Subject: PREMISES LICENCE NEW APPLICATION

Yum Yum, 379 St John Street, London, EC1V 4LD.

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is seeking to allow:
 - The provision of late night refreshment, Tuesdays to Sundays, from 23:00 until 03:00, and Mondays, from 23:00 until 00:00;
 - The applicant has stated that the premises will close at 23:00 to customers and the
 extended hours are for deliveries only; however, elsewhere in the application, the
 applicant has proposed that the premises will be closed to the public from 00:00 Mondays
 to Fridays and from 01:00 on Saturdays and Sundays.

- 3.2 The Licensing Sub Committee granted a licence to a former operator on 6 November 2012 to allow Late Night Refreshment until 23:30, Mondays to Sundays. This licence was subsequently surrendered on 16 December 2013; the then licence holder stated that they had never used the licence.
- 3.3 The current applicant has stated that they have operated to the same times as proposed in the application within the area of Westminster City Council for 7 years. The Licensing Service have contacted Westminster City Council who have confirmed that they have no record of a licence for the premises identified by the applicant.
- 3.4 The provision of Late Night Refreshment is defined within Schedule 2 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the definition includes the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public, whether for consumption on or off the premises, between the hours of 11pm and 5:00am.
- 3.5 Representations have been received to this application from the Metropolitan Police, three local residents and a local property management company representing 8 local properties. The Licensing Authority has also made representation.
- 3.6 The applicant has submitted a response to the representations.
- 3.7 Licensing Officers monitored activity at the premises on 7 July 2017 and found that the premises being used for the provision of late night refreshment. The operator was sent a warning letter on 10 July 2017.

4. Planning Implications

3.1 Planning have reported:

"The application is for a premises licence to extend the hours of operation at a Chinese takeaway, which is operating under an A5 use class. Historical records confirm that a Chinese takeaway has existed at the premise for a number of years and, on the balance of probability, it is now a lawful use. There are no enforcement investigations concerning the land. As such, the planning department has no objections to the application."

5 Recommendations

- 5.1 To determine the application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5.2 These premises are located in the Clerkenwell Cumulative Impact Area therefore the Licensing Committee will need to consider Licensing Policy 2, which states that there is a presumption of refusal unless the Committee is satisfied that there will be no adverse cumulative impact on the licensing objectives.
- 5.3 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
 - i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 5)
 - ii. any conditions deemed appropriate by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

6 Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

6.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions as appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

M – The steps I intend to take to promote the four Licensing Objectives

General

I have seven years experience running this model of operation to the times applied for in the City of Westminster, with no issues or complaints. Similarly, I have been operating a delivery service from this premises since I took over in July last year until 01:00 on weekdays and until 02:00 at the weekends. I understand that there have been no issues or complaints. These are also the times the previous owners operated the premises until.

The prevention of crime and disorder

- CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. 1. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business then Police must be informed.
- 2. The premises licence holder will work closely with the Police and the Licensing Authority.
- 3. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police.
- 4. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder.

Public safety

5. All exit routes shall be kept unobstructed, with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.

The prevention of public nuisance

- 6. Staff at the premises shall ensure that the immediate area outside the premises is kept clear of rubbish at all times the premises are open and operating.

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority in respect of this new application for a Premises Licence to permit late night refreshment on the premises

Monday to Saturdays from 23:00 to 03:00

Sundays from 23:00 to 00:00

The application contains an anomaly over the proposed hours and it is unclear what the applicant's attentions are. In the description of the premises the applicant has stated it is their intention to close at 23:00 hours but would like to deliver food until 03:00; however, in the proposed conditions attached to the application (number 8), the applicant has stated that the premises would be closed to the public from midnight Monday to Friday and 01:00 on Saturday and Sunday.

The application raises concern about compliance with the Licensing Act 2003. The applicant has stated that they ran a premises in Westminster for the same hours as currently being sought for 7 years. The Licensing Service has contacted Westminster Council who have reported that no licence was ever granted for the premises referred to. Furthermore, the applicant has reported that they have been operating the current premises to 02:00 without a licence since July 2016. The applicant states that they have relied on information provided by their solicitor but has evidently made no attempt to obtain a copy of the "licence", which the solicitor referred to. This admission raises concerns about the ability of the applicant to comply with the licence requirements.

The applicant has stated that they have operated from this premises with no issues or complaints. However, Council records show that the applicant has been issued with 4 Fixed Penalty Notices in respect of litter offences relating to these premises since November 2016; these remain unpaid.

The premises has previously been licensed. The Licensing Sub Committee granted a licence on 6 November 2012 to allow Late Night Refreshment until 23:30, Mondays to Sundays. This licence was subsequently surrendered on 16 December 2013; the then licence holder stated that they had never used the licence.

Whilst it is appreciated that the current application does not include the sale of alcohol, the premises is in a part of the borough which is relatively quiet late at night despite being located between the borough's two busiest late night areas at the Angel and in Clerkenwell. Whether the premises is open to customer or not, the arrival and dispatch of delivery drivers will inevitably lead to an increase in noise levels in the early hours of the morning.

The following Policies, determined by the Licensing Authority as being appropriate to promote the licensing objectives, are relevant to this application:

Licensing Policies 1, 2, 8, 9, 10, 18

- The premises is located in the Clerkenwell Cumulative Impact policy area;
- The premises is located in an area where there are no other late night operating premises in the immediate vicinity;
- The premises is located very close to residential dwellings;
- The proposed hours are outside the favourable hours for take-away premises (midnight Sunday to Thursday and 01:00 Friday to Saturday);
- The applicant has demonstrated a lack of understanding of the legal requirements and has admitted to a history of non-compliance in respect of the Licensing Act 2003;
- There is evidence of non-compliance with other statutory requirements and poor

management in respect of litter management.

In view of these concerns the Licensing Authority is making a representation against the grant of this application. It is recommended that the application be refused as the Licensing Service has concerns about the ability of this operator to comply with the legal requirements and operate to the required standards.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives, Prevention Of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of public nuisance

The venue is situated in the 'Clerkenwell Cumulative impact area' (CIA), an area which traditionally suffers from high levels of crime and disorder and there are concerns that the addition of a further Licensed venue will add to this impact causing further policing problems in an already demanding area.

I am aware that this venue has been operating without a License for the last year. The applicant Mr Zekair Herar only made this application after contacting the Council Licensing Team to ask about making a license variation. It was then discovered that the previous venue License had been surrendered in December 2013.

Mr Herar stated that when buying the premises he had been told by his solicitor that the venue was licensed until 3am. I appreciate that Mr Herar was paying for best advice from his solicitor but I am astonished that he has never taken the time to read a copy of the license, if there was one, and if he did not have a copy then why has he not contacted the Council to ask for a duplicate. I have grave concerns about his ability to manage the venue correctly and within any conditions on the license.

I emailed Mr Herar asking for some information regarding the application. I received a very short reply so I further emailed asking for further information and details of Mr Herar's previous experience within the licensing trade. I have not had a reply at this time.

I have been made aware that Mr Herar did operate a venue in Westminster for a number of years but it seems that Westminster Licensing have not heard of this venue?

I submit that the Committee refuse the application.

I am writing on behalf of the eight owners and occupiers of the flats comprising in connection with the above application under the Licensing Act 2003. I am the Company Secretary of Pilotgrange Property Management Company Limited, which is the company co-owned by the eight flat-owners and acts on behalf of the common interests of the residents.

Together we constitute the properties which are closest and therefore most immediately affected by this application recently submitted by Yum Yum restaurant and take-away, and are concerned about the impact on order, noise and safety that may result from approving the application.

The presence of Yum Yum has already led to a considerable increase in the level of noise in the street as a result of the activities of both the direct customers of Yum Yum and the delivery scooters/motorbikes whose drivers park and gather outside both Yum Yum itself and further up the road outside Nos. including smoking and chatting on the doorsteps of our premises. This has resulted in higher levels of noise in the early hours of the morning, so the nights are already much noisier, particularly on the occasions when there are arguments outside which then provoke further noise, dogs barking, and so forth, and can sometimes become quite disturbing for us as the nearest residents.

We recognise that local and passing communities have an interest in encouraging local food and other businesses and have therefore not wished to make an issue of this in the past, but we believe that this application goes beyond what is in the common public interest. The extension of hours which has been proposed, including deliveries until 3am in the morning, will inevitably lead to considerably more nuisance and disturbance for a large part of the night, regardless of whether this relates to retail to customers or goods delivery.

Furthermore, we believe that an application for an alcohol licence is inappropriate and unnecessary: inappropriate because of the association between late-night drinking and public disturbance, and unnecessary since it is possible already to buy alcohol from shops within the area, some of which are open very late or even all night.

We therefore oppose granting this licensing application because it will increase the level of noise and other forms of public nuisance well into the early hours of the morning and – especially given the involvement of alcohol – has the potential to lead to crime and other disorders.

I trust that you will take into account the objections raised by the flat-owners of the eight properties which are nearest and therefore most affected, and reject this application. Thank you for considering our views.

Visit with NF 7 July 2017

Initially we drove past premises at 23:36 and observed lights on and 3 people behind the serving counter. Two motor cycles were parked immediately outside on the pavement and two males, who appeared to be delivery drivers, were standing immediately outside. I took a photograph as we drove past; NF was driving. We parked on St John Street and monitored activity at the premises standing on the opposite side of the road. I observed one of the riders was smoking. At 23:59 a third motor cycle arrived, pulling up outside. The rider entered the shop, collected an order, returned to his motor cycle and drove away. One of the remaining two riders then left with an order, which he collected from inside, on his motor cycle at 00:03. A further motor cyclist arrived, parked on the pavement opposite, entered shop, collected an order and then left. We continued to monitor, patrolling the pavement on the opposite side of the road and observed at least 5 different motor cyclist arriving, collecting and leaving with orders. We walked past the entrance, where the door was open and the sounds of cooking could be heard and the smell of Chinese style food cooking was clearly evident. A member of staff was seen preparing food in delivery packages. We returned to our vehicle and then drove past the premises again at 00:11. No shutters down, lights still on, and staff still visible behind the counter. There were at least two delivery drivers visible, now standing inside the premises. The were 3 motor cycles parked on the pavement outside and a further motor cycle parked on the pavement opposite.

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect.
