64 INTRODUCTIONS AND PROCEDURE (Item A1)

Councillor Angelo Weekes welcomed everyone to the meeting and officers and members introduced themselves. The procedure for the conduct of the meeting was outlined.

65 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE (Item A2)

There were no apologies for absence.

There were no declarations of substitute members.

That the minutes of the meeting held on 19 March 2023 be confirmed as an accurate record of proceedings and the Chair be authorised to sign them.

70 <u>BUDGET SUPERMARKET, 18-20 CROUCH HILL, N4 4AU - PREMISES</u> <u>LICENCE VARIATION (Item B1)</u>

The licensing officer stated that there was no additional information to report.

The police reported that the applicant was seeking to vary condition 21. He was concerned that this condition had already been weakened and he considered that any further loosening of this condition would have a detrimental effect on the area. There were issues in the area such as street drinking and anti-social behaviour which made the area challenging.

In response to questions, it was noted that street drinking was commonplace in Elthorne Park. Holly Park estate also had hostels for vulnerable people and this area was one of the first areas to pilot Reducing the Strength drinking as it was

known as a hot spot. He had sought to clarify the price point and stated that the applicant had said that the alcohol would be bought at a unit cost to them of 75 pence.

The licensing agent stated that this was a small convenience store and a small change to a condition was requested to allow a greater number of products to be sold. It was proposed that alcohol would be sold at a price of 75 pence per unit. The number of units in a product would be multiplied by 0.75 in order to be able to be sold. Many shops did not have this condition.

In response to questions, the applicant's agent stated that the applicant wished to sell a wider range of products. Alcohol could then be sold but at a higher price point eg a 2.5I bottle of Frosty Jacks contained 18.8 units and could therefore not be sold for less than £14. The unit referred to in the condition was one unit of alcohol. The police had been consulted but did not agree with the condition, so the applicant had made a full application to go to the Sub-Committee. There had been no issues with this premises. The premises was already selling high strength alcohol and other shops in the area were selling high strength alcohol.

The Sub-Committee raised concerns regarding the 3am licence and it was stated that local supermarkets were only open until 1am. The licensing agent stated that if the shop sold whisky the Sub-Committee would not have these same concerns. He advised that shops in the local area already sold alcohol. Customers could buy alcohol locally in the Finsbury Park area and the licensing agent advised that they could condition to not serve this alcohol after midnight.

In summary, the police stated that even though the price point had been clarified this had not dissuaded them from their objection.

The licensing agent stated that the licensing objectives would be promoted by the minimum unit price and the high price of strong alcohol would dissuade street drinkers.

RESOLVED

That the application for a new premises licence, in respect of Budget Supermarket, 18-20 Crouch Hill, N4 4AU be refused.

REASONS FOR DECISION

The Sub-Committee listened to all the evidence and submissions and read all the material. The Sub-Committee reached the decision having given consideration to the Licensing Act 2003, as amended, and its regulations, the national guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.

The application was for a variation of an existing premises licence. The existing licence permits off supplies sale of alcohol from Monday to Sunday from 7am to 3am the following day.

The Sub-Committee took into consideration the fact that the premises are situated in an area with a significant street drinking problem. Street drinkers and homeless people congregate in the area and there are street drinking shelters/homes in the area accommodating many vulnerable residents. The premises are not situated in a specifically designated cumulative impact area but as an off sales business the premises fall under the ambit of Licensing Policy 4.

Under Licensing Policy 4, the Council has adopted a special policy relating to cumulative impact in relation to shops and other premises selling alcohol for consumption off the premises. The policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for the grant or variation of premises licences which are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused or subject to certain limitations, following the receipt of representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in the operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

The Sub- Committee noted the submissions of the Police representative who stated that in his opinion the adding of the additional condition would add to the risk of high strength alcohol being available for sale to vulnerable people in the area and by doing so would increase the prospects of crime and anti-social behaviour for the other residents.

The Sub Committee considered the fact that the applicant and/or his representative could not in their answers to specific questions from the Sub Committee, provide an explanation as to why the variation would benefit the business in any way. The applicant submitted that the variation as worded would provide stronger strength products at a far higher sale price that those of his competitors.

The existing conditions already provide for the sale of high strength beers, lagers and ciders provided they are sold in glass bottles. The reasoning behind this condition being to make the products unattractive to younger drinkers/front loaders and street drinkers. The proposed additional condition would be extremely difficult to enforce.

Licensing Policy 4 has been adopted specifically to control the ease of access to alcohol in street trading hotspots and in areas visited by vulnerable people.

There are possible exceptions to the cumulative impact policy for off sales of alcohol. Applicants need to demonstrate policies that restrict or prevent the sale of high strength beer, lager and cider, single cans and miniatures.

The Sub Committee was not satisfied that presumption in relation to Policy 4 had been rebutted in relation to the impact the granting of the variation would have.

Taking all factors into account the Sub Committee concluded that the proportionate and reasonable decision to would be to refuse the application for the variation in order to promote the licensing objectives.

1. Synopsis

- 1.1. This is an application for a variation of the premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1.3. The variation application is to allow:
 - The sale of alcohol, Off the premises, Mondays to Sundays, from 06:00 to 23:00.
 - To add the following conditions:

- There shall be no sale of single cans of beer, lager, or cider from the premises.
- There will be no sales/supplies of beer, lager, or cider with an ABV over 6% save for craft or premium beers.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. To determine the application for a variation premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003;
- 2.2. If the Licensing Sub-Committee grants the application, it should be subject to:
 - i. Conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 3); and
 - ii. Any conditions deemed appropriate by the Licensing Sub-Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

3.1. This premises has held a licence since 2005 when it was converted from the Old Justices Licence to a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

- 3.2. In September 2007, an application to transfer the licence and vary the Designated Premises Supervisor was made by Malthouse Retail Limited.
- 3.3. Designated Premises Supervisor variations were made in March and May 2010, December 2017, and May 2018. In May 2018, the DPS was varied to Parameswaran Jegan who remains the current DPS.
- 3.4. In April 2019, an application was made to transfer the licence from Malthurst Retail Limited to Motor Fuel Limited.
- 3.5. An application to vary the Licence was made in March 2020 to extend the sale of alcohol, update the plans attached to the licence, remove embedded conditions and to add a number of conditions.
- 3.6. This variation application was received by the Council's Licensing Service on 6th June 2023.
- 3.7. The Licensing Authority received representations from three local residents, copies of which can be found at Appendix 2.

4. Implications

4.1. Financial Implications

4.1.1. The Head of Finance reports that the applicant has paid the application fee of \pounds 190.00. Should the application be refused, the fee is not refundable.

4.2. Legal Implications

- 4.2.1. The legal implications are set out in Paragraph 2.
- 4.2.2. Legal advice will be provided at the meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee, as necessary.

4.3. Environmental Implications and contribution to achieving a net zero carbon Islington by 2030

4.3.1. The Licensing Sub-Committee need to consider the impacts that that proposals will have on the environment. An impact is defined as any change to the environment, whether positive or negative, wholly, or partially resulting from Council activities. Almost all human activity has some impact on the environment, and it is very unlikely that any activity will not have any implications.

- 4.5.3. Planning permission was granted on 21 September 1972 for the erection of a petrol filling station, together wit a block of twelve maisonettes above and twelve private garages at the rear. (Ref:TP3675).

Condition (5) states: - The petrol filling station shall not open for use between the hours of midnight and 6am on any day.

- 4.5.4. There are no current enforcement cases relating to this site.
- 4.5.5. No planning objection.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

There are further 'Mandatory conditions' applicable to licences authorising the supply of alcohol. A full list of the current mandatory conditions is available from the licensing pages on Islington's web site, <u>www.islington.gov.uk</u>. This list is subject to change by order of the Secretary of State and licensees and other responsible persons are advised to ensure they are aware of the latest conditions.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. CCTV shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function all times that the premises is open for licensable activities. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria

(a) The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct.

(b) A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, will be kept and made available to the police or other authorised officer on request;

(c) The Police will be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason;

(d) One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering;

(e) The system will provide full coverage of the interior of the premises and any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public;

(f) The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped;

(g) The system will be specified so as to operate satisfactorily regardless of lighting conditions;

(h) During opening hours, at least 1 member of staff on duty will be able to operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request;

(i) Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days;

(j) Footage will be provided free of charge to the police or other authorised officers upon request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.

2. All sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers, for consumption away from the premises only.

3. No spirit miniatures or other bottles containing alcohol below 33cl shall be sold from the premises at any time.

4. In the event that crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:

(a) the police and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service, are called immediately.

(b) As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to preserve any identified crime scene pending the arrival of police

5. There shall be no advertising or marketing of alcohol products in the store windows.

6. At all times that the premises is open outside the alcohol trading hours, all alcohol will be covered (ie completely obscured from view) using a suitable curtain, cabinet or shutter.

7. All sales tills will offer a Challenge 25 reminder / prompt the cashier making an alcohol sale to verify that the customer is over 18.

8. An incident log shall be kept on the premises and made available to the police or local authority upon reasonable request, which will record:

(a) Any and all allegations of crime or disorder reported at the venue

(b) Any and all complaints received by any party

(c) Any faults with the CCTV system

(d) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

9. The premises shall operate the Challenge 25 proof of age scheme, whereby the only forms of acceptable identification shall be:

(a) Photographic driving licence;

- (b) Valid passport;
- (c) Military/ UK Services Photo ID;
- (d) PASS Hologram ID;

(e) Any other form of identification from time to time approved by the secretary of the state.

10. The premises will be fitted with a burglar alarm system.

11. All staff engaged or to be engaged in the sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive training in conflict resolution, age restricted sales and recognising the signs of intoxication.

12. There will at all times be adequate levels of staff maintained at the premises. Such staff levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and police.

Issues of Concern

Licensing Policy 2 & 3 – The premises is located within the Holloway and Finsbury Park Cumulative Impact Area. It is a busy commercial and residential area and Islington is committed to minimising any adverse impacts in terms of crime, disorder, nuisance, and anti-social behaviour.

Licensing Policy 4 - The Licensing Authority has adopted a special policy relating to cumulative impact in relation to shops and other premises selling alcohol for consumption off the premises. This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications for premises licences, which are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact, will normally be refused or subject to certain limitation, following the receipt of representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in the operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

The applicant has not put forward any mitigation or information in the operating schedule to demonstrate that these premises would not have a negative impact in an area saturated with outlets for alcohol. The premises as also close to a drug and alcohol dependency unit, and it is not uncommon for users of these centres to seek out alcohol in the early hours.

Licensing Policy 5 - Where representations are received from responsible authorities or other persons the Licensing Authority may seek to restrict hours of opening where it is appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

Licensing Policy 6 - Licensing Hours- The hours applied for are outside of the recommended policy hours for off sales of alcohol, which are from 8am to 11pm each day.

The Licensing Authority is committed to protecting the amenity of residents and businesses in the vicinity of licensed premises, and to reducing the impact on public and emergency services.

The Licensing Authority will seek to impose appropriate restrictions and controls on the premises licence to prevent public nuisance and undue disturbance to residents from licensed premises.


Existing Conditions on the current premises licence

- 1. CCTV shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function all times that the premises is open for licensable activities. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria
 - a) The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct.
 - b) A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, will be kept, and made available to the police or other authorised officer on request.
 - c) The Police will be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason.
 - d) One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, fulllength image of anyone entering.
 - e) The system will provide full coverage of the interior of the premises and any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public.
 - f) The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped.
 - g) The system will be specified so as to operate satisfactorily regardless of lighting conditions.
 - h) During opening hours, at least one member of staff on duty will be able to operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request.
 - i) Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days.
 - j) Footage will be provided free of charge to the police or other authorised officers upon request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
- 2. All sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers, for consumption away from the premises only.
- 3. No spirit miniatures or other bottles containing alcohol below 33cl shall be sold from the premises at any time.
- 4. In the event that crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:
 - a) the police and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service, are called immediately.
 - b) As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to preserve any identified crime scene pending the arrival of police
- 5. There shall be no advertising or marketing of alcohol products in the store windows.

- d) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 9. The premises shall operate the Challenge 25 proof of age scheme, whereby the only forms of acceptable identification shall be:
 - a) Photographic driving licence.
 - b) Valid passport.
 - c) Military/ UK Services Photo ID.
 - d) PASS Hologram ID.
 - e) Any other form of identification from time to time approved by the secretary of the state.
- 10. The premises will be fitted with a burglar alarm system.
- 11. All staff engaged or to be engaged in the sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive training in conflict resolution, age restricted sales and recognising the signs of intoxication.

- 1.1. This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

 - The sale by retail of alcohol, on & off supplies, Mondays to Sundays from 12:00 until 23:00; and
 - The premises to be open to the public, Mondays to Sundays from 12:00 until 00:00.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. To determine the application for a variation of the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003;
- 2.2. These premises are located in the Holloway Road and Finsbury Park Cumulative Impact Area therefore the Licensing Sub-Committee will need to consider Licensing Policy 3, which states that there is a presumption of refusal unless the Sub-Committee is satisfied that there will be no adverse cumulative impact on the licensing objectives.
- 2.3. If the Licensing Sub-Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. Conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 4); and
 - ii. Any conditions deemed appropriate by the Licensing Sub-Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1. The premises licence was granted before a licensing sub-committee on 25th May 2021. The licensee and DPS initially named on the licence at the time of approval are still active at the time of writing this report.
- 3.2. There have been periodic reports of noise nuisance and allegations of the premises selling alcohol beyond their permitted hours over the last 6 months. While most of these complaints were not substantiated, the premises was found to be open beyond its permitted hours on 11th May 2023.
- 3.3. The licensing service engaged with the licensee in response to this breach and ensured that management were aware of their licensable hours and related conditions. The licensee wished to extend the terminal hour for sale of alcohol and opening hours so was given advice regarding the premises licence variation process.
- 3.4. This premises licence variation application was subsequently received by the Council's licensing service on 12th June 2023.
- 3.5. The Council's noise service submitted a representation in response to the application however, this was withdrawn based on agreed conditions of approval. These conditions are detailed at Appendix 4 of this report.
- 3.6. At the end of the consultation process there was one remaining representation from a local resident. This representation is detailed at Appendix 3 of this report.

4. Implications

4.1. **Financial Implications**

- 4.1.1. The Head of Finance reports that the applicant has paid the application fee of \pounds 190.00. Should the application be refused, the fee is not refundable.
- 4.2. Legal Implications
- 4.2.1. The legal implications are set out in Paragraph 2.
- 4.2.2. Legal advice will be provided at the meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee as necessary.

4.3. Environmental Implications and contribution to achieving a net zero carbon Islington by 2030

4.3.1. The Licensing Sub-Committee need to consider the impacts that that proposals will have on the environment. An impact is defined as any change to the environment, whether positive or negative, wholly or partially resulting from Council activities. Almost all human activity has some impact on the environment, and it is very unlikely that any activity will not have any implications.

4.4. Equalities Impact Assessment

- 4.4.1. The council must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation, and to advance equality of opportunity, and foster good relations, between those who share a relevant protected characteristic and those who do not share it (section 149 Equality Act 2010). The council has a duty to have due regard to the need to remove or minimise disadvantages, take steps to meet needs, in particular steps to take account of disabled persons' disabilities, and encourage people to participate in public life. The council must have due regard to the need to tackle prejudice and promote understanding.
- 4.4.2. An Equalities Impact Assessment is not required in relation to this report, because this is a decision relating to a Premises Licence application under the Licensing Act 2003.

4.5. Planning implications

- 4.5.1. The property is not a listed building but it is located in the St Mary Magdalene Conservation Area.
- 4.5.2. The property has a long established use for retail purposes.
- 4.5.3. However, planning law was changed by the government on 1 September 2020 by virtue of the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2020. This changed the use classes order 1987 that created a new Class E that incorporates retail, cafes, restaurants and offices etc.
- 4.5.4. On this basis, the use noted in the license application would not be in breach of planning control. There is no objection.

5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

5.1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee determines this application.

2. Recommendations

 - i. Conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 3); and
 - ii. Any conditions deemed appropriate by the Licensing Sub-Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1 The application describes the premises as being a restaurant.
- 3.2 This is an application for on sales of alcohol from 12:00 until 23:00 Monday to Sunday.

- 3.3 The application received three letters of representation from local residents.
- 3.4 The applicant has accepted conditions requested with the Police and Islington's Noise Service.

4. Implications

4.1. Financial Implications

4.1.1. The Head of Finance reports that the applicant has paid the application fee of \pounds 190.00. Should the application be refused, the fee is not refundable.

4.2. Legal Implications

- 4.2.1. The legal implications are set out in Paragraph 2.
- 4.2.2. Legal advice will be provided at the meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee as necessary.

4.3. Environmental Implications and contribution to achieving a net zero carbon Islington by 2030

4.5. **Planning implications**

4.5.1 The Planning department confirmed the use as a restaurant is lawful and that the premises does not have any restrictive conditions in relation to opening hours. Planning has no concerns with regards proposed licence.

We run the premises only for the licensable activity only. We would have sufficient and competent manpower at the premises. We take responsibility for serving the alcohol by personal license holder or the desginated person only. We would avoid drunkenness in the premises and do not server to the underage person. All the necessary required record would be kept of the training and refresher training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We would have CCTV maintained and operated in the premises. CCTV captures the most useful area and notice would be kept in to let the public know the CCTV is in operation and may be used as an evidence. CCTV record image would kept for 31 days. When necessary we would pass a copy of the CCTV record image to the police in the suitable format to carry and retrieve. As the owner of REDACTED, I am writing to object to the proposal to grant an alcohol licence to a new restaurant, Katsumama (Ground Floor Unit 4, Rosebery Court) from Monday - Sunday, 12:00 - 23:00.

My objection is on the grounds of the Prevention of Public Nuisance. We already have problems of anti-social behaviour in the area, especially around Bath Court, which have been the subject of complaints to Islington Council by our management company, Hindwoods. We also have had numerous problems with late night customers at Kalbi Restaurant (also occupying a Ground Floor unit) spilling out onto the street, drinking, smoking and on occasion obstructing the entrance to our block. The granting of a drinks licence to another premises in the immediate area would exacerbate these problems without improving the quality of life for residents of Rosebery REDACTED and nearby blocks.

I fully understand that in this area of Clerkenwell a balance has to be struck between the needs of commercial premises and the right of residents to quiet enjoyment of their homes. I am also very aware of the benefits that restaurants of many kinds bring to the district and that this is one of its many attractions. However, in this case, I believe that granting a drinks licence to Katsumama tilts the balance too far towards the commercial interest and would be detrimental to residents of Rosebery Court. It means that below our block we would have two licensed premises, serving alcohol seven days a week from midday until late at night. This is surely a step too far and I hope that you will reconsider this proposal.

We write in response to the licence application relating to the above-mentioned premises ("the premises").

Our names are REDACTED and REDACTED. We live at REDACTED

We urge the licensing committee to reject this application. The immediate surroundings are inherently residential in nature.

- The premises itself is within a residential building Rosebery Court, with around 30 flats.
- Immediately across the road and facing the premises are two residential buildings (Barnstaple and Bideford Mansions) with approximately 25 flats.
- Immediately adjacent to the premises is another residential building (Braunton Mansions) with six flats.

While there is one restaurant in the immediate vicinity (Kalbi, 1-2 Rosebery Avenue) and a convenience store (Retail Express, 3 Rosebery Avenue), these businesses do not generate any noise or anti-social behaviour. Nor is there any significant night time activity. We have lived in this area since 2012. There has been no bar and no night time noise during all of that time.

We oppose the application because:

- There are no other premises in the immediate vicinity where alcohol can be consumed on site. There are many bars on Farringdon Road and Exmouth Market. But none near 36A Rosebery Avenue. Allowing this application would result in a significant change to the area.
- A new bar would likely result in noise and disturbance, which is likely to have a negative impact on approximately 60 residential premises in the immediate surroundings. None of these flat have been exposed to a bar before, and there is no good reason why one should be permitted in this location. There are plenty of other units available in nearby areas that are less residential and already populated by bars.
- We are concerned about an increase in public nuisance as a result of a new bar in an area where there are currently none.
- In particular, the proposed operating hours (12.00-23:00) seven days a week is excessive. This will impact on residents (including children) being able to sleep. Rosebery Avenue is very quiet at night - a new bar will invariably result in more noise at night. We are worried that REDACTED son will be kept up at night due to the noise. His bedroom REDACTED the premises.
- A new bar in an area where there are currently none which is open until 11pm every night is likely to result in more crime and disorder.

Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

Conditions have been reworded by the Responsible Authorities and are listed below.

Conditions proposed by Islington's Noise Service – Agreed

- 1. Noise or vibration must not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 2. In the event of a noise/nuisance complaint substantiated by an authorised officer, the licensee shall take appropriate measures in order to prevent any recurrence.
- 3. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 4. The outside frontage shall be swept and cleared of any rubbish and smoking litter associated with the business towards the end of trade each evening.
- 5. Any music shall be restricted to ambient background levels of sound.
- 6. Alcohol may only be consumed on the premises while being seated at a table.
- 7. The last sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises shall be 30 minutes before the stated closing time.
- 8. No more than 5 patrons, at any one time, shall use the frontage of the premises to smoke after 21:00hrs until closing. Signage shall be displayed to advise customers of this.
- 9. All doors and windows will remain closed from 21:00 hours, except for access or egress.
- 10. The shutters to the front of the premises shall be maintained so as not to cause a noise nuisance when in operation to residential properties in close vicinity.
- 11. The licensee shall practice best endeavours to ensure that no internal combustion engine vehicles are used for deliveries from the premises.
- 12. If internal combustion engine vehicles are used for deliveries from the premises, the licensee shall ensure that drivers do not park or loiter in the vicinity of residential premises.
- 13. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, via delivery from the premises, otherwise than to persons purchasing food and is ancillary to their meal.
- 14. The premises will operate a no idling policy.
- 15. Delivery drivers will conduct the delivery in a manner that will not cause a noise disturbance to the occupiers of any residential properties surrounding the delivery address.

Conditions proposed by the Metropolitan Police-Agreed

1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained at all times that the premises is open for licensable activities, so as to comply with the following criteria;

- The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and time of the person checking, shall be kept and made available to police or authorised council officers on request.

- The police must be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason.

- One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering.

- The system will provide coverage of any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public.
- The system shall record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped.

- Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided free of charge to police or authorised council officers on request, (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.

- 2. Clear, permanent signage will be prominently displayed at the entrance to the premises stating:
 - CCTV in operation.
 - Challenge 25 Proof of Age Scheme in operation.
 - Residential Area: Please be respectful of our neighbours and leave quietly.
- 3. The premises shall operate the Challenge 25 proof of age scheme, where the only acceptable forms of identification shall be:
 - Photographic driving licence.
 - Valid passport.
 - Military/UK Services Photo ID.
 - PASS Hologram ID.
- 4. Non-intoxicating beverages shall be available to patrons at all times where alcohol is sold, and tap water shall be provided free of charge upon request.
- 5. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant whereby:
 - All customers are shown to their table;
 - The supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service;

- Substantial meals, freshly prepared and plated on the premises, shall be served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery/cutlery;

- Save for the exception made below; alcohol shall only be supplied to persons seated in the premises and taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

- There shall be no vertical drinking anywhere on the premises at any time save for a maximum of 4 persons permitted to be provided with a drink whilst waiting to be shown to their table.

- 6 An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to officers of the police or local authority. Said log shall be updated as soon as reasonably practicable and in any event within 12 hours of any given incident. All entries will be dated, timed, and signed. Said log shall record the following:
 - Any and all crimes reported to the venue.
 - Any and all ejections of customers.
 - Any and all complaints received concerning crime and disorder.
 - Any and all incidents of disorder.
 - Any and all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons.
 - Any and all faults in the CCTV system.
 - Any and all refusals of the sale of alcohol.
 - Any and all visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 7. There shall be no sales of:
 - beers or ciders af 6.5% abv or greater
 - spirit miniatures
- 8. A current and direct number for a dedicated local taxi company shall be made available to customers at all times.
- 9. No drink promotions shall be operated at any time.
- 10. In the event that any serious assault is (or appears to have been) committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:
 - The police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay.

- All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the police.

- The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police.

- Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.

11. All staff members engaged in selling alcohol on the premises shall, upon induction and every 12 months thereafter, receive training pertinent to the Licensing Act.

- All such training shall be fully documented, signed by the employee, and kept at the premises for inspection by Police or other authorised officers.

- Training shall include, but not be limited to:
- The premises age verification policy
- Dealing with refusal of sales
- Identifying attempts by intoxicated persons to purchase alcohol Identifying signs of intoxication.
- 12. The licensee shall train and instruct the management and staff to prevent the admission of, and ensure the immediate and orderly departure of:
 - Any and all persons who appear to be drunk and/or disorderly.

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- Any and all persons displaying signs of other substance abuse.
- 13. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside of the premises do so in an orderly manner and are regularly monitored by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction on the public highway.
- 14. A fire safety risk assessment shall be completed as per government guidelines on an annual basis (Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005). Maximum venue capacity will be maintained at a level dictated by said risk assessment, as per legislation.
- 15. A fully stocked first aid kit shall be maintained at the premises and all staff shall be aware of its location.
- 16. All emergency exits shall be clearly and prominently signed and shall be maintained unobstructed at all times.

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
