SUBJECT: PREMISES LICENCE SUMMARY REVIEW RE: HOLLOWAY FOOD STORE, 59 – 61 SEVEN SISTERS ROAD LONDON N7 6BH

Synopsis

- 1.1 In accordance with Section 53a of Licensing Act 2003 the premises licence was the subject of an expedited / summary review application by the Metropolitan Police on 16th February 2022.
- 1.2 This application relates to an incident involving serious crime, namely an assault with a knife resulting in serious injury.
- 1.3 On Sunday 13th February 2022, Police were called to Seven Sisters Road, N7 by a male stating he had been injured. Police attended and found a male with apparent knife related injuries. These injuries consisted of a deep laceration to the forearm, a 5cm slash to the face and a 12cm slash injury to the stomach.
- 1.4 The victim informed Police that he had been assaulted by two men working in the nearby shop who had a 'big machette'. This shop was identified as the Holloway Food Centre.
- 1.5 Subsequent investigation has revealed that the victim of the attack was drunk and was causing a disturbance within the venue. Upon leaving, the victim has thrown fruit at the shop and has damaged the glass door.
- 1.6 CCTV footage from the venue and nearby cameras has been interrogated. Footage shows the victim causing a disturbance outside. A male can be seen walking towards the victim who is stood still in the road. The male has in his possession a large 'Rambo'

- style knife. The male can be seen to make a slashing movement with the knife towards the victim.
- 1.7 This male has been identified and is confirmed to be a member of staff from Holloway Food Centre. The CCTV also shows another male with a large stick chasing the victim. This male has also been identified and is a member of staff from the Holloway Food Centre.
- 1.8 The victim was taken to hospital for treatment for the knife injuries. His condition is not life threatening however follow up treatment will be required for his arm injury.
- 1.9 Attending officers found that the two males involved had left the scene. At the time of writing, the two suspects involved have not been traced by Police.
- 1.10 The Police state they have serious and immediate concerns regarding the management of this venue and no confidence that they can operate without posing a risk to public safety. That in their view that such critical failings and actions by management and staff constitute ongoing risk of serious crime.
- 1.11 On the 18th February 2022 the Licensing Sub-Committee considered whether it was necessary to take interim steps pending a full licence review. The Sub-Committee took into account the oral and written representations from the police.
- 1.12 The Sub-Committee decided to amend the licence of Holloway Food Store, 59 61 Seven Sisters Road, London N7 6BH to add as additional condition that stated. The member of staff arrested in relation to the incident on the 13 February 2022 is not permitted to return to the premises until the conclusion of the criminal investigation into the said incident.

3. Background/History

- 3.1 The premises licence is currently held by Eshabil Kavak who transferred onto the Premises Licence in October 2020.
- 3.2 Mr Kavak also became the designated premises supervisor at the premises in November 2020.
- 3.3 The premises were granted a 24 hour alcohol licence in 2006.
- 3.4 The summary review application is subject to supporting representations from the Licensing Authority and the Council Trading Standards Team.
- 3.5 The Police Licensing Team has submitted additional evidence in support of the review. These are all attached as Appendix 3.
- 3.6 Licensing Officers and Police have visited the premises since the review and found that the premises was breaching three of its license conditions.
- 3.7 At the time of publishing the report the licence holder hadn't submitted any supporting documents.

4. Recommendations

- 4.1 To determine the application to review the premises licence under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.2 The Committee must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps as mentioned in Section 53C(3) of the Act (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 4.3 The steps stated in Section 53C(3) of the Act are as follows:
 - a. the modification of the conditions of the premises licence;
 - b. the exclusion of a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - c. the removal of the designated premises supervisor from the licence;
 - d. the suspension of the premises licence for a period nor exceeding three months; or
 - e. the revocation of the premises licence.
- 4.4 The Committee also have the option to:
 - a. leave the licence in its existing state; and
 - b. has the power in relation to steps a) and b) detailed at 4.3 to provide that the modification and exclusion only has effect for a limited period not exceeding three months.

5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

5.1 The Council is required to consider this summary review application in the light of all relevant information, and must take such steps as is considers appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

5.2 The Council is also required to consider whether the interim measures continue pending any appeal.

Venue Background:

The Holloway Food Centre is a 24 hour licensed off licence and grocery store based on Seven Sisters Road, N7.

Incident: - CAD 1346/13FEB22 - CRIS 2703650/22 -

At 0449 hrs on Sunday 13th February 2022 Police receive a call from a male stating he needs Police as there is 'too much blood'. Police arrive on scene at 0503 hrs to a male standing in the road outside the premises initially presenting with a deep cut to his forearm. The male states he has been attacked by 2 men who work inside the shop who have injured him with a machete. [from CCTV later accessible it appears to be a silver bladed Rambo type knife with a black sheath]. The male also had a slash to his face approx. 5cm long and a slash wound to his stomach that was 12cm long.

After administering first aid, Police entered the shop spoke to a staff member who provided his personal details. He stated the male outside had caused issues and damaged the shop front window. The staff member stated he could not show the premises CCTV to officers as he could not work it and would need the manager and was alone in the shop. A crime scene was set up due to the amount of blood outside the premises, injuries sustained and the allegation made. A further witness approached police and stated 2 shopkeepers from the premises had attacked both him and the male with the knife wounds.

At 0600 hrs the owner of the premises arrived to work the CCTV and it became apparent that there were 3 shop workers present at 0453 hrs but only 1 remained on police arrival following the call from the injured male. The attack had possibly been as early as 0429 hrs. Limited available CCTV available to be viewed by investigating officers [noted to be showing the incorrect time by 1 hr in any case] captures one shop keeper in possession of a Rambo style knife approach the injured male [appears to be after any initial incident and damage to the shop door] with victim standing on road away from shop. The shopkeeper approaches the victim whilst holding the knife and makes a slashing and thrusting movement towards him at stomach height at 0429 hrs. This is clearly not in self-defence. One shop worker also appears to be armed with a wooden pole or large stick during the incident. It is not clear if the knife injuries evident when police are notified and attend are sustained at 0429 hrs or in prolonged periods off of CCTV view prior to police arrival.

Specialist digital investigators will be required to visit the premises to obtain any other available angles or footage it is believed. Of note: - At no stage did the venue contact either ambulance or Police but do find time to brush and sweep down the outer pavement and adjust produce displays.

Officers attending are not able to locate the weapon used or the 2 shop workers said to be involved. At the time of writing the victims injuries are deemed by medical staff to be non-life threatening. A Police report states one will need further specialist medical appointments for assessment to see if he regains feeling in his arm.

Submission: Having reviewed the available evidence in this case, the Police are of the view that immediate steps are necessary to deal with the risk posed by the operation of this venue. Staff members employed at the venue have had immediate access to a large Rambo style knife. Staff have reacted wholly inappropriately to a minor disturbance by a drunk male. Instead of calling the Police, 2 of the staff members have taken it upon themselves to attack the male with one causing significant injuries using a huge knife. Following the incident, no call was made to Ambulance or Police by venue staff. Police suggest this lack of action was intentional, in order to allow for the suspects to make good their escape, dispose of the weapon involved and eliminate incriminating forensic evidence. These deliberate actions have delayed vital initial investigations and obliterated any potential forensic evidence, frustrating the Police investigation. On this occasion it appears the victim was lucky to escape life threatening injury. Circumstances and nature of injuries suggest that repeated blows with a knife were made to cause serious injury.

It is the view of Police that multiple and grave failings have been identified and demonstrate a stance completely at odds with any responsible operation and indeed opposing the Licensing Objectives. It is concerning that staff appear to have to hand immediate access to such deadly weapons. They have caused a minor disturbance to escalate, that could have easily been diffused or dealt with by a call to Police, into a potentially life threatening assault.

Police have considered other enforcement options open to them. However, mindful of the current and ongoing risk, and specifically the fact that the venue has made decisions contrary to (and in breach of), a licence that already states any instances of crime and disorder at the premises shall be reported to the police immediately, it is not felt that the venue can safely operate.

Police enter this application for the panels urgent attention and ask that consideration be given to suspending the premises licence in question pending full review. The criminal investigation is active and ongoing at this time in an effort to locate the suspects involved.

I am giving this certificate because I am of the opinion that other procedures under the Licensing Act are inappropriate in this case because:

This application relates to an incident involving serious crime, namely an assault with a knife resulting in serious injury.

The matter has been recorded as GBH with intent and is being investigated as such.

CRIS 2703650/22 refers.

This incident is directly linked to the Holloway Food Centre, 59 - 61 Seven Sisters Road, N7. The suspects involved are staff members, working at the venue at the time of the incident.

On Sunday 13th February 2022, Police were called to Seven Sisters Road, N7 by a male stating he had been injured. Police attended and found a male with apparent knife related injuries. These injuries consisted of a deep laceration to the forearm, a 5cm slash to the face and a 12cm slash injury to the stomach.

The victim informed Police that he had been assaulted by two men working in the nearby shop who had a 'big machete' This shop was identified as the Holloway Food Centre.

Subsequent investigation has revealed that the victim of the attack was drunk and was causing a disturbance within the venue. Upon leaving, the victim has thrown fruit at the shop and has damaged the glass door.

CCTV footage from the venue and nearby cameras has been interrogated. Footage shows the victim causing a disturbance outside. A male can be seen walking towards the victim who is stood still in the road. The male has in his possession a large 'Rambo' style knife. The male can be seen to make a slashing movement with the knife towards the victim. This male has been identified and is confirmed to be a member of staff from Holloway Food Centre.

The CCTV also shows another male with a large stick chasing the victim. This male has also been identified and is a member of staff from the Holloway Food Centre.

The victim was taken to hospital for treatment for the knife injuries. His condition is not life threatening however follow-up treatment will be required for his arm injury.

Attending officers found that the two males involved had left the scene. At the time of writing, the two suspects involved have not been traced by Police.

Police were called to this incident by the victim. Staff did not call Police or ambulance at any point.

I have considered authorising a standard review of the premises licence, however I do not feel this step to be appropriate given the circumstances.

This incident was so serious, and actions by the venue staff so grave and concerning, that in my view the case should be put before a licensing committee as soon as possible in order for measures to be put in place to address the risk that this venue poses. Given the circumstances, I recommend an immediate suspension of the premises licence.

I have serious and immediate concerns regarding the management of this venue and no confidence that they can operate without posing a risk to public safety.

It is my view that such critical failings and actions by management and staff constitute ongoing risk of serious crime.

Again, and as submitted in my initial statement, this matter revolves around an allegation of serious violence involving weapons by staff members at the venue and the actions at the time of staff at the venue in question and standards of management there. A subsequent report has also now been received for a separate incident of violence associated with the premises at 0009 hrs on 14/02/2022.								
The criminal investigation into both these matters is ongoing.								
 Incident Outline: During the early morning of 13th February 2022 the Police receive a call at from a male giving the shop location which is a 24hr licensed convenience store stating there is 'too much blood'.

Police now know this male to be the victim of the stabbing.

- Officers attend the address and an allegation is formally made to them by a male with multiple
 injuries that he has been attacked by shop staff at the location one of whom was armed with a
 knife, another was armed with a pole or a stick. Initial actions are undertaken by both Police
 and Ambulance Services. Only 1 of the 3 staff members on duty remains on scene upon police
 arrival. The staff member remaining is searched for weapons but was found to be in possession
 of class B drugs.
- Following footage of the assault being obtained it is clear that the incident is ongoing for some time. None of the 3 staff at the venue call Police at any stage during or after the incident. This action would likely have diffused the situation. Police were only notified as a result of a call from the victim. The response from a responsible operator would have been to call the Police when the incident was occurring instead of taking matters into their own hands. The collective actions of staff was wholly unacceptable, criminal and disproportionate to the circumstances. Furthermore, staff chose to flee the scene in order to avoid the consequences of their actions.
- Following the initial investigation, Police conduct a man hunt for the staff member involved in the knife assault owing to the fact he fled the scene. Numerous enquiries at known addresses are conducted to no avail.
- In the days following the incident, the suspect for the knife assault is arrested when he attends
 a police station. He is the nephew of the premises licence holder and his jacket is seized by
 officers as it is believed he was wearing it at the time of the stabbing from CCTV recovered by
 officers attending. The knife was a silver bladed black handled commando or Rambo type knife
 with a large blade that seems to have had a sheath from footage of the assault. A knife of this
 type has no place in a retail venue.
- The Police investigation is ongoing into the knife incident. A separate report the following evening 14/02/22 when a different male states that he was assaulted and had his teeth knocked out by someone known to shop staff in front of the venue. From information received by Police, the suspect attends the venue and meets with a staff member. The staff member is present with the suspect when he assaults the victim. Staff at the venue again failed to call Police to this incident.
- The premises has not been able to demonstrate that staff on duty have been trained or are able to operate and produce CCTV or to keep the records required by the current premises licence during engagement since the knife incident. The manager, Mr Kaykusuz who stated it was 'his licence' on a subsequent visit to the premises has stated that he can not operate or use the CCTV system sufficiently to download CCTV if requested and police should attend to do it if they want it. The premises did not have an incident log book as required either.
- Mr Kaykusuz although regularly at the premises as the leaseholder and manager is not believed to be a suitable premises licence holder or designated premises supervisor due to a

conviction in February 2017 at the premises for possession of an offensive weapon and a public order offence after chasing a customer from the premises with a hockey stick police indices state.

The venue offered evidence at the summary review hearing that the knife involved was at the venue and Police were welcome to collect it. This is not case. Police have attended and to date the knife has not been recovered.

Background Timeline: Timeline of events/engagements March 2022-present

Engagement

Date: 16/03/2020

Visit under taken with colleagues from Trading Standards. Council 'No Knife Shop' campaign re premises that do not need to be stocking knives as part of their core offer agreeing to stop stocking them in interests of public safety and immediate availability. The PLH and DPS for the premises were shown as Mustafa Atici but he was not present and told he is rarely there. Idris stated the premises would not stop stocking knives now as they had a large stockholding and kitchen products were a best selling line for them especially in the evenings. Scheme leaflet left with Idris, Idris was told Mustafa would have to be contacted as he was the PLH and DPS and after initially saying that the premises would continue selling knives Idris then said it might be that they would stop once current stocks were sold.

Engagement Date: 09/06/20

Return visit as part of Islington Trading Standards led No Knife Initiative. Previously stated premises would consider no longer stocking knives once stock sold down. Licensing queries made still re who owns or runs as DPS/PLH [Mustafa Atici] was still absent. Staff stated owner was Idris Kaykusuz but was not present and premises still stocked knives. Letter re initiative left and police licensing card left.

Offence: Homophobic Public Order/Assault

Date:11/06/2020 Time: 0837

Report to police that male staff member in his thirties with a beard had made homophobic remarks and verbally assaulted a customer and then thrown items of stock at them until they had left shop. Crime report closed after informant stated they did not wish to speak to police or progress as a crime.

Visit conducted on 18/06/2020 at 1330 hrs. Visit conducted and paperwork completed with store manager, Idris Kaykusuz as DPS/PLH not present . Idris stated he believed complainant was a regular customer who regularly purchased K cider and he and staff member involved had made up after a misunderstanding over a 'joke' and customer had been in since. Venue opening 24 hrs seven days a

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week as per licence and had a 16 camera CCTV system installed with a recently newly fitted hard drive. 3 cameras covering front of store, 1 covering rear delivery area and other 12 sited in store.

Licence breaches identified on visit were no general incident log book kept or clear age verification policy. Letter send to DPS/PLH as premises has been invited to engage re breaches and give assurances and evidence of steps taken to address and comply with their current licence conditions and provided with police recommendations in regard to their dated Council premises licence. Letter returned on 06/07/2020 PLH and DPS Mustafa returned as not known at address. Idris supplied a different address for him in Enfield. Letter reposted, Council licensing support manager informed and response sent to Idris asking him to have Mustafa officially inform the council of his change of address to correct licence. This letter also latter returned as not known at this address. Checks made after visit following queries from Idris found he was arrested at the premises in 2017 and convicted of offensive weapon and public order offences after chasing customer from store with a hockey stick [the premises does not stock sports goods]. Idris had asked for advice as stated he had a recent conviction for a weapons enabled assault at a nightclub that meant he might not be able to be the DPS but the premises arrest was not mentioned. It was not clear that the above ever came to attention of then police licensing team at time or if council licensing were aware as no other incident references found.

Engagement

Date: 30/09/2020

Return visit made due to lack of engagement since last visit and clear PLH does not reside at licence address and no contact details for him with post being returned to Police. Spoke with manager Idris who stated he and his new business partner Eshabel Kavak will be transferring the licence to themselves as Mustafa Atici is stepping down and that also Eshabel Kavak who has a personal licence with Haringey Council will be applying to be the designated premises supervisor at the premises. Confirmed that once he is the PLH police looked forward to engagement re the recommended conditions for 24 hrs licence there as discussed and passed on in earlier emails after the crime related visit police made in June 2020. Mr Kaykusuz was still aware that it would likely not be before MAR2023 that he would be line for a personal licence or to become the designated premises supervisor at this store or elsewhere himself following earlier convictions.

Application

Date: 04/11/2020

Summary: Premises Licence Transfer & DPS Transfer received and processed for Eshabel Kavak changing from Mustafa Atici who had never been able to be traced or contacted. Now Mr Kavak has formally taken over after police crime visit in JUN20 noted he would be approached to progress the recommendations to 24 hrs licence discussed and agreed in principle then after breaches and management lapses.

Engagement

Date: 09/11/20. Visit made to speak with new PLH/DPS, Eshabel Kavak. He wasn't present but a letter was left for him. No call, intervention or welfare evidenced from premises and staff complicit from details known to date. No incident pack yet provided by premises.

Date 16/02/2022 – Police attend with Council Licensing to deliver notice re summary review application. As Mr Kavak was not present officer fully explained to Idris who had questions the reasons

and procedure and advised him to have Mr Kavak to consider consulting and instructing a solicitor with licensing experience.

18/02/22 – Licensing Sub-Committee hears submission and issues interim steps following first hearing. Solicitor representing stated that his client had the knife used from the stabbing incident secured at the premises.

Engagement

18/02/22 – Police returned to secure the knife from the stabbing at 2140 hrs on the evening of the hearing as evidential having been informed it was present. The knife wasn't there and wasn't awaiting collection. Eshabil Kavak was present and did not know about any knife awaiting collection or why this would have been said. There were 13 working knives found at the premises which Mr Kavak collected up on the first sweep of all shapes and sizes that he said staff used but were mainly all small kitchen ones. None were anything similar to what was seen on footage viewed of the stabbing incident. None appeared evidential and none were seized for the investigation. They had all been in use by staff since the incident it was stated and Mr Kavak confirmed the male arrested in relation to the incident was his nephew, Ali.

Engagement

24/02/22 – At 1305 hrs Police accompanied the Council Licensing Officer to premises for him to assess current compliance with licence and for Police to collect incident pack collated by premises for 14/02/22 incident after premises had said that it was ready on 23/02/22. No pack was ready and CCTV had not been downloaded. Manager and owner/boss [according to day shop staff] Mr Idris Kaykusuz attended the premises to open the managers officer at rear after a phone call. He knew nothing of any pack. He opened the locked manager's office and stated that even though it was a current licence condition and had been part of discussions in earlier years he could not work the CCTV and there was no general incident log-book still. He had been able to work the CCTV when police attended in June 2020 records indicated.

Engagement

03/03/22 – Police have contacted the solicitor who represented the premises at the first hearing to see if they are planning to ask for any engagement or meeting before the second hearing re the premises implementing the previous recommendations and/or, bolstered licence conditions, personal licence holder on duty while open, staff training measures, management checks or CRB checks on staff in future. Response still awaited.

Recommendations:

The incidents of concern are highlighted above and speak for themselves;

- The presence of a Rambo knife in a retail environment
- Staff arming themselves to deal with a disruptive members of the public

Police have made efforts to engage with Mr Kavak since the incident on the 13th February. The venue have been unable to supply basic information formally requested via 'incident pack' requests. This includes incident reports and CCTV as detailed.

Both Police and the Local authority have engaged with the venue over recent years. Conditions have been suggested that would assist in safeguarding against such incidents have not been acted upon.

Although the suspect for the knife offence remains under investigation, the Police view remains that the grave severity of the initial incident as evidenced by the footage viewed and the weapons availability and willingness to use it at the venue constitute a continuing risk of serious crime and risk to the public. The further report received and a staff member in charge being found in possession of drugs are also of concern. Police checks indicating there have previous violence and weapon related convictions at the venue also cause concern re leadership, training, staff supervision and management standards.

The sale of alcohol brings with it additional risk and the need for responsible control and management. This is even more the case for a premises with a 24 hrs licence. It is clear that this responsible management is simply not present at this venue and the licensing objectives are not being upheld. Police are concerned as to the safety of the public as and when future incidents occur.

Police respectively request that the committee give serious consideration to all options available under the licensing act.

- Any instances of crime and disorder at the premises shall be reported to the Police immediately, record of these incidents shall be kept in a general incident log-book in which are recorded details of each day's events. This log shall be made available to an authorised officer or a police officer with 24 hours of any request
- Notices will be prominently displayed at exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- Noise and vibration will not be allowed to emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- The premises shall enforce a proof of age scheme, which is approved by the authorised officer of the Council and by the Local Police.

The Sub-Committee has decided to impose the following interim steps with regard to the premises licence in respect of Holloway Food Store, 59-61 Seven Sisters Road, N7 6BH with immediate effect and until a full review hearing has taken place.

An additional condition to be added to the premises licence:-

That the member of staff arrested in relation to the incident on the 13 February 2022 is not permitted to return to the premises until the conclusion of the criminal investigation into the said incident.

REASONS FOR DECISION

This meeting was facilitated by Zoom.

The Licensing Sub-Committee considered whether it was necessary to take interim steps pending a full licence review. The Sub-Committee took into account the oral and written representations from the police and the legal representative of the licence holder.

It was common cause that the victim had been part of a group of people who had damaged the premises and threatened the staff on 13th February 2022 and that instead of immediately calling the Police to the scene one staff member took matters into his own hands and stabbed one of the members of the group who then reported the incident to the Police.

A criminal investigation has been launched by the Police into the incident and one staff member has been arrested. That staff member has had his employment suspended by the licensed premises.

The Sub-Committee determined that it was necessary to impose interim steps to promote the licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee determined that the added condition referred to above was reasonable and necessary.

I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority in support of the application for a Premises Licence Review submitted by the Metropolitan Police Service. This representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and promotion of public safety licensing objectives.

Background

The licensed premises is on the ground floor of the property. The premises have been licensed since at least January 2006 for the off sales of alcohol for 24 hours per day. At the time of the Review being applied for, the licence was held by Eshabil Kavak, who transferred on to the licence and became the Designated Premises Supervisor in November 2020.

This review application presents the recent serious incident at the premises that took place in the early hours of the morning.

The review application shows disregard for the safety of customers, the Police and the licensing objectives. Staff were un-cooperative and obstructive. No calls were made to the emergency services, which is also required by licence conditions. We have serious concerns regarding the management of the premises and have no confidence that they can operate without posing a risk to public safety.

During a Trading Standards project, the licensee was found to be selling illicit alcohol that was not duty paid. They were un-cooperative with the officers and refused to take part in the No Knife scheme.

Trading Standards officers question whether the licensee can operate the business lawfully or promote the licensing objectives.

One of the licensing officers visited the premises with a member of the Licensing Police on 24 February 2022 at 13:05.

The recently requested CCTV by the Police was not available for collection this is a breach of the current premises licence Annex 2 condition 3.

"CCTV system shall be installed and maintained inside and outside the premises, including a CCTV unit, which monitors the immediate vicinity of the premises. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Tape recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a police officer with 24 hours of any request."

They spoke to Mr Idris Kaykusuz. He stated the licence was his although the he is not the named licence holder.

The Licensing Officer asked Mr Kaykusuz to let them have access to the manager's office, as the staff on duty claimed the incident log required under condition 4 was in there. When they got inside the office he stated the premises did not have a general incident log-book or incident book as required.

Mr Kaykusuz said he didn't need a log as he had CCTV and stated that none of the other off licences in the area would have logs.

Given the licence is under summary review it would be expected that the premises would be fully complying with all the licence conditions.

It was also noted that there was no sign requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly. This was also a licence breach.

Licensing Policy considerations:

The following Policies, determined by the Licensing Authority as being appropriate topromote the licensing objectives, are relevant to this application:

Licensing Policies 5 and 6 - Licensing Hours

Licensing Policy 8 - Management Standards

Licensing Policy 14 - Alcohol Induced Crime, Disorder and Antisocial Behaviour

Licensing Policy 29 - Review of Licensed Premises

Standards of Management:

When assessing the licensee's ability to demonstrate a commitment to high standards of management the Licensing Authority will take into account whether the applicant or licensee:

- can operate the business in compliance with the licensing objectives
- is able to understand verbal and written advice and legal requirements
- can demonstrate knowledge of the licensing objectives, relevant parts of the Licensing Policy and their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003
- is able to run their businesses lawfully and in accordance with good businesspractices
- can demonstrate a track record of compliance with legal requirements

Where there is a history of non-compliance associated with the management of the premises, the Licensing Authority is unlikely to permit premises to continue to operate without further restrictions on review, unless there is evidence of significant improvement in management standards.

The Licensing Authority is committed to promoting high standards of management in all licenced premises and expects licensees to demonstrate this through their management practices. Experience indicates that where these standards are not

met, the licensing objectives are likely to be undermined.

Licensing Hours

The Licensing Authority may impose limitations on hours upon review of the licence, particularly where the premises are shown to be the focus or cause of nuisance or anti-social behaviour.

The premises is in Finsbury Park Ward which has become saturated with late night premises selling alcohol, where there is a high level of crime and anti-social behaviour such as noise, street drinkers and disturbance to local residents, that continue through the early hours of the morning.

Additionally there is an alcohol and drug dependency service very close by, catering for vulnerable people who are attracted to shops open early in the morning and selling hi strength beers and ciders.

Review of Licensed Premises

The Licensing Authority will apply the full range of powers available to it when a review of apremise licence becomes necessary, including:

- Restricting hours of operation
- Removing licensable activities from the premises licence
- Imposing additional conditions
- Require the removal of a designated premises supervisor
- Suspending a licence
- Revoking a licence.
- The Licensing Authority believes that the promotion of the licensing objectives are best achieved in an atmosphere of mutual co-operation between all stakeholders. Reviews are therefore mainly reserved for circumstances where early warnings of concerns and the need for improvement have gone unheeded by the management of the licensed premises.

Recommendation

The Licensing Authority has submitted this representation, having considered all the evidence presented by the Metropolitan Police and the Trading Standards Service. It is recommended that the Licensing Sub-Committee consider the full options available under Section 52 of the Licensing Act and fully support the Police recommendations.

The premises was visited twice by TS as part of our illicit alcohol and tobacco project in 2021. On 24th January 2022, they were found to be selling illicit Polish Debowe and Perla Black beers that were non UK duty paid. They were asked to remove them from sale by attending officers. The premises has been uncooperative with TS officers and refused to take part in our No Knife Shop scheme when approached.

As illicit goods have been discovered at these premises, it is questionable whether the applicant is able to run their businesses lawfully and in accordance with good business practices. This also demonstrates a lack of compliance with legal requirements.

The Trading Standards Service is therefore of the opinion that this undermines the Licensing Policy and objectives and should subsequently be revoked.
