1. Synopsis

- 1.1. This is an application for a variation of a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2. The variation application is to allow:
 - The provision of Late Night Refreshment from 23:00 until 03:30 Monday to Sunday
 - Opening hours of the premises from 10:00 until 03:30 Monday to Sunday

- 1.3. The existing premises licence allows:
 - The provision of Late Night Refreshment from 23:00 until 00:00 Sunday to Thursday and From 23:00 until 01:00 Friday and Saturday.
 - Opening hours from 10:00 until 00:00 Sunday to Thursday and From 10:00 until 01:00 Friday and Saturday.

2. Recommendations

- To determine the application for a variation of the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003;
- 2.2. This premises is located in the Kings Cross Cumulative Impact Area therefore the Licensing Sub-Committee will need to consider Licensing Policy 3, which states that there is a presumption of refusal unless the Sub-Committee is satisfied that there will be no adverse cumulative impact on the licensing objectives.
- 2.3. The applicant has accepted conditions suggested by Islington Council's Noise Service.
- 2.4. If the Licensing Sub-Committee grants the application it should be subject to:

- i. Conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 4); and
- ii. Any conditions deemed appropriate by the Licensing Sub-Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1 The property has held a premises licence for late night refreshment for the hours listed in 1.3 of the report since 28 January 2021.
- 3.2 The application for a new premises licence had been refused by Members of the Licensing Sub Committee on 20 July 2021.
- 3.3 The decision was appealed by the applicant on the grounds of
 - a) The respondent's decision was against the weight of evidence before it.
 - b) The respondent did not give sufficient weight to the Home Office Section 182 Guidance when arriving at its decision.
 - c) That the refusal of Premises Licence application was neither proportionate nor appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 3.4 On 28 January 2021 a Consent Order was agreed between the applicants Legal Representative and Islington Council. A premises licence was subsequently issued to the premises, to the agreed terms.
- 3.5 This is an application to vary that premises licence to extent the terminal hour for the provision of late night refreshment until 03:30 daily.
- 3.6 The application received two letters of representation, these were from the Licensing Authority and Islington's Police Licensing Team.
- 3.7 The applicant has accepted conditions requested by Islington's Noise Service.

4. Implications

4.1. Financial Implications

4.1.1. The Head of Finance reports that the applicant has paid the application fee of \pounds 190.00. Should the application be refused, the fee is not refundable.

4.2. Legal Implications

4.2.1. The legal implications are set out in Paragraph 2.

4.2.2. Legal advice will be provided at the meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee as necessary.

4.3. Environmental Implications and contribution to achieving a net zero carbon Islington by 2030

4.3.1. The Licensing Sub-Committee need to consider the impacts that the proposals will have on the environment. An impact is defined as any change to the environment, whether positive or negative, wholly or partially resulting from Council activities. Almost all human activity has some impact on the environment, and it is very unlikely that any activity will not have any implications.

4.4. Equalities Impact Assessment

- 4.4.1. The council must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation, and to advance equality of opportunity, and foster good relations, between those who share a relevant protected characteristic and those who do not share it (section 149 Equality Act 2010). The council has a duty to have due regard to the need to remove or minimise disadvantages, take steps to meet needs, in particular steps to take account of disabled persons' disabilities, and encourage people to participate in public life. The council must have due regard to the need to tackle prejudice and promote understanding.
- 4.4.2. An Equalities Impact Assessment is not required in relation to this report, because this is a decision relating to a Premises Licence application under the Licensing Act 2003.

4.5. Planning implications

4.5.1 The Planning & Development section have the following comments to make in relation to the above application:

The property is located within the Barnsbury Conservation Area but it is not listed.

The property has an established use within Class E of the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) Order 1987 (as amended).

There are no planning conditions restricting opening hours.

There are no planning enforcement cases relating to the use of the property.

As such, there is no objection.



Issues of Concern

The applicant has not put forward any mitigation or information in the operating schedule to demonstrate that these premises would not have a negative impact in an area saturated with outlets for take away and delivery of food. In fact, the applicant already has a late-night refreshment premises next door at 2b York Way which is open until 5am each day.

Licensing Policy 6 - Licensing Hours- The hours applied for are outside of the recommended policy hours for premises selling hot food and drink supplied by takeaway and fast-food premises, which is Sundays to Thursday 11pm to midnight and on Fridays and Saturdays 11pm to 1am.

Licensing Policy 22 & 23- The Licensing Authority is committed to protecting the amenity of residents and businesses in the vicinity of licensed premises, particularly when late hours have been sought. Where relevant representations are received, the Licensing Authority will impose appropriate restrictions and controls on the premises licence to prevent public nuisance and undue disturbance to residents from licensed premises.

Licensing Police 25 - Delivery drivers from this and the other food outlets very close by will congregate outside while waiting to pick up orders. Islington now has several areas where delivery drivers are congregating and causing noise and anti-social behaviour, leading to complaints from residents and businesses.

Recommendations

The Licensing Authority suggests that should the Committee consider granting an extension of hours, the effect of delivery drivers in the local area be taken into account and ask that all deliveries be by non-motorised vehicles, there should be a plan of where riders would wait and pick up deliveries and, that the management of the premises monitor the behaviour of the drivers and operate a procedure for taking action on any drivers causing anti-social behaviour.

Dear Licensing Authority,

With reference to the above application the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, object to the Premises Licence Application for the extension of late night refreshment hours.

We believe if this application was granted it would undermine the Licensing Objectives as the application currently requests operating times out of framework hours for trading and does not provide any clear case for exceptional cultural or other reasons or additional safeguarding measures as to why there would be no adverse impact in regards to the potential for crime and disorder or anti-social behaviour resulting.

The applicant for this premises is also the Licensee for Crystal Kebab 2B YORK WAY N1 which is located next door. Page 25

The above premises Crystal Kebab initially came to Police attention in June 2023 following a number of incidents, I have provided a brief timeline of events.

On Thursday 01st June 2023 around 2005 hours, Police officers attended the venue following reports two customers had made threats towards a members of staff. The pair verbally racially abused them and referred to their ethnicity before throwing food (sauces) at them. One of the member stated to officers the suspects may have been armed as one was seen putting his hands in their pockets. The suspect left prior to police arrival. The investigation was closed as the victims did not wish to pursue the matter.

In the same month on Wednesday 15th June 2023 at 0140 hours police were called to the premises following a report of three suspects threatening staff members with violence. Further information was relayed that one of the suspects was armed with a knife. Police officers attended the venue and were informed by staff members that CCTV was not working and had not recorded the incident. The report was closed.

On Friday 16th June 2023 at 2235 hours the premises was visited by the Islington Licensing team. Pc Darren Emmanuel spoke to the PLH Mr Ahmet Terpak who stated the fault with the CCTV had been reported and an engineer was due to attend the following week to remedy the issues.

On Wednesday 12th July 2023 at 0119 hours police were called to reports of a fight. It transpired that an altercation had taken place between a male and staff from the venue after the male had asked to use the toilets. It transpired that a staff member has armed himself with a metal bar and hit the male in the shoulder as he believed he may have been in possession of a weapon due to his body language.

Staff informed officers that there was a fault with the CCTV system and it would not have recorded the incident.

Mr Toprak was invited in for a panel to discuss the incident and subsequent concerns.

When discussing the matter concerning the CCTV system Mr Toprak had contacted an engineer following the visit by Pc Emanuel in June 23.

Mr Toprak stated that he did not check the CCTV system as there was never any trouble at the venue and assumed the system was recording. He could not produce any documents to support that any CCTV system checks were being conducted. Mr Toprak did not produce any documents to support that incidents were being recorded/documented. It was pointed out to Mr Toprak that he was not adhering to the conditions Annex 2 1, 2 and 3 under the premises licence.

It was agreed the licence required updating to include further conditions to assist Mr Toprak to promote the licensing objectives and demonstrate that he is a responsible operator.

The premises is located in the Kings Cross area and is considered to be one of the busiest and challenging areas in Islington. It is therefore paramount that any premises seeking to operate in this area with extended hours does so to a high standard.

I respectfully ask the committee to take into account the serious concerns raised in this representation and not grant the extens bage 26 urs.



2. Recommendations

- 3. Background

- 3.1. This new premises licence application was received by the Council's licensing service on 7th August 2023. The applicant has amended the hours of operation from the hours on the application to: Mondays to Thursday, from 12:00 to 23:00, Fridays and Saturdays from 12:00 to 00:00 and on Sundays, from 12:00 to 22:30
- 3.2. This property has previously been licensed.
- 3.3. Carouse London Limited were the previous licence holder, however due to the company being dissolved, the premises licence lapsed. A copy of that licence is attached at Appendix 2.
- 3.4. The licensing authority received four letters in opposition to the application from local residents. On receipt of the representations, the applicant wrote to each of the representors responding to the concerns they had raised along with a copy of the conditions that have been agreed with the Responsible Authorities, following that three of the representors withdrew their objection. Conditions have been agreed with the Council's Noise Service and the Metropolitan Police
- 3.5. At the time of writing this report no additional comments from the remaining representor have been received.

4. Implications

4.1. Financial Implications

4.1.1. The Head of Finance reports that the applicant has paid the application fee of \pounds 190.00. Should the application be refused, the fee is not refundable.

4.2. Legal Implications

- 4.2.1. The legal implications are set out in Paragraph 2.
- 4.2.2. Legal advice will be provided at the meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee as necessary.

4.3. Environmental Implications and contribution to achieving a net zero carbon Islington by 2030

4.3.1. The Licensing Sub-Committee need to consider the impacts that that proposals will have on the environment. An impact is defined as any change to the environment, whether positive or negative, wholly or partially resulting from Council activities. 

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

There are further 'Mandatory conditions' applicable to licences authorising the supply of alcohol. A full list of the current mandatory conditions is available from the licensing pages on Islington's web site, <u>www.islington.gov.uk</u>. This list is subject to change by order of the Secretary of State and licensees and other responsible persons are advised to ensure they are aware of the latest conditions.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, consumed in or taken from the premises except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means the authorised hours specified on this licence for the sale by retail of alcohol. This restriction does not prohibit:
 - a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
 - b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
 - consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
 - h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- 2. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours for the sale by retail of alcohol unless one of the following applies:
 - a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.

- b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

3. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virute of the enactments hereinafter set out:

Children and Young Persons Act 1933 Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955 Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985

- 4. Any customer suspected of possessing or using drugs on the premises will be immediately removed from the premises by the DPS, barred from entering the premises again and shall be reported to the Police. Notices to this effect shall be prominently displayed on the premises.
- 5 The premises shall raise awareness of safer drinking and travel at night by use of the premises in house display boards, these board shall also prominently display local licence mini cab numbers.
- 6 Notices will be prominently displayed at exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents; to use the toilet facilities prior to leaving the premises; and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 7 The premises shall enforce a proof of age scheme, which is approved by the authorised officer of the Council and by the Local Police.
- 8 No unaccompanied children will be allowed in the premises at any time. Children accompanied by an adult will vacate the premises by 20.00.
- 9 The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25 and the BII National Standards Proof of Age Scheme.
- 10 CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained, at all times that the premises is open for licensable activities, so as to comply with the following criteria:
 - a. The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, shall be kept and made available to Police or authorised Council officers on request;
 - b. The Police must be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason;
 - c. One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering;
 - d. The system will provide coverage of any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public;

- e. The system shall record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped;
- f. Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided free of charge to Police or authorised Council officers on request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request; &
- g. At all times, there will be a person on the premises who can operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request.
- 11 In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
 - a. The police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;
 - b. All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the police;
 - c. The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police; and
 - d. Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.
- 12 Noise and vibration must not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 13 The beer garden/outside drinking area shall be cleared of drinking customers by 22:00. After that time up to 6 customers shall be permitted to smoke on the frontage. No drinks shall be taken outside after 22:00
- 14 Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 15 The entertainment noise control system is to be calibrated and maintained at settings which restrict amplified sound played on the premises to, or below, the following levels (all readings measured in the centre of the room front bar area at 1.5 metres above the floor level approximately 2 metres from the speakers).

Maximum Levels Sound shall not exceed

- a) 82dB(A) L_Aeq(1 min)
- b) 81dB at 63 Hz
- c) 78dB at 125 Hz

In the event of a noise complaint relating to amplified sound substantiated by authorised officers the licensee shall reduce all levels of amplified sound at the premises to the lower levels quoted on the premises licence until such works are carried out to contain sound to the satisfaction of the Pollution Team.

- 16 All pre-recorded music played through the in-house music system shall be controlled by an automatic electronic noise limiting device which restricts the sound system output to below pre-set threshold levels. All music from live bands, or DJs utilising their own amplification equipment, shall be controlled by a continual music noise level monitoring device which cuts the power supply to the sound system if a pre-set threshold is exceeded.
- 17 The entertainment noise control system shall be monitored, checked and calibrated as necessary, so that the levels approved by the Council, are not exceeded.
- 18 The controls for the entertainment noise control system shall be located in a secure, lockable cupboard or similar location. The entertainment noise control system is to be independent of control by persons other than the licensee. Access to the

entertainment noise control system is to be restricted to the Licensee or a designated manager.

- 19 Doors and windows to the premises will be kept closed, so far as practicable, at all times when noise generating regulated entertainment is taking place i.e. live and recorded music.
- 20 Bottling out from the premises is prohibited between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours.
- 21 In the event of a noise complaint substantiated by an authorised officer, the licensee shall take appropriate measures in order to prevent any recurrence.
- The delivery of licensable goods shall be restricted to the hours between 09:00 and 19:00 Monday-Saturday. No deliveries shall be made on a Sunday or Bank Holiday.
- 23 There shall be no collections of refuse or bottles between the hours of 23:00 and 08:00.
- 24 Exterior lighting shall be directed away from residential properties.
- 25 Any off sales shall be limited to drinks in sealed containers for customers to take away and consume at home.

I hope these conditions go some way in allaying your fears about noisy drinking crowds late at night.

Appendix 4

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

1. The disposal of empty bottles into the bins outside will not be permitted between the hours of 22:00 and 07:00.

Conditions agreed with the Metropolitan Police

- 1. In the event that crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:
 - a) The police and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service, are called immediately.
 - b) As far as is safe and reasonably practicable, all measures will be taken to apprehend any identified suspects pending the arrival of the police.
 - c) As far as is safe and reasonably practicable, all measures will be taken to preserve any identified crime scene pending the arrival of the police.
 - d) Any and all appropriate measures are taken to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises at all times during operating hours.
- 2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to the police or an authorised officer, which will record:
 - a) Any and all allegations of crime or disorder reported at the venue
 - b) Any and all complaints received by any party
 - c) Any faults in the CCTV system
 - d) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
 - e) Any and all ejections of patrons
 - f) Any and all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - g) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- 3. CCTV shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function all times that the premises is open for licensable activities. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria:
 - a) The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct.
 - b) A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, will be kept, and made available to the police or other authorised officer on request.
 - c) The Police will be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason.
 - d) One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, fulllength image of anyone entering.
 - e) The system will provide full coverage of the interior of the premises and any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public.

- f) The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped.
- g) At all times during operating hours, there will be at least 1 member of staff on the premises who can operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request.
- h) Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided free of charge to the police or other authorised officers on request (subject to the Data Protection Act 2018) within 24 hours of any request.
- i) Signage stating that CCTV is in operation will be clearly and prominently displayed at the premises.
- j) The use of CCTV at the premises shall be registered with the Information Commissioners Office [ICO].
- 4. The premises will operate the 'Challenge 25' proof of age scheme.
 - a) All staff will be fully trained in its operation.
 - b) Only physical production of suitable forms of photographic identification, such as passport or UK driving licence, or a holographically marked PASS scheme cards, will be accepted. A screenshot or digital document copy will not be sufficient.
- 5. The licence holder will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff and security. Such staff and security levels will be disclosed, on request, to the Licensing Authority and the Police.
 - a) The need for door supervisors will be assessed by way of risk assessment and cognisance will be taken of any police advice.
- 6. The licensee shall ensure that all staff are trained on relevant matters, including the conditions of the premises licence, age restricted products and [if they are ever left in charge of the shop] the operation of the CCTV system and how to deal with visits from authorised officers. The licensee shall keep written records of training and instructions given to each member of staff, detailing the areas covered to include the Licensing Objectives, identifying persons under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof of age & checking it, making & recording a refusal, avoiding conflict & responsible alcohol retailing. Staff shall sign to confirm that they have received and understood the training. All staff who work at the till will be trained for their role on induction and be given refresher training every six months. The written training records kept for each staff member will be produced to police & authorised council officers on request.
- 7. The premises shall not be hired out to any third party.
- 8. The premises to operate a zero-tolerance policy to drugs. Any customer suspected of possessing or using drugs on the premises will be immediately removed from the premises by the DPS, barred from entering the premises again and shall be reported to the Police. Notices to this effect shall be prominently displayed on the premises.
- 9. The premises licence holder shall endeavour to eliminate or minimise any nuisance arising out of its licensable activities. In doing so the premises licence holder will work with enforcement authorities where any issues are identified. A complaints procedure will be maintained in order that local residents have a means of contact if necessary. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at the times the premises is open. The telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
- 10. A fire safety risk assessment shall be completed as per government guidelines on an annual basis (Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005). (Maximum venue capacity will be maintained at a level dictated by said risk assessment, as per legislation).

- 11. The beer garden/outside drinking area shall be cleared of drinking customers by 22:00. No drinks shall be taken outside after 2200 hrs. A maximum of 6 smokers shall be permitted to stand outside the frontage after 2200 hrs once the outdoor has closed. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so in in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 12. The premises to operate a zero-tolerance policy to drugs. Any customer suspected of possessing or using drugs on the premises will be immediately removed from the premises by the DPS, barred from entering the premises again and shall be reported to the Police. Notices to this effect shall be prominently displayed on the premises.
- 13. Off supplies of alcohol must be provided in sealed containers, except for such supply to persons seated within any authorised external consumption area.
- 14. Where a takeaway service is provided for the supply of alcohol the licensee shall take appropriate steps to ensure the local area is not adversely effected by such supply.
- 15. There shall be no motorised deliveries of take-away food or drink from the premises at any time.
- 16. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any third party deliver/courier company is instructed to comply with the following:
 - a) Any refusals will be logged by the delivery driver. Records of all refusals will be obtained from the delivery company and provided to the relevant authorities upon request; and
 - b) Couriers will be trained on relevant aspects of the Licensing Act 2003 including underage sales, sales to a person who is drunk, obtaining alcohol for a child or a person who is drunk and delivering alcohol to someone under the age of 18.
- 17. Any person or automated system taking an order for the supply of alcohol on behalf of the premises licence holder will inform customers that proof of age by way of photographic driving licence, passport, or a form of identification with the PASS hologram may be required before alcohol is supplied in accordance with the Challenge 25 age verification scheme.

Conditions agreed with the Council's Noise Service

- 1. Noise, vibration, and odour must not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 2. In the event of a noise/odour nuisance complaint substantiated by an authorised officer, the licensee shall take appropriate measures to prevent any recurrence. Upon direction by the Licensing Team, this may include the licensee appointing a noise consultant registered with the Institute of Acoustics or Association of Noise Consultants to prepare a scheme of sound insulation and noise control measures, which may include the installation of a noise limiting device, to prevent persons in the neighbourhood from being unreasonably disturbed by noise of music from the premises. The scheme shall be submitted for approval by the Council, and the approved scheme fully implemented to the satisfaction of the Council and the licensee notified in writing accordingly, prior to the premises being used for music.
- 3. If a noise limiting device is installed, sound levels shall be set so as not to cause a nuisance to the nearest noise sensitive premises and levels agreed with the Council's Pollution Team. A calibration certificate shall be provided by your acoustic consultant to show maximum levels in dB(L) Leq(5min) and dB(A) Leq(5min), as well as in the 125 and 63 Hz frequency bands, measured within the venue.
- 4. If there are any changes in the distribution and type of loudspeakers or amplification equipment serving the sound system, then the noise control system shall be re-calibrated to ensure the music

levels given above are not exceeded. The calibration certificate shall be forwarded to the Licensing team.

- 5. The licensee shall ensure that the limiters are tamper-proof, are located in a secure, lockable cupboard or similar location and access restricted to the licensee or a designated manager and are maintained and calibrated as instructed by the Acoustic Consultant or if the council requests an up-to-date calibration certificate if substantiated noise complaints are received, and the calibration certificates shall be submitted to the Council.
- 6. Patrons of the premises shall be encouraged, by signs within the premises visible at all exit points, to disperse from the area of the premises quietly and quickly.
- 7. Waste collections and the delivery of licensable goods to the venue shall be restricted to the hours between 07:00 and 22:00 Monday-Saturday. No waste collections or deliveries shall be made on a Sunday or Bank Holiday.
- 8. The licensee shall practice best endeavours to ensure that no internal combustion engine vehicles are used for deliveries from the premises.
- 9. If internal combustion engine vehicles are used for deliveries from the premises, the licensee shall ensure that drivers do not park or loiter in the vicinity of residential premises.
- 10. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, via delivery from the premises, otherwise than to persons purchasing food and is ancillary to their meal.
- 11. The premises will operate a no idling policy.
- 12. Delivery drivers will conduct the delivery in a manner that will not cause a noise disturbance to the occupiers of any residential properties surrounding the delivery address.
