The Pollution team object to this TEN.

This TEN proposes to significantly increase the potential noise between 11pm and 5am from the premises and from deliveries from the premises without offering any mitigation to limit or prevent noise affecting local residents etc.

At a minimum I would expect conditions covering the period of late night refreshment to be in place to limit any noise disturbance to residents etc. for example:

- Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- No internal combustion engine vehicles will be used for deliveries from the premises.
- The licensee shall ensure that delivery riders do not park or loiter in the vicinity of residential premises.
- Delivery riders will conduct the delivery in a manner that will not cause a noise disturbance to the occupiers of any residential properties surrounding the delivery address.
- Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting staff and delivery riders to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

It is disappointing that no consideration has been given to measures to reduce noise impacts.

The Pollution team object to this TEN.

This TEN proposes to significantly increase the potential noise between 2am and 5am from the premises and from deliveries from the premises offering minimal mitigation to limit or prevent noise affecting local residents etc. by extending condition 1 from Annex 3 for the duration of the TEN.

Annex 3

1. Persons leaving the premises will be advised, by written notice prominently displayed and verbally where necessary, to leave the area quietly and without causing disturbance in the neighbourhood.

At a minimum I would expect conditions covering the period of late night refreshment to be in place to limit any noise disturbance to residents etc. particularly from delivery riders, for example:

- No internal combustion engine vehicles will be used for deliveries from the premises.
- The licensee shall ensure that delivery riders do not park or loiter in the vicinity of residential premises.
- Delivery riders will conduct the delivery in a manner that will not cause a noise disturbance to the occupiers of any residential properties surrounding the delivery address.
- Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting staff and delivery riders to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

It is disappointing that little consideration has been given to measures to reduce potential noise impacts.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. Shift managers shall have documented safety and security training.
2. The maximum number of persons (including staff) permitted on the premises at any one time is:
 - **87 on the Ground and Basement Floors.**
3. The licensee shall work in partnership with the local police force to prevent crime and disorder.
4. CCTV shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function at all times that the premises is open for licensable activities. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria:
 - a) The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct
 - b) A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, will be kept and made available on demand by the Police or an authorised officer from London Borough of Islington, in the lawful execution of their duty.
 - c) The Police Licensing Team will be informed by email if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason
 - d) One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering
 - e) The system will provide full coverage of the interior of the premises and any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public
 - f) The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped
 - g) At all times during operating hours, there will be at least 1 member of staff on the premises who can operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council Officers to view footage on request.
In the event there is no member of staff on duty that can operate the CCTV system the requested footage will be made available within 24 hours of request”
 - h) Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided free of charge on reasonable demand by the Police or an authorised officer from London Borough of Islington, in the lawful execution of their duty. Subject to the data protection act 1998 or any subsequent legislation and this must be done without reasonable excuse, within 24 hours of any request.
5. CCTV shall be maintained at the premises when the premises is open to the public. CCTV images shall be held for 28 days and access to the CCTV system shall be provided to police officers and council officers at their request.
6. The CCTV system shall meet the industry standard and will have Kalegate Certification.
7. The CCTV system shall have an alarm that will sound if the equipment is faulty or not recording, thereby alerting management for the need to intervene.
8. The licensee shall work in partnership with local Fire Service and Environmental Health Officers to ensure public safety.
9. Doors shall be maintained self-closing and customers shall be encouraged to be considerate to neighbours and limit noise when leaving the vicinity of the premises.
10. A “No open Alcohol Containers” policy shall be in place to prevent persons carrying open alcohol into the in-store area.
11. A & L Restaurants t/a McDonald’s will carry out litter patrols during the hours the store is open, ensuring that the area behind the store known as Swan Yard is checked at least three times per day and all litter found at that time will be collected. In addition, when the main storage bins located behind the premises are accessed for disposal of other litter, further checks will be made and any litter found at that time will also be cleared.

12. The licensee shall act on recommendations of the Environmental Health Officer concerning extending litter patrols, as far as is reasonably practical.
13. In the event that crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:
 - a) The Police and where appropriate the London Ambulance Service, are called immediately
 - b) As far as is safe and reasonably practicable, all measures will be taken to identify suspects pending the arrival of the Police
 - c) As far as is safe and reasonably practicable, all measures will be taken to preserve any identified crime scene pending the arrival of the Police. All staff will receive training and guidance from the Metropolitan Police in Crime Scene Preservation
14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on demand by the Police or an authorised officer from London Borough of Islington, in the lawful execution of their duty, which will record:
 - a) All allegations of crime or disorder reported at the venue
 - b) All complaints received by any party
 - c) Any faults in the CCTV system
 - d) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

 - f) All seizures of drugs or offensive weapons

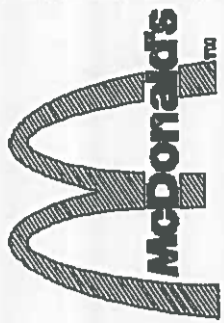

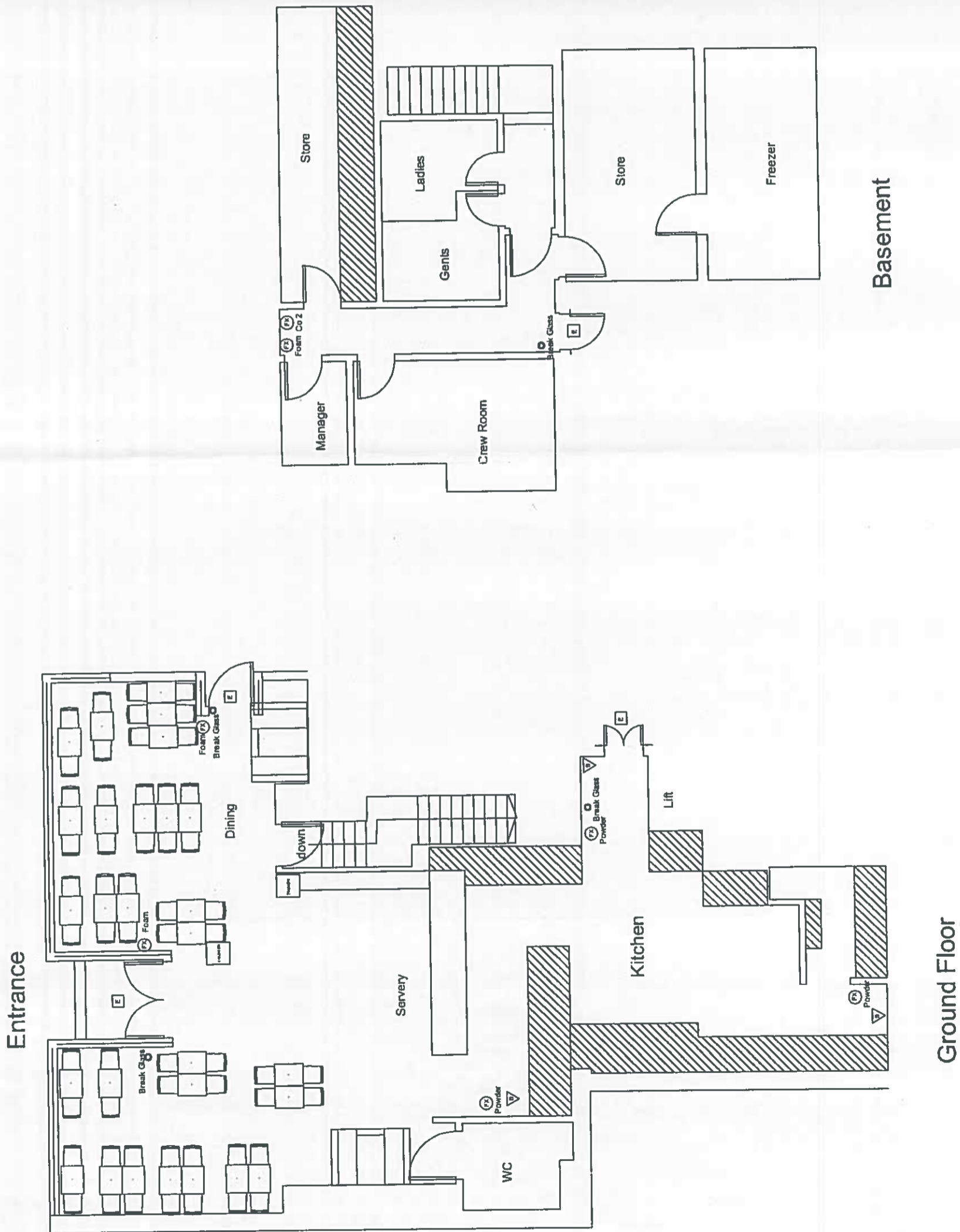
