**SUBJECT: PREMISES LICENCE VARIATION APPLICATION
RE: OLD QUEENS HEAD, 44 ESSEX ROAD, LONDON
N1 8LN**

1. Synopsis

1.1 This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

1.2 The premises currently holds a licence allowing:

- The provision of live music on Monday to Friday from 18:00 to 00:00, and on Saturday and Sunday from 12:00 to 00:00.
- The provision of recorded music from 12:00 to 02:00 on Monday to Saturday and from 12:00 to 02:00 on Sunday
- The sale of alcohol, on & off supplies, from 10:00 to 02:00 on Monday to Saturday and from 12:00 to 02:00 on Sunday
- The provision of late night refreshment from 23:00 to 02:00 on Monday to Sunday.
- The opening hours of from 10:00 to 03:00 on Monday to Saturday and from 12:00 to 03:00 on Sunday.

1.3 The variation application is seeking to

- reduce the hours permitting licensable activity and the opening hours by one hour every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday;
- extend the hours permitting licensable activity by one hour every Saturday; and
- extend the opening hours by 30 minutes every Saturday.

The premises would as a result allow:

- The sale of alcohol, on & off supplies, Mondays to Wednesdays from 10:00 until 01:00, Thursdays & Fridays from 10:00 until 02:00, Saturdays from 10:00 until 03:00 and Sundays from 12:00 until 02:00;
- The provision of live music, Mondays to Wednesdays from 18:00 until 23:00, Thursdays & Fridays from 18:00 to 00:00, Saturdays from 12:00 until 01:00 and Sundays from 12:00 to 00:00.
- The provision of recorded music, Mondays to Wednesdays from 12:00 until 01:00, Thursdays & Fridays from 12:00 until 02:00, Saturdays from 12:00 until 03:00 and Sundays from 12:00 until 02:00.
- The provision of late night refreshment, Mondays to Wednesdays from 23:00 until 01:00, Thursdays & Fridays from 23:00 until 02:00, Saturdays from 23:00 until 03:00 and Sundays from 23:00 until 02:00 and
- The premises to be open to the public, Mondays to Wednesdays from 10:00 until 02:00, Thursdays & Fridays from 10:00 until 03:00, Saturdays from 10:00 until 03:30 and Sundays from 10:00 until 03:00.

The application is also seeking to authorise the following non-standard timings for Sale of alcohol, Recorded Music Late Night Refreshment and the hours open to the public:

- New Year's Eve, until the time authorised on the following day; and
- An extension to the permitted hours on 1st January, Easter Sunday and Sundays preceding bank holiday Mondays by an additional hour.

3. Background

- 3.1 The premises was granted the current hour for licensable activities in 2007. The most recent licence application was granted on 3 July 2018. This application was to convert an upstairs storage room into a licensable area without increasing overall capacity for the premises.
- 3.2 This application was submitted on 25 May 2020, it is subject a representation from a ward Councillor and one local resident.
- 3.3 The Police licensing team made a representation but this was withdrawn on the agreement of additional conditions.

4. Planning Implications

- 4.1 There no planning implications for this application.

5. Recommendations

- 5.1 To determine the application for a variation of the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5.2 These premises are located in the Angel and Upper Street Cumulative Impact Area therefore the Licensing Committee will need to consider Licensing Policy 3, which states that there is a presumption of refusal unless the Committee is satisfied that there will be no adverse cumulative impact on the licensing objectives.
- 5.3 If the Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
- i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 3); and
 - ii. any conditions deemed appropriate by the Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.(see appendix 3)

6. Reasons for recommendations

- 6.1 The Council is required to consider this application in the light of all relevant information, and if approval is given, it may attach such conditions as appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

We have extensive internal training scheme for all staff. We are members of the local the Pubwatch scheme. We have an excellent team of SIA registered door supervisors. All of our senior staff have personal licenses.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We have an high quality CCTV system and keep the data for six weeks. We have excellent staff training in this area. We pick effectively on the door of our premises. Our marketing is designed to attract a demographic in which crime and disorder is less commonplace.

c) Public safety

We conduct regular searches on the door of the premises. Anyone suspected of drug use is removed from the premises, barred and the police are notified. At busy times we switch from using glassware to polycarbonate glasses.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We operate a slow exit procedure - licensable activity ceases but we do not ask everyone to leave the premises at the same time, patrons leave over an extended period, once taxis have been ordered, reducing the number of patrons on the street outside at any one time. We display signs requesting patrons are quiet as they leave the premises. Our security request patrons are quiet as they leave. At close we have a senior manager on the street monitoring egress. We utilise a sound limiter to ensure no amplified music can be heard outside the premises. Doors and windows are kept closed aside from entry and egress. Refuse collection and deliveries only happen during the day. Our smoking area is monitored by security and staff.

e) The protection of children from harm

We operate a Challenger 21 scheme, both at the door and at the bar. We do not allow children into the premises.

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, consumed in or taken from the premises except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means the authorised hours specified on this licence for the sale by retail of alcohol. This restriction does not prohibit:
 - a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
 - b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
 - d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
 - h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

2. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours for the sale by retail of alcohol unless one of the following applies:
 - a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
 - d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

3. Unless otherwise specified on this licence no regulated entertainment shall take place at the premises with the exception of pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dancing for pre-invited guests.
4. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:
 - Children and Young Persons Act 1933
 - Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
 - Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985
5. Any customer suspected of possessing or using drugs on the premises will be immediately removed from the premises by the DPS, barred from entering the premises again and shall be reported to the Police.
6. The manager shall actively participate in and support the local Pubwatch scheme.
7. There shall be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate consumption of alcohol.
8. CCTV system shall be installed and maintained inside and outside the premises, including a CCTV unit, which monitors the immediate vicinity of the premises. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Tape recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a police officer with 24 hours of any request.
9. Patrons of the premises shall be encouraged, by signs within the premises visible at all exit points, to disperse from the area of the premises quietly and quickly. Staff shall also supervise persons leaving the premises after entertainment has taken place and where necessary, request that persons leaving the premises do so in an orderly manner as quickly as possible.
10. There will be no persons under 18 on the premises at any time.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. The storage and removal of refuse will not cause a nuisance to local residents. No bottling out or removal of refuse from the premises will take place between 23.00 and 07.00
2. There shall be no more than a maximum number of 270 persons, excluding staff, at any one time in the premises and the maximum number for each floor shall be:

Ground Floor - 120
First Floor – 150
Second Floor - 60

3. To regulate smoking outside the premises after 23:00 on Fridays and Saturdays through the use of a smoking area marked out by stanchions situated to the left hand side (when facing) of the front entrance. The smoking area will not exceed 14 square metres and must remain within their curtilage.
4. All amplified sound played at the premises shall not exceed the following levels:

Ground floor levels

90 dB Leq (linear)
85 dBA LAeq (A-weighted)
86 dB at the 125 Hz octave band
85 dB at the 63 Hz octave band
when measured facing the rear wall standing at a position midway between the supporting columns in the main customer area.

First floor levels:

93 dBA LAeq (A-weighted)
90 dB at the 125 Hz octave band
102 dB at the 63 Hz octave band
when measured at the front of bar, near stage at 2m from bass and 3m from mid loud speakers.

Second Floor Front Room (The Playroom)

87 dB Leq (1 min)
83 dBA LAeq (1 min)
81 dB at 63 Hz and
82 dB at 125 Hz
Measured in the centre of the room 2 metres from the nearest loudspeakers.


Second Floor Rear Room (Karaoke Room)

95 dB Leq (1 min)

GROUND FLOOR PLAN




FIRST FLOOR PLAN

Dear Ryan,

I wish to formally object to this application as an elected member of the Council for St Peters ward.

I have over the years dealt with many complaints about noise in relation to licensed premises on Essex Road around the Old Queens head, and opposite, and from the Winchester at the top of St Peters street. Complaints are not just about noise from licensed premises themselves, but more significantly from the customers of licensed premises as they leave at closing time, when they are most voluble and noisy after having consumed quantities of alcohol.

I am particularly mindful of the recent review of the license for the Winchester Bar, which is in an almost identical relationship to residential properties to the Old Queens head, and which caused very significant amounts of disturbance in the surrounding streets up to around 4.30am, as customers waited for cabs, and gradually drifted away. My strong view is that the hours for The Old Queens Head should be guided by the recent review decision on the Winchester, and should not be any later. My views are related to the licensing objective "the prevention of public nuisance" and "the prevention of crime and disorder".

Dear All,

Ref application for license variation of The Old Queen's Head Public House, 44 Essex Road, Islington, London, N1 8LN

We hear that The Old Queen's Head has requested to extend the opening hours and in particular extend till 3.30 AM with alcohol served till 3 AM on Saturday night.

I think any extension should not be granted as the current situation is already really bad. And it will become even worse.

We live in front of the pub and we've had to call the Anti Social Behaviour team several times as exasperated by their clients, standing outside the premises on the public pavement till late at night, often drunk and very loud, and heavily disrupting the neighbourhood with their bad behaviour. During the weekends when they close late at night the outside area becomes almost like a street party and allowing them to stay open even longer will cause us to stay awake even longer.

An extension will also encourage nearby bars to apply for a similar license extension and have it granted on the basis there is already a precedent case.

Please do consider the residents in the area, whose life is already badly impacted by these pubs.

2. We shall be a member of the local pub watch.
3. The premises shall operate documented dispersal procedure to minimise public nuisance.

Conditions proposed by the Metropolitan Police (Agreed)

4. In the event that serious crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:
 - (a) The police and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service, are called immediately;
 - (b) As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to apprehend any identified suspects pending the arrival of the police;
 - (c) As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to preserve any identified crime scene pending the arrival of the police;
 - (d) Any and all appropriate measures are taken to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises at all times during operating hours.
5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to the police or an authorised officer, which will record:
 - (a) Any and all allegations of crime or disorder reported at the venue
 - (b) Any and all complaints received by any party
 - (c) Any faults in the CCTV system
 - (d) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
 - (e) Any and all ejections of patrons
 - (f) Any and all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (g) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
6. (To replace and update your current Annex 2.8 condition) CCTV shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function all times that the premises is open for licensable activities. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria:
 - (a) The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct.
 - (b) A record of these checks, showing the date and name of the person checking, will be kept and made available to the police or other authorised officer on request;
 - (c) The Police will be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason;
 - (d) One camera will show a close-up of the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear, full length image of anyone entering;
 - (e) The system will provide full coverage of the interior of the premises and any exterior part of the premises accessible to the public;
 - (f) The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped;

(g) At all times during operating hours, there will be at least 1 member of staff on the premises who can operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request.

(h) Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided free of charge to the police or other authorised officers on request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.

7. The licence holder will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff and security . Such staff and security levels will be disclosed , on request , to the Licensing Authority and the Police . The need for door supervisors will be assessed by way of risk assessment and cognisance will be taken of any police advice
