# Youth Crime: Our offer (1)

# The Working Together for a Safer Islington Plan was launched in June 2017. Over the past year we have:

- Expanded the remit of the IGT now working with more young people on the cusp of Gang activity
- Increased capacity into YOS since 2016- i-Work Coach and Educational Psychologist and 3 ISS staff
- Youth Violence Tool kit out into all our primary and secondary schools
- Safe Spaces initiative in public and community buildings for young people to go to if they feel unsafe
- Knife Programmes in all schools and the Safer Schools
  Police linked to all schools in Borough



# Youth Crime: Our offer (2)

- Islington Fire Cadets programme starting Sept 18
- Saturday Night offer for Youth Hubs and increased work
  with Arsenal
- Increased Detached Youth Work offer to more hot spots across borough in Targeted Youth Support
- 2017 **summer assertive outreach** team 2017 successful at diversion as reduction in knife crime during this period
- New Abianda post in TYS starting this summer to enhance work around young women involved in unhealthy relationships
- We will continue to joint fund **trauma informed training** in schools into 2018/19
- Increased Counselling posts into targeted work/ youth hubs

## **Youth Crime Performance 2017 - 18**

- 8.5% reduction in knife crime injuries victims under 25 (March 2018) compared to London increase of 2.9%
- 2. Slight decrease: 0.2% in youth violence London increase: 2.2%
- 3. Increase: 4.3% in serious youth violence but less than London increase of 13.7%
- 4. 28% increase in theft snatch offences but 60% reduction since the introduction of Op Gondola in January 2018

#### The YOS has seen smallest cohort since 2010 -81 (12 are 18)

- 5. 20% reduction in first time entrants to youth justice system (75 in 16/17 compared to 60 in 17/18)
- 43% reduction in young people receiving custodial sentences from 30 (16/17) to 17 (17/18)

# **The Integrated Gang Team**

The work of the IGT has been highlighted as good practice in the national & local press.

In the past year the IGT worked with 129 young people / young adults

- 73 gang involved young people
- 27 gang affected young women
- 29 young victims of crime.

**Impact** – Among the gang involved young people IGT achieved a:

- 5% reduction in the arrest rate among the cohort
- 67% reduction in the YP harm score.
- 5% decrease in the proportion of the cohort arrested
- 31% supported to access EET
- 49% supported in to secure and stable accomodation

# **Council Investment Tackling Youth Violence**

The £500k per annum council investment has been used to provide mentoring, key working, trauma informed training for 100+ practitioners schools etc and posts in the IGT and Missing and Exploited team.

### Achievements to date include:

- St Giles Key Working: 68 YP engaged of the 32 who completed interventions: 5 exited gangs and 61% reduced or had no new offending
- Safer London mentoring 11 17 years: Of 35 closed cases: 100% decreased offending behaviour and 91.7% achieved engagement in EET
- Chance UK mentoring 5 11. Of 49 children: 74% had no behaviour difficulty & 54% increase in pro-social behaviour at the end of the mentoring

# **Youth Crime Challenges**

- London wide context of the increase in knife crime with 37 fatally stabbed since January and 62 overall murders in Capital
- Increase in cocaine use and dealing contributing to violence
- High rates of robbery offences particularly in north of the borough
- Sustaining the reduction in mobile phone theft when enhanced police resource ends (Op Gondola)
- Reduction in police resource which impacts on day to day
- Impact of county lines and the exploitation of young people
- Surrounding boroughs have limited youth offer and no IGT (except Hackney and this is being reviewed)

# ISLINGTON

### Ofsted Outcomes (January 2017 – May 2018)

#### Primary (maintained schools/primary PRU)

- 18 primary schools inspected/100% good or better
- 2/18 primary schools improved their rating to outstanding
- 1/18 will be inspected again within 18 months judged good but capacity to remain good is fragile, hence a re-inspection
- 7/18 schools were supported by School Improvement Service to secure good or better outcomes

#### Secondary (maintained)

- 2 secondary schools inspected
- 1 school judged good
- 1 school judged requiring improvement



# Y6 (end of KS2)Primary Attainment 2017:




Islington's % reaching the Expected (EXS) for RWM Combined, at 66 is 2 percentage points below the rate for Inner London and 13 percentage points above England





# KS2 Primary Progress 2017: Maths – LBI v Nat. PP v NPP






