PREMISES LICENCE VARIATION APPLICATION

RE: THE ALBION PH, 10 THORNHILL ROAD, LONDON, N1 1HW

- 1. Synopsis
 - 1.1 This is an application for the variation of a premise licence under the Licensing Act 2003.
 - 1.2 The premises currently holds a licence allowing:
 - The sale by retail of alcohol, on and off supplies, Mondays to Saturdays from 10:00 until 23:00 and Sundays from 12:00 until 22:30;
 - The provision of late night refreshment, Mondays to Saturdays from 23:00 until 23:30;
 and
 - The playing of recorded music, Mondays to Sundays, 24 hours.
 - 1.3 The variation application is to:
 - Vary the design and layout of the premises in accordance with the submitted plan, ref: G15-5302/01A.

The licensee proposes the addition of a first floor private dining area. The dining area shall have a limited capacity of 24 persons at any one time. The hours and licensable activities remain as currently authorised.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any "irresponsible promotions" in relation to the premises.

In this condition, an "irresponsible promotion" means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:

- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:
 - i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

8. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 9. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, consumed in or taken from the premises except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means the authorised hours specified on this licence for the sale by retail of alcohol. This restriction does not prohibit:
 - a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
 - b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol
 on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for
 consumption as ancillary to the meals;
 - d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
 - h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- 2. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours for the sale by retail of alcohol unless one of the following applies:
 - a. He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - b. He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - c. He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.

- d. The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.
 - In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.
- 3. Unless otherwise specified on this licence no regulated entertainment shall take place at the premises with the exception of pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dancing for pre-invited guests.
- 4. This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virute of the enactments hereinafter set out:
 - Children and Young Persons Act 1933
 - Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
 - Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985



Appendix 3 a -Currently Authorised Layout plan








I would like to object to the Licensing application on the ground of Public Nuisance:

This planning application will result in additional public nuisance for 3 reasons:

- 1/ The clientele of this pub is already very much too loud
- 2/ The pub is already squeezing way to many people in its premises, which will only get worse if an additional floor is added.
- 3/ The clientele disturbs neighbouring properties, which includes yelling, hanging around on the street after the permitted time and dumping empty bottles on the neighbouring properties across the road.

With regards to point 1 and 2:

The noise disturbance is diminishing the enjoyment of our property. In our garden, due to loud noise and shouting from this pub's gardens we can hardly keep a normal volume of conversation. With the proposed dining area on the first floor of this pub, the increased number of guests will mean that this noise disturbance problem will be even further aggravated. It is inevitable that the additional dining guests will add to the overall noise level - while arriving, while waiting in the garden for their tables, while going out to smoke, and while leaving.

Even the pub's regular customer comment on the noise and the fact that the pub is going over the limit on customer per square meter.

The tables are too close together, hence it is hard to hear one's voice and those of one's friends. More space between tables would be a welcome change". Customers in the pub gardens are talking much louder than normal to overpower the background noise, making the noise disturbance problem even worse. The pub's clientele is indeed loud and boozy and does not leave in a timely fashion after closing time but drag on and continue to make noise. Customers pile out onto Thornhill Road long after closing time and do not leave quietly. I have noticed an empty bottle thrown as trash onto a neighbouring property wall and left there.

This pub creates much noise disturbance in the neighbourhood during normal pub opening hours, and it is bad enough that it is allowed to continue the noise disturbance and serve for another 30 minutes until 23.30. This is not a high street venue but an otherwise quiet residential area with houses and gardens in the immediate vicinity of the pub. I request that the Council does not accept proposals which would only make the noise disturbance problem worse.

I would also like to point out that parking in the immediate area is very limited, and, with a whole additional floor of diners, where would they park their vehicles?

PUBLIC NUISANCE

The premises have a very large outside seating area at the front. Due to woefully inadequate management over the last year in particular, local residents have been regularly subjected to unacceptable levels of noise from boisterous groups of late night revellers who then pile into taxis and minicabs, slamming doors and conversing with great bonhomie to one another as they slowly leave to go their separate ways.

Customers have been allowed to stay drinking at outside tables until 11.30/11.45pm regularly throughout this past summer. I have personally complained on several occasions and I have never received an apology, nor any approach from Punch Taverns despite having left my name and address with the manager on duty on the evenings of my complaints.

The local residents were given the opportunity on 21st September to meet Barry Skarin to discuss and any concerns regarding the Application and the existing noise levels. Although he felt that employing security staff to monitor the outside was not an image he wanted to promote and was not something he was willing to undertake, he was willing and confident that by re-training his staff to ensure that they not only adhere to the licensing conditions but also that they educate customers to extend general courtesy when leaving this purely residential area, the situation can be rectified.

Until it has been demonstrated that the existing premises can be policed efficiently, I object to the Application as it will further increase the number of customers and corresponding noise levels.

Although I am extremely grateful that the applicant has agreed to limit the capacity of the upstairs room and to keep the windows shut throughout all licensable activities, my concern still remains with regard to the inadquate control of the noise levels from the outside, even within permitted hours and certainly after the 10pm curfew.

This pub is situated in a purely residential area, and unlike all the other premises in the neighbourhood who employ dedicated security staff to ensure custoers are brought in and kept inside in accordance with the terms of their licence, the Albion feels it can leave it to the overworked and disinterested bar staff to monitor. Until I am convinced that proper measures are to be put in place to address the existing problem, which can only be exacerbated by another 24 customers, I am unwilling to withdraw my representation on the grounds of public nuisance.
