

THE PREMISES IS IN THE "CIZ". HOWEVER THE PROPOSED HOURS DO PROMOTE THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES IN THE "CIZ". The operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact. The applicant will accept the follow conditions. The alcohol only will sale in operation hours and the alcohol will be consumed OFF the premises. Cctv will be installed to the premises, installed the cctv system that meet the standard in "Uk police requirements for digital cctv system. The premises operates the "challenge 25" the proof of age scheme. The premises will open and shut at its permitted hours and the sale of alcohol or any other permitted licensing activity will not be carried out at any other time than its permitted opening hours. The premises shall install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activitie and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. THE CCTV SHALL BE IN OPERATION AT ALL THE PREMISES ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. A MEMBER OF STAFF CAPABLE OF DOWNLOADING IMAGES FOR THE POLICE OR AUTHORISED COUNCIL OFFICERS SHALL BE ON DUTY AT ALL TIMES THE PREMISES ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

NOTICES WILL BE PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED AT THE ENTRY AND POINT OF SALE STATING THAT CCTV IS IN USE, CHALLENG 25 IS OPERATED AND THE PROVISIONS OF THE LICENSING ACT REGARDING UNDERAGE AND PROXY PURCHASES AND SALES.

NOTICES WILL BE DISPLAYED ADVISING CUSTOMERS OF THE PERMITTED HOURS.

ALL STAFF WILL BE TRAINED FOR THEIR ROLE ON INDUCTION AND AT REGULAR INTERVALS OF SIX MONTHS THEREAFTER. TRAINING WILL INCLUDE IDENTIFYING PERSONS UNDER 25, MAKING A CHALLENGE, ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF AGE, MAKING AND RECORDING A REFUSAL, AVOIDING CONFLICT AND RESPONSIBLE ALCOHOL RETAILING.

WRITTEN TRAINING RECORDS WILL BE KEPT.

THE PREMISES WILL ACTIVELY ENGAGE WITH AND WORK WITH THE POLICE SAFER NEIGHBOURGHOOD TEAM.

A HARD BACK INCIDENT BOOK SHALL BE KEPT AND MADE AVAILABLE TO POLICE AND AUTHORISED COUNCIL OFFICERS IN WHICH SHALL BE RECORDED ALL INSTANCES OF CRIMINALITY, ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, ABUSE OF STAFF, INCIDENTS WHERE POLICE ARE CALLED ETC.

A NOTICE WILL BE PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED BY THE FRONT DOORS ADVISING CUSTOMERS THAT THEY ARE IN AN AREA SUBJECT TO A DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACE ORDER AND SHOULD NOT DRINK IN THE STREET AND MUST SURRENDER ANY OPEN ALCOHOLIC DRINK TO A POLICE OFFICER ON DEMAND OR FACE

ARE ST AND A FINE ON CONVICTION.

MANAGEMENT AND STAFF WILL DISCOURAGE PERSONS DRINKING OR LOITERING OUTSIDE THE SHOP.

#### PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

NOTICES WILL BE PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED BY THE EXIT ASKING CUSTOMERS TO RESPECT NEARBY RESIDENTS AND TO LEAVE QUIETLY, TO DISPOSE OF LITTER RESPONSIBLY NOT TO LOITER OUTSIDE THE SHOP AND NOT TO DRINK IN THE STREET AS THEY ARE WITHIN AN AREA SUBJECT TO A DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES ORDER.

MANAGEMENT AND STAFF WILL DISCOURAGE PERSONS DRINKING OR LOITERING OUTSIDE THE SHOP. THE SHOP FRONT WILL BE KEPT TIDY AT ALL TIMES AND SHALL BE SWEPT AT CLOSE. NO DELIVERIES WILL BE RECEIVED OR REMOVALS OF RUBBISH TAKE PLACE BETWEEN 20.00 AND 07.00. PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

THE CHALLENGE 25 PROOF OF AGE POLICY WILL BE OPERATED AND ONLY A PHOTOGRAPHIC DRIVING LICENCE, VALID PASSPORT OR PROOF OF AGE CARDS WITH THE BEARER'S PHOTOGRAPH & THE PASS LOGO/ HOLOGRAM ON IT WILL BE ACCEPTED AS PROOF OF AGE. A HARD BACK WRITTEN REFUSALS RECORD WILL BE KEPT AND MADE AVAILABLE TO POLICE DATA OUNCIL OFFICERS ON REQUEST.NOTICES WILL BE PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED AT THE ENTRY AND AT THE POINT OF SALE STATING THAT CHALLENGE 25 IS IN USE AND THE PROVISIONS OF THE LICENSING ACT REGARDING UNDERAGE AND PROXY PURCHASES AND SALES.

ALL STAFF WILL BE TRAINED FOR THEIR ROLE ON INDUCTION AND AT REGULAR INTERVALS OF SIX MONTHS THEREAFTER. TRAINING WILL INCLUDE IDENTIFYING PERSONS UNDER 25, MAKING A CHALLENGE, ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF AGE, MAKING AND RECORDING A REFUSAL, AVOIDING CONFLICT AND RESPONSIBLE ALCOHOL RETAILING. WRITTEN TRAINING RECORDS WILL BE KEPT AND MADE

AVAILABLE TO POLICE OR COUNCIL OFFICERS ON REQUEST.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Cctv will be installed to the premises for safety and crime prevention. Will not serve alcohol who already drunk in the premises. The DPS will undertake routine monitoring of the refusals records and record that this is being done. All staff that makes sales of alcohol receives regular training (induction and refresher). Installed cctv systems that meet the standard in uk police requirements for digital cctv systems' shall operate and record video images at all times that premises are open to the public and any recordings made will be retained for not less than 31 days and made available to a police officer on request. A member of staff on premises at the relevant time will be capable of operating the cctv system.

Emergency light will be installed and fire extinguisher will be installed. The fire exit is free of any impediment or obstacle at all time of the operating hours.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received regards crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol

## d) The prevention of public nuisance

For public nuisance there will not allow any alcohol drink at outside. All occasions when persons have been refused service will be recorded in a refusals book, which shall be kept at the premises for not less than 12 months. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of exit advising customers leave the premises quietly. Deliveries to the premises shall only be made during normal working hours. Bottles and similar goods shall not be handled outside the premises in the late evening, night or early morning. Bins shall not be emptied outside the premises in the late evening, night or early morning.

## e) The protection of children from harm

We will be very strict to not sell alcohol to children and under age. Any alcohol must be sold by DPS or a person authorised be the DPS at all times. All staff who sells alcohol will be trained in the role by the DPS with regular refresher training. Records of training will be kept and made available for examining officers of the relevant authorities. Where a person appears to be under the age 25, identification in the form of passport, photo driving licence or a proof of age card bearing the pass hologram will be sought and if not provided service of alcohol will be refused. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of entry and at the service area advising customers that the premises operates the "challenge 25" proof of age scheme.

There is an exemption from the payment of fees in relation to the provision of regulated entertainment at church halls, chapel halls or premises of a similar nature, village halls, parish or community halls, or other premises of a similar nature. Th costs associated with these licences will be met by central Government. If, however, the licence also authorises the use of the premises for the supply of alcohol or the provision of late night refreshment, a fee will be required.

Schools and sixth form colleges are exempt from the fees associated with the authorisation of regulated entertainment where the entertainment is provided by and at the school or college and for the purposes of the school or college.



#### **Issues of Concerns**

- 1. The application is in a cumulative impact which means that the onus is on the applicant to demonstrate that the application will not add to the cumulative impact.
- 2. The proposed measures are typical of many off licences operating in the borough. There hasn't been any attempt to acknowledge the sensitive nature of operating an off licence in a cumulative impact area where we are working hard to deal with the negative aspects of the sale of alcohol on local communities. No bespoke mitigation measures have been proposed.
- 3. The area already has a high number of licenced premises with 10 other off licences within 200m radius.
- 4. There is another off licence two doors away at 415-417 Holloway Road operated by the same licensee Mr Tesfalem Negash, who sells large quantities of high strength beers and ciders, who did not want to take part in Islington's Campaign to Reduce the Strength of the types of alcohol which is commonly sold to street drinkers and adds to the high levels of anti-social behaviour in the area.
- 5. Alcohol related crime, alcohol related violence and ambulance call outs in the area are high and significantly higher than the London average

6. The Licensing Authority has been working with partners and the licence trade to tackle underage drinking, street drinking and preloading which affect residents living in the area. An additional off licence in the area will undermine this work and add to the cumulative impact.

7. The applicant intends to sell alcohol from 07.00, making alcohol available early in the morning to vulnerable drinkers.

8. The Licensing Authority has been working with off licences to prevent drinking on the street on match days. The premises is in the vicinity of the Emirates Stadium and would add to the disorder and anti-social behaviour in the area associated with football fans.

The measures proposed in the operating schedule do not sufficiently rebut the presumption to refuse the application on the basis that the application will not add to the cumulative impact.

## **Summary and recommendations**

An additional off licence selling alcohol will add to the cumulative impact.

The applicant has not demonstrated at his existing premises that he is willing to co-operate with the Council to reduce levels of anti-social behaviour or to protect vulnerable street drinkers.

The measures proposed by the applicant in the operating schedule are industry standard.

The applicant has not demonstrated that the application will not add to the cumulative impact therefore in order to promote the licensing objectives it is recommended that this application is refused.

I am submitting a representation against the application for a licence to permit the sale of alcohol from the above premises. This representation is on behalf of Camden and Islington Council's Public Health Department, which as a health body is a responsible authority.

## The grounds for the representation are:

- Public safety
- Crime and disorder

The impact of alcohol is particularly great in Islington with some of the greatest levels of alcoholrelated problems in London, including:

- The highest rate of alcohol-specific deaths in men in London
- One of the highest rates of alcohol-related hospital admissions in London
- Significantly higher levels of alcohol-related violent crime and claimants of incapacity benefit where the main medical reason for being a claimant is alcoholism
- The premise is situated in the Finsbury Park/Holloway road cumulative impact area which indicates that there is already a high density of premises selling alcohol and any more would have a detrimental effect on the area.
- There were 53 alcohol related ambulance callouts within a 250m radius of this premises, which is in the cumulative impact area that runs along Holloway Road. The premises are close neighbouring Finsbury Park and Holloway wards, and neighbouring <sup>1</sup>LSOAs and many of the 53 LAS callouts were in these areas.
- St Georges ward neighbours with Finsbury Park and Holloway wards, all of which are in cumulative impact areas. In 2014/2015 there was 53 alcohol related ambulance callouts within a 250m radius of this premise.
- In 2014/15 St Georges ward saw 162 Alcohol- Specific Hospital Admissions which is higher than the Islington average.



## Working in partnership

The evidence available suggests that St George's Ward is an area which experiences a particularly high level of alcohol harm relative to the rest of Islington, which as a borough experiences some of the greatest levels of harm in London. As a result the area is designated as a **cumulative impact area** in the Islington Statement of Licensing Policy 2013 to 2017. As stated in this policy: any further increase in the ease of access to alcohol in terms of the number of premises and the **hours of operation** needs to be carefully managed. The onus is also on the applicant to demonstrate how they will avoid adding to this cumulative impact.

The area already has sufficient premises to meet demand and additional outlets supplying alcohol will be detrimental to the local residents in terms of noise and disturbance, anti-social behaviour and crime

### Alcohol and health

Alcohol misuse imposes a major preventable burden to health and the effect of this in Islington is felt across all health services, other front line services and residents. Islington experiences some of the highest levels of alcohol-related harm in London and the cumulative availability of alcohol is one area that is likely to be impacting on this.

There is a growing body of evidence that an increased number of alcohol outlets results in significant increases in both alcohol consumption and alcohol-related harm, including injury, violence and medical harm. Evidence indicates reducing alcohol outlet density can have an impact on reducing violence and problem drinking. There is also strong and reasonably consistent evidence that changes in hours or days of trading can have a significant impact on volume of alcohol consumed and rates of alcohol related problems.

I am concerned that if this application is granted it will increase the availability of alcohol for consumption off premises. This could lead to an increase in public nuisance, crime and disorder and impact adversely on the health of both those buying and consuming the alcohol but also the health of others who come in contact with them.

In summary the area has sufficient premises to meet demand and additional outlets supplying alcohol will only be detrimental to the local residents in terms of noise and disturbance, anti-social behaviour and crime and will significantly add to the **cumulative impact** of alcohol on residents.

We do not feel that the applicant has demonstrated how they will not add to this level of impact in line with the Cumulative Impact Policy.

#### Recommendations

Camden and Islington Public Health Department recommends that: the application for a licence to supply the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises is refused as it would significantly add to the cumulative impact of alcohol on the licensing objectives in the Finsbury Park/Holloway road Cumulative Impact Area where this premise is based


With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives, being the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The venue is situated in the Finsbury Park/Holloway Road Cumulative Impact Zone'; an area which traditionally suffers from high levels of crime and disorder and there are concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

Islington has almost double the national average of licensed premises per resident, and this is why the Police supported the implementation of the Council's Cumulative Impact Policy. This large number of licensed premises and the issues associated with these impacts greatly on the Police and all other emergency services resourse.

There are already 29 Licensed Premises within a 200m radius of these proposed premises, 10 of which are off licenses.

Over the preceeding 12 weeks there have been 243 crimes reported in the St Georges ward area.



The above map shows the total notifiable offences that have been reported to police over that same 12 week period. The venue is marked with a black star, and circled by a 200 metre radius. As can be seen, the proposed venue is on the very eastern border of St Georges Ward, in an area of far greater crime problems that the ward itself.

The applicant already has another off licence at 415-417 Holloway Road which is licensed to sell alcohol, off-sales Monday to Saturday 8am to 1am and Sundays, 10 am to 10.30pm.

For police purposes the applicants have submitted a thorough application, but we fail to see how yet another off licence in an area of saturation, and such dense general crime figures, will not add to the cumulative impact. It is for these reasons we are objecting to the application and propose that it is refused.

# Suggested conditions of approval consistent with the operating schedule

The prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The system will enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises. The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are open for licensable activities. The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an Authorised Officer or a Police Officer (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998) within 24 hours of any request.
- There shall be a member of staff on duty at all times at the premises, who is able to operate the CCTV system.
- 3. Alcohol shall not be sold to persons who are already intoxicated. A refusal log will be kept of these refusals. The log will be regularly monitored by the DPS, to ensure refusals are being made and logged.
- 4. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained in all aspects of the Licensing Act 2003 and ensure that they sign to confirm that they have understood the training. Refresher training shall be provided to staff at regular intervals of six months. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff. Training records shall be kept at the premises and provided to authorised officers upon request.
- Staff shall be trained in all aspects of the Licensing Act 2003 and refresher training will be provided at regular intervals. Training records shall be kept at the premises and provided to authorised officers upon request.
- 6. The premises will actively engage with and work with the Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team.
- 7. A notice shall be prominently displayed at the front doors to the premises advising customers that they are in an area subject to a Designated Public Place Order and should not drink in the street.
- 8. Management and staff shall discourage persons from drinking or loitering outside the premises.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available upon request to an authorised officer
  of the Licensing Authority and the Police. The log shall record the following;
  - (a) All crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) All ejections of patrons
  - (c) Any complaints received with regards to crime and disorder
  - (d) Any incidents of disorder
  - (e) Seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - (f) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.

## **Public Safety**

10. Emergency lighting and fire fighting equipment shall be installed and maintained at the premises.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

11. Alcohol purchased from the premises shall not be allowed off the premises in open containers.

- 12. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 13. Deliveries to the premises shall only be made between 07:00 and 23:00.
- 14. Bins shall not be emptied outside the premises between 07:00 and 23:00.
- 15. The area immediately outside of the premises shall be kept clean at all times and will be swept clean when the premises close.

#### The Protection of Children from Harm

- 16. The licensee shall adopt the Challenge 25 and the BII National Standards Proof of Age Scheme.
- 17. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained about age restricted products, identifying persons under 25, acceptable proof of age, making a challenge, recording a refusal, avoiding conflict and responsible alcohol retailing. The licensee shall ensure that staff sign to confirm that they have understood the training. Refresher training shall be provided to staff at regular intervals of six months. The licensee shall keep records of training and instruction given to staff. Training records shall be kept at the premises and provided to authorised officers upon request.
- 18. The licensee shall put arrangements in place to ensure that before serving alcohol to young persons, staff ask to see accredited proof of age cards e.g. Citizencard, a Passport, or UK Driving Licence bearing the photograph and date of birth of the bearer.
- 19. The licensee and staff should note any refusals to sell to young people in a refusals log. The refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection by the licensing team, police or trading standards
- 20. Signage shall be displayed at the premises, including at the point of sale, advising that the premises operate a Challenge 25 policy.
