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LICENSING REGULATORY COMMITTEE

PROCEDURE FOR THE HEARING OF OBJECTIONS TO STREET TRADING, TRACK BETTING, AND SPECIAL TREATMENT LICENCES

1. The Chair of the Licensing Regulatory Committee shall:
 - (a) invite all members of the Committee, the applicant, the objector, their representatives and any witnesses and officers to introduce themselves
 - (b) ascertain whether the applicant and objector(s) are present and, if unaccompanied, whether they were aware that they could be represented
 - (c) outline the procedure to be followed at the meeting
2. The Service Director (Public Protection) or his/her representative, will introduce the application.
3. (a) Council officer reports on noise and other matters
(b) Questions to officers from objectors and applicants
4. The applicant or his/her representative will present in detail the grounds of the application.
5. Objectors and members of the Committee may ask questions only of the applicant at this stage. Statements will not be allowed.
6. The objector(s) or his/her representative(s) will present in detail the grounds of the objection and may call witnesses in support of the objection.
7. The objector(s) and any witnesses may be called be questioned by members of the Committee, the applicant or his/her representative(s) and appropriate officers of the Council. Statements will not be allowed. Witnesses called by the objector(s) may be re-examined by the objector(s) or his/her representative on matters arising from those questions.
8. A Ward councillor may be present at the meeting and may make a statement to the Committee regarding the application, if the required notice has been given.
9. The objector(s) or his/her representative may then make a closing speech.
10. The applicant or his/her representative may then make a closing speech.
11. Members of the Committee may withdraw from the room to consider their decision. The Council's legal adviser and the clerk will accompany Members, in case legal or procedural advice is required.
12. The Licensing Officers, objectors(s), applicant, any representative(s) and witnesses will remain available for recall.
13. If it is necessary to recall any party to provide further information or clarification, all parties at the meeting will be invited to return.
14. At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Committee will consider the evidence presented and the Chair will announce the decision, together with any conditions deemed fit to apply to the application. Reasons will be given for the decision and any conditions imposed on the licence.

This will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and objector(s), or to their legal representative, accompanied by a description of any conditions which are to be attached to the granting of the licence, or the reasons for the refusal of the application. The applicant will be told of any statutory rights of appeal which are available to him/her.

DESIGNATION OF STREET OUTSIDE 67-83 SEVEN SISTERS ROAD N7 FOR STREET TRADING PURPOSES

The Street Trading Team officer introduced his report, which proposed the designation of an area of the highway on the footway outside 67 – 83 Seven Sisters Road N7 for street trading purposes. He explained that the Town Centre Manager had first identified this area and approached the Street Trading Team for a designation of this area for ad hoc events to help to promote and enhance the local environment. At the same time, a local and long-established trader had asked to be sited permanently outside 67-83 Seven Sisters Road N7. The Committee noted the letters of support for the street trader which were attached to the report, including reports of a reduction in anti-social behaviour, crime and rubbish in the area, since the trader had traded from this site. Officers had worked closely with Transport for London to achieve the proposed designation.

Members queried the operating times for street traders ie “07:00 hours to 18:00 hours” specified in the newspaper advertisement in Appendix 1 of the report. Officers confirmed that the hours of operation for other traders were from 09:00 to 17:00 hours, with two hours for set up and one hour for closing down. A new advertisement would be published specifying the correct hours of operation.

The Committee noted the conditions proposed by Transport for London, detailed on page 25 of the report. The Street Trading Team officer reported that these conditions would be incorporated onto the licences for street traders at the two proposed pitches and their successors viz “trading being limited to two pitches, each with a maximum surface area of 8m x 2m set back from the kerb line by 5m and licence conditions including the following:
(a) No loading or unloading will take place from Seven Sisters Road
(b) All receptacles and other equipment to be removed from the highway at the end of each trading session.”

RESOLVED:

That the area on the footway outside 67 - 83 Seven Sisters Road N7 and detailed in Appendix 2 of the report of the Service Director – Public Protection be designated for street trading purposes, every Monday to Sunday, from 09:00 hours to 17:00 hours, with two hours setting up time before and one hour setting down time after trading times, subject to the standard conditions associated with a street trading licence and the following additional conditions:

“trading being limited to two pitches, each with a maximum surface area of 8m x 2m set back from the kerb line by 5m and licence conditions including the following:
(a) No loading or unloading will take place from Seven Sisters Road
(b) All receptacles and other equipment to be removed from the highway at the end of each trading session.”

Reason for decision

The Committee considered all of the written and oral evidence.

The Committee noted the letters of support for the street trader from local shoppers, the Police and a local church, for his pitch to be sited permanently on the footpath in front of 67-83 Seven Sisters Road and detailed in Appendix 2 of the report.

The Committee also noted Transport for London’s decision to agree the application to designate this part of the street for street trading purposes, subject to certain conditions.

The Committee wished to support this area for ad hoc events to help to promote and enhance the local environment.

VARIATION OF THE STANDARD STREET TRADING LICENCE CONDITIONS UNDER SECTION 27 OF THE LONDON LOCAL AUTHORITIES ACT 1990 (AS AMENDED)

The Street Trading Manager stated that Street Trading Conditions and Procedures had last been reviewed in 2007. Markets had seen a lot of changes in the intervening years, with Whitecross and Exmouth Markets in particular having become established food markets. The Street Trading Manager had worked closely with the Council's Environmental Health Services Team to ensure that the new conditions and guidance for street traders ensured that health and safety issues associated with the handling of food and equipment were taken on board. In addition, it was thought that it would be more helpful to street traders and officers to have street trading conditions clearly separated from guidance on procedures, so there were now two separate documents to reflect this. The new Compliance Team would be checking the markets regularly to ensure that all conditions were being complied with.

RESOLVED:

- (a) That officers be thanked for their work in producing the new standard street trading conditions and procedures and guidelines documents.
- (b) That the revisions and additions to the existing street trading licence conditions and procedures, detailed in Appendices B and C of the report of the Service Director for Public Protection and summarised below, be approved:

Clause 13 – included to allow the instant suspension of a licence if the activity compromised the health and safety of the public. This could be for matters such as breaches of food safety regulations or violent conduct

Clause 20 – included as many traders had been welding brackets and extensions higher up their stalls to place displays that not only blocked out business/premises behind the stall, but made the stall unstable and unsafe, especially on windy days

Clause 22 - included to prevent traders from removing their equipment ie trailers being moved from the market at the end of the trading day and returning back on the pitch well before setting up time

Clause 25 – included to deal with unlicensed advertising boards which obstructed the highway and were not contained on pitches. Traders would be encouraged to advertise their wares in other ways so as not to clutter the area

Clause 27 – added to underline existing advice given to traders who used kiosks around the Borough

Clauses 28 – 37 – reinforced electrical safety. Detailed lists of conditions were included to cover any misuse of Council supplied electricity ports and to ensure that appliances were safe.

Clauses 38 – 45 – reinforced the need to contain refuse and to ensure that traders were not damaging the pavement/highway

Clause 45 - included because an issue of fixed premises using the Street Market waste collection was raised by representatives from Chapel Market

Clauses 62 – 65 – included to recognise the transfer of the invoicing system to the Sundries Income Team and the introduction and management of monthly rather than weekly charges

Clauses 66 – 70 – reinforced health and safety conditions with reference to the sale of foods

Clauses 71 – 80 – introduced to ease the administration tasks related to the sale of casual vouchers

Reason for decision

Licensing Regulatory Committee - 18 July 2016

The Committee considered all of the written and oral evidence.

The Committee heard from the Street Trading Manager that the existing street trading conditions had to be reviewed to address health and safety issues associated with the handling of food and equipment. The new, revised, standard street trading conditions provided greater clarity to traders.

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SUBJECT: APPLICATION TO DESIGNATE AN AREA OF THE HIGHWAY ON THE FOOTWAY OUTSIDE 2 Highbury Place, N5 1QZ, FOR STREET TRADING PURPOSES

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 To consider an application by the Council's Street Trading Team to designate for the purpose of street trading an area on the footway outside Nos. 2 Highbury Place, N5,1QZ (herein after referred to as "the location"), and effective daily between the hours of 08.00 – 18.00 hours.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1 To pass the resolution as set out in the public notice published in the local newspaper, Appendix 1, to designate an area of the footway outside 2 Highbury Place, N5 1QZ for street trading purposes.

3. Background

- 3.1 In 2015, The Street Trading Team were dealing with illegal trading and anti-social behaviour associated with illegal trading outside 2 Highbury Place, N5. Street Trading also had to deal with promotional companies that were setting up without permission opposite the entrance of Highbury Rail Station. As an experiment, temporary licensed promotions at the location were permitted. It was a success to the extent that it reduced problems of begging: illegal trading and homeless sleeping in the area. It also created a "feel-good" factor for residents and commuters alike who received a free promotional gift from these companies and helped reduce the congestion close to the entrance to the rail station. The location benefitted local businesses such as Clarissa Hulse who had an increase in visitors to their premises in Corsica Street. A map of the proposed designation is attached as Appendix 2 and a photograph as Appendix 3.

- 3.2 Although Transport for London (TfL) are not the Authority for the area, they are responsible for works taking place on the redevelopment of Highbury Corner. They had no objections to occasional promotional activities taking place at the location, see (Appendix 3A).
- 3.3 Consultations were carried out with ward councillors (see Appendix 3B); cleansing services and public realm (see Appendices 3C and 3D). An email outlining our intentions was sent to the Highbury East Neighbourhood Police team's direct line on 15 September 2016, asking for any comments. There was no response.
- 3.4 On 15 September 2016 a public notice was published in the local newspaper for one week, stating the Council's intentions to designate the location for the purpose of street trading (Appendix 1). At the same time copies of the council's intention were also attached to lamp posts in and around the location.
- 3.5 The Street Trading Team received three representations as a result of the consultation process, (see Appendices 3E, 3F and 3G). The deadline date was 13 October 2016.

4. Implications

4.1 Financial implications:

The Street Trading Account should break even each year and any shortfall would be met from compensating savings within this account.

The fees received as a result of the approval of this designation and the issue of the licence would help offset the additional costs incurred by the council in connection with cleansing, administration and enforcement of Part 111 of the provisions of the London Local authorities Act 1990 (as amended). Promotional areas would increase income.

4.2 Legal implications:

Section 24 of the London Local Authorities Act 1990 (as amended) set out the procedure to be applied for a local authority to designate a street or part of a street, for street trading purposes.

If a borough council pass a designating resolution the designation of the street shall take effect on the day specified in the resolution (which must not be before the expiration of the period of one month beginning with the day on which the resolution is passed). (section 24, (3))

The borough council shall publish notice of the passing of such a resolution in a local newspaper circulating in their area on two consecutive weeks, the first publication being no later than 28 days of the date the designation takes effect.

5 Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

- 5.1 The London Local Authorities Act 1990 (as amended) allows for designation of a street or a part of the street for street trading purposes. Applications of this nature are considered on their merits. This area would not be utilised for permanent day to day trading but for promotional purposes only. Approval of the location for promotional activities would enable the Street Trading Team to take greater control over spontaneous unannounced promotional and trading activities. For example, a promotions company had set up next to one of our established traders and were giving away free coffee and diaries, despite the fact the licensed trader sold coffee. They were also giving away crepes with every subscription taken for the Reader's Digest, and had not registered with Environmental Health. Extra income can be generated from this location and other future areas yet to be identified, throughout the borough. Unlicensed promotional displays have caused obstruction of the footpath and approval of this application will assist Street Trading in preventing this. If granted, income generated from the rental of the site is credited to the Street Trading account.

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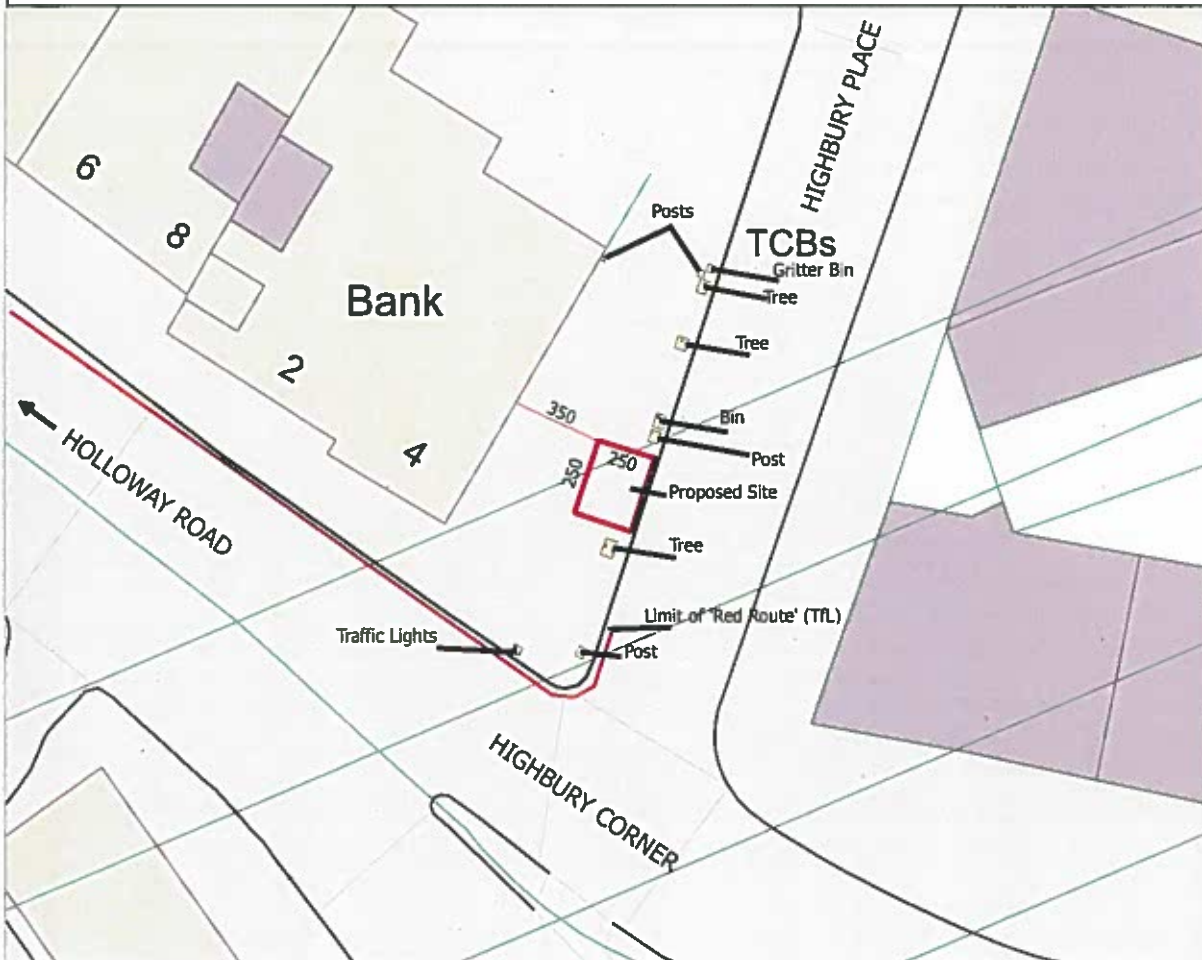

Good afternoon,

Thank you for your email concerning the area outside Barclays Bank being designated for trading. The intention was to keep this area for ad hoc promotional events. We had so many complaints regarding begging; homeless sleeping and illegal street trading coupled with promotion companies obstructing the entrance to the station that we experimented for the past six months with allowing small local businesses such as Clarissa Hulse and Bloombox to promote their businesses for a small fee. We extended this to the more up market companies such as Abel and Cole; Fresh; Riverford Organics and Freddie's Flowers who give away small promotional gifts, creating a feel good factor first thing in the morning! It has been a great success and the anti-social behaviour has decreased significantly.

I must emphasise this area is intended for promotional purposes only and so would not be selling or promoting the types of food products you mention, and would also not be a regular daily occurrence. This site would not be used when Arsenal are at home.

In relation to any promotion of food products, our team work alongside our colleagues in Environmental Health, so any catering taster stalls will only be allowed if their businesses are rated 3 or higher for hygiene as part of the FHRS (see food.gov.uk/ratings). As mentioned earlier they will not be selling or promoting the types of food you mention, and if relevant, they will also have achieved or be working towards the healthy Catering Commitment (HCC). HCC is a London wide scheme working with caterers to reduce levels of salt, sugar and saturated fats in foods served by the capital's catering industry.
