

TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE APPLICATION

THE HORNS ROOF TERRACE, 262 STREET, LONDON EC1V 9dd

1. Synopsis

- 1.1 This is a hearing to determine a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) in respect of the above premises. The application was submitted on the 17 November 2015 and is seeking to allow for the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises, provide regulated entertainment and late night refreshment 21:00 on 31 December to 04:00 on 1 January 2016. The temporary event notice is applied for under section 100, Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 This application is subject to a representation from the Environmental Health relating to the following licencing objective :
 - Public nuisance

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 To determine the temporary event notice under Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 as the Licensing Sub-Committee consider appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.
- 2.2 The Committee can decide to:
 - i. allow the TEN for the specified event:
 - ii. allow the TEN, subject to one or more conditions of the existing premises licence; or
 - iii. prohibit the TEN by way of a counter notice.

Background 3.

- 3.1 The roof terrace holds a separate premises licence which allows the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises Monday to Sunday from 10:00 to 23:30 and the Exhibition of Films on Mondays from 18:00 to 23:00. The permitted opening hours for the roof terrace is from 10:00 to Midnight Monday to Sunday.
- 3.2 The premises licence for the roof terrace was recently varied to increase the hours stated in point 3.1 but there was no alteration of the conditions attached to the licence in the application. In fact, the operating schedule for the variation application explicitly stated that the existing conditions would be kept. Please note the following conditions on the premises licence
 - Annex 2 Condition 11 states, "No alcohol will be sold on the roof terrace after 21.00."
 - ii. Annex 2 Condition 12 states, "The roof will be cleared of all customers and closed at 23.00."
 - iii. Annex 2 Condition 13 states, "No music or amplified sound will be played on the roof terrace."

NOTES

General

In these notes, a person who gives a temporary event notice is called a "premises user".

The police and local authority exercising environmental health functions may intervene on the grounds of any of the four licensing objectives (the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm) to prevent the occurrence of an event at which permitted temporary activities are to take place or to agree a modification of the arrangements for such an event. However, the licensing authority will intervene of its own volition in the cases described below.

First, it will issue a counter notice if there is an objection to a late temporary event notice (see note 7 below).

Secondly, it may issue a notice in relation to its decision to impose conditions on a temporary event notice (see note 2 below).

Thirdly, it will issue a counter notice if the first, second, third and fifth of the limits set out below would be exceeded. If any of the limits below are breached or if a counter notice has been issued, any licensable activities taking place would be unauthorised and the premises user would be liable to prosecution. The limitations apply to:

- the number of times a person may give a temporary event notice (50 times per year for a personal licence holder and 5 times per year for other people);
- the number of times a person may give a late temporary event notice (10 times per year for a personal licence holder and 2 times per year for other people);
- the number of times a temporary event notice may be given in respect of any particular premises (12 times in a calendar year);
- the length of time a temporary event may last for these purposes (168 hours or 7 days);
- the maximum aggregate duration of the periods covered by temporary event notices at any individual premises (21 days per calendar year); and
- the scale of the event in terms of the maximum number of people attending at any one time (a maximum of 499).

For the purposes of determining the overall limits of 50 temporary event notices per personal licence holder (in a calendar year) and of 5 for a non-personal licence holder (in a calendar year), temporary event notices given by an associate or a person who is in business with a premises user (and that business involves carrying on licensable activities) count towards those totals. The limits applying to late temporary event notices are included within the overall limits applying to the total number of temporary event notices. Note 15 below sets out the definition of an "associate".

When permitted temporary activities take place, a premises user must ensure that either:

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. All door supervisors shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 4. The admission of children to the exhibition of a film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of a film classification body as defined in the Video Recordings Act 1984 or Islington Council acting as the licensing authority where it has given notice in section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

There are further 'Mandatory conditions' applicable to licences authorising the supply of alcohol. A full list of the current mandatory conditions is available from the licensing pages on Islington's web site, www.islington.gov.uk. This list is subject to change by order of the Secretary of State and licensees and other responsible persons are advised to ensure they are aware of the latest conditions.


Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. The manager shall actively participate in and support the local Pubwatch scheme.
- 2. Members of staff shall be on the roof terrace at all times the area is open.
- 3. CCTV system shall be installed and maintained at the premises, including a CCTV unit, which monitors the immediate vicinity of the premises. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Tape recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer or a police officer with 24 hours of any request.
- 4. Notices shall be displayed to inform customers that CCTV is operating on the roof terrace.
- 5. In the event that door supervisors are employed at the premises, they shall be registered with the Security Industry Authority.
- 6. Text and or radio pagers shall be used for staff to communicate.
- 7. The manager shall ensure that all emergency escape routes are kept clear.
- 8. No music will be played on the roof terrace.
- 9. Members of staff shall keep nuisance and disturbance from the roof terrace to a minimum level.
- 10. No children shall be allowed on the roof terrace.
- No alcohol will be sold on the roof terrace after 21.00.
- 12. The roof will be cleared of all customers and closed at 23.00.
- 13. No music or amplified sound will be played on the roof terrace.
- 14. On the roof terrace alcohol or soft drinks may not be sold in glass containers for consumption either on or off the premises.
- 15. All glass ashtrays to be replaced by plastic ashtrays.
