 - i. conditions prepared by the Licensing Officer which are consistent with the Operating Schedule (see appendix 4)

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Only alcoholic drinks which are detailed on invoices will be purchased or accepted as part of a 'free' offer. Invoices (or copies) for all alcoholic goods on the premises will be made available to officers from the council, police or HMRC upon request.

An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamp on spirits as soon as practical after they have been purchased.

If any spirits bought by the business have UK Duty Stamps that do not fluoresce under ultra-violet light, or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee shall identify the supplier to Islington Trading Standards as soon as possible.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and / or another person who manages licensable activities at the business will attend any low-cost training for off-licence managers planned to be put on by the Council in 2015, unless their attendance is not reasonably possible.

All training records will be kept.

Faisel Kashmiri shall not be involved in the business in any way.

Haseeb Kashmiri shall not be involved in any management role at the business, where he makes any decisions about the sale or purchase of alcohol, or any other aspect relating to licensable activities.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business then Police must be informed.

No high strength beer, lager or cider of 6.5% abv or above shall be sold other than premium beer, lager or cider priced at £1.95 or above per 500ml.

c) Public safety

There are smoke alarms and fire alarms installed at the premises.

The fire exit is clearly marked and there are fire extinuishers on site.

There is a designated health and safety officer located at the 'Old Red Lion Pub' nearby.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

No alcolhol is permitted to be sold on the premises.

Alcohol will not be sold to anyone who is or appears to be intoxicated.

There is a sign in the shop "Please leave the premises quietly and please respect our neighbours".

e) The protection of children from harm

The licensee shall adopt 'Challenge 25', the Retail of Alcohol Standards Group's advice for off-licences, and promote it through the prominent display of posters.

The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The training shall include the assessment of age; making a challenge; acceptable proof of age; and recording refusals. The licensee shall keep records of training and instructions given to staff, detailing the areas covered, and make them available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.

The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to persons they believe to be less than 25, staff ask to see accredited proof of age: that is, proof of age cards carrying the 'PASS' logo (and no others), a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.

The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.

The existing till prompt for the sale of tobacco will apply to sale of alcohol as another reminder to staff selling age-restricted goods.

There is an exemption from the payment of fees in relation to the provision of regulated entertainment at church halls, chapel halls or premises of a similar nature, village halls, parish or community halls, or other premises of a similar nature. The costs associated with these licences will be met by central Government. If, however, the licence also authorises the use of the premises for the supply of alcohol or the provision of late night refreshment, a fee will be required.

Schools and sixth form colleges are exempt from the fees associated with the authorisation of regulated entertainment where the entertainment is provided by and at the school or college and for the purposes of the school or college.



I am submitting a representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority with respect to the application to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises on Mondays to Sundays from 10am to 23:00.

The grounds for the representation are:

- Public nuisance
- Crime and disorder.

Issues of Concerns

- 1. The application is in a cumulative impact which means that the onus is on the applicant to demonstrate that the application will not add to the cumulative impact.
- 2. The proposed measures are typical of many off licences operating in the borough. There hasn't been any attempt to acknowledge the sensitive nature of operating an off licence in a cumulative impact area where we are working hard to deal with the negative aspects of the sale of alcohol on local communities. No bespoke mitigation measures have been proposed.
- The area already has a high number of licenced premises and the density of premises in the area is 10 times higher than the London average.
- 4. Alcohol related crime, alcohol related violence and ambulance call outs in the area are high and significantly higher than the London average
- 5. The Licensing Authority has been working with partners and the licence trade to tackle underage drinking, street drinking and preloading which affect residents living in the area. An additional off licence in the area will undermine this work and add to the cumulative impact.
- The measures proposed in the operating schedule do not sufficiently rebut the
 presumption to refuse the application on the basis that the application will not add to
 the cumulative impact.

7. The Licensing Authority is aware that this premises is owned by the same family who owned the off licence at 426 St John Street. That premises had a very poor track record of compliance and the premises licence was revoked twice for illicit alcohol and sales of alcohol to under age volunteers.

Summary and recommendations


An additional off licence selling alcohol will add to the cumulative impact.

The measures proposed by the applicant in the operating schedule are industry standard.

The applicant has not demonstrated that the application will not add to the cumulative impact therefore in order to promote the licensing objectives it is recommended that this application is refused.

Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. No more than 15 % of the shop area shall be for the display of alcohol.
- 2. A personal licence holder shall be on the premises at all times that licensable activities are taking place.
- 3. The alcohol section (non-spirits) shall be located at the rear of the shop and the spirits shall be located behind the till next to tobacco where indicated in red on the plan attached to the premises licence. The lights shall be switched off in the alcohol section before 10:00 and after 23:00 and a blind with cover the alcohol section so that customers will be prevented from entering the area and shall not see or be aware that there is alcohol present.
- 4. An alarm system shall be installed to indicate 23:00 the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol.
- 5. No alcoholic goods will ever be purchased or taken from persons calling to the shop.
- 6. No spirits shall be purchased in a resealed box, without thorough checks being made to ensure it is legal to sell.
- 7. The licensee will immediately report to Trading Standards any instance of a caller to the shop attempting to sell alcohol.
- 8. Only alcoholic drinks which are detailed on invoices will be purchased or accepted as part of a 'free' offer. Invoices (or copies) for all alcoholic goods on the premises will be made available to officers from the council, police or HMRC upon request.
- 9. An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamp on spirits as soon as practical after they have been purchased.

- 14. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon request by the licensing team, police or trading standards.
- 15. Faisel Kashmiri shall not be involved in the business in any way.
- 16. Haseeb Kashmiri shall not be involved in any management role at the business, where he makes any decisions about the sale or purchase of alcohol, or any other aspect relating to licensable activities.
- 17. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full frontal head and shoulder image of everyone entering

the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business then Police must be informed.

- 18. No High Strength Beer, Lager or cider of 6.5% abv or above shall be sold other than premium beer, lager or cider priced at £1.95 per 500ml.
- 19. Smoke and fire alarms shall be installed and maintained at the premises.
- 20. The fire exits shall be clearly marked and fire extinguishers shall be available on the premises.
- 21. A designated health and safety officer and qualified first aider shall be located at the pub nearby called the Old Red Lion.
- 22. A sign shall be clearly displayed which states, "Please leave the premises quietly and please respect our neighbours."
- 23. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25 and the BII National Standards Proof of Age Scheme and prominent it through the prominent display of posters.
- 24. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff.
- 25. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young persons, staff ask to see accredited proof of age cards e.g. Citizencard, a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
- 26. The licensee shall require staff to note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection by the licensing team, police or trading standards
- 27. The premises shall operate a till that prompts the staff to any potential underage sales.
