## PREMISES LICENCE NEW APPLICATION

## Amor, 139 Holloway Road, London, N7 8LX.

## 1. Synopsis

- 1.1. This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2. The premises currently holds a licence allowing:
  - The sale by retail of alcohol, on & off supplies, Mondays to Sundays from 10:00 until 22:00; and
  - The premises to be open to the public, Mondays to Sundays from 10:00 until 23:00.
- 1.3. The variation application is to allow:
  - The sale by retail of alcohol, on & off supplies, Mondays to Sundays from 12:00 until 23:00; and
  - The premises to be open to the public, Mondays to Sundays from 12:00 until 00:00.

## 2. Recommendations

- 2.1. To determine the application for a variation of the premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003;
- 2.2. These premises are located in the Holloway Road and Finsbury Park Cumulative Impact Area therefore the Licensing Sub-Committee will need to consider Licensing Policy 3, which states that there is a presumption of refusal unless the Sub-Committee is satisfied that there will be no adverse cumulative impact on the licensing objectives.
- 2.3. If the Licensing Sub-Committee grants the application it should be subject to:
  - i. Conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 4); and
  - ii. Any conditions deemed appropriate by the Licensing Sub-Committee to promote the four licensing objectives.

## 3. Background

- 3.1. The premises licence was granted before a licensing sub-committee on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2021. The licensee and DPS initially named on the licence at the time of approval are still active at the time of writing this report.
- 3.2. There have been periodic reports of noise nuisance and allegations of the premises selling alcohol beyond their permitted hours over the last 6 months. While most of these complaints were not substantiated, the premises was found to be open beyond its permitted hours on 11<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
- 3.3. The licensing service engaged with the licensee in response to this breach and ensured that management were aware of their licensable hours and related conditions. The licensee wished to extend the terminal hour for sale of alcohol and opening hours so was given advice regarding the premises licence variation process.
- 3.4. This premises licence variation application was subsequently received by the Council's licensing service on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2023.
- 3.5. The Council's noise service submitted a representation in response to the application however, this was withdrawn based on agreed conditions of approval. These conditions are detailed at Appendix 4 of this report.
- 3.6. At the end of the consultation process there was one remaining representation from a local resident. This representation is detailed at Appendix 3 of this report.

## 4. Implications

## 4.1. Financial Implications

4.1.1. The Head of Finance reports that the applicant has paid the application fee of £190.00. Should the application be refused, the fee is not refundable.

## 4.2. Legal Implications

- 4.2.1. The legal implications are set out in Paragraph 2.
- 4.2.2. Legal advice will be provided at the meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee as necessary.

## 4.3. Environmental Implications and contribution to achieving a net zero carbon Islington by 2030

4.3.1. The Licensing Sub-Committee need to consider the impacts that that proposals will have on the environment. An impact is defined as any change to the environment, whether positive or negative, wholly or partially resulting from Council activities. Almost all human activity has some impact on the environment, and it is very unlikely that any activity will not have any implications.

### 4.4. Equalities Impact Assessment

- 4.4.1. The council must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation, and to advance equality of opportunity, and foster good relations, between those who share a relevant protected characteristic and those who do not share it (section 149 Equality Act 2010). The council has a duty to have due regard to the need to remove or minimise disadvantages, take steps to meet needs, in particular steps to take account of disabled persons' disabilities, and encourage people to participate in public life. The council must have due regard to the need to tackle prejudice and promote understanding.
- 4.4.2. An Equalities Impact Assessment is not required in relation to this report, because this is a decision relating to a Premises Licence application under the Licensing Act 2003.

## 4.5. **Planning implications**

- 4.5.1. The property is not a listed building but it is located in the St Mary Magdalene Conservation Area.
- 4.5.2. The property has a long established use for retail purposes.
- 4.5.3. However, planning law was changed by the government on 1 September 2020 by virtue of the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2020. This changed the use classes order 1987 that created a new Class E that incorporates retail, cafes, restaurants and offices etc.
- 4.5.4. On this basis, the use noted in the license application would not be in breach of planning control. There is no objection.

## 5. Conclusion and reasons for recommendations

5.1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee determines this application.

### **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

There are further 'Mandatory conditions' applicable to licences authorising the supply of alcohol. A full list of the current mandatory conditions is available from the licensing pages on Islington's web site, <a href="www.islington.gov.uk">www.islington.gov.uk</a>. This list is subject to change by order of the Secretary of State and licensees and other responsible persons are advised to ensure they are aware of the latest conditions.

### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. The premises shall only operate as a delicatessen and cafe which provides food in the form of substantial meals that are prepared on the premises.
- 2. Substantial food shall be available throughout the premises and menus shall be displayed.
- 3. Alcohol for consumption on the premises or at any tables lawfully placed on the highway outside the premises will only be served to customers seated at a table by Waiter or waitress service.
- 4. The premises licence holder shall ensure that CCTV cameras and recorders are installed at the premises and are of a standard acceptable to and approved by the Police.:
  - The system shall be maintained in good working order and at all times the premises is open to the public, be fully operational covering both internal and external areas of the premises to which the public have access;
  - One CCTV camera shall be positioned to cover the entrance/exit in order to capture clear, facial images of all persons entering/leaving the premises;
  - c) The CCTV camera views shall not be obstructed;
  - d) The medium on which CCTV images are recorded shall be of evidential quality; stored securely; shall be retained for a period of 31 days; and be available for inspection by the Police or Local Authority upon request;
  - e) At all times when the premises are open for the purposes of licensable activities, subject to the Data Protection Act 2018, a suitably trained member of staff shall be available to assist the Police or an authorised officer in obtaining the CCTV footage;
  - f) Subject to the Data Protection Act 2018, copies shall be made available within 48 hours to the Police or Local Authority, upon request;
  - g) The facility to transfer the images to a compatible, removable format, shall be held on the premises;

- h) At least one member of working staff at the premises shall be trained in the use of CCTV and a log will be kept to verify this; and
- i) Signs shall be displayed in the customer areas to advise that CCTV is in operation.
- 5. Notices shall be displayed within the premises warning customers about personal thefts; and to be vigilant.
- 6. When the venue is open for licensable activities, the toilet shall be checked by staff at least every two hours and these checks are to be documented on each visit.
- 7. The licensee shall adopt a 'Challenge 25' policy and promote it through the prominent display of posters. Only suitable forms of photographic identification, such as passport or UK driving licence or a holographically marked PASS scheme cards, will be accepted.
- 8. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training.
- 9. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained, as appropriate, in respect of relevant Licensing Law; crime scene best practice and upon the sale of alcohol to drunks. and to persons underage.
- 10. The licensee shall keep records of training and instructions given to staff, detailing the areas covered, and make them available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
- 11. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
- 12. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers except to persons seated at tables lawfully placed on the highway.
- 13. Staff shall ensure a quiet, safe dispersal of customers, with appropriate signage requesting customers to respect neighbouring residents and businesses.
- 14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - a) all crimes reported to the venue;
  - b) all ejections of patrons;
  - c) any complaints received;
  - d) any incidents of disorder;
  - e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons;
  - f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol see condition 25 on refusals log; and
  - g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 15. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 16. There shall be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate consumption of alcohol.
- 17. Should alcohol deliveries apply, the premises licence holder shall ensure that any third party deliver/courier company is instructed to comply with the following:

- a) Any refusals will be logged by the delivery driver. Records of all refusals will be obtained from the delivery company and provided to the relevant authorities upon request; and
- b) Couriers will be trained on relevant aspects of the Licensing Act 2003 including underage sales, sales to a person who is drunk, obtaining alcohol for a child or a person who is drunk and delivering alcohol to someone under the age of 18.
- 18. In the event that an assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
  - a) The police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;
  - b) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police; and
  - c) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.
- 19. The delivery of licensable goods to the premises shall be restricted to the hours between 07:00 and 23:00 Monday-Saturday. No deliveries to the premises shall be made on a Sunday or Bank Holiday.
- 20. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied on the premises otherwise than to persons purchasing food there and for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to their meal.
- 21. The shutters to the front of the premises shall be maintained so as not to cause a noise nuisance when in operation to residential properties in close vicinity.
- 22. The outside frontage shall be swept and cleared of any rubbish and smoking litter associated with the business at the end of trade each evening.
- 23. The outside of the premises shall be regularly monitored to ensure that noise levels from patrons do not cause a nuisance to any nearby residents.
- 24. Any outdoor furniture shall be fitted with rubber pads to the bottom of the legs to minimise noise when moved.

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## Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

No additional controls have been proposed, current premises licence conditions are as detailed below:

- 1. The premises shall only operate as a delicatessen and cafe which provides food in the form of substantial meals that are prepared on the premises.
- 2. Substantial food shall be available throughout the premises and menus shall be displayed.
- Alcohol for consumption on the premises or at any tables lawfully placed on the highway outside the premises will only be served to customers seated at a table by Waiter or waitress service.
- 4. The premises licence holder shall ensure that CCTV cameras and recorders are installed at the premises and are of a standard acceptable to and approved by the Police.:
  - a. The system shall be maintained in good working order and at all times the premises is open to the public, be fully operational covering both internal and external areas of the premises to which the public have access;
  - b. One CCTV camera shall be positioned to cover the entrance/exit in order to capture clear, facial images of all persons entering/leaving the premises;
  - c. The CCTV camera views shall not be obstructed;
  - d. The medium on which CCTV images are recorded shall be of evidential quality; stored securely; shall be retained for a period of 31 days; and be available for inspection by the Police or Local Authority upon request;
  - e. At all times when the premises are open for the purposes of licensable activities, subject to the Data Protection Act 2018, a suitably trained member of staff shall be available to assist the Police or an authorised officer in obtaining the CCTV footage;
  - f. Subject to the Data Protection Act 2018, copies shall be made available within 48 hours to the Police or Local Authority, upon request;
  - g. The facility to transfer the images to a compatible, removable format, shall be held on the premises;
  - h. At least one member of working staff at the premises shall be trained in the use of CCTV and a log will be kept to verify this; and
  - i. Signs shall be displayed in the customer areas to advise that CCTV is in operation.
- 5. Notices shall be displayed within the premises warning customers about personal thefts; and to be vigilant.
- 6. When the venue is open for licensable activities, the toilet shall be checked by staff at least every two hours and these checks are to be documented on each visit.

- 7. The licensee shall adopt a 'Challenge 25' policy and promote it through the prominent display of posters. Only suitable forms of photographic identification, such as passport or UK driving licence or a holographically marked PASS scheme cards, will be accepted.
- 8. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training.

## Conditions of approval agreed with the Council's Noise Service

- 26. In the event of a noise/nuisance complaint substantiated by an authorised officer, the licensee shall take appropriate measures in order to prevent any recurrence.
- 27. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 28. Any music shall be restricted to ambient background levels of sound.
- 29. All doors and windows will remain closed from 21:00 hours, except for access or egress.
- 30. All speakers will be positioned as to face away from doors or windows.
- 31. All speakers will be mounted away from walls adjacent to residential properties.
- 32. No more than 5 patrons, at any one time, shall use the frontage of the premises to smoke after 22:00hrs until closing. Signage shall be displayed to advise customers of this.
- 33. In the event of noise nuisance being established, the licensee shall appoint an acoustic consultant accredited by the Institute of Acoustics or the Association of Noise Consultants to install an entertainment noise control system and come to agreements with the Council regarding maximum levels of amplified sound at the premises.
- 34. If the above licence condition is required, the agreed maximum levels of amplified sound shall be expressed on the premises licence.

- 35. If the above licence condition is required, the entertainment noise control system shall be monitored, checked and calibrated as necessary, so that the levels approved by the Council, are not exceeded.
