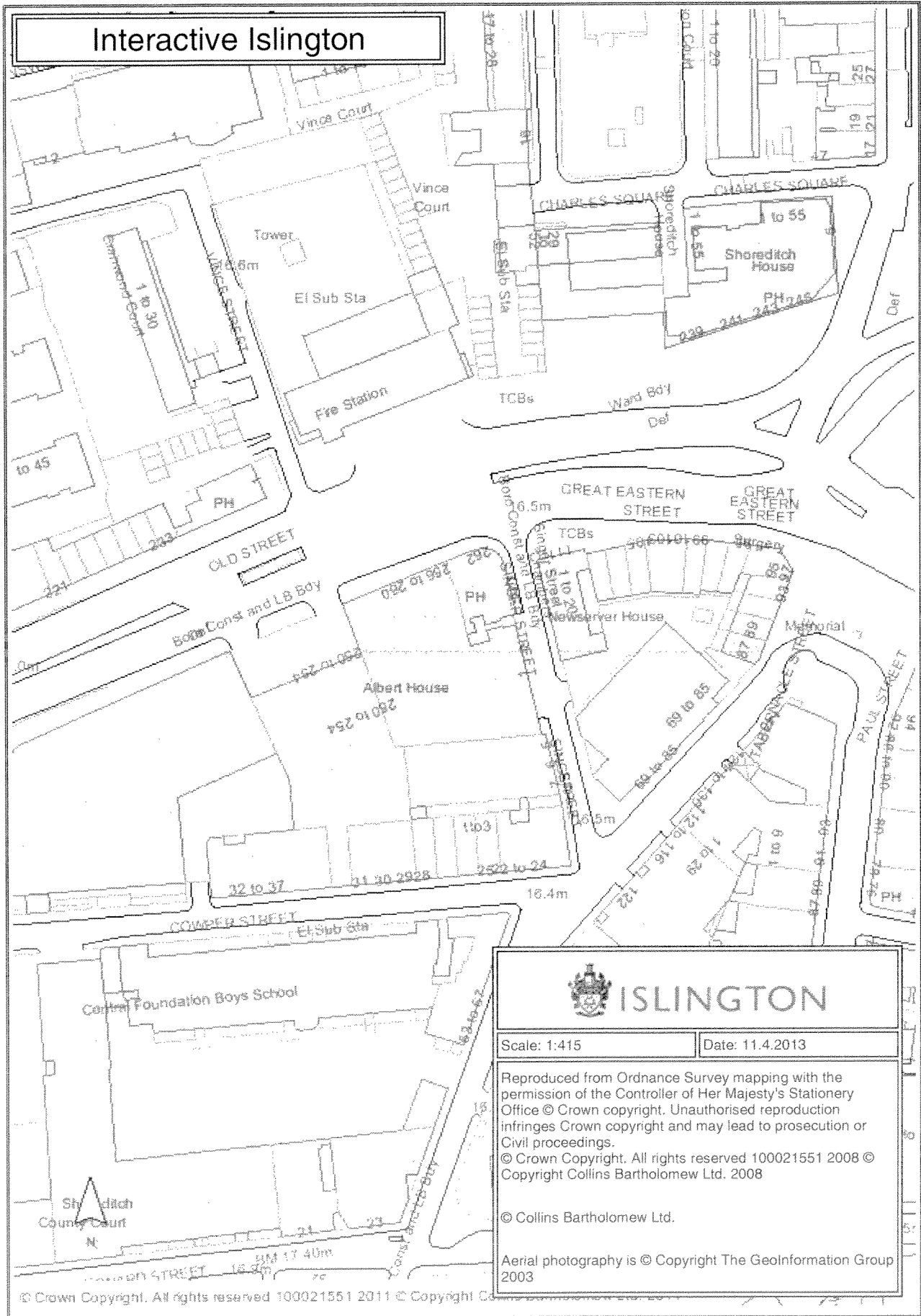
17. Notices will be prominently displayed at exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
18. Members of the security staff shall advise customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
19. Security Officers registered with the Security Industry Authority shall be on patrol when the cabaret show is taking place, monitoring the audience and the performers.
20. Tickets for the cabaret show must be purchased in advance. There shall be no ticket sales for the cabaret show on the door of the premises.
21. Barriers shall be used outside the premises to control the customers for the cabaret show.
22. The striptease shall be in a location where the performance can not be seen from the street.
23. The striptease entertainment shall be in a location where the performers/entertainers and the audience shall not be permitted to participate.
24. Whilst striptease entertainment is taking place, no person under the age of 18 shall be on the premises. A clear notice shall be displayed at each entrance to the premises in a prominent position so that it can be easily read by persons entering the premises with the following words '*No person under the age of 18 will be admitted*'.


### **Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

1. No coaches or limousines to park outside the premises during the hours of operation.
2. A notice shall be displayed in a prominent place to remind patrons to use the toilet facilities before leaving the premises.
