

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The new application is to allow:
 - The sale by retail of alcohol, on supplies only, Sundays to Thursdays 11:00 until 23:00 and Fridays & Saturdays from 11:00 until 00:00;
 - The provision of Late Night Refreshment, Fridays & Saturdays from 23:00 until 00:00;
 - The premises to be open to the public Sundays to Thursdays from 09:00 until 23:30 and Fridays & Saturdays 09:00 until 00:30 the following day.

M Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 9)

The Fig Tree restaurant and its owner are dedicated to ensuring that they comply to all licensing legislation and are committed to ensuring that the abide by all rules and regulations and local authority policies to ensure the safe retail and selling of alcohol in their restaurant. This will be carried out in a seated environment which will be controlled both indoors and on the outside front tables allowing for 12 seated customers and there will be no bar service of alcohol. The premises will be well maintained and supervised with fully trained staffing cover who will ensure that the premises or any activity will not contravene any legislation so as to jeopardise the premise s licence. The restaurant is keen to also ensure that they will be part of the Pub Watch and will join the Licensees Charter to ensure that the issues in the local community are addressed. The staff will be encourage to undertake training/apprenticeships in food and beverage and any other course, as well as they will be have to undertake the Challenge 25 training that will ensure that they are aware of all legislation, their rights and responsibilities and compliance. The premise will never be unsupervised and it is the intention of the owners to provide CCTV surveillance in order to combat local crime and disorder.

Furthermore, the premise will be retailing a fine selection of Wine, Bottled Beer, Spirits and Mixers, therewill be no alcohol on tap. These will be supplied by reputable Wine merchants and deliveries will be made during designated daytime hours, with little obstructions to local traffic and pedestrians, in the local area. Any purchasing and ordering of Alcohol would be made on a regular basis in smaller quantities on a need basis and this couple with the fact that we would not be holding large quantities of alcohol in storage would also assist in the prevention of crime. In regard to the disposal of any bottled glass waste and rubbish the restaurant will be signing up and contracted to the local authority waste disposal, as previously carried out and ensure that all waste is handled and disposed of by a reputable waste company and that the waste will be recycled in compliance to local authority policies. We are aware of the high saturation of businesses in the area and feel we would be enhancing the variety and quality of restaurants in the area. Our goals and aims for developing the business would coincide with the Local Authorities aim of creating a vibrant and exciting environment for local people and visitors dining in Upper Street. We feel that the kind of food that we shall be purveying, together with the kind of service, beverages and ambience that, we will be encouraging a responsible client base as before, that would not create further problems in the area. Previously, we also had signed up to a neighbourhood scheme for businesses that encouraged cooperation and support in the area and we feel that we would continue with creating a good healthy environment for our neighbours and competitors. Personally, the owners are on good terms with local businesses and have many friends in the area that run catering businesses in the locality.

We would also be stressing the need for our staff to monitor and impose the legal requirement of checking the sale of Alcohol to our client base, to refuse where necessary and where they are legally required to refuse a sale of any alcohol to intoxicated or drunk and disorderly persons, as well as the primary refusal to underage members of society, children, young adults who would be required to meet the Challenge 25 requirement, of providing the required ID, which would be hologram meet the requirements of the law as being valid and acceptable, eg fraud, tampered or damaged id. Where refusal has been made, as a company we would be logging details of the sale or no sale in an alcohol register. Staff will also be trained to ensure that any drunk or disorderly activity is prevented and dealt with promptly, we would be looking to liaise closely with the local police authorities to ensure that we have good control in place.

It is also essential that as a company we would not permit the use and sale of illegal drugs in or on the premises. Regardless, the authorities would be promptly notified and public awareness would be made by the Fig tree by the use of notices displayed on the premises. We would also not tolerate any violent or antisocial behaviour and the restaurant would have a Safeguarding policy to help protect children and young adults, or more importantly vulnerable adults.

As a licensed premises we know that it is necessary to carry out our functions or operate their businesses with a purpose of promoting these objectives. We promise to support these objectives through their operating schedules and other measures (including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnerships with other agencies).

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The Fig Tree will be installing a CCTV System to monitor entrances, exits, and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime. Our staff will be trained to recognise signs of crime and disorder and informed on the methods of dealing with such issues. Clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted coupled with clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential chimical activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.

Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the restaurant area, this would not be tolerated and promptly reported.

Our Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner and when leaving will be asked to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly fashion, respecting our neighbours. All food and Alcohol will be served at the tables which includes indoor and outdoor tables as marked on plan.

c) Public safety

The premise having been recently refurbished have been upgraded to meet current regulations, all mechanical and electrical installations have been renewed to meet Building regulations and Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective. Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements. Our staff will also undergo fire procedure training and training in the use of Fire Extinguishers.

Training and implementation of underage ID checks. Documentation and records to be completed and kept on the premises

A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation. Health and Safety documents and food safety records.

All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air condition, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition. Warranties and guarantees are available for inspection.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Noise reduction measures to address the public nuisance objective.

We will have visible, clear and legible notices displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly. Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.

The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive or depart late at night when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to the local area.

Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises once they

depart and no customers will be permitted to the restaurant outside the designated opening hours. The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11.00pm. This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises.

Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.

Furthermore, we will be playing background music for customers only during designated opening hours, ensuring that we do not cause any breaches of the peace or indeed cause any disruption to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

Challenge 25" sign which is a retailing strategy that encourages anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID (a card bearing the PASS hologram, a photographic driving license or a passport) if they wish to buy alcohol. Well trained staff about requirement for persons' identification, age establishment etc.

Log Book will be kept upon the premises all the time recording the sale of Alcohol when the Challenge 25 policy as been carried out.

The company shall include a Safeguarding policy which will ensure the protection of vulnerable adult, young persons and Children.



Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. Maximum of 12 persons to be seated outside the premises at any one time.
- 2. There shall be no bar service of alcohol.
- 3. Challenge 25 Scheme shall be implemented.
- 4. There shall be no draft alcohol available to customers.
- 5. A log shall be used to record any refusals to supply alcohol to a customer.
- 6. Training records shall be kept for all staff in relation to the supply of alcohol.
- 7. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 8. Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.

Conditions proposed by the Metropolitan Police

- 9. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant:
 - a. in which customers are shown to their table;
 - b. where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only;
 - c. which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery;
 - d. which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption;
 - e. which do not provide any take away service of food after 23.00; and
 - f. where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.
- 10. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. Maintained means that the system will be regularly serviced (at least once a year) and checked every two weeks to ensure that it is storing images correctly and a log kept and signed by a Supervisor to this effect. The system will provide an identifiable full head and shoulder image of everyone entering the premises and will operate in any light conditions within the premises. The system will cover the full exterior of the premises and shall record in real time, date and time stamped and will operate whilst the premises is open for licensable activities. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and copies will be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24hrs of any request free of charge. There will always be a member of staff on duty who can operate the system, to allow Officers to view recordings and if required by a Police Officer, provide a copy of images immediately free of charge to assist in the immediate investigation of offences. If the system malfunctions and will not be operating for longer than one day of business then Police must be informed.

- 11. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to the police or an authorised officer, which will record the following:
 - a. All crimes reported to the venue;
 - b. Any complaints received;
 - c. Any incidents of disorder;
 - d. Any faults in the CCTV system;
 - e. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service;
 - f. All ejections of patrons;
 - g. All seizures of drugs or offensive weapons; and
 - h. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol

Conditions proposed by the Noise Service

- 12. There shall be no bottling out, waste collections and deliveries from the premises between 23:00 and 07.00 on any day of the week.
- 13. Outside tables and chairs will be cleared away or rendered unusable by 23:00.
